thence Northerly and Westerly along part of the latter boundary, the Northern boundary of the latter location and part of that of Location 205 to the Eastern boundary of Location 593 ; thence Northerly along the latter boundary and continuing through Location 207 to and along an Eastern boundary of Location 462 to a Southern boundary of the latter location ; thence Easterly along the latter boundary to and along the Southern boundary of Canning Location 373 and along the Southernmost boundary of Reserve 5704 to the Easternmost boundary of the latter reserve ; thence Northerly along the latter boundary along the Eastern boundary of Location 482 to and along the Eastern boundary of Location 533, to and along the Eastern boundary of Location 525 and continuing along part of the Eastern boundary of Location 32 to the Southern boundary of Location 33 ; thence Easterly and Northerly along the latter boundary and part of the Eastern boundary of the latter location to the Southern boundary of Location 287 ; thence Easterly along part of the latter boundary to the Western boundary of Location 674 ; thence South and East to the North-Western corner of Location 348, and continuing along part of the Northern boundary of the latter location to the boundary of Reserve 5913 (Canning Reservoir Watershed) ; thence generally North-Easterly along boundaries of said Reserve to a point in the Southern prolongation of the Eastern boundary of Location 375 ; thence North, West, and South to and along the latter boundary, the Northern and part of the Western boundary of the latter location to the Northern side of Road No. 994 ; thence South-Westerly and North-Westerly along the said side to the Southern boundary of Location 389 ; thence Easterly and Northerly along part of the latter boundary and the Eastern boundary of the latter Location to the Southern boundary of Location 500 ; thence Easterly, Northerly, and Westerly along part of the latter boundary, the Eastern and the Northern boundary of the latter location to the Eastern boundary of Location 499 ; thence Northerly along part of the latter boundary and the Eastern boundary of location 511 to the Northern boundary of the latter location ; thence Westerly along the latter boundary and continuing to a North-Eastern boundary of the Karragullen Townsite Reserve ; thence North-Westerly, South-Westerly, again North-Westerly and Westerly along boundaries of latter Reserve to the Eastern boundary of Location 163 ; thence Southerly along part of the latter boundary and onward to the Northern boundary of Location 162 ; thence Westerly and Southerly along part of the latter boundary and part of the Western boundary of the latter location to a point in the Eastern prolongation of the Northern boundary of Location 411 ; thence Westerly to and along the latter boundary, the Northern boundary of location 613 and the Western prolongation of the latter boundary through Location 473 to the Eastern boundary of Location 438 ; thence Northerly along part of the latter boundary and its prolongation onward to the North-Western side of Road No. 245 ; thence South-Westerly and North-Westerly along said side of road to the Southern boundary of Location 584 ; thence Easterly and Northerly along part of the latter boundary, the Eastern boundary of the latter location and continuing onward to the Southern boundary of Location 426 ; thence Westerly along part of the latter boundary, the Southern boundary of Location 490 and that of Location 425 to the Western boundary of the latter location ; thence Northerly along part of the latter boundary to a point in the Eastern prolongation of the Northern boundary of Location 340 ; thence Westerly to and along part of the latter boundary to the Eastern boundary of Location 496 ; thence Northerly along the latter boundary and its Northerly prolongation along the Western boundary of Location 313 to the Northern boundary of the latter location ; thence Easterly, Northerly, and again Easterly along part of the latter boundary, the Westernmost, and part of the Northernmost boundary of Reserve No. 7365 to the Easternmost boundary of Location 147 ; thence Northerly along the latter boundary, the Eastern boundary of Location 78, and the Easternmost boundary of Location 285 to the South-Western boundary of Location 145 ; thence South-Easterly along part of the latter boundary, and North-Easterly along the South-Eastern boundary of the latter location to the Southern boundary of Location 648 ; thence

Easterly along the latter boundary and part of the Southern boundary of Location 639 to the North-Western side of Road No. 5686; then South-Westerly and Southerly along said side of road to an angle-post opposite the Western boundary of Location 206; thence South-Easterly to the secant post on the latter boundary; thence Southerly and Easterly along part of the said boundary, the Southern boundary of the latter location and the Eastern prolongation thereof to a South-Western boundary of Reserve No. 8059; thence generally South-Easterly along boundaries of the latter Reserve to a South-Western boundary of State Forest No. 7; thence generally South-Easterly along boundaries of the latter State Forest to the Northernmost boundary of State Forest No. 13; thence Westerly along the latter boundary to the Westernmost boundary of State Forest No. 13 aforesaid; thence Southerly along the latter boundary and the Western boundary of Location 10383 to the South-West corner of the said location; thence Easterly along its South boundary to a Western boundary of State Forest No. 13 aforesaid, and Easterly, Southerly, and again Easterly along the boundaries of said State Forest to the Western boundary of late 8/216; thence Southerly along the latter boundary and the Western boundary of late 8/218 to the Northern boundary of late 8/240; thence Westerly along part of the latter boundary and its Western prolongation to the South-Western side of the Perth-Albany Road; thence South-Easterly along said side of road to the Northernmost boundary the Reserve No. 12981; thence Westerly along the latter boundary and the Northernmost boundary of State Forest No. 14 to the Eastern boundary of Murray Location 473 aforesaid, and thence Northerly along part of the latter boundary to the starting point.

*Kondinin Road District—Alteration of Boundaries with Narembeen, Corrigin, and Kulin Road Districts.*

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 368/25.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council sever any portion of a Road District and annex it to an existing Road District; and whereas it is desirable to:—

- (1) sever portion of the Narembeen Road District and annex it to the Kondinin Road District;
- (2) sever portion of the Corrigin Road District and annex it to the Kondinin Road District;
- (3) sever portion of the Kulin Road District and annex it to the Kondinin Road District;
- (4) sever portion of the Kondinin Road District and annex it to the Narembeen Road District;
- (5) sever portion of the Kondinin Road District and annex it to the Kulin Road District:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby—

- (1) sever that portion of the Narembeen Road District, as described in Schedule "A" hereto, and annex it to the Kondinin Road District;
- (2) sever that portion of the Corrigin Road District, as described in Schedule "B" hereto, and annex it to the Kondinin Road District;
- (3) sever that portion of the Kulin Road District, as described in Schedule "C" hereto, and annex it to the Kondinin Road District;
- (4) sever that portion of the Kondinin Road District, as described in Schedule "D" hereto, and annex it to the Narembeen Road District;
- (5) sever that portion of the Kondinin Road District, as described in Schedule "E" hereto, and annex it to the Kulin Road District.

*Kondinin Road District—Transfer of Territory from the Narembeen Road District.*

## PARKS AND RESERVES ACT, 1895.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the By-laws for the control of King's Park being amended by repealing Clause 21a, as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 10th December, 1926, and reverting to Clause 21 (a), as published in the *Government Gazette* of 27th August, 1926. Clause 21a shall now read as follows:—

No hackney carriage or other vehicle which plies for hire, and whether it has been hired or not, shall be allowed to enter or pass through the Park unless licensed by the Board. Every driver of a hackney carriage or other vehicle who, contrary to this Regulation, enters or passes through the Park shall be liable to the penalty for a breach of this Regulation.

No person shall use any roadway within the said Park for the purpose of instructing any other person how to drive any motor vehicle.

No person shall drive any motor vehicle within the limits of the said Park unless he is the holder of the requisite Driver's License under "The Traffic Act, 1919."

No person shall make use of any roadway within the said Park for the purpose of testing or trying any motor vehicle.

"Motor Vehicle" has the same meaning as in "The Traffic Act, 1919."

## THE ROYAL AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY ACT, 1926.

### *Uniform By-laws made in pursuance of Clause 6 of the Act.*

#### *Office Bearers of Society.*

1. The Office bearers of each Society shall be the members of a Committee, and such Committee shall comprise the Chairman, the Treasurer, and not less than six members, to be elected in pursuance of Rule 18 (hereinafter referred to as the "elected members").

Every Society shall appoint a Secretary, and such appointment shall be notified to the Royal Agricultural Society by writing under the hand of the Chairman.

#### *Election of Members.*

2. Every candidate for admission into a Society, by giving his name and address to the Secretary, and signing an application form of membership, together with the payment of the yearly subscription, shall be constituted an ordinary member, and shall have all the rights of membership till the end of the current financial year; provided, that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company, one member only of such firm or company may exercise the rights and privileges belonging to the same, and may be elected to any office,

Notwithstanding anything herein contained the Secretary, with the concurrence of the Committee, shall have the right to refund within two weeks any money so received and to refuse to accept any person as a member of the Society.

#### Register of Members

3 An alphabetical list of the names of all members of the Society shall always be kept in the office of the Society.

#### Privileges of Members.

4. The privileges of membership shall consist of power to vote at any general meeting, and also of free admission to the Show Grounds (on production of member's ticket or badge) at any time when any of the Society's shows are being held. The Society may grant any further privileges at its discretion.

#### Resignation of Members.

5. The resignation of any member shall be by written notice to the Secretary; but no such resignation shall relieve any member from payment of any subscription or other moneys due by him to the Society at the time of such resignation, and such subscription or other moneys shall be deemed to be a debt due to the Society and may be recoverable at law.

#### Subscription.

6. The annual subscription shall be fixed by the members in general meeting, and shall continue to be payable until altered by any subsequent general meeting. The date of payment thereof shall also be fixed in general meeting, and may be altered from time to time as the members think fit.

#### Arrears of Subscription.

7. Any member who shall be six months in arrears in payment of his subscription shall not be entitled to hold or continue to hold any office under By-law 1 hereof or to any privileges of membership.

8. Any member who shall be twelve months in arrears in the payment of his subscription shall be deemed to have resigned his membership, and his name shall be struck off the roll of members. On payment of all arrears of subscriptions he may be reinstated as a member.

#### General Meetings.

9. A general meeting of members (six to form a quorum) shall be held during each year, at such time and place as may be appointed by the Committee; such meeting shall—

- (a) elect the office bearers of the Society, in accordance with Rule 18;
- (b) elect the Auditor of the Society;
- (c) consider the annual report and yearly statement of accounts.

Subject to the provisions of By-laws 15, 17, and 24, the office bearers and Auditor shall be deemed to hold office for one year from the first day of the month following the date of the meeting at which such election takes place.

10. A special general meeting may be called (six to form a quorum) at any time by the Secretary, on the direction of the President, or on the requisition of six members, but no business shall be transacted at any such meeting other than that for which it has been called.

11. The chairman of any general or special meeting shall have a deliberate vote, and in case of equality of votes, a casting vote also. Notice of any general or special meeting shall be posted or delivered to members fourteen days at least prior to the time fixed for such meeting.

The accidental omission to give notice of any such meeting, or the non-receipt of any such notice, shall not invalidate any resolution passed at any such meeting.

#### How Questions are to be decided.

12. Subject to the proviso hereinafter contained, all matters (except the election of office bearers) to be dealt with at general meetings, shall be determined on the voices, unless a division be called for. Provided, however, that when a motion or any special business or matter is the subject of notice to members, one-fourth of the members present at any meeting at which the special business or matter is under discussion, or the next nearest number above one-fourth, if a fraction

remains after division of the number of members present, by four, may require discussion of the special business or matter to be postponed to the next annual meeting (provided such meeting be held not less than one month thereafter), or to a subsequent meeting, to be held not earlier than one month after the meeting at which such postponement takes place nor more than three months thereafter, at which meeting the matter under discussion shall be decided upon the votes then recorded. In the case of an equality of votes, the Chairman shall have an additional or casting vote.

#### Management of Society.

13. Subject to these By-laws, the business of each Society shall be managed by the Committee constituted in accordance with By-law 1.

14. The Chairman shall retire annually, but shall be eligible for re-election.

15. Such members of the elected Committee shall retire annually, as the members in general meeting may from time to time decide, not being less, however, than one-third, but such retiring members shall be eligible for re-election.

16. The Treasurer shall retire annually, but shall be eligible for re-election.

17. Any reputable person not being a member of the Committee or any firm of which such person is a partner, shall be eligible to be elected Auditor of the Society. Any such Auditor so appointed shall hold such office for one year only, as provided by By-law 9, but shall be eligible for re-election. In case of any vacancy arising in the office of Auditor through any cause prior to the date of the annual meeting, such vacancy shall be filled by the Committee, and such person or firm so appointed to fill such vacancy shall hold office until the first day of the month following the annual meeting.

#### Nomination of Office Bearers.

18. Office bearers of the Society, who shall be financial members, shall be nominated prior to or at the annual general meeting.

- (a) Should the number required and no more be so nominated, the Chairman of the meeting shall declare all candidates elected.
- (b) Should the number nominated exceed the number required, a ballot shall be taken during the holding of such meeting.
- (c) Should a less number than required be nominated the Committee, at its next meeting, shall fill such vacancies.
- (d) Members shall vote in each instance for the required number of candidates, and any voting paper on which are recorded votes for more or less than the required number of members for any office or committee shall be informal to that extent, but any such informality shall not affect the legality of the voting paper in instances where votes for a member or members for other offices or committees are properly recorded on the same voting paper.
- (e) The Committee shall appoint two scrutineers to assist in the conduct of the ballot.

#### Committee.

19. Meetings of the Committee shall be held once during every month, provided there be business sufficient to warrant the calling of such meeting—four to form a quorum. The Secretary shall convene such meetings by posting or delivering to each member of the Committee a notification thereof five days at least before the date fixed for such meeting, and such notification shall specify the time and place of such meeting. The Chairman may convene a special meeting of the Committee at any time, and in such case the Secretary shall give a similar notification to all members at least three days prior to the meeting.

20. The Committee shall have the control and management of the income and expenditure of the funds of the Society, and also the entire management and superintendence of all the Society's other affairs and concerns, and also the appointment and management of its officers and servants.

21. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Committee. In the absence of the Chairman, the members present shall elect a Chairman from among their number. The Chairman presiding at any meeting shall have a deliberate, and in the case of equality of votes, a casting vote also.

#### Rescinding Resolutions.

22. No motion, the effect of which if carried would be to rescind any resolution previously passed by the Committee during the same year, shall be entertained unless notice of intention to move the same shall have been given in writing to the Secretary at least fourteen days prior to the holding of the meeting of the Committee at which it is proposed to move such resolution.

#### Special Vacancies.

23. If any of the elected members be absent without leave for three consecutive ordinary meetings of the Committee, he shall cease to be an office bearer.

24. Vacancies in the number of office bearers caused by death, resignation, absence without leave, or otherwise, and occurring at any time between two annual general meetings, shall be notified by the Secretary to the Committee at its next meeting thereafter, and the Secretary shall notify such vacancies in writing to each of the members of the Committee not present at such meeting, and all such vacancies shall be filled up by the Committee at the following meeting. Any member so appointed shall, previous to such appointment, signify to the Secretary his willingness to accept such appointment, but any person so chosen shall retain office only so long as the member in whose place he is appointed would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred.

Provided, however, that when any such vacancy has been filled by the appointment thereto of any office bearer of the Society, as provided by Rule 1, the notification of the next meeting of the Committee to be given in pursuance of Rule 19 shall specify such vacancy and the Committee may at such meeting fill the same.

#### Secretary.

25. The appointment or removal of the Secretary shall be dealt with by the Committee only.

#### Sale of Property.

26. The Committee, by the authority of a majority of members present at a general meeting called for the purpose, may sell property of the Society, and may also sell any of the Society's property for the purpose of payment of the debts of the Society without any such authority; but no sale for the last-mentioned purpose shall be made by the Committee until after a general meeting of the Society shall have been held, which said meeting shall be called by the Committee by circular at least fourteen days before the date of such meeting, stating the objects of the meeting and the reasons which induce the Committee to propose a sale of the Society's property, and the debts and liabilities which it is proposed shall be paid out of the proceeds of such sale.

#### Borrowing Powers.

27. The Committee may, with the sanction of a resolution passed by members in general meeting, or in any special meeting called for the purpose, raise money by bank overdraft or by the issue of debentures, or by such other means as may be approved of at such meeting, and if necessary may secure the payment thereof by any mortgage or charge upon the property of the Society, or by such other means as the members by such resolution shall decide.

The notice convening any general or special meeting at which it is intended to seek the foregoing power from members shall set out the intention of the Committee to seek such power, and such notice shall be posted or delivered to each member not less than 14 days before which the meeting is convened.

#### Appeals.

28. The Council of the Royal Agricultural Society may herein determine any appeal by any member or exhibitor from the decision of any Society, subject to the following conditions, namely:—

- (a) The appellant shall within three days after the decision appealed against has been notified to him, lodge with the Secretary of the Society from whose decision he desires to appeal, a notice in writing of his intention to appeal, stating the ground on which he desires to appeal.
- (b) The appellant shall, within seven days after lodging such notice, also lodge with the Secretary of the Royal Agricultural Society the sum of £3 3s., together with a copy of such notice of appeal.

(c) On the hearing of the appeal the Council of the Royal Agricultural Society may—

- (i) remit the matter in dispute to be reopened or re-heard by the Committee of the Society from whose decision the appeal is brought; or
  - (ii) make such order as in its opinion ought to have been made by such Committee, or as in its opinion may be necessary to ensure the determination on the merits of the real question at issue.
- (d) On the hearing of the appeal the Council of the Royal Agricultural Society may make such order as they may think proper for payment of the costs and expenses of the appeal and with reference to the disposal of the said sum of £3 3s.
- (e) Except by leave of the Council of the Royal Agricultural Society no fresh evidence shall be adduced on the hearing of any appeal.
- (f) The Committee of the Society from whose decision any appeal is brought, shall, immediately after the lodging of notice of such appeal, cause a true copy of the minutes of the meeting at which the decision was arrived at, together with minutes of any evidence taken, to be sent to the Secretary of the Royal Agricultural Society.

#### Disqualifications.

29. The Secretary of any Society which shall have disqualified any member or exhibitor shall, within fourteen days from the date of such disqualification, notify the same to the Secretary of the Royal Agricultural Society, who shall then notify all societies of such disqualification, together with the reasons for same.

30. Any person who shall have been disqualified by the Royal Agricultural Society, or by any country Society, shall not be eligible to become a member of nor exhibitor at any other Society until such disqualification shall have been removed. The Council of the Royal Agricultural Society shall have power to remove at any time any disqualification or suspension, upon application from the Society originally concerned in the disqualification.

#### Shows.

31. Every Society shall each year, on or before a date to be fixed by the Royal Agricultural Society, make written application for a date or dates on which to hold its show or shows, and no show shall be held by such Society on any other date or dates than that or those notified in writing by the Secretary of the Royal Agricultural Society.

#### Registered List of Judges.

32. Every Society shall forward to the Royal Agricultural Society between the 1st March and the 1st May in each year, the names and addresses of such persons as are prepared to act as judges and are approved of by such Society. From such information an official list of approved judges will be compiled by the Royal Agricultural Society, and such list will be subject to revision by the Council of that Society. No person shall, without the consent of the Royal Agricultural Society, be appointed a judge by any country Society unless his name appears on the list of judges published for that year by the Royal Agricultural Society.

#### Disqualification of Live Stock.

33. Live stock accepted at any Agricultural Show held contrary to the provisions of "The Royal Agricultural Society Act, 1926," may be disqualified from competing at any registered Society's show and the exhibitor and/or owner of such live stock may be disqualified. Such disqualification may continue during the pleasure of the Royal Agricultural Society.

#### Schedule of Prizes.

34. All registered Societies shall submit each year for approval before issue proof schedule of prizes.

#### Balance Sheet and By-laws.

35. Within three months from the closing of each financial year, every Society shall forward to the Royal Agricultural Society a report and balance sheet for the year so closed, and shall with such report and balance sheet forward a copy of all By-laws passed during such year in pursuance of Subsection 2 of Section 6 of the said Act.

36. A breach of any of these By-laws may be reported in writing by any member to the Secretary of the Royal Agricultural Society, who shall thereupon

be empowered to inquire into such breach and make a report thereon to the Council of the Royal Agricultural Society.

For the purpose of such inquiry the Secretary of the Royal Agricultural Society may inspect the minute books and records of the Society accused of committing such breach.

37. Any person who takes part in any matter coming within these By-laws shall be held thereby to consent to be bound by them and shall not be entitled to appeal to any court because of anything done under their provisions.

*By-laws for the Management and Use of the Road Board Hall and other Buildings under the Control of the Board.*

1. Interpretation clause.—In the construction of these By-laws:—

- (a) The word "Board" shall mean the Manjimup District Road Board;
- (b) The word "Building" shall mean and include any hall, room, or corridor of any such hall under the control of the Board.

2. Applications for the hire of any building or furniture shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Board not less than 24 hours before the time that such building or furniture is required, and shall state the purpose for which the building or furniture is required.

3. The name and place of abode of the actual responsible person or persons hiring any building or furniture shall be given in the application for the use of such building or furniture.

4. The rent of the building or furniture shall be paid with the application, and shall be as set out in the schedule hereunder.

5. The hours for which any building or furniture may be hired shall be:—

- (a) Day: 9 o'clock a.m. to 7 o'clock p.m.
- (b) Evening: 7 o'clock p.m. to 12 o'clock midnight.
- (c) Extension of time may be granted upon payment of prescribed fees.

6. The Board may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of such engagement.

7. The Board reserves the right to refuse to let any building or furniture to any applicant for the hiring of the same, without assigning any reason for such refusal.

8. The Board may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of any building or furniture.

9. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any building or furniture for the same date and hour, the Board may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire of such building or furniture shall be granted.

10. The hirer of any building shall comply with the Health Act provisions, Entertainments Tax Act, and any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such hirings and use of any buildings. If in the opinion of the Board all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts above-mentioned, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of the engagement forbid and prevent the use of such building.

11. In the event of the use of any building being forbidden or prevented under the last preceding By-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of such building as if the hire had been duly fulfilled, and the Board shall not be responsible to the hirer for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.

12. No spirituous liquors, wine, ale, beer, porter, cider, or perry shall be brought into or consumed in any building during the term of engagement, except when permitted by the Board in writing.

13. No person shall smoke any tobacco, cigar, cigarette, or objectionable substance, nor strike or otherwise ignite any light in any building during any ball or public entertainment, or at any gathering of persons in the said building, whether such persons have been admitted by the payment of money or otherwise, except at a banquet or smoke social where those present comprise men only.

14. Dogs, whether under control or otherwise, will not be allowed to enter the building.

15. No person shall, in any part of the building, enter or be—

- (a) allowed to enter whilst intoxicated;
- (b) be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever;
- (c) use profane or improper language;
- (d) damage, mark, or deface any wall or other part of the building. Any person who does, permits, or suffers any such damage, shall be liable to pay the cost of such damage in addition to any penalty imposed by these By-laws.

(e) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever in the passage-ways of any building. Any person so doing shall immediately disperse on being requested to do so by the Secretary or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable, whether in uniform or otherwise.

16. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons, nor anything calculated to produce a disturbance, riot, or breach of peace, shall be permitted in any building.

17. The hirer of any building shall be responsible for—

- (a) maintaining good order and enforcing these By-laws;
- (b) any damage done to the building, fittings, fixtures, furniture, or crockeryware, or other part of the property.

18. The Secretary of the Board or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable, shall be permitted to have free ingress to the building, or any part thereof, at all times during term of engagement, and every facility shall be given them for enforcing these By-laws.

19. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect hereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

## INDUSTRIAL ARBITRATION ACT, 1912-25.

*Industrial Agreement.*

No. 48 of 1927.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-25," this third day of October 1927, between the Perth City Amalgamated Society of Carpenters and Joiners of Australia Industrial Union of Workers, of the one part, and The Honourable Alexander McCallum, M.L.A., Minister for Works, on behalf of the State Government, of the other part.

1. All full time wages employees in the service of the Government (except the Government Railways) who are not by Award or Agreement already entitled to long service leave, and who have served continuously for ten or more years after attaining the age of eighteen years, will be entitled under this Agreement, subject as hereinafter provided, to three months' long service leave, to be granted at the convenience of the Department concerned.

2. Such employees shall be similarly entitled to three months' long service leave for ten years' continuous service after the first period of long service leave; and to a further period of three months for seven years' continuous service after the second period of long service leave; and thereafter to a further period of three months' long service leave in respect of each seven years' subsequent continuous service. The words "continuous service" do not include the period during which an employee is on long service leave.

3. Every application for long service leave shall be made in the prescribed form.

4. Every full time wages employee who, on the 31st day of December, 1926, had been employed continuously for at least ten years shall, upon making application in the prescribed form, be entitled to a period of three months' leave, such leave to be granted in order of length of service as far as may be convenient.

5. The qualifying period for the second grant of long service leave to wages employees having more than ten years' continuous service on 1st January, 1927, will, without regard to the grant of the first period of such leave, commence as follows:—

To employees of more than twenty-eight years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st January, 1927.

To employees of more than twenty-two years' service, and of less than twenty-eight years' service, on 1st January, 1927—1st July, 1927.

To employees of more than sixteen years' service and of less than twenty-two years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st July, 1928.

To employees of more than thirteen years' service and of less than sixteen years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st July, 1929.

To employees of more than ten years' service and of less than thirteen years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st January, 1930.

To employees of less than ten years' service on 1st January, 1927, but who have completed ten years' service on 1st July, 1930—1st July, 1930.

6. Any public holidays occurring during the period in which an employee is on long service leave will be calculated as portion of the long service leave, and extra days in lieu thereof will not be granted.

7. Long service leave is granted solely for recuperative purposes. No employee of the Department is to undertake during long service leave any form of employment for hire or reward without the consent of the Under Secretary for Labour. Contravention of this provision will be followed by dismissal.

8. An employee dismissed from the service shall not be entitled to payment in respect of long service leave, other than for leave that had accrued due to him prior to the date of the offence for which he was dismissed.

9. Employees may be paid their wages in advance, at their permanent classified rate of pay, for a period equivalent to the leave taken, provided such period does not extend into the next financial year. Any balance may be paid on the 1st July next ensuing.

10. Any employee who is eligible for three months' long service leave and who resigns or is retired from the service, may be paid for such long service leave due.

11. Any employee who is retired for any reason other than misconduct or unsatisfactory service, and who has served continuously for at least twelve months

next before his retirement may be paid for long service leave *pro rata* to the day of retirement.

12. If a deceased employee who has served continuously for at least twelve months next before his death leaves a widow, dependent children, mother or invalid sister, payment *pro rata* of long service leave up to the date of such employee's death shall be granted to such dependant or dependants.

13. During the period of long service leave District Allowance will not be paid except where the family or dependants of the employee remain in the district.

14. An employee whose service is broken owing to the exigencies of his particular work for a period not exceeding two weeks shall in respect of such period be deemed on leave without pay.

15. So far as practicable an employee shall not be booked off for long service leave without receiving one month's notice of the date of the commencement of such leave.

16. This Agreement has effect throughout the State.

17. This Agreement is for the term of three years from the date thereof.
