WHEREAS it is provided by Section 233 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," that rates throughout a district shall be uniform, except in so far as a Board may fix the rates for any townsite or any area defined for that purpose by Proclamation at a higher figure within the limits in the said section set forth: And whereas it is desirable to approve of and define the areas hereinafter described as areas within which the Greenmount Road Board may rate at such higher figures: Now, therefore, I, the said Lieut.-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Coun-cil, do hereby approve of and define the following area, as described in schedules hereunder, of the Greenarea, as described in schedules hereunder, of the Green-mount Road District as areas in which the Greenmount Road Board may fix the rate at such higher figure as aforesaid, within the limits mentioned in Section 233 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919."

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir Robert Furse TO WIT. { R. F. MCMILLAN, in and over the State of Western Lieut.-Governor. Australia and its Dependencies in [L.S.] the Commonwealth of Australia.

# The Land Act, 1898. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

# The Stock Diseases Act, 1895. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered to make such regulations as may be deemed necessary for any of the purposes men-tioned in the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him as aforesaid, and acting with the advice and consent of the Eventive Council deth hereby make the following the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations:-

1. All that area situated within a circle having a radius of five miles from the Town Hall at Kalgoorlie is hereby established and declared to be a quarantine area.

2.No pig shall be removed from the said quarantine area while this Order in Council continues in force.

3. No pig products shall be removed from the said quarantine area while this Order in Council continues in force.

4. No pig shall be removed from one place to another in the said area, except to a local abattoir, with be authority of an Inspector of Stock; and the trans-port of pigs to an abattoir shall be by means of a

vehicle with an impervious floor and not otherwise. 5. No local pigswill or kitchen refuse shall be used for the purpose of feeding pigs within the said area unless such pigswill and kitchen refuse has been boiled before being so used.

Any person who commits a breach of any of the foregoing regulations shall be liable on conviction to a

penalty not exceeding twenty pounds. 7. These regulations shall be read as one with the Regulations made under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," and in force for the time being.

THE PUBLIC WORKS ACT, 1902. Scaddan Water Supply. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 171/25; Ex. Co. No. 2013. WHEREAS by Section 11 of "The Public Works Act, 1902,'' it is made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to authorise the Minister to undertake, construct, or provide any public work (subject as to Rail-ways to Section 96), and such authorisation shall be deemed an authority to such Minister by and under that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Excentive Counand with the advice and consent of the Executive Coun-cil, and in exercise of the power conferred by the re-cited section of "The Public Works Act, 1902," doth hereby authorise the Honourable Minister for Works to construct a Tank for Water Supply at Scaddan, and provide a Water Catchment in connection therewith, on the land shown edged green on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 25300, which may be inspected at the office of the Min-ister for Works, Perth.

# The Vermin Act, 1918. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Vermin Act, 1918," the Governor is empowered to make, repeal, and alter regulations for earrying this Act into effect: And whereas the Governor, acting under the said Act, did on the 19th day of March, 1910 make certain model that a bid and the sector of the sector. 1919, make certain regulations which were duly pub-lished in the *Government Gasette* of the 21st day of March, 1919: And whereas the Governor, acting as aforesaid, did on the 2nd day of July, 1919, repeal Regulation 93 of the said regulations, and did make a new Regulation 93 of the said regulations, and dud make a new Regulation 93 to take the place thereof, which was duly published in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th day of July, 1919, and did subsequently amend the said Regulation 93 by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th day of August, 1921: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Regulations 90, 91, 92, and 93 as amended, now appearing under the heading "Bonus for Destruction of Wild Dogs and heading "Bonus for Destruction of Wild Dogs and Foxes" in the said regulations, shall be repealed and roxes." in the said regulations, shall be repeated and that the regulations hereinafter set out should be made under the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Excentive Council, and in exercise of the powers con-ferred by the said Act, doth hereby repeal the said Regulations 90, 91, 92, and 93 as amended and doth hereby make the regulations following in lieu thereof, namely -namely:-

# Payment by Vermin Boards for destruction of Wild Dogs and Foxes (Section 107).

A Vermin Board may grant, at the cost of the 90. Board, for every wild dog and fox destroyed within its district, a bonus of an amount not exceeding ten shil-lings and, under special circumstances (to be recorded in the minutes of the Board), of such larger amount, not exceeding five pounds, as the Board in its discretion may think fit.

Payment of Uniform Bonus for Destruction of Wild Dogs, Foxes, and Eaglehawks (Section 100, Subsection 3).

91. The uniform bonus pavable for the destruction of wild dogs, foxes, and englebawks under the provi-sions of Section 100, Subsection (3), of the Act shall be as follows :-

(a) For every wild dog or fox destroyed-Two pounds.

(b) For every eaglehawk destroyed-Five shillings.

No evidence of the destruction of a wild dog or 92 fox shall be received unless the scalp, consisting of two ears connected by a strip of skin, and the tail are produced; and no evidence of the destruction of an eaglehawk shall be received unless the head and claws are produced. All such scalps and tails and heads and claws shall be properly dried before being so produced. produced.

93. Any person claiming payment of the uniform bonus mentioned in Regulation 91 must hand the scalp and tail, in the case of a wild dog or fox, or the head and claws, in the case of an eaglehawk, to the Chief Inspector or to a person authorised in writing by him for that purpose, or to the Clerk to the Vermin Board of the district within which such wild dog, fox, or eaglehawk has been destroyed. If such scalp and tail be handed to the Clerk to the Vermin Board, he shall forthwith cut off the greater portion of one ear therefrom and retain such portion until advised by the Chief Inspector that the payment of the uniform bonus has been approved, whereupon he may destroy the same. All scalps and tails less the portion re-moved as aforesaid, and all heads and claws of eagle-hawks handed in to the Clerk to the Vermin Board shall be sent by him to the Chief Inspector together with a statement in writing in duplicate certified by the Chairman of the Board and such Clerk, giving the names and addresses of the persons claiming the bonus, the number of scalps and tails, and heads and claws handed in by such persons respectively, the dates when the same were so handed in by them, and the amount of bonus claimed by such persons respectively.

93a. All scalps and tails and all heads and claws received by the Chief Inspector shall be totally destroyed by fire, either by the Chief Inspector or by some person anthorised in writing by him for that purpose: Provided that a scalp and/or tail may be

received by the Chief Inspector or person so authorised as aforesaid, attached to the whole skin of the ised as aforesaid, attached to the whole skin of the animal's body, and in such case, if by arrangement with the person handing in the same the said scalp and/or tail, together with the said skin is properly and effectively tanned by or under the supervision of the Chief Inspector or person authorised as aforesaid, then the same need not be destroyed by fire, but may be delivered up to the person who handed in the same.

93b. Whenever the said uniform bonus has open elaimed through the Clerk to the Vermin Board as aforesaid, and payment thereof has been approved by the Chief Inspector, such payment shall be made by sending the amount thereof to the Clerk to the Vermin Barned for preparing the payment article to the commu-Board for payment to the person entitled to the same: Board for payment to the person entitled to the same: Provided that if by an arrangement with the Chief Inspector the said Clerk shall have previously paid the uniform bonus on behalf of the Chief Inspector upon receipt of the claim for such bonus, then the said Clerk may receive the payment from the Chief In-spector as a reimbursement of the moneys already wide a aforegoid paid as aforesaid.

93c. Whenever a person claiming the said uniform bonus hands the scalp and tail of a wild dog or for to the Chief Inspector or to the person authorised by him as aforesaid, and such person also desires to claim Vermin Board under Regulation 90, he shall be en-titled to receive from the Chief Inspector or author-ised person as aforesaid a certificate in writing stating the number of scalps and tails (if more than one) so handed in by him the date when the same were so handed in by him, the date when the same were so handed in, and the number in respect of which the said uniform bonus has been paid; and in such case the Clerk to the Vermin Board shall accept such certificate in lieu of the production of the scales and tails in respect of which such application is made to the Vermin Board for payment of the bonus by such Board Board.

#### FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST.

#### Amendment of Regulations.

The Regulations made by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners on the 9th day of November, 1923, are hereby amended as follows, viz.:--By repealing Regulation No. 130 and enacting the following new Regulation in lieu thereof, viz.:--

#### Regulation No. 130.

Regulation No. 130. Mode of Discharging or Loading.—The master of every vessel shall give notice to the Wharf Manager of his intention to discharge or load before such work is commenced. Such notice in respect to labour or the hire of mechanical appliances must be handed to the Wharf Manager at least one clear half-hour before the commencement of the nearest "pick-up" period of watersiders, having regard for the time of commence-ment of such work. No goods, live stock, or other material of any sort whatsoever shall be discharged or shipped, except at such times and places, and in such order and mode as may be directed and deemed expedient shipped, except at such times and places, and in such order and mode as may be directed and deemed expedient by the Wharf Manager for the proper working of any wharf or jetty. Cargo discharged without permission of the Wharf Manager being first obtained shall not be deemed to be in the custody of the Trust, nor shall the Trust be held responsible for any loss or damage that may accrue to such cargo from any cause whatever.

(a) Casual hands shall be paid 2s. 3d. per day in excess of the rates prescribed in Clause 4. If em-ployed only part of the day, the extra 2s. 3d. shall be paid. If a permanent employee is engaged as a casual hand within three weeks of the Easter or Christmas helidays the rate of pay shall be 3s in excess of the

name when there weeks of the Easter or Christmas holidays, the rate of pay shall be 3s. in excess of the rates preseribed in Clause 4. (b) All persons engaged on tarred metal, tarred blocks, or spreading tar shall be paid 1s. per day extra. (c) Where a driver is called upon to provide stab-ling for his horse or horses, he shall be paid 5s. per week for each horse stabled in addition to the rate of wages he is receiving at the time. All feed for horses wages he is receiving at the time. All feed for horses so stabled shall be provided by the employer.

(d) Drivers who are required to collect money during any week or portion of a week as part of their duties, and account for it, shall be paid 1s. for such week in addition to the rate of wage prescribed by Clause 4. 6. Hours:

(a) The hours of duty shall be forty-eight per week, except for ice carters in winter, when the hours shall be forty-six per week.

(b) In any week in which there is a holiday forty hours shall constitute a week's work, and in any week in which there are two holidays, thirty-two hours shall constitute a week's work: Provided that this subclause shall not apply in the case of milk carters.

(e) Any hours worked on any day or days to make (d) The working hours for casual employees shall be

(d) The working hours for casual employees shall be cight hours and forty minutes on five days in the week, and four hours and forty minutes on Saturdays. 7. Meal Times.—Employees are entitled to a break of one hour for meals on all the days in the week, except Saturday. Where an employee is required to work on Saturday beyond 2 p.m., he shall be allowed a break of half an hour for a meal, or an hour if he has to continue after 3 p.m. has to continue after 3 p.m. 8. Starting and Finishing Time.—The starting time

for the purpose of calculating overtime shall (with the exceptions hereinafter mentioned) be 7 a.m. or after, and the finishing time on Mondays to Fridays inclusive shall not be later than 6 p.m., and on Saturdays not later than 1 p.m. The exceptions referred to are:---

(a) Drivers employed at fish, fruit, vegetable, and pastry-cooks' shops or stores;(b) Ice carting in summer and parcel express cart-

ing;

(c) Milk carters, stablemen, and yardmen;

(d) Drivers employed by mail contractors.

9. Overtime.—For all time of duty before the pre-scribed starting time or after the prescribed finishing time, or after nine hours and forty minutes on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, and six hours on Saturday, or in excess of the hours prescribed in Clause 6, payment shall be made at the rate of time and a quarter for the first two hours and time and a half thereafter. In the case of juniors under eighteen years of age overtime shall be paid at the rate of time and a half. All over-

time shall stand alone and shall be paid for in addition to the ordinary weekly or casual wage. 10. Sunday Work.—For all time of duty on Sun-days, with the exceptions hereinafter mentioned, pay-ment in addition to the weekly wage shall be made at

In the case of drivers feeding and attending horses the rate to be paid shall be the ordinary rate paid for the other six days of the week.
11. Holiday Pay.—All time of duty on holidays shall stand alone and be paid for in addition to the weekly wage at the rate of ordinary time. Any employee required to work on a holiday shall be paid at least half a day's pay at holiday rates: Provided that this clause shall not apply to milk carters.
12. Termination of Employment.—One week's notice at any time on either side shall be required be

notice at any time on either side shall be required be-for the engagement of any but a casual hand shall be determined: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss an employee for refusal or neglect to obey

orders, misconduct, carelessness in the performance of his duties, or if after receiving one week's notice he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice: Provided also that, except for the reasons mentioned in the first proviso to this clause, the engagement shall not be terminated by any notice expiring within a week of the Christmas or Easter holidays if it is intended to re-engage the employee immediately or very shortly after the holidays mentioned, and meu in permanent employment shall not be changed to casual employees within one week of the Christmas or Easter holidays.

Notice given every week to determine the employment without any intention to determine the employment at the end of the week, but only with a view of dismissing men at any time shall not be deemed notice for the purpose of this Agreement unless given during a general or shipping or coal strike.

13. Heavy Work.—Where employees are called upon to handle, without proper mechanical appliances, heavy stone, wool, or gunney bags over two hundredweight, an extra man shall be provided.

14. Time and Wages Book.—Each employer shall provide a time and wages book, to be kept in a place where it is easily accessible to both the employer and the worker. Such book shall show the name of the worker, the time he starts and finishes work each day, the number of hours worked by and the wages and overtime paid to each worker and his signature for the same. The employer and the worker shall be jointly responsible for the proper posting of such book daily. Such book shall be open on one day in each week, during working hours, to inspection by the Secretary of the Union or any other person authorised in writing by him.

15. Travelling Allowances.—Employees engaged on work from which they are unable to return to their homes at night shall be paid such personal expenses as they reasonably incur, but they shall be paid at the rate of seven shillings and sixpence a day at the least. An employee prevented from returning with his turnout to the depot or yard from which he started shall be paid any travelling expenses he has to incur and for the time he reasonably takes to get to his home beyond the time he would have taken to get to his home from the depot or yard.

16. Pay Day.—All wages shall be paid on either Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday of each week, but the day once fixed shall not be altered more than once in three months or without two weeks' notice to the employees. Such pays shall be made within ten minutes of the time the employee ceases duty where it is practicable to pay the employee on pay day at the yard or depot. If not paid within that time through any fault or delay of the employer, or because the employee ceases work at a place which causes more than ten minutes delay, overtime shall be paid for any excess of the ten minutes referred to. No employer shall hold more than one day's wages in hand.

17. Payment for Highest Function.—Where an employee is called upon to perform two or more classes of work on any one day he shall, for the purpose of assessing the wages to be paid, be deemed to have worked the day at the class for which the highest rate of wages is prescribed.

18. Commencing and Finishing Work.—Work shall commence when an employee signs on at the yard or depot in the morning, and finish when he signs off on leaving in the evening, except where the horses are stabled at the driver's own home. In such a case the driver shall be allowed twenty minutes in the morning and fifteen minutes in the evening to perform the necessary stable work. Drivers of milk earts need not sign on and off when they start and leave off work, but they shall sign once a day.

19. Temporary Change of Stable.—Where an employer transfers an employee, after he comes to work, from one stable or yard situated more than two miles distant from the stable or yard at which he usually works, fares to and from such altered stable or yard shall be allowed by the employer. If he is transferred temporarily to work at a stable which requires him to travel one mile or more from his home beyond the distance he usually travels, the fares to and from and excess time shall be paid for by the employer.

20. Proportion of Juniors.—Juniors may be employed in the proportion of one junior to every five sdult drivers employed: Provided that grocers, green-

grocers, retail milk vendors, and/or wood merchants who do not employ an adult driver or drivers shall be permitted to employ one junior. 21. General:

(a) Stablemen shall be entitled to receive one clear day's rest in seven. If they work on seven days in any week they shall receive Sunday rates for all time worked on Sunday of such week.

(b) Stablemen required to live at the stable shall be provided with suitable housing accommodation for a stableman free of cost, but if proper housing accommodation is provided for a stableman and his wife and family, and they elect to live there, the employer shall be entitled to charge a rent not exceeding half the rent a similar house in that locality would readily let at not exceeding ten shillings a week.

(c) Stablemen shall, if required, generally speaking, to work continuously seven days in the week, be allowed one week's holiday on full pay at the expiration of each twelve months' service.

(d) Milk earters shall, if required, generally speaking, to work continuously seven days in the week, be allowed two weeks' holiday on full pay at the expiration of each twelve months' service: Provided that if the cugagement is terminated after the completion of six months' service, but before the completion of twelve months' service, one day's pay shall be allowed for each month of service.

(c) No reduction shall be made from wages when an employee is learning the round.

(f) No junior under nineteen years of age shall be allowed to drive or be in charge of more than one horse.

(g) Employers shall, when engaging employees, state definitely whether such employee is engaged as a weekly or casual hand.

(h) Casual hands shall be notified at the end of the day if their services are not required next day. Failing such notice, a full day's wages shall be paid.

(i) Employers shall notify their employees on the working day preceding a holiday if their services are required next day. Failing such notice the employee shall be entitled to take the holiday and to receive a full week's wages.

(j) Employees shall be provided free by the employer with all shovels and other tools necessary for the loading and unloading of goods or materials on to or from any vchiele.

(k) Each employee, with the exception of milk carters, shall be entitled to holidays, and all carters and drivers shall be entitled to a half-holiday from the hour of 1 p.m. on some working day in the week.

(1) A copy of this Agreement shall be exhibited by each employer where the industry is carried on by being posted or hung up in a place where it is easily accessible to the employees.

(m) Weekly hands ready and willing to work for the whole week, and not dismissed during the week for any reason set out in Clause 12 of this Agreement, shall be entitled to a full week's wage.

(n) Where an employer desires to vary or change his starting and finishing time (in accordance with the provisions of Clause 8 of this Agreement), he shall give two weeks' notice of such variation or change to his employees, and post a notice of the intended change at the depot or yard.

22. Definition.—For the purposes of this Agreement:—

(a) "Junior" shall mean any person under the age of twenty years in receipt of less than the adult wage;
(b) "Casual hand" shall mean an employee competent to do the work he is engaged to do, who is dismissed or refused work without any fault of his own before the expiration of six days from the date he starts work;

(c) "Horse-driver's assistant" and "Motor-driver's assistant" shall mean and include any employee who accompanies the driver to assist in loading, unloading, or delivering;

(d) "Loaders" shall mean and include all employees engaged exclusively in loading or unloading any goods, wares, merchandise, or materials on to or from any vehicle;

(e) "Jinker" shall mean a vehicle with a forecarriage and a bow axle under which the load is slung;

(f) "Boiler truck" shall mean a vehicle on four low wheels, with or without springs, generally used for the carrying of boilers;

(g) "Float" shall mean a vchicle on four wheels, with or without springs, generally used for carrying plate glass or other heavy material;

(h) "Holidays" shall mean the days on which New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Union Pienie Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Anzac Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day are observed;

(i) "Summer" shall mean from the sixteenth day of October to the fourteenth day of April inclusive;

(j) "Winter" shall mean from the fifteenth day of April to the fifteenth day of October inclusive;

(k) "Saturday," for the purpose of this Agree-ment, means either Saturday or such other day as is at present observed as the weekly half-holiday in par-ticular industries or districts;

(1) "Yardmen" shall include all employees not otherwise specified employed in or in connection with a stable

yard or garage; (m) "Head Stablemen" shall mean stablemen ap-pointed to be in charge of or directing the work of other stablemen;

(n) "Horse" shall mean any beast of burden, except bullocks; (o) "Road" shall mean and include any road or

place where goods, merchandise, implements, or materials are being conveyed or drawn by horse or motor power-
