WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The Vermin Act, 1918," it is enacted that "Vermin" means and includes any animal or bird mentioned in the Third Schedule to this Act, and such other animals or birds the names of which the Governor may by Proclamation add to the said schedule, and also that any Proclamation whereby the names of other animals or birds are added to the Third Schedule may be restricted in its operation to any portion of the State to be defined by the Proclamation: And whereas it is deemed expedient to add the names of animals known as Brush Kangaroos to the Third Schedule, but to restrict this Proclamation in its operation to Katanning Vermin District: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby add to the said Third Schedule of the said Act the name of animals known as Brush Kangaroos for the purposes of the said Act, but this Proclamation shall be restricted in its operation to that portion of the State constituted and known as Katanning Vermin District for the purposes of the said Act.

Industrial Agreement.

No. 32 of 1927.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-25," this 3rd day of October, 1927, between the West Australian Timber Workers' Industrial Union of Workers (South-West Land Division), of the one part, and the Honourable Alexander McCallum, M.L.A., Minister for Works, on behalf of the State Government, of the other part:

1. All full time wages employees in the service of the Government (except the Government Railways) who are not by Award or Agreement already entitled to long service leave, and who have served continuously for ten or more years after attaining the age of eighteen years, will be entitled under this Agreement, subject as hereinafter provided, to three months' long service leave, to be granted at the convenience of the Department concerned.

2. 5. The qualifying period for the second grant of long service leave to wages employees having more than ten years' continuous service on 1st January, 1927, will, without regard to the grant of the first period of such leave, commence as follows:—

To employees of more than twenty-eight years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st January, 1927.

To employees of more than twenty-two years' service, and of less than twenty-eight years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st July, 1927.

To employees of more than sixteen years' service, and of less than twenty-two years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st July, 1928.

To employees of more than thirteen years' service, and of less than sixteen years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st July, 1929.

To employees of more than ten years' service, and of less than thirteen years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st January, 1930.

To employees of less than ten years' service on 1st January, 1927, but who have completed ten years' service on 1st July, 1930—1st July, 1930.

6. Any public holidays occurring during the period in which an employee is on long service leave will be calculated as portion of the long service leave, and extra days in lieu thereof will not be granted.
