The above wages are payable under a contract of daily service.

4.—District Allowances.

In addition to the wages prescribed in Clause 3 of this Award the following allowances shall be paid for six days per week to workers employed in the districts which are hereinafter respectively described, with the exception of districts contained therein which are situated within a radius of five miles of Kalgoorlie, Coolgardie, Southern Cross and Westonia, viz.:

First District.—Lying South of Kalgoorlie and comprised within lines starting from Kalgoorlie; thence W.S.W. to Woolgangie; then S.E. to Dundas; thence N.E. to a point 10 miles East of Karonie on the Trans-Australian line, and thence back to Kalgoorlie: 1s. per shift extra for those mines within five miles of the railway, and 1s. 6d. per shift for those outside.

Second District.—Starting from Kalgoorlie W.S.W. to Woolgangie; thence N.N.W. to the intersection of the 120 E. meridian with the 30 S. parallel of latitude; thence N.E. by E. to Kookynie; thence back to the point 10 miles East of Karonie on the Trans-Australian line and thence back to Kalgoorlie: 1s. 3d. per shift extra for those mines within five miles of the railway, and 1s. 6d. per shift for those outside.

Third District.—Starting from and including Kookynie, then N. by W. to Kurrajong; thence N.E. to Stone's Soak; thence S.E. to and including Burtville; thence S.W. through Pindinnie to Kookynie: 1s. 6d. per shift extra for those mines within five miles of the railway, and 1s. 9d. per shift for those outside.

Fourth District.—Surrounding Southern Cross within a radius of 30 miles: 1s. per shift extra.

Fifth District.—Comprising all mines not specifically defined in foregoing boundaries but within the area covered by this award: 2s. per shift extra.

5.—Hours.

(a) Forty-eight hours, exclusive of crib time, shall constitute a week's work for surface workers. If more than one shift is worked on the surface the forty-eight hours shall then be inclusive of crib time.

(b) Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work underground, including crib time.

(c) On Mondays to Fridays inclusive eight hours, including crib time, and on Saturdays four hours, excluding crib time, shall comprise the week's work for underground workers.

(d) A day's work on the surface shall be deemed to be satisfied if time of duty be eight and three-quarter hours on five days in each week and four and a quarter hours on one day.

(e) Six hours shall constitute a shift's work in all rises or in sinking specially wet shafts and winzes and for men engaged inside the gas or water spaces of any boiler or flue in cleaning or scraping work and for men engaged in cleaning dust bins or dust flues. In case of boiler cleaners working broken shifts, one hour on the above description of work shall count as one hour and twenty minutes. In the case of Lancashire and Cornish boilers all time necessary for boiler cleaner to come out for a spell shall count as time worked in the boiler.

6.—Overtime.

(a) For work done beyond the hours of duty on any ordinary day, payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Work done on holidays shall be paid at double time, except work in connection with repairs to machinery which has broken down and caused a stoppage of operations.

(c) All work done on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a third, and any work done in excess of eight hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and double time thereafter.

(d) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time due to private arrangement between the employees themselves, or which is necessary for effecting periodical rotation of shifts, or which is owing to a relieving man not coming on at the appointed time. The time for which any worker may be paid at ordinary rates instead of overtime, due to a relieving man not coming on at the proper time, shall not exceed two hours, after the expiration of which overtime rates shall apply for the whole shift.

(e) When computing overtime the district allowances shall not be computed as an addition to the day's pay.

7.—Wet places.

In all wet or hot places eightpence extra per shift shall be paid in addition to the rates set out. This extra payment shall not apply to Subclause (e) of Clause 5.

8.—Dry Crushing Plants.

No dry crushing plants shall be operated unless under such conditions as obviate dust as far as is reasonably practicable. It shall be the duty of the Inspector of Mines to make an examination of all dry crushing plants in his district, once in each month, and at such other times as he may be requested so to do by the Secretary of the Union. He shall examine and report to the State Court of Arbitration, and such report shall be *prima facie* evidence of the facts stated therein.

9.—Piece-workers.

There shall be implied in every contract in which a worker is engaged to perform any kind of work at or for a remuneration other than the rates fixed by this Award:—

(a) Where the engagement is for a period of time such period shall not be determined before the expiration thereof without the written consent of the worker.

(b) Where the engagement is to perform a specified quantity of work, the amount of work to be performed shall not be curtailed by a greater amount than five per cent.

(c) The rate of remuneration agreed upon shall not be decreased during the engagement.

(d) The actual remuneration paid for the work done shall not be less than the amount which the worker would have received for the period of his work if he had been working for that period at the rate of wages fixed by this Award for the work done.

(e) The price of any article supplied by the employer for the use of the worker during the period of his engagement shall not be increased during the period, and shall in no case exceed the cost or price of the article to the employer at the place of supply.

(f) Where the work is to be carried out by a body of workers acting together, the number of workers to be employed shall be specified in the contract. In the event of the specified number of workers not being present during any shift, the employer may provide a substitute in the place of any worker absent, and shall pay such substitute wages at the rate fixed by this Award, or by the contract, whichever shall be the greater, for the work done by him during the time he is so employed as a substitute, and may charge such payment against any money found due under the contract.

(g) Where any workers are employed to work by or with the contractors at a wages remuneration, the employer shall be entitled to pay the amount due to such wage workers for the period of their several employment by the rate fixed by this Award, or the rate fixed by the contract, whichever shall be the greater, and to charge the payment so made against the amount found due to the contractors. A printed copy of these conditions shall be kept exhibited in the Change Room on the mine.

10.—Holidays.

The following shall be holidays: Christmas Day, Easter Monday, and Labour Day. If Christmas Day falls on a Sunday, the following Monday shall be kept.

11.—Casual Workers.

Men employed for less than one week shall be considered casual, and shall receive one shilling per shift above the rates specified for the work.

12.—Drinking Water.

Good drinking water shall be supplied on all levels where men are working, and kept cool and free from dust.

13.—Free Water.

In all districts where free water is supplied by the employer, single men shall get three gallons and married men six gallons per day.

14.—No Reduction.

Any worker who may be at the date of the signing of this Award in receipt of a higher rate of pay for his particular class of work than is herein prescribed shall not suffer by reason of this Award any reduction in the amount which such worker was receiving above the rate prescribed herein.

15.—Mixed Functions.

Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate for two hours in any shift, shall be paid at the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift, provided that such minimum is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he be employed for less than two hours at work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole of the shift.

16.—Change Rooms.

If more than four persons are employed underground in any mine in one shift, sufficient accommodation shall be provided above ground near the principal entrance to the mine, and not in the engine room or boiler house, for enabling the persons employed in the mine to conveniently dry and change their clothes, and in no case shall men change their clothes upon a boiler.

17.—Reduction of Hands.

Should occasion arise to reduce the number of men employed the management, in selecting those to be retained, shall give full weight to the consideration of length of service, and, all things being equal, shall retain those who have been longest in the employ of the company.

18.—Accident Pay.

In the event of an employee meeting with an accident during the shift, or being required to attend to one who has met with an accident, he shall be deemed to have rendered duty during the whole of the shift, and be paid accordingly.

19.—Full Payment for Shift.

(a) After beginning a shift workers shall not be paid less than for a full shift, unless they leave of their own accord, or are dismissed for misconduct. This shall not apply in matters beyond the control of the management.

(b) If before an employee leaves the works at the end of his shift, and because he is not so informed, he attends at the next shift willing to work it, and there is no suitable work which he is allowed to perform, he shall be paid the wages he would have been entitled to if he had worked the shift he was ready and willing to work. This shall not apply in matters beyond the control of the management.

20.—Water Jets.

Provisions of the regulations made under "The Mines Regulation Act, 1906," for the prevention of dust shall be deemed to be incorporated in this Award.

21.—Payment of Wages.

Pay day shall be in accordance with Section 55 of "The Mines Regulation Act, 1906." Any worker leaving or being discharged shall be paid the full amount of wages due to him within one hour of ceasing work, or within one hour of the opening of the mine office, or, if such office was closed at the time of his ceasing work, or if the work done requires to be measured or assessed, within two hours of ceasing work.

22.—Hours in Hot Places.

No person shall be allowed to work for a longer period than six hours in any part of the underground working of a mine when the temperature in that part, ascertained by the reading of the wet bulb thermometer, exceeds 76 degrees Fahrenheit, for a period of four consecutive hours. The reading of the thermometer shall be ascertained at intervals of one half-hour, over four hours, and the average of such readings shall be taken as the temperature during that period. The Inspector of Mines shall take readings when required so to do by any worker, or by the Secretary of the Union. The Manager of the mine shall provide a wet bulb thermometer.

23.—Annual Holiday.

A fortnight's holiday, including twelve working days, on full pay shall be granted once in each year to every worker provided he has worked 298 shifts at ordinary rates of pay, and should he have worked less than 298 such shifts when the said holiday is taken, or at the termination of his employment, he shall be paid for a proportionate number of holidays. Payment for the said holiday shall be at the rate of pay the worker is receiving immediately before the holiday is taken or employment terminated. Provided further, that where the worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct he shall not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this clause. A piece-worker shall be entitled to be paid, when on holiday, the minimum rate for his grade.

24.—Underground Workers.

All men who have to go underground to work, and the bracedmen, shall work the same hours as miners.

25.—Explosives.

Any trucker using explosives where boring is necessary shall be classed as a miner.

26.—Lime.

Lime used in the reduction of ore shall not be mixed in battery bins.

27.—Definitions.

“Wet Places.”—Should any dispute arise as to whether any place is wet, or especially wet, within the meaning of Clause 5, Subclause (e), such dispute shall be referred to a Board constituted of a representative appointed by the Employer and a representative appointed by the Miners' Union of which the worker concerned is a member, with the Warden of the Goldfield in which such mine is situated as Chairman. The decision of the majority of the Board shall be final.

“Timberman” (ordinary).—Timberman shall mean a worker engaged in underground timber work, but a miner timbering his own workings shall not be classed as a timberman.

“Timberman” (shaft).—A shaft timber man shall mean a worker engaged in shaft timbering or timber work, but a miner timbering his own shaft shall not be classed as a shaft timber man.

“Braceman” shall mean any worker in charge of a cage at the mouth of a shaft; if more than one cage, each worker shall be classed as a braceman, but shall not include any worker who may be temporarily assisting a braceman in loading.

“Platman” or “Skipman” shall mean any worker in charge of a cage or skip; if more than one cage or skip, each worker so in charge shall be classed as a platman or skipman.

“Leading Fireman” shall mean a fireman who attends to feed pumps, feed water, gauge glasses, etc., and/or where only one fireman is employed on more than one boiler, he shall be classed as in charge.

“Hot Places” shall mean places underground where the temperature exceeds 76 degrees Fahrenheit using the wet bulb.

Between The Australian Workers' Union (Westralia's Goldfields Mining Branch) Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and The West Australian Goldfields Firewood Supply, Limited, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the Industrial Dispute between the above-mentioned parties.

Award.

1. Area.

The Award shall operate over the land and premises owned or used by The West Australian Goldfields Firewood Supply, Limited, in connection with its operations or incidental thereto.

2. Term.

The term of the Award shall be for three years, and shall take effect from the 1st day of October, 1927.

3. Wages.

(Basic wage at the rate of £4 5s. per week.)

Notwithstanding that the rates above are expressed in weekly amounts, it is hereby declared that the contract of service is a daily contract, subject to Clause 16.

4. Hours for Day Workers.

Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked as follows:—Eight hours on each day, from Monday to Friday inclusive, and four hours on Saturday: Provided, however, that at the employer's option as regards any department of the company's activities the forty-four hours may be worked in five days of 8 hours 48 minutes each, or 40 hours in five days of 8 hours each may be worked one week and the following week 48 hours in six days, at times to be mutually agreed upon: Provided, however, that where functions are so closely associated that one cannot be carried on without the active assistance of the other (as, for instance, blacksmith and blacksmith's striker) this clause shall not apply, and the hours of work shall be as heretofore obtaining, subject to any future Award or indus-

trial Agreement. Should any dispute or question arise under this proviso it shall be referred to the Board hereinafter appointed for decision.

5. Overtime.

All work performed beyond the specified hours of duty on any ordinary day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and double time thereafter. Work done on Sundays and holidays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

6. Sub-contracting.

(a) All the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth as far as applicable to them respectively shall be observed and carried out by the Company themselves, and by their sub-contractors, and also by the workers, anything which herein may be read to the contrary notwithstanding.

(b) For the more effectively securing the due observance and performance of the last preceding clause, and the carrying out of the terms and conditions hereinafter mentioned, the Company, so far as concerns their own acts, and so far as permitted by law, agree that no sub-contractors under them shall be allowed to operate on or use the lines, lands, and/or places under the control of the Company for the purpose of supplying firewood without such person or Company first having agreed in writing to the terms and conditions of this Award.

(c) Before any sub-contractor shall be allowed to commence operations on or use any of the said lines, lands, and/or places controlled by the Company, he shall notify in writing the secretary of the Union whose members are affected that such sub-contractor has agreed to writing to the terms and conditions of this Award.

7. Holidays.

The following shall be holidays:—Christmas Day, Labour Day, and Easter Monday.

8. Annual Holidays.

A fortnight's holiday on full pay shall be granted once in each year to every worker provided he has worked on 298 working days at ordinary rates of pay, and should he have worked on less than 298 working days when the said holiday is taken or at the termination of his employment he shall be paid for or allowed a proportionate number of holidays. Payment for the said holiday shall be at the rate of pay the worker is receiving immediately before the holiday is taken or employment terminated: Provided, further, that where the worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct, he shall not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this clause.

Piece-workers shall be entitled to be paid, when on holiday, the minimum rate for their grade.

9. Stores and Supplies.

The Company shall, during the currency of this Award, sell stores and supplies to the workers at Kalgoorlie cash prices, such prices to be revised from time to time by the representative of the workers and the Head Storekeeper on behalf of the Company on the basis of information obtained by them from the Traders' Association at Kalgoorlie, and the principal business firms of Kalgoorlie. Meat prices to be similarly regulated and revised on the basis of the cash prices as obtained from the principal butchers of Kalgoorlie.

10. Feeder.

(a) Where 12 or more horses are in any camp a feeder shall be employed.

(b) Where the number of horses is more than two and less than 12 a leading driver shall be employed for the purpose at the rate of £5 15s. per week on a daily contract of service.

11. Water.

Good drinking water shall be supplied free to all workers, and in the case of bush workers shall be delivered into tanks along the line where the men are working, and in no case shall the distance between each tank be more than half a mile.

12. Piece-work.

(a) Where workers are employed to work at piece-work, the rates shall be in accordance with the attached schedule, but in no case shall payment be less than they would have received had they been working under a contract of daily service at the rates fixed in Clauses 3 or 23 hereof (overtime, if any, not being included): Provided, however, that in the case of a worker who has not had three months' experience, the minimum rate

shall be such as may be mutually agreed upon between the representative of the Union and the Bush Boss in each case, and in the event of their disagreement may be referred to the Resident Magistrate for the district. Each such inexperienced worker shall, during his period of probation, be deemed to be an apprentice. At the end of each period of six months the Company shall furnish the Registrar with a return showing the number of workers employed under this proviso and the wages and/or other payments made to each.

(b) For the purpose of ascertaining whether each worker is receiving less than the minimum rate under the preceding subclause, the total earnings of such piece-worker for the period of the last preceding two months shall be averaged.

13. General Conditions of Piece-work.

(a) Except in the case of wheel or curve blocks, the minimum frontage shall be two chains for each man in any one party, with a maximum frontage of six chains, irrespective of the number of men in the party. In the case of double banking the original cutter shall have the choice of ends.

(b) Cutting or splitting shall be left to the option of the cutters so that they shall not be idle whilst firewood is being carted from the back of their blocks.

(c) When a team or teams are carting wood for cutters who have cut out their blocks, such team or teams shall not be withdrawn until all the firewood of the cutter has been cleaned up.

(d) If two or more parties of cutters require blocks at the same time, they shall draw lots for precedence and the Bush Boss shall conduct the drawing and measure out the blocks and distribute them between the cutters. Subject to the order of drawing, cutters shall be supplied with new blocks as soon as they have cut out their old blocks, provided their services be required. No cutter shall take a block on his own authority.

(e) In the event of trees being unsuitable to cutters, such trees need not be felled. If a dispute arises as to what constitutes unsuitable trees, the Bush Boss and the workers' representative shall decide the question. If they cannot agree the trees in dispute shall be felled and cut and loaded by the cutter at the rate of two shillings per hour.

(f) Camps shall be placed so that cutters shall not have to walk more than a mile to the front of the block where they are working. In the case of large blocks tanks shall be placed so that the water shall be available within 1½ miles from where the cutters are working.

(g) Wood shall be trucked within five weeks from the time the blocks are cleaned up and, so far as possible, in the order in which they were carted.

(h) (i) Wood burnt on the line shall be paid for at 7s. per load for green wood and 8s. per load for dry wood to the woodcutters, and at the rate of 1s. per load for green wood and 1s. 3d. per load for dry wood to the drivers.

(ii) Wood burnt on trucks shall be paid for at tonnage rates based on the average weight of the rake.

(i) Wood belonging to each cutter or party to be loaded into trucks separately as far as practicable, except when cleaning up the line.

(j) Cutters shall peg their blocks from a point to a line as directed by the Bush Boss and the Company shall clear the tip.

(k) Cutters who are desirous of leaving their blocks shall give the Company notice, and their wood shall be trucked and paid for within four days after carting, and payment forwarded, when necessary, by registered letter to any address left by the worker. This shall also apply to cutters who have severed their connection with the Company.

(l) Cutters may obtain advances in cash or stores from the Company up to 75 per cent. of the estimated value of the sun coming to them for wood lying out on their blocks, or on the line; the value of such stores or supplies shall be taken as payment or part payment for any such firewood.

(m) (i) The wood shall be cut in accordance with the following extracts from the mine specifications, viz., the Company shall supply firewood of locally grown timber, other than black oak, in lengths of 5ft. with a diameter, if unsplit, of not more than 10 inches nor less than 3 inches at either end, but if the firewood exceeds 10 inches at both ends but does not exceed 12 inches at both ends, the same shall be split in half, and should the firewood exceed 12 inches at both ends shall be split in four pieces.

(ii) All cutting shall be done in a face either from the back of the block inwards or from the front outwards. All suitable timber shall be cut into firewood lengths and sizes as specified herein.

(iii) In the event of the cutter having unsplitable logs on hand, the price for same shall be arranged between the Bush Boss and the workers' representative, who shall also decide, if necessary, the question of whether any log is unsplitable or not.

(n) (i) Drays shall be supplied to clean up blocks as soon as possible after they have been cut out. If cutters are idle for more than one day whilst waiting for drays or to shift camp, the Company shall find work for such cutters for which they shall be paid at the rate of 16s. 6/11d. per day of eight hours. In the event of the Company being unable to find work for such cutters, the cutters shall nevertheless be entitled to receive 16s. 6/11d. per day of eight hours for each day thus kept waiting for drays or to shift camp after the expiry of the first 24 hours.

(ii) Cutters shall be supplied with two teams if carting beyond a mile, provided the block is cut out satisfactorily.

(iii) In the event of cutters being required to walk more than three miles to load wood they shall receive an extra 1s. 2d. per day for each additional mile or part of a mile over three. If called out to load on Sundays cutters shall be allowed wages at double the ordinary rates.

(iv) Woodcutters in culled bush shall be paid at the rate of 3d. per ton extra. Culled bush shall mean any block adjacent to a Government railway line from which mining firewood has previously been cut and removed by contractors or others.

(o) Engine wood cutters shall have their blocks cleaned up at least once per month.

(p) Horse-drivers' camp shall be so situated that the drivers shall not have to travel more than one mile from the camp to the front of the block.

(q) (i) Facilities shall be provided for watering horses at crib time on the job.

(ii) If drivers are required to travel more than a quarter of a mile from the front of the block to water their horses at crib time, travelling time to be paid both ways at the rate of twenty minutes to the mile.

(r) The cutter shall place his wood in heaps convenient for the driver.

(s) Horses shall be supplied to the drivers in a fit condition to do the work.

(t) Tips to be cleared and levelled by the Company.

(u) The Company shall provide a sufficient number of trucks for loaders. For any time lost owing to an insufficiency of trucks, loaders shall be paid waiting time at the rate of 2s. per hour, and the Check Clerk shall keep an account of the time so lost, but this clause shall not apply in the case of a breakdown or for any other cause beyond the control of the Company.

(v) A van or truck shall be attached to trains to bring loaders home from work.

(w) Loaders prevented from loading by wet weather shall be returned to the home camp as early as possible.

(x) Loaders shall not travel more than six miles from the camp to the place of working.

(y) The Company shall deliver all stores required three times per week. Present arrangements for delivery to camps shall continue. In any place where stores are left at or near the railway line to be taken delivery of by the workers, a suitable safe or other receptacle shall be provided for the reception and protection of such stores.

(z) Loads shall be tipped not closer to the nearest rail than 3 feet and not further away from the said nearest rail than 18 feet.

14. Mixed Functions.

Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate shall be paid at the rate of such work for the whole of that shift.

15. Casuals.

All men not employed for the full working week shall be considered casuals and shall receive 10 per cent. in addition to the rate specified. This clause shall not apply to piece-workers.

16. Full Payment for Shift.

(a) After beginning a shift a worker shall not be paid for less than a full shift unless he leaves work of his own accord or is dismissed for misconduct.

(b) If before an employee leaves the works at the end of his shift he is not informed that his services are

not required, and because he is not so informed he attends at the next shift willing to work it, and there is not suitable work which he is allowed to perform, he shall be paid the wages he would have been entitled to as if he had worked the shift he was willing to work. This shall not apply in matters beyond the control of the management.

17. Payment of Wages.

Pay day for day workers shall be at least once every month not later than the 12th. Any worker leaving or being discharged shall be paid the full amount of wages due to him within one hour from the time of his application at the Company's office during office hours.

18. New Classes of Labour.

Should men be employed on a class of labour not specified in the schedule, the amount of wages to be paid for that class of work shall be mutually arranged between the Company and the Union.

19. Existing Customs.

All existing customs and conditions prevailing at the time of this Award, and not altered by this Award, shall not be varied unless by mutual consent of the parties thereto, and the workers and the Company shall not be deprived of any privileges or rights hitherto enjoyed, nor shall any new conditions detrimental to the interests of either of the parties be imposed unless specifically mentioned herein.

20. Settlement of Disputes.

Any minor dispute arising as to the working of any portion of this Award, same to be referred to a Board consisting of a representative of the Australian Workers' Union and the Company. Should they be unable to agree, they shall refer the matter to an independent chairman for settlement, such person to have a practical working knowledge of the work in dispute. In the event of the parties being unable to agree as to the chairman to be appointed, the Industrial Magistrate at Kalgoorlie shall be the chairman.

21. Weighing of Wood.

The Company shall cart the wood to the railway line and load it into wagons. Wagons shall be taken across the weighbridge and weighed in the presence of the workers' representative. The weight then ascertained shall be taken as final. Delivery between the cutters and the Company shall be completed when the wood has passed the weighbridge and the weight has been ascertained unless otherwise agreed to.

22. Spark Arrestors.

In order to safeguard the wood from being burnt, the Company shall employ men as spark arrestors.

23. Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum rate prescribed by this Award may be paid such lesser rate as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the employer and the secretary of the Union, or, failing such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the Union stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate, upon the application of such worker, after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period, until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the Union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

24. First Aid.

The Company shall provide at Kurrawang and at each Main Camp, first aid equipment, and keep same fully and efficiently supplied. The Company shall also, wherever it may be done without loss or expense or undue

interference with its operations, facilitate the efforts of its workers to acquire a knowledge of first aid and ambulance work.
