5. License for hawkers shall be in the Form "G" in the schedule, and for stalls in the Form "H" in the schedule hereto attached.

6. Every hawker whilst employed in hawking must produce his license upon being required by any constable or officer of the Board, and shall at all times have affixed to some conspicuous part of his cart, barrow, basket, or vehicle a board or plate bearing his name and the words "Licensed Hawker" legibly written thereon in letters not less than one inch in length.

7. No licensed stall shall be placed or allowed to stand in any street or position other than that allowed by the Board and endorsed on such license.

8. No person to whom a hawker's license or stall-holder's license shall have been granted shall lend, transfer, or assign his license, and no person shall borrow or make use of such license granted to a person other than himself.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased, under the provisions of "The Forests Act, 1918," and on the recommendation of the Conservator of Forests, to approve of amendment to the Forest Regulations, 1925, as follows:—

Regulations 46 (a), 46 (b) and 46 (c) (Bee Ranges and Apiary Sites), as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 22nd April, 1927, are hereby repealed and the following Regulations are inserted in lieu thereof:—

Apiary Site Permits.

- 46 (a). A permit for the purpose of bee farming may be granted by the Conservator, subject to such conditions as may be expressed therein, and shall confer on the holder the right to occupy an area of land not exceeding three acres as an apiary site.
- 46 (b). Every applicant for an apiary site permit shall be actively engaged in the occupation of bee farming, and shall have at least twenty-five hives of bees in this State.
- 46 (c). No person shall hold more than four apiary site permits for every fifty hives of bees in his possession.
- 46 (d). No person shall be granted an apiary site permit on Crown Lands within four miles of an apiary site granted to any other person.
- 46 (e). The rental for an apiary site permit shall be two pounds per annum. Such rental shall be payable in advance.
- 46 (f). A deposit of not exceeding twenty pounds may be required by the Conservator before issue or renewal of a permit as a guarantee for the observance and performance of the conditions contained therein.
- 46 (g). Any person who occupies or uses any Crown Lands for the purpose of an apiary site without first obtaining a permit from the Conservator shall be guilty of a forest offence and liable to a penalty of not exceeding fifty pounds.

BARMAIDS AND BARMEN (STATE HOTELS).

(Registered 15/8/27.)

No. 18 of 1927.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this third day of August, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, between Western Australian Barmaids and Barmen's Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Western Australia, being an Industrial Union of Workers duly registered under the provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration

Act, 1912-1925," of the one part, and the Honourable the Chief Secretary of the other part, whereby the said parties mutually agree as follows:—

(1.) This Agreement is based on a basic wage of 85s. per week.

(2.) In this Schedule and unless the context otherwise indicates and without limiting the ordinary meaning of the word "barmaid" or "barman" means any person over the age of twenty-one (21) years employed in the sale of liquor by retail in any hotel licensed under a publican's general license, hotel license, or wine and beer license.

Wages.

(3.) The wages of a barmaid or barman shall be £5 3s. per week without board and lodging, and shall be paid weekly. Where it is deemed necessary by the Executive or Board of Reference to grant a permit to board and reside on the premises, the amount to be deducted for same shall not exceed £1 5s.

(4.) Except as hereinafter provided no barmaid or barman shall board or reside upon the licensed premises of the employer by whom she or he is employed.

The above proviso shall not apply to:—

(a) Any barmaid or barman who is the daughter or son of the licensee of the hotel in which she or he is working;

(b) Any employee agreed upon between the General Manager of State Hotels and the Secretary of the Union.

In the event of a disagreement the dispute to be determined by the Industrial Magistrate of the district concerned.

(5.) All work done in excess of forty-eight (48) hours in any one week shall be paid for at the rate of time and a third. Each day's work shall be not more than eight (8) hours per day, with the exception of two days per week, on which nine (9) hours per day shall be worked, if so required.

This clause is subject to revision at any time after three (3) months of the signing of this Agreement.

Christmas Day, Good Friday, Anzac Day, Sunday, and Labour Day.

(6.) All work done on Christmas Day, Good Friday, Anzac Day, Sunday, or Labour Day shall be paid for at the rate of double an ordinary day's pay (*i.e.*, 4s. 3d. per hour).

Uniform.

(7.) Where the employers require a barmaid or barman to wear a uniform whilst at work the employer shall supply same, and also maintain same in a reasonable state of cleanliness. Should the washing of the white coats be done by arrangement at the expense of the barman, the sum of three shillings shall be provided by the employer per week to defray such cost.

Meal Time.

(8.) A barmaid or barman shall be allowed one hour between the hours of twelve noon and two o'clock, and on every evening when required to work after six o'clock one hour between the hours of five and seven o'clock for tea.

Weekly Half-holiday and Late Nights.

(9.) A barmaid or barman shall not be called upon to work later than six-thirty (6.30) p.m. on more than four nights per week, inclusive of the weekly half-holiday.

Each barmaid or barman shall be allowed one half-holiday per week, to start not later than one (1) o'clock.

Holidays and Annual Leave.

(10.) A barmaid or barman shall be entitled to two weeks' leave on full pay after the expiration of each twelve (12) months' service: provided that where a barmaid or barman is usually called upon to perform Sunday work he or she shall be allowed three weeks' annual leave on full pay. A barmaid or barman whose services have been terminated before twelve (12) months have expired shall be entitled to payment in lieu of holidays at the rate of one-twelfth of the holiday allowance for each completed month of service.

(12.) This Agreement shall operate for a period of three (3) years from its execution. Each party may, after twelve (12) months from the date of execution, apply to amend, alter, or revise the same.

Each employer shall keep or cause to be kept at his business premises record books, in which shall be entered the name of each worker, the time each worker commences and ceases work each day, the total number of hours and the amount of overtime worked, the time worked on a Christmas Day, Good Friday, Sunday, and Labour Day, and the amount of wages and overtime paid and the worker's signature for the same. The workers and the employer shall be jointly responsible for the proper posting of the record book weekly. Such record books shall be so kept as to be open to and available for inspection by an accredited representative of the Union during all reasonable hours, but not at such hours as may unduly interfere with the management of the business.

Schedule of Wages and Working Conditions and Roster.

(14.) Each employer shall keep on some portion of his business premises a copy of this Agreement where it shall be open to the inspection of the worker at all reasonable times.

Area.

(15.) This Agreement shall apply to the Hotels under the jurisdiction of the Chief Secretary.
