## The Road Districts Act, 1919.

Kondinin Road District-Alteration of Boundaries with Narembeen, Corrigin, and Kulin Road Districts. ORDER IN COUNCIL.
P.W. 368/25.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919,' the Governor may by Order in Council sever any portion of a Road District and annex it to an existing Road District; and whereas it is desirable to:-
(1) sever portion of the Narembeen Road District and annex it to the Kondinin Road District;
(2) sever portion of the Corrigin Road District and annex it to the Kondinin Road District;
(3) sever portion of the Kulin Road Distict and annex it to the Kondinin Road District;
4) sever portion of the Kondinin Road District and annex it to the Narembeen Road District;
(5) sever portion of the Kondinin Road District and annex it to the Kulin Road District:
Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby-
(1) sever that portion of the Narembeen Road District, as described in Schedule "A" hereto and annex it to the Kondinin Road District;
(2) sever that portion of the Corrigin Road District, as described in Schedule ' $B$ ': hereto, and annex it to the Kondinin Road District;
(3) sever that portion of the Kulin Road District, as described in Schedule " C "' hereto, and annex it to the Kondinin Road District;
(4) sever that portion of the Kondinin Road District, as described in Schedule "D"' hereto, and annex it to the Narembeen Road District;
(5) sever that portion of the Koudinin Road District, as described in Schedule "E" hereto, and annex it to the Kulin Road District.

## The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1900. <br> ORDER IN COUNOTL.

M.W.S. $1452 / 27$.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909,' it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works; and whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the adrice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.

## THE ROYAL AGRIOULTURAL SOCIETY ACT, 1926.

## Uniform By-laws made in pursuance of Clause 6 of the Act. <br> Office Bearers of Society.

1. The Office bearers of each Society shall be the members of a Committee, and such Committee shall comprise the Chairman, the Treasurer, and not less than six members, to be elected in pursuance of Rule 18 (hereinafter referred to as the "elected members'").

Every Society shall appoint a Secretary, and such appointment shall be notified to the Royal Agricultural Society by writing under the hand of the Chairman.

## Election of Members.

2. Every candidate for admission into a Society, by giving his name and address to the Secretary, and signing an application form of membership, together with the payment of the yearly subscription, shall be constituted an ordinary member, and shall have all the rights of membership till the end of the current financial year; provided, that when any subseription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company, one member only of such firm or company may exercise the rights and privileges belonging to the same, and may be elected to any office,

Notwithstanding anything herein contained the Secvetary, with the concurrence of the Committee, shall have the right to refund within two weeks any money so received and to refuse to accept any person as a member of the Society.

## Register of Members

3 An alphabetical list of the names of all members of the Society shall always be kept in the office of the Society.

Privileges of Members.
4. The privileges of membership shan consist of power to vote at any general meeting, and also of free admission to the Show Grounds (on production of member's ticket or badge) at any time when any of the Society's shows are being held. The Society may grant any further privileges at its discretion.

## Resignation of Members.

5. The resignation of auy member shall be by writ ten notice to the Secretary; but no such resignation shall relieve any member from payment of any subscription or other moneys due by him to the Society at the time of such resignation, and such subseription or other moneys shall be deemed to be a debt due to the Society and may be recoverable at law.

## Subseription.

6. The annual subscription shall be fixed by the members in general meeting, and shall continne to be payable until altered by any subsequent general meeting. The date of payment thereof shall also be fixed in general meeting, and may be altered from time to time as the members think fit.

## Arrears of Strbscription

7. Any member who shall be six months in arrears in payment of his subseription shall not be entitled to hold or continue to hold any office under By-law 1 hereof or to any privileges of membership.
8. Any member who shall be twelve months in arrears in the payment of his subscription shall be deemed to have resigned his membership, and his name shall be struck off the roll of members. On payment of all arrears of subscriptions he may be reinstated as a member.

## General Meetings.

9. A general meeting of members (six to form a quorum) shall be held during each year, at such time and place as may be appointed by the Committee; such meeting shall-
(a) elect the office bearers of the Sneiety, in aceordance with Rule 18;
(b) elect the Auditor of the Society;
(c) eonsider the ammal report and yearly statement of accounts.
Subject to the provisions of By-laws 15, 17. and 24, the office bearers and Anditor shall be deemed to hold office for one year from the first day of the month following the date of the meeting at which such election takes place.
10. A special general meeting may be called (six to form a quormm at any time by the Secretary, on the direction of the President, or on the requisition of siz members; but no business shall be transacted at any such meeting other than that for which it has been called.
11. The chairman of any general or special meeting shall have a deliberate vote, and in case of equality of votes, a casting rote also. Notice of any gencral or special meeting shall be posted or delivered to members fourteen days at least prior to the time fixed for such meeting.

The accidental omsssion to give notice of any such meeting, or the non-receint of any such notice, shall not invalidate any resolution passed at any such meeting.

How Quastions are in he decided.
12. Subject to the moriso hereinafter contained. all matters (except, the election of office hearers) to be dealt with at general meetings, shall be determined on the voices, unless a division be called for Provided, however, that when a motion or any special husiness or matter is the subject of notice to memhers, one-fourth of the members prosent at any meeting at which the special business or matter is under discussion, or the next nearest number above one-fourth, if a fraction
remains after division of the number of members present, by four, may require discussion of the special business or matter to be postponed to the next anmual meeting (provided such meeting be held not less than one month thereafter), or to a subsequent meeting, to be held not earlier than one month after the meeting at which such postponement takes place nor more than three months thereafter, at which meeting the matter under discussion shall be decided upon the votes then recorded. In the case of an equality of votes, the Chairman shall have an additional or casting vote.

## Management of Society.

13. Subject to these By-laws, the business of each Society shall be managed by the Committee constituted in accordance with By-law 1.
14. The Chairman shall retire ammally, but shall be oligible for re-election
15. Such members of the elected Committee shall retire aunually, as the members in general meeting may from time to time decide, not heing less, however, than one-third, but such retiring members shall be eligible for re-election.
16. The Treasurer shall retire ammally, hut shall be eligible for re-election.
17. Any reputable nerson not being a member of the Committee or any firm of which such person is a partner, shall be eligible to be elected Auritor of the Society. Any such Auditor so apmointed sholl hold such office for one year only, as provided by By-law 9 , but shall he eligible for reelection. In case of any racancy arising in the office of Auditor throngh any canse prior to the date of the annual meeting, such vacancy shall be filled by the Committee. and such person or firm so appointed to fill such vacancy shall hold office until the first day. of the month following the anmal meeting.

## Nomination of Office Bearers.

18. Office bearers of the Societr, who shall be financial members. shall be nominalied prior to or at the annual general meeting.
(a) Should the number reonired and no more be so nominated, the Chairman of the meeting shall declare all candidates elected.
(b) Should the number nominated exceed the number required, a ballot shall be taken during the holding of such meeting.
(c) Should a less number than rednired he nominatod the Committee, at its next meeting, shall fill such vacancies.
(d) Members shall wote in each instance for the re quired number of candidates. and anv voting paper on which are recorded votes for more or less than the reanired number of members for any office or committee shall be informal to that extent. but any such informality shall not affect the legality of the voting naper in instances where rotes for a member or members for other offices or committees are pronerly recorded on the same roting paper.
(o) The Committee shall appoint two scrutineers to assist in the conduct of the ballot.

## Committee

19. Meetings of the Committee shall he held onee furine every month, provided there be business suff. cient to warrant the calling of such meeting-four to form a cuorum. The Secretary shall conrene such mectings by posting or delivering to a ach member of the Committee a notification thereof five dave at least hefore the date fixed for such meeting. and sneh notifieation shall specify the time and place of such meeting. The Choirman may convene a snecial mertion of the Committee at anv time. and in such ease the Secretarr thall give a similar notification to all members at least three davs prior to the meting.
on. The Committee shall have the enutrot and manacement of the income and pxnenditure of the funds of the Societr, and also the rutire monacoment and smerintandence of all the Societr's othor affairs and comeems. and also the amointment and management of its officers and servants.
20. The Chairman shall wreside at all meetinos of the Committee. In the absence of the Chairman. the members nresent shall olect a Chairman from amono th-ir number. The Chairman presiding at ant moetinm shall have a deliberate. and in the mese of muatite of votes, a casting vote also.

## Rescinding Resolutions.

22. No motion, the effect of which if carried would be to reseind any resolntion previously passed by the Committee during the same year, shall be entertained unless notice of intention to move the same shall have been given in writing to the Secretary at least fourteen days prior to the holding of the meeting of the Committee at which it is proposed to move such resolution.

## Special Vacancies.

23. If any of the elected members be absent withont leave for theo consecutive ordmary meetings of the Committee, he shall cease to be an offee bearer.
24. Yacancies in the number of office bearers cansed by death, resignation, absence without leave, or otherwise, and occurring at any time between two annual geacral meetings, shall be notified by the Secretary to the Committee at its next meeting thereafter, and the Secretary shall notify such vacancies in writing to each of the inembers of the Committee not present at such meeting, and all such vacancies shall be filled up by the Conmittee at the following meeting. Any member so appointed shall, previous to sueh appointment, signify to the Secretary his willingness to aceept such appointment, but any person so closen shall retain office only so long as the member in whose place he is appointed would have retaned the same if no vacaney had necurred

Provided, however, that when any such vaconcy has heen filled by the appointment thereto of any office bearer of the Society, as provided by Rale 1, the notification of the next mecting of the Committee to be given in pursuance of Rule 19 shall specify such vacancy and the Committee may at such meeting fill the same.

## secretary

25. The appointment or removal of the Secretary shall be dealt with by the Committee only.

## Sale of Property.

26. The Committee, by the authority of a majority of members present at a general meeting called for the purpose, may sell property of the Society, and may also sell any of the Society's property for the purpose of nayment of the debts of the Society without any such authority; but no sale for the last-menioned purpose shall be mate by the Committee until after a general meeting of the Society shall have been held, which said meeting shall be called by the Committee by cireular at least fourteen days before the date of such meeting, stating the objects of the meeting and the reasons which induce the Committee to propose a sale of the Society's pronerty. and the debts and liabilities which it is proposed shall be paid out of the proceeds of such sale.

## Borrowing Powers.

27. The Committee may, with the sanction of a resolution passed by members in general meeting, or in any special meeting called for the purnose, raise money hy bank overdraft or by the issme of debentures. or by such other means as may be approved of at such meeting, and if necessary may secure the pavment thereof hy any mortgage or charge unon the pronerty of the Societr, or by such other means as the members by snch resolution shall decide.

The notice convening any general or special meting at which it is intended to seek the foregoing power from members shall set out the intention of the Committee to seek such nower, and such motiec shall be nosted or delivered to each member not less than 14 dars before which the meeting is convenca.

## Appeals.

24. The Comeil of the Royal Agricultural Socicty mar horein detemine any appeal by any member or cxhibitor from the decision of any Society, subject to the following conditions, namely:-
(a) The appellant shall within three bays after the decision appealed against has been notified to him, lodge with the Secretary of the Society from whose decision he desires to appeal, a notice in writing of his intention to apneal, stating the ground on which he desires to appeal.
(b) The appellant shall, within seven days after lodging such notice also lodge with the Secretare of 但 Poral Agrienltural Society the sum of $£ 3$ 3s. together with a eopy of such notios of appeal.
(e) On the hearing of the appeal the Council of the Royal Agricultural Society mar-
(i) remit the matter in dispute to be reopened or re-heard by the Committee or the Society from whose decision the appeal is brought; or
(ii) make such order as in its opinion ought to havo been made by sucl Committee, or as in its opinion may be necessary to ensure the determination on the merits of the real question at issue.
(d) On the hearing of the appeal the Comecil of the Royal Agricultural Society may make such order as they may think proper for payment of the costs and expenses of the appeal and with reference to the disposal of the said sum: of $£ 33 \mathrm{~s}$.
(c) Excent by leave of the Comeil of the Royal Agricultura! Society no fresh evidence slatl be adduced on the hearing of any appeal.
(f) The Committee of the Soeiety from whose decision any appeal is brought, shall; immediately after the lodging of notice of such appeal, cause a true copy of the minutes of the meeting at which the decision was arrived at, together with minutes of any evidenee taken, to be sent to the Secectary of the Royal Agricultural Society.

## Disqualifications.

29. The Socretary of any Society which shall have disqualified any member or exhibitor shall, within fourtem dass from the date of such disqualification, notify the same to the Secretary of the Royal Agricultural Society, who shall then notify all societies of such dis. Gualification, together with the reasons for same.
30. Any person who shall have been disqualified by the Royal Agricultural Society, or by any country Socicty, shall not be cligible to become a member of nor exhibitor at any other Society antil such discualification shall have been removed. The Council of the Roya! Agricultural Society shall have power to remove at any time any disqualification or suspension, upon application from the Society originally conerned in the disqualification.

## Shows.

31. Fvery Society shall each vear, on or before a date to be fixed by the Roval Agricultural Society, make written application for a date or dates on which to hold its show or shows, and no show shall be held by such Society on any other date or dates than that or those notified in writing by the Secretary of the Roysil Agrieultural Society.

## Registered List of Judges.

32. Every Society shall forward to the Royal Agriallural Society hetween the 1st Marcl and the 1st May in each year, the names and addresses of such persons as are promared to act as juiges and are approved of hy such Society. From such information an official list of arproved judges will be compiled by the Royal Agricultural Society, and such list will be subject to revision by the Comeil of that Society. No nerson shall. without the consent of the Royal Agricultumi Socicty. be appointed a juder by anv countre Socintr muless lis name appears on the list of juderes publishert for that year by the Royal Agricultural Socicty.

Dismualification of Live Stock.
33. Live stock acceoted at any Agricultural Show held contrary to the rrovisions of "The Royal Agricultural Society Act. 1926," may be disqualified from rommeting at any registered Sociaty's show and the cubibitor mator owner of such live stoek may be disomalifed. Surh disoualifeation may continue during the Reasure of the Royal Agricultuml Society.

Schedule of Prizes.
34. All rooistered Societies shall submit each vear for approval before issue proof schedule of prizes.

Balance Sheet and By-laws.
35. Within three months from the closing of each fuancial year, every Society shall forward to the Royal Agricultural Society a report and balane slieet for the year so closed. and shall with such report and bat once sheet forward a cony of all By-laws nassed during such vear in pursmance of Subsection 2 of Scetion 6 of the said Act.
36. A breach of any of these Br-laws may be ra norted in writing by any momber to the Secretarr of the Royal Agricultural Society, who shall themenpon
be empowered to inquire into such breach and make a report thereon to the Council of the Royal Agricultural societs.

For the purpose of such inquiry the Secretary of the Roval Agricultural Society may inspect the minute looks and records of the Society accused of committing such breach.
37. Any person who takes part in any matter coming within these By-laws shall be held thereby to consent to be bound by them and shall not be entitled to appeal to ary cont beanse of anything done mader their provisions.

By-laws for the Managemont and Use of the Road Board Hall and other Buildings under the Control of the Board.

1. Interpretation clase.-.-In the construction of these By-laws: -
(a) The word "Board" shall menn the Manjimup District Road Bond;
(b) The word "Building" shall mean and include any hall, room, or corridor of any such hall under the control of the Board.
2. Applications for the hire of any building or furuiture shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Board not less than 24 hours before the time that such building or furniture is required, and shall state tho purpose for which the building or fumiture is required.
3. The name and place of abode of the actual responsible person or persons hiring any building or furniture shall be given in the application for the nse of such building or fumiture.
4. The rent of the building or furniture shall be paid with the application, and shall be as set out in the schedule hereunder.
5. The hours for which any building or furniture may be hired shall be:-
(a) Day: 9 o'clock a.m. to 7 o'clock p.m.
(b) Evening: 7 o'clock p.m. to 12 o'elock midnight
(c) Extension of time maty be granted upon pay ment of prescribed fees.
6. The Board may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might oceur during the term of such engagement.
7. The Board reserves the right to refuse to let any building or furniture to any applicant for the hiring of the same, without assigning any reason for such refusal.
8. The Board may at any time cancel any agree ment made for the hiring of any buiding or furniture.
9. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any building or fumiture for the same date and hour, the Board may, withont considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire of such building or funiture shall be granted.
10. The hirer of any building shall comply with the Health Act provisions, Bntertainments Tax Act, and any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such hirings and use of any buildings. If in the opinion of the Board all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts abovementioned, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of the engagement forbid and prevent the use of such building.
11. In the event of the use of any building being forbidden or prevented under the last preceding By-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of such building as if the live had been duly fululled, and the Board shall not be responsible to the hirer for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.
12. No spirituous liquors, wine, ale, beer, porter, cider, or perry shall be brought into or consumed in any building during the term of engagement, except when permitted by the Board in writing.
13. No person shall smoke any tobacco, cigar, cigarette, or objectionable substance, nor strike or otherwise ignite any light in any building during any ball or public entertamment, or at any gathering of persons in the sati building, whether such persons have been admitted by the payment of money or otherwise, except at a banquet or smoke social where those present comprise men only.
14. Dogs, whether under control or otherwise, will not be allowed to enter the building.
15. No person shall, in any part of the building, enter or be-
(a) allowed to enter whilst intoxicated;
(b) be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever;
(c) use profane or improper language;
(d) damage, mark, or doface any wall or other part of the building, Any person who does, permits, or suffers any such damage, shall be liable to pay the cost of such damage in addition to any penalty imposed by these By-laws.
(e) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever in the passage-ways of any building. Any person so doing shall immediately disperse on being requested to do so by the Secretary or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable, whether in uniform or otherwise.
16. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons, nor anything calculated to produce a disturbance, riot, or breach of peace, shall be permitted in any building.
17. The hirer of any building shall be responsible for-
(a) maintaining good order and enforcing these By-laws;
(b) any damage done to the building, fittings, fixtures, furniture, or crockeryware, or other part of the property.
18. The Secretary of the Board or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable, shall be permitted to have free ingress to the building, or any part thereof, at all times during term of engagement, and every facility shall be given them for enforeing these Bylaws.

PHIS Agrement, made in pursuance of "The Thlus. trial Arbitration Aet, 1912.25 ," this third day of Oe. tober 1927, between the Perth City Amaigamated Society of Garpenters and , lomers of Australia Tudustrial Union of Workers, of the one part, and The Ilomonrable Alexander MeCallum, M.L.A., Minister for Works, on behalt of the State Govermment, of the other part.

1. All full time wages employecs in the service of the Govermment (except the Govermment Railways) who are not by Award or Agreement already entitled to long service leave, and who have served continuonsly for ten or more years after attaining the age of eighteen years, will be entitled unfer this Agreement, subject as heremafter provided, to three months" long service leave, to be granted at tho convenience of the Department concerned.
2. Such employees shall be similarly entitled to three months' long service leare for ten years' continuous service after the first period of long service leave; and to a further period of three months for seven years' continuous service after the second poriod of long serviee leave; and thereatter to aturther period of three months' long service lave in respect of each seven years' subsequent continuous service. The words "contmmous service" do not inchle the period daring which an employee is on long service leava
3. Every application for long service leave shall be made in the prescribed form.
4. Every full time wages onployee who, on the 31st day of December, 1926, had been employed contimously for at least ten years shall, upon making application in the prescribed form, be cotitled to a period of three months' leave, such lease to be granted in order of length of serviee as far as may be convenient.
5. The qualitying period for the second grant of long service leave to wages employees having more than ten years' contimuous service on ist fanuary, 1927, will, without regare to the grant ot the first perive of such leave, commence as follows:-

To employees of more than twentyeight years' serviee on 1st January, 1927 -1st January, 1927.
T'o employees of more than twenty two years' serrice, and of loss than twenty-eight years' service, on 1st Jamany, 1927-1st July, 1927.
To employees of more than sixtem yeas' service and of less tham twenty-two gears' service on 1st Jamary, 1927-1st July, 1028.
'Lo cmployes of more than thinteen years' service and of less than sixteen years' service on 1 st Jamary, 1927 -Ist July, 1929.
To employeos of more than ten years service and of less than thirteen yars' service on 1st Jannary, 1927-1st January, 1930.
'To employees of less than ten years' sevice on 1st Jimuary, 1927, but who have completed ten years' service on lst July, $1930-1$ st July, 1930.
6. Any public holidays eceuring during the period in which an cmployec is on long service leave will be calculated as portion of the long service leave, and extma dias in lien thereot will not be granted.
7. Long service leave is ganted solely for recuperative purposes. No employe of the Department is to undertake during long servee leave any form of cmployment for hire or reward without the consent of the Under Secretary for Labour. Contravention of this provision will be followed by dismissal.
8. An conployee dismissed from the service shall not be entitled to payment in respect of loug service leave, other than for leave that had acerued the to him prion to the date of the offence for which he was dismissed.
9. Employees may be paid their wages in atvanee, at their permanent classified mate of pay, for a period equivalent to the leave taken, provided such period does not extend into the next financial year. Any balance may be paid on the 1st July next ensuing.
10. Any employee who is eligible fion three months' long service leave and who resigns or is retired from the service, may be paid for such long service leave due.
11. Any employee who is retired for any reason other than misconduct or unsatisfactory service, and who has served contimously for at least twelve months
next before his mitenent may be paid for long set vice loave mo mala to the day of retirment.
12. If a dereased employee who has served confimousty for at least tweive months next before his death kaves : wilow, dependent ehidren, mother or immalid sister, farment por rota of long sedrice leave ub to the date of steh emplovee's de:th shatl be granted to such dependant or dependants.
