WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets for a term of twelve months as from the 1st day of September, 1927.

Moore River (the whole), situate about 45 miles North of Fremantle.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council, held in the Executive Council Chambers, Perth, on the 10th day of August, 1927 the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

The Road Districts Act, 1919.

Capel Road District—Alteration of Boundaries with the Preston and Sussex Road Districts.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1307/26.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council sever any portion of a Road District and annex it to an existing Road District: And whereas it is desirable to sever portions of the Preston and Sussex Road Districts and annex them to the Capel Road District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby—

- (1) sever that portion of the Preston Road District as described in Schedule "A" hereto, and annex it to the Capel Road District;
- (2) sever that portion of the Sussex Road District, as described in Schedule "B" hereto, and annex it to the Capel Road District.

Schedule "A."

Transfer of Territory from the Preston Road District.

All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing on the present district boundary on the South boundary of Boyanup A.A. Lot 217 and extending East along part of the said South boundary and part of the South boundary of Lot 215 to the production North of the East boundary of Wellington Location 725; thence South along the said production to the North-East corner of Location 725 aforesaid, and along its North and West boundaries, part of the Southern boundary of Location 724, the West boundary of Location 594, a West and a North boundary of Location 2363 to rejoin the present district boundary; thence Northward along said district boundary to the starting point.

Schedule "B."

Transfer of Territory from the Sussex Road District.

All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing on the present district boundary at the South-West corner of Wellington Location 103 and extending Eastward and Southward along said district boundary to an East and West line passing through the intersection of the North-Eastern side of Road No. 4630 with the East boundary of Location 2716; thence West along part of said East and West line to again intersect the present district boundary; thence Northward along said district boundary to the starting point.

THE TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-26.

West Arthur Road Board.

The West Arthur Road Board, pursuant to an Order in Council, under Section 43 of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," and in exercise of the power thereby conferred, doth hereby make the following By-law, to have effect within the West Arthur Road District:—

The passage of any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic over those portions of the Coolikan Road, William Road, Duranillin-Darkan Road, Capercup North Road, Capercup South Road, Capercup South-West Road, Bokal North Road, Bokal South Road, Bokal-Darkan Road, Cordering South Road, Duranillin-Moodiarrup Road, Duranillin-Darkan Road, Duranillin South Road, Dardadine South-East Road, Moodiarrup-Preston Road, Darkan-Collie Road, Bulding North-West Road within the West Arthur Road District is prohibited during such period or periods as the Board may deem necessary.

For the purposes of this By-law "heavy traffic" shall be as defined by Regulation 149, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th day of September, 1924.

Any person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding £20.

THE TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-26.
Darling Range Road Board.

The Darling Range Road Board, pursuant to an Order in Council under Section 43 of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," and in exercise of the power thereby conferred, doth hereby make the following By-law to have effect within the Darling Range Road District:—

The passage of any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic over Hale Road, Lewis Road, Watsonia Road, Albina Road, Gavour Road, Mead Road, George Road, Zamia Road, Lenore Road, Hillside Crescent within the Darling Range Road District is prohibited.

For the purpose of this By-law "Heavy traffic" means the traffic of all vehicles engaged in the carriage of any of the following:—sawed timber, split timber, firewood, firewood, bricks, stone, gravel, salt, lime, cement, farm produce, or other material in bulk, and the traffic of any vehicle the weight thereof including any load exceeds 10 cwt. per wheel, both inclusive.

Any person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding £20.

CARPENTERS AND JOINERS (METROPOLITAN).

(Registered 9th August, 1927.)

No. 17 of 1927.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this twentieth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, between The Master Builders and Contractors' Association Industrial Union of Employers; Millars' Timber and Trading Company, Limited; A. Douglas Jones and Company, Limited; Mount Lyell Chemical Works, and Cuming, Smith, and Company Proprietary, Limited (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the one part, and the Perth (City Amalgamated Society of Carpenters and Joiners of Australia Industrial Union of Workers (Perth Branch), (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part, witnesseth, that for the considerations hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1. Wages.—Basic wage—at the rate of £4 5s. per week.

Minimum wage.—The minimum rate of wage payable to any carpenter or joiner shall be:—

2. When employed on building construction other than the abovenamed ..	2 9

The above rate of 2s. 9d. per hour for workers classified under subclause 2 hereof shall be inclusive of holiday and tool allowances and no further claim shall be made by the Union or any such worker for such allowances.

Journeymen carpenters and journeymen joiners, including shop or mill carpenters and joiners, when working in dust-laden atmosphere caused by the use of materials for insulating deafening or pugging work (as for instance pumice, charcoal, silicate of cotton, or any other substitute) or working on insulating work in an average temperature of forty-five degrees or under, shall be paid not less than threepence per hour in addition to the rate prescribed.

In chemical and manure works journeymen carpenters and journeymen joiners engaged on all repairs and renewals on superphosphate mixing plants and pyrites furnaces shall receive one and one half-pence per hour additional to the rate prescribed.

2. Casual Employees.—Any employee who is employed for a period of one week or less, exclusive of hours of overtime worked, shall be classed as a casual employee and shall be paid threepence per hour extra for the time employed: Provided that this clause shall not apply in the case of a worker dismissed for misconduct or incompetence or owing to weather conditions.

3. Leading Hands.—An employee who is in charge in a shop or on a job of four or more journeymen, and a journeyman setting out work on a job or in the mill for four or more journeymen, shall be deemed a leading hand and shall be entitled to receive one shilling and sixpence per day additional to the rate prescribed in Clause 1 hereof.

4. Country Work.—When any worker is sent by his employer or is engaged by his employer to go to a job at such a distance that he cannot return to his home each night, unless the employer shall provide board and lodging, he shall be paid in addition to his regular wages 6s. per day for the first seven days and 30s. per week thereafter. The employer shall pay all fares and travelling time: Provided that such travelling time shall be limited to eight hours in any one day. The employer shall also provide free transport for the employee's tools.

5. Hours.—Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work. Such hours shall be worked as follows:—On the first five days of the week, between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., and on Saturdays between 8 a.m. and 11.45 a.m.: Provided that the lunch interval on each Friday shall be restricted to forty-five minutes.

6. Overtime.—(a) All work performed after the usual time for ceasing duty shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and double time thereafter. Any employee who is called upon to work overtime for more than two hours without receiving

notice of such overtime on the previous day shall be paid an allowance of two shillings for a meal, or shall be supplied by the employer with a reasonable meal in lieu of such payment. Any employee who has left the premises in which he is employed and is recalled to work after the usual ceasing time for less than one hour, shall receive payment for one hour at overtime rates. If an employer requires an employee to work during the usual meal time, he shall allow to such employee a period equal to the usual meal time for the purpose of having his meal. For all work done at the request of the employer after 12.30 p.m. by an employee who has not had the usual time allowed for a meal, and for all work done at the request of the employer before the expiration of the usual meal time, the employer shall pay double time.

(b) All work performed on Sunday and the holidays recited in Clause 7 shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

7. Holidays.—Workers referred to in Clause 1, Sub-clause 1 (a) and 1 (b) only shall be entitled to the following paid holidays:—

Christmas Day, Boxing Day, the three working days ensuing next after Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Picnic Day (approximately the first Monday in November): Provided also, that where an employee's employment is terminated during the course of a calendar year, his employer shall pay to him one day's wages for each calendar month of his service in lieu of the holidays to which he would be entitled under this clause and has not received. In the event of an employee being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such holidays are not equal to the holidays given to the other employees he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other employees of such employer are on holidays on full pay. Where any specified holiday falls on Sunday the following Monday shall be observed in lieu thereof. The provisions of this clause and of Subclause (a) of Clause 6 preceding shall apply to apprentices.

8. Travelling Time.—During the hours of work all travelling time from and to the employer's place of business, or from one job to another, shall be paid for by the employer at ordinary rates. The employer shall pay all fares in connection with such travelling.

9. Payment of Wages.—When a worker is discharged at or before the usual pay time he shall then be paid all wages due to him. Payment of wages shall be made on or before Friday of each week within fifteen minutes of the usual time for ceasing work. An employer shall not keep more than one day's pay in hand.

10. Safe Keeping of Tools.—The employer shall provide a place for the storing and safe keeping of his employees' tools when not in use.

11. Provision of Appliances.—The employer shall provide the following tools when they are required on the job:—dogs and cramps of all descriptions, bars of all descriptions, augers of all sizes, bits not ordinarily used in a brace, all hammers except claw hammers, glue pots and brushes, dowel plates, trammels, hand and thumb screws, soldering irons and spanners from three-quarters of an inch and upwards. The employer shall provide on all jobs suitable sanitary conveniences and boiling water ready for meal times where it is necessary.

12. Employee presenting himself and not engaged.—When notice is given to an employee by his employer or his responsible representative to present himself for work, and he attends where so directed and his services are not required for reasons other than those due to weather conditions, such employee shall be paid five shillings in addition to any expenses necessarily incurred in travelling to and from the job.

13. Grinding Time.—When an employee, who has been employed for six consecutive working days is discharged, he shall be allowed two hours for grinding tools, or shall receive two hours' pay in lieu thereof. The employer shall provide for the use of his employees a suitable grinding stone on any job where such grindstone is reasonably necessary, together with the required power (hand or driven) for turning same, provided that the necessary power or labour is available.

14. Interviewing Workers.—The Secretary or any duly authorised official of the Union shall not be prevented by any employer from visiting and conversing during meal times with the members of the Union on any job or in any shop.

15. Record Book.—The employer shall make and keep a record showing the name of each worker and the hours worked by and the amount paid to each worker. Such record shall be signed by the worker, and shall be open for inspection by the representative of the Union during working hours.

16. Piece-work.—A worker employed on piece-work shall be paid at least the minimum rate of wages.

17. Under-rate Workers.—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer, and in default of such agreement being reached within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the Union stating his desire that such wage shall be agreed upon, such wage shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate, upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said Secretary, who shall, if he so desire, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the Secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof and after the expiration of the said period, until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said Secretary in the manner prescribed. The Secretary of the Union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

18. Posting Notices.—No employer shall prevent an official of the organisation at any time from posting a copy of this Award, or any notice of the organisation not exceeding fourteen inches by nine inches in a suitable place on any job.

19. Definition.—The term "Carpenter and Joiner" shall mean an employee engaged upon the erection, repair, ornamentation, or any form of constructional work, as well as the making, preparing, and fixing of all necessary woodwork and fittings in connection therewith, including metal shop fronts and fittings.

20. Apprentices.—(a) In this Agreement the term "Apprentice" means an apprentice duly registered with the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause, and the term "Probationer" means a person working as apprentice on probation of whose probationary period notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause: Provided that an apprentice or probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the period of fourteen days allowed for registration.

(b) Any employer hereafter taking a probationer or an apprentice shall within fourteen days thereafter duly register such probationer or apprentice by giving notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court in the prescribed forms.

(c) If at the date of this Agreement any employer is employing any person as an apprentice or a probationer who has not been duly registered as such he shall register such apprentice or probationer within fourteen days thereafter.

(d) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to every two or fraction of two journeymen employed by him.

(e) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time the number of journeymen employed shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the six months immediately preceding such time.

(f) The term of apprenticeship shall be five years. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful. Such probationary period shall be deemed portion of the period of apprenticeship.

(g) (1) Should any employer from any cause whatsoever be unable to carry out his obligations to his apprentice, he shall be allowed, with the consent of the Union and the apprentice and the parent or guardian

of the apprentice, to transfer the apprentice to another employer, who shall thereupon be bound by the covenants, conditions, and stipulations of the agreement of apprenticeship and of this Agreement and be held to indemnify the former employer from all actions, claims, and demands in respect of same. The agreement of apprenticeship shall be endorsed to this effect, and signed by the new employer and the other parties thereto.

(2) It shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Registrar of the date of such transfer and such particulars thereof as may be required.

(h) The following provisions shall apply in respect of all apprenticeships:—

(1) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this Agreement, and shall, subject to the provisions of Subclause (o), pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.

(2) At the end of the period of apprenticeship, the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate in the prescribed form to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice, he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the rate of wages prescribed by this Agreement, according to the total length of time served and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of such transfer in the form prescribed. It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall nevertheless give him a certificate for the time actually served.

(3) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.

(4) Before an apprentice employed under a registered agreement is discharged by the employer for alleged misconduct, the registration of the agreement of apprenticeship shall first have been cancelled by order of the Court.

(5) It shall be provided in every agreement of apprenticeship that technical instruction of the apprentice, when available, shall be at the employer's expense and shall be in the employer's time, except in places when such instruction is given after the ordinary working hours.

(6) It shall be provided in every agreement of apprenticeship that in the event of the apprentice in the opinion of the examiners not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense to enable such apprentice to reach the necessary standard.

(i) The minimum wage payable to an apprentice shall be:—

(j) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners hereinafter constituted once in each year of his service when called upon by the Clerk of the Court so to do, and shall in each year of his apprenticeship attend at the Technical School the classes for instruction in the trade covered by this Agreement.

(k) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at such place as shall be

from time to time appointed by the Clerk of the Court, and it shall be the duty of each employer to supply such necessary material and machinery as may be required and in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination.

(1) The examination will be held in the month of November in each year. The Board of Examiners shall consist of one person skilled in the trade to be nominated by the worker's Union, one person skilled in the trade to be nominated by the employers, and one person to be nominated by the Director of Education, or, failing such nomination or nominations, such person or persons as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. The examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.

(m) The examiners shall report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination.

(n) The Clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate the result of his examination, and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing in any year in accordance with the scale set forth in Subclause (i) hereof from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners at the examination for that year referred to in Subclause (1), or (until he has completed the carpentry course) fails to obtain from the Technical School a certificate that he has during the year passed an annual examination in carpentry at the school. The employer shall pay the fees payable to the Technical School.

(o) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima facie* guilty of a breach of this Agreement under Section 97 of the Act, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.

(p) Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.

(q) The forms referred to in this clause or prescribed therein shall be such as are provided by the Court.

21. Area.—This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of fourteen miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

22. Term.—This Agreement shall operate as from the day of the date hereof, and shall continue in force for a period of three years, subject to the right of either party to apply to the Court of Arbitration at any time after the expiration of twelve months from such date, and at the end of any succeeding twelve months from the date of any such application to amend this Agreement.

23. The Industrial Agreement No. 15/1923, dated the thirteenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and subsequent amendments thereof numbered 3/1923 and 1/1926, dated the third day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and the sixth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six respectively, are hereby, and with the leave of the Court duly obtained, cancelled as from the date hereof.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 17 of 1926.

Between Metropolitan Soap and Candle Manufacturers Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and W. H. Burford & Sons, Ltd., and J. Kitchen & Sons Proprietary, Ltd., Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the Industrial Dispute between the above-mentioned parties.

Award.

1.—Area.

This Award shall apply over the area comprised within a radius of fifteen miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

2.—Term.

This Award shall continue in force for a period of three years.

3.—Hours.

Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked between the hours of 7.30 a.m. to 12 noon and 12.43 p.m. to 4.55 p.m. on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, and between 7.30 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays: Provided, however, that, upon any competent wage-fixing authority prescribing for Adelaide or Melbourne the weekly hours of work less than 48 per week, the hours to be worked under this clause shall be reduced so as to coincide with the hours so prescribed, and the apportionment of the weekly hours for each day shall be such as may be agreed upon between the employers and the Union, or, in the absence of such agreement, left to the President of the Court of Arbitration for determination.

4.—Overtime.

(a) For all work done beyond the hours of duty on any week day other than a holiday, payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Work done on Sunday, Boxing Day, Good Friday, Christmas Day, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, or Labour Day shall be paid for at double time rates.

5.—Holidays.

The following days, or days observed in lieu thereof, shall be holidays, and no deduction shall be made from the wages of the workers for such holidays:—Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Labour Day.

As to any other public holiday, the employer may make a deduction from the wages of any worker in respect of same if no work is done on such day.

6.—Annual Leave.

A holiday of one week on full pay shall be granted to each worker on the completion of each year of service. A worker not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu thereof in proportion to his length of service.

7.—Change and Mess Room.

A suitable change and mess room shall be provided for in all establishments.

8.—Time and Wages Book.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a book containing the name of each of his workers to whom this Award applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each such worker, and the time during which each such worker has been employed. Such book shall be open for inspection by a representative of the Union during all working hours.

9.—First Aid Equipment.

Adequate first aid equipment shall be provided in all establishments.

10.—Contract of Service.

(a) All workers other than casuals shall be engaged and paid by the week, and one week's notice shall be given by either party: Provided, however, that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct: Provided, further, that any worker not attending for duty will lose his pay for the actual time lost, unless he produces evidence satisfactory to the employer that his non-attendance was due to personal ill-health or accident necessitating such absence, but he shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the grounds of personal ill-health or accident for more than six days in each year.

(b) The year referred to in the preceding clause begins on the date on which this Award comes into force, and the said six days may be apportioned accordingly.

11.—Wages.

Casual Labour.—Casual hand shall mean a worker whose services are terminated by the employer within one week of his being engaged, and such casual worker shall be paid as follows:—

Adults—3d. per hour above the rates specified on an hourly basis.

Juniors—1½d. per hour above the rates specified on an hourly basis.

Juniors.—No junior under the age of seventeen years shall be required to lift packages of a greater weight than thirty pounds.

12.—Higher Duties.

A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Award than that which he usually performs shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate while so employed.

13.—Aged and Infirm Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the Union stating his desire that such lesser wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate upon the application of such worker, after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and, after the expiration of the said period, until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the Union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

14.—No reduction in Wages.

Provided that nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Award was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum rate prescribed for his class of work.
