The Fisheries Act, 1905-13. PROCLAMATION

Western Australia, By His Excellency Sir Robert Furse
TO WIT. SmcMillan, K.C.M.G., Lieut.-Governor
in and over the State of Western
Lieut.-Governor. Australia and its Dependencies in
the Commonwealth of Australia.

955/25. WHEREAS by a Proclamation under "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," published in the Government Gazette on the 10th day of December, 1926, the waters of Parry's Harbour and Irwin's Inlet were closed against the use of fishing nets until the 31st day of December, 1927: And whereas it is desirable to vary the said Proclamation by deleting the reference to Irwin's Inlet in the schedule thereto, and in exercise of the power conferred by Section 8 of the said Act to prohibit the taking of fish by means of nets during certain periods of every year in the waters of Irwin's Inlet and the tributaries thereof: Now, therefore I, the Lieut.-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council,-(a) Do hereby vary the said Proclamation as published in the Government Gazette on the 10th day of December, 1926, by deleting the words "and Irwin's Inlet" in the schedule thereto, and (b) do by this Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by the use of a fishing net or fishing nets in the waters of Irwin's Inlet, or any portion thereof, including its tributaries, from the 1st day of January until the 30th day of June, and from the 1st day of October until the 31st day of December (inclusive of the first and last days of each period) in every year.

The Traffic Act, 1919-26. Preston Road Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1375/23. WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a Local Authority to exercise within its district power a Local Authority to exercise within its district any power of making regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4 of Part IV. of the said Act; and whereas it is desirable to empower the Preston Road Board to prehibit the passage of heavy traffic over those portions of the reads described in the schedule hereto within its district during the months of July, August, and September in every year, and to define that heavy traffic for such purpose shall be as set out in Nos. 149 and 150 of the Traffic Regulations as published in the Government Gazette dated 5th September. 1924: Now. therefore His Excellency the as published in the Government Gazette dated 5th September, 1924: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut. Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby empower the Preston Road Board to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over those portions of the roads described in the schedule hereto within the Preston Road District during the months of July. Preston Road District during the months of July, August, and September in every year accordingly, and to define that heavy traffic for such purpose shall be as set out in Nos. 149 and 150 of the Traffic Regulations as published in Government Gazette dated 5th Scartenber 1924, and also that any present actions in September, 1924, and also that any person acting in contravention of this Order shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding twenty pounds, as set forth in No. 150 of the Traffic Regulations gazetted on the 5th September, 1924.

#### THE TRAFFIC ACT. 1919-26.

#### Regulations.

P.W. 939/26.

THE passage of any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic is prohibited on over or along any of the roads des-eribed in the schedule becomier during the months of June. July, August, and September in each and every year.

"Heavy Troffic," for the purposes of this regula-tion, shall mean heavy traffic as defined by a regula-tion published in the Government Gazette on the 5th day of September, 1924, that is to say:-

"149. For the nurnose of 'The Traffic Act, 1919,' and all regulations made thereunder, 'heavy traffic' shall mean and include the traffic of all vehicles engaged in the carriage or conveyance of sleepers, or sawn, hewn, split, and other timber, firewood, bricks, stone, gravel, metal, salt, lime, cement, farm produce, or other material in bulk, and the traffic of any vehicle the weight whereof, including any load, exceeds 12cwt. per wheel."

Any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Add as a separate clause after the clause interpreting "Surveyor" in the interpretations preceding By-law in the interpretations preceding By-law No. 1:-

"Wood—or wooden buildings' means buildings of wood or having wooden frames."

(ii) By-law No. 5-Position of building on site:

Delete the whole of By-law No. 5 and add the following new By-law:

"No building which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling-house, and no addition to any such building, shall be built, constructed, or erected within a distance of twenty feet measured horizontally from the building line of the street or road the building is intended to or shall front.

Except as hereinafter provided no building which is intended to be used, or which shall be used as a dwellinghouse, and no addition to any building which is intended to be used, or which shall be used as a dwelling-house, shall be built, constructed, or erected-

- (a) If of wood, within a distance of four feet: if of brick, stone, concrete, or cement blocks, within a distance of three feet measured horizontally of any street, road. lane, or right-ofway at the side of such building or of any land not in the same possession or occupation.
- (b) Provided always, that any such building or addition may abut on the building line of any street, road, lane, or right-of-way at the side of such building, or be less than the prescribed distance therefrom, or from land not in the same possession or occupation, or from a building or erection with an external wall of wood; provided that the wall or walls which abut on or face with the prescribed distance such street, road, lane, or right-of-way or land or huilding or erection, as the case may be, shall be of concrete at least six inches in thickness, or of brick or stones at least 814 inches in thickness, projecting in all cases at least one inch beyond the woodwork front and back and at least one foot six inches through the roof covering of gutter adjoining the same."

(iii) By-law No. 8-Materials:

Add the words "or cement blocks" after the word "concrete" in By-law No. 8.

(iv) By-law No. 6-External Walls-Structure:

- (a) Add the words "or cement blocks" after the words "brick, stone, or concrete" wherever these appear in By-law No. 16.
- (b) Delete the word "two" immediately before "storeys" in the sixth clause of By-law No. 16 and substitute therefor the word "one."
- (c) Add the following new clause to By-law No.
- "All external walls of brick, stone, concrete, or cement blocks shall be built with a true cavity at least two inches wide; provided that where such external walls are protected by a verandah not less than seven feet wide they may be built solid without a cavity."

  (v) By-law No. 24—Rooms—Windows:

Add the words "under the main roof of the dwelling" after the words "privy closet" in By-law No. 24.

#### WYNDHAM MEAT WORKS.

(Registered 19th May, 1927.)

No. 12 of 1927.

AGREEMENT made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this First day of April, in the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, between—

- The Wyndham Freezing, Canning, and Meat Export Works (hereinafter known as "tne employer"), of the one part,
- and the following Unions, jointly and severally. hereinafter known as "tne Unions," of tne otner part, namely—
- THE WEST AUSTRALIAN BRANCH OF THE AUSTRALASIAN MEAT INDUSTRY EMPLOYEES' UNION INDUSTRIAL UNION OF WORKERS, PERTH,
- THE COASTAL DISTRICT COMMITTEE AMALGAMATED SOCIETY OF ENGINEERS' INDUSTRIAL ASSOCIATION OF WORKERS,
- THE WESTERN AUSTRALIAN BRANCH OF THE FEDERATED ENGINE-DRIVERS AND FIREMEN'S ASSOCIATION OF AUSTRALASIA,

THE W.A. BRANCH OF THE FEDERATED COOPERS OF AUSTRALIA,

and

THE AUSTRALIAN WORKERS' UNION.

#### WHEREBY IT IS AGREED-

1. This Agreement shall apply in respect of the rates of wages and conditions of labour in connection with the tasks hereinafter mentioned at the Wyndham Meatworks.

#### GENERAL CONDITIONS.

2. Clauses under this heading are to be operative only where not otherwise provided under the headings of Sections I. to VII.

#### DEFINITIONS.

- 3. In this Agreement, unless the context indicates otherwise, the following terms have the meanings, respectively, set out against them, that is to say:—
  - (a) WEEK DAYS.—Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays.
  - (b) A WEEK shall mean Monday to Saturday inclusive.
  - (c) SHIFT WORK shall mean work done in time preceding, during, and following ordinary working hours by separate relays of employees.
  - (d) "MUTUALLY AGREED" or "MUTUAL ARRANGEMENT" implies agreed between the Management of the Meatworks and the Union Executive at Wyndham or Perth in writing.

#### PREFERENCE.

- 4. Subject to Clause 5, preference of employment in respect of tasks for which rates of wages are specified in this Agreement shall be given to Members of the Unions who are parties to this Agreement, provided they are competent and qualified workmen and do their work to the satisfaction of the Management. The Employer may require a Medical Certificate of fitness in respect of any applicant for employment. The cost of obtaining such certificate to be borne by the Employer.
- 5. With respect to the employment of Watch-keeping Engineers, the Employer reserves the right to employ Members of any Union or Organisation who are qualified to perform the duties of Watch-keeping Engineers.

- 6. Subject to preference to Members of the Unions who are parties to this Agreement, the Employer shall have the right—
  - (a) To select employees with due regard to their qualifications for their respective tasks;
  - (b) To allot to employees their respective tasks;
  - (c) In the case of an employee not fulfilling his task satisfactorily, to allot another task at the rate specified for such allotted task;
  - (d) To transfer employees from one department or task to another whenever reasonably necessary to do so. In case of alleged unreasonableness the Board of Control can discuss with the Management;
  - (e) To dispense with the services of any employee for incompetence, drunkenness, or unsatisfactory work.

#### GUARANTEE.

7. Subject to Clause 6 (c) and (e), a guarantee of 16 weeks' work from date of commencement of operations is given to each employee brought from Perth or Fremantle for the 1927 season. The rates applicable under this guarantee shall be the rates for the respective tasks for which employees shall have been engaged. The date of commencement of operations shall be a matter for mutual arrangement.

#### PAID HOLIDAYS.

8. Labour Day, Good Friday, Wyndham Cup Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day.

#### PAID HOLIDAY RATES.

- 9. (a) When an employee does no work on a paid holiday he shall be entitled to wages at ordinary rate for a working day, hours or tally, as the case may be.
- (b) When an employee is required to work on a paid holiday he shall be entitled to wages at double ordinary rate, with a minimum of a working day, hours or tally, as the case may be.

#### CLOSE HOLIDAYS.

10. Christmas Day and Sundays.

#### ORDINARY HOLIDAYS.

11. Anzac Day, Easter Monday, and King's Birthday.

#### HOLIDAY RATES.

- 12. For time or tally worked on holidays the rates shall be—
  - (a) On ordinary holidays, rate and a half.
- (b) On close holidays, double rate, with a minimum of two hours.

#### WAITING TIME ALLOWANCES.

- 13. When (after expiry of the 16 weeks' guarantee), owing to completion or interruption or reduction of all or any of the operations from any cause, no employment is available for any employee who has been brought from Perth or Fremantle for the 1927 season, such employee shall be paid a waiting time allowance for each ordinary working day (excluding Sundays and holidays) as follows:—
  - (a) Day wage employees— Ordinary working hours for the day at half their respective task rates.

- (b) Contract slaughtermen—Half the minimum payment prescribed in Clause 50 (b).
- (c) Slaughterhouse assistants—
   Half the minimum rates prescribed in Clause
   58.

#### CHANGE OF TASK.

14. When, owing to completion or interruption or reduction of all or any of the operations from any cause, no employment is available for an employee at his usual task, such employee shall, if so required by the Management, do any other work available and be paid the rate pertaining to his recognised task.

#### TRAVELLING.

- 15. Each employee brought from Perth or Fremantle for the 1927 season shall be entitled to—
- (a) Passage from Fremantle to Wyndham and travelling time allowance.
- (b) Passage (and travelling time allowance) by first available steamer from Wyndham to Fremantle after termination of work in his department, or when his services are not further required by the Management; provided that his duties have been performed to the satisfaction of the Management.
- (c) When such employee shall, at the request of the Management, remain in employment until the end of the succeeding season, he shall be entitled to receive payment in lieu of passage and estimated travelling time to Fremantle. This will not deprive such employee of his right to passage and travelling time (as above provided) at the end of such succeeding season.
- (d) When an employee shall have been requested by the Management to remain in employment (Clause 15 (c)), and the Management afterwards notifies that the employee's services will not be required for the succeeding season, the allowance to the employee, Clause 15 (c), shall be calculated in the proportion that the length of time he is retained bears to a period of twelve months, dating from 30th November of the current season.
- 16. Travelling time allowance referred to in Clause 15 shall be at the rate of Fifteen shillings (15s.) per day, and shall accrue from day of embarkation to day of landing, both inclusive.

#### HOURS OF LABOUR.

- 17. Unless otherwise specifically mentioned herein, 44 hours shall constitute a week's work—divided into six working days as follows:—Five week days each eight hours, 40 hours; Saturday four hours, total 44 hours. A day's work shall therefore consist of eight hours on week days and four hours on Saturdays.
- 18. Daily rates of wages specified herein relate to a working day of eight hours.
- 19. Unless otherwise mutually agreed, ordinary starting time shall be 7.30 a.m. and ordinary ceasing time shall be 4.30 p.m. on week days and 11.30 a.m. on Saturdays.
- 20. Ordinary working hours shall comprise the hours between the ordinary starting time on any day and the ordinary ceasing time, exclusive of meal times and smokes.
- 21. "Outside of ordinary working hours" on any day means between midnight the previous day and starting time, and/or between ordinary ceasing time and midnight; also meal hours and smokos.

#### MEAL TIMES.

- 22. Unless otherwise mutually arranged, meal times shall be—
  - (a) From 6.30 a.m. to 7.30 a.m.

11.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m.

4.30 p.m. to 5.30 p.m.

11.30 p.m. to 12.30 a.m.

(b) When employees are engaged on loading out frozen beef the above meal times will be recognised with the exception of breakfast time, which will be observed at the following time:—

7.30 a.m. to 8.30 a.m.

(c) When employees are engaged on loading and discharging steamers meal hours shall be elastic to the extent of one hour either way.

#### CRIBS.

- 23. (a) Employees engaged on loading and discharging steamers will be supplied with cribs as follows:—One crib at second smoko after commencing work after tea; one crib at second smoko after commencing work at midnight.
- (b) Shift workers engaged on 4 p.m. to midnight and midnight to 8 a.m. shifts will be supplied with one crib during their shift.

#### MINIMUM OF OVERTIME.

- 24. Subject to any mutual arrangement, employees called back to work, after a meal time, following ordinary ceasing time, shall be provided with the following minimum periods of work, or shall be entitled to payment for such:—
  - (a) On week days and Saturdays—two hours.
  - (b) On Sundays-four hours.

#### GENERAL.

- 25. The Management shall give the delegate reasonable notice of workers required to work overtime. The delegate shall then be responsible on behalf of the Union for supplying such workers. The Management shall give due regard to distribution of overtime.
- 26. When an employee works at more than one task on any one day he shall be paid for that day at the highest rated of such tasks.
- 27. Day wage employees shall be paid in the employer's time and contract and tallymen within reasonable time after ceasing work.
- 28. The employment and rates of pay of roys shall be a matter for mutual arrangement.
- 29. Wages shall be paid fortnightly in cash, or any employee may have his wages lodged to his credit with the State Savings Bank if he so desires.
- 30. Employees shall be provided without charge with accommodation in the quarters erected for that purpose, including stretcher, mattress, and pillow.
- 31. Each employee engaged under this Agreement who boards at the Works canteen agrees to have the amount of 25s. per week deducted from his wages fortnightly.
- 32. When employees under this Agreement are temporarily required to work away from the Works (outside of a two-mile radius) they shall be paid a victualling allowance of 6s. per day, provided it be found inconvenient to send a cook out with such employees.

33-34. All delegates shall be officially recognised by the Management.

#### DISPUTES.

- 35. Should any dispute arise as to the construction or meaning of this Agreement, or touching anything arising out of its operation, the work is nevertheless to be carried on without any interruption, and the matter in dispute shall be submitted to a conference between the Management and representatives of the Union concerned, such conference to be held at the Meatworks as soon as can be arranged.
- 36. Should no settlement be arrived at by above conference, the matter in dispute shall then be discussed between the Management and the local Board of Control of the Unions.
- 37. In the event of a settlement not being arrived at by discussion (referred to in Clause 36), the matter in dispute shall be submitted to the arbitration of an umpire to be chosen by one representative appointed for that purpose by the Employer and one representative appointed for that purpose by the Unions who are parties to this Agreement; and the decision of such umpire shall be final and conclusive. The umpire may determine by whom the costs of the arbitration shall be paid and may fix such costs.
- 38. Every reasonable facility will be afforded by both parties to enable arbitration to be completed within 12 hours of the beginning of any dispute in connection with Waterside work.

#### SECTION I.

# SECTIONAL CONDITIONS (pertaining to this Section).

- 39. Being responsible for the quality and condition of products, foremen may attend personally to such of the operations as they may consider necessary to ensure satisfactory results. Such operations include the making-up and attention to cold and hot pickles; the pumping and filterpressing of soups, and the finishing off of extracts, the setting and supervision of tinshop dies; the refining and weighing of tallow and edible fats and other processes of a like nature.
- 40. All freezing chamber employees working outside chambers shall be allowed 15 minutes for cooling down before entering freezing rooms.

#### SHIFT WORK.

- 41. Shift of eight hours may be worked in departments where operations are continuous or where they require attention for more than twelve hours in the twenty-four.
- 42. Shift workers shall be entitled to the prescribed overtime rates for work done during Sundays, holidays, meal times or smokos. For other time worked outside of ordinary hours shift workers shall only be entitled to rate and a half for any time worked in excess of eight hours per shift.

#### SMOKOS.

- 43. Smokos of fifteen minutes each shall be paid for as working time and shall be allowed (at times to be mutually arranged) as follows:—
- (a) One smoke each forenoon worked, one smoke each afternoon worked, and one smoke after every two hours continuous work done outside of ordinary working hours.

(b) When employees are engaged on 12-hour shifts loading out frozen meat, three smokos each of 20 minutes will be allowed and paid for as working time for each 12-hour shift worked at the following times:—

7.30 p.m. to 7.50 p.m.

9.45 p.m. to 10.5 p.m

2.15 a.m. to 2.35 a.m.

44. When reasonably required by the Management, owing to exigencies of the work, employees shall forego their smoko until a more convenient time.

#### OVERTIME.

- 45. Subject to any special provision herein, overtime rates shall be paid—
  - (a) Outside of ordinary working hours, rate and a-half.
  - (b) Meal times and smokos, double rates.
  - (c) Sundays:

Midnight Saturday to 6 p.m., double rates. 6 p.m. to midnight, treble rates.

46. Provided that ordinary rates and conditions shall apply during ordinary working hours, and rate and a-half for one hour before ordinary starting time or for one hour after ordinary ceasing time, to men doing preparatory or finishing work on preserving, cook room, cellarman handling meats for canning purposes, in any place set aside for curing purposes, open-air boners, retort and traymen, and chillroom men, as is now customary.

#### BEEF SLAUGHTERING.

- 48. Work to be performed by slaughtermen in dressing of freezing cattle shall be:—Knocking down, sticking, footing-off, grounding, backing-off, taking out offal, sawing down, dropping hides, finishing off, and wiping up.
- 49. The slaughtering gang shall, if so required by the Management, slaughter up to—
  - 45 cattle per slaughterman per day on week days, and
  - 20 cattle per slaughterman per day on Saturdays.
