THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this twentieth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, between The City of Perth Municipal Council and The Fremantle Gas and Coke Company, Limited (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the one part, and The Metropolitan Gas Works Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the par-ties hereto that the several stipulations, conditions, and ties hereto that the several stipulations, conditions, and provisions set out in this Schedule hereto shall in all cases be binding upon and shall be faithfully carried out and observed, performed, and complied with by all parties concerned.

Men engaged discharging coal 'from railway trucks in Perth-15s. 8d. per day.

Leading hand (not otherwise specified) in charge of three or more men shall be paid 1s. 3d. per day above the ordinary rate of pay for such work.

Leading hand (being a tradesman) in charge of three or more tradesmen or six or more other workers shall be paid 2s. 6d. per day above the rate prescribed for his trade.

Men engaged inside the gas, tar, or water space of any boiler, or inside the boiler flue, in cleaning or scraping work shall, whilst so employed, be paid 6d. per hour in addition to his ordinary or overtime rate of pay.

Any employee working in wet ground shall be paid 1s. per day in addition to his ordinary or overtime rate of pay. "Wet ground" means ground in which, in the opinion of the Engineer, it is imwet feet. Provided that where water-tight boots are supplied by the management there shall be no allowance for wet ground.

Clause 2.—Travelling Allowance for Main Gangs and Outside Workers.

Where an employee commencing work at starting time on the job incurs extra tram or railway fares over and above one tram fare each way, or over and above the amount he would incur if starting work at Wellington Street Works, Perth, or Gas Works, Fre-mantle, this extra amount of fares shall be refunded to him each week; providing that this clause does not apply to any worker who has been allotted a special district whilst working in such district,

Clause 3 .-- Time Allowance outside the Two-mile Radius.

Employees working temporarily outside the two-mile radius of the Wellington Street Works, Perth, or Gas Works, Fremantle, and not within two miles of their place of residence, shall be allowed one-half hour per day travelling time without loss of pay, in addition to above travelling allowance, when required to report for work on the job.

Clause 4.-Hours.

The hours of duty shall not, without payment for overtime, exceed 48 hours per week, and the hours of duty for any day shall not, without payment for over-time, exceed 8 hours 45 minutes: Provided also, that if it is found necessary arrangements may be made for employees to commence work earlier or later and finish earlier or later than the ordinary hours. Each shift to consist of eight hours on shift work.

Clause 5,-Overtime.

Payment shall be made for overtime at the rate of time and one-half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.

When a worker is recalled to work after leaving job he shall be paid for at least two hours at overtime rates.

When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one hour he shall be provided with any meal required, or shall be paid two shiftings (2s.) in lieu thereof. This provision shall not apply in case of emergency, breakdown repairs nor to men unloading coal.

Clause 6.—Shift Work

All shift work shall be so arranged as to allow each man by rotation or otherwise one clear day or shift off in each week. A week shall be deemed to commence from the starting of the morning shift on Thursday in each week.

For all duty performed on his day off in the week, not being a Sunday or a holiday, the minimum ordinary rate prescribed for a shiftman shall be increased by

one-half, but in the case of a Sunday it shall be doubled. For all time worked on a Sunday (not being his day off) the minimum ordinary rate for a shiftman shall be increased by one-half. For all duty on holidays the minimum ordinary rate

rescribed for a shiftman shall be paid in addition to the holiday pay.

In the case of a shiftman working on his day off at the request of another employee, the rate to be paid shall be the ordinary rate payable for the day or shift. In the case of a man, after his usual day's work,

being called on for Retort House work between 5 p.m. and 7.30 a.m., he will be paid at the rate of time and one-half, unless notified before 5 p.m. that he will be required for the night-shift.

Clause 7.—Holidays.

tioned will be treated as the days to which this clause applies.

All employees, other than shiftmen, shall be free from duty on holidays, without loss of pay for the day, but any employee may be required for duty on any Sunday or holiday, and if so required shall be entitled to the ordinary rate for the time worked on Sunday, and on holidays the ordinary day's pay plus the holi-day pay for the day. The rates for shiftmen shall be time and one-half for Sundays and double rates for holidays.

Annual Leave.—Six days' leave of absence will be granted annualy on full pay after twelve months' service in addition to the six days' holiday already specified herein. Leave not to be cumulative and to be taken

at the discretion of the management, so as to interfere with the routine of the works as little as possible. In the case of a retort operator being compelled to work on a holiday as defined in this clause, one day shall be added to his annual leave for each scheduled holiday so worked.

Employees not completing twelve months' service shall receive holidays or pay in lieu thereof after six months' service, in proportion to the length of service, that is, one day's holiday for every two months' service, unless summarily dismissed for misconduct, dereliction of duty, etc., in which case no holiday pay shall be granted.

Clause 8.—Casual Workers.

A casual worker shall be paid ten per cent. increase on the prescribed rate for the particular class of work he is required to perform.

"Casual worker" means a worker (other than men picked up for unloading coal) employed for less than fourteen consecutive days.

Clause 10.—Weekly Hiring.

(a) Except as to casual workers, the employment is terminable on either side by one week's notice given on any day, but for the first fourteen days of employment the hiring shall be from hour to hour, and during this period an hour's notice or an hour's pay shall be sufficient.

(b) If a weekly worker absents himself from duty a sum proportionate to his time of absence may be deducted from his pay.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

(d) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the applicant or the Unions affiliated with it or by any other Association or Union, or through any breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work, or by any such strike or breakdown which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

(e) Sick Pay.—The employers will, in the case of personal accident or personal sickness necessitating absence from work, pay for a total period of six days in the year for such absence from work.

Providing also, that the employee will lose his pay for the time of such absence from work unless he produces or forwards within forty-eight hours of the commencement of such absence, a medical certificate or other evidence satisfactory to the management that his absence was due to personal accident arising out of and in the course of his employment, or to personal ill health necessitating such absence.

Provisions.

Clause 11.—Service Layers.

Service layers' work to terminate within six feet of inside of building or street line.

Clause 12.-Maintenance Work.

Maintenance work shall not constitute gas fitters' work, unless it is found necessary to remove the fittings and replace them to repair a fault.

Clause 13 .- Tools.

All tools required by the abovenamed employees (service and maintenance men) in connection with any work performed by them on behalf of the employers, to be provided by the employers, with the following exception:--

All tools (small) generally known as "Pocket tools" to be found by the employees.

Clause 14.

Plumbers, carpenters, blacksmiths, fitters and turners, and other trades provided for under the various Federal and State awards are not included in this Agreement.

Clause 15.—Forty-four Hour Week.

Should the State Arbitration Court award a 44-hour week to the Amalgamated Society of Engineers in the claim (Reference No. 451/1926) now before that Court, then a 44-hour week shall apply between the parties to this Agreement, as regards day workers, as from seven days after the date such Award is announced, or from the date it is fixed to take effect by the Court, whichever is the later.

Provided that in case a 44-hour week is granted, the week as regards day workers shall be spread over six days, and that as regards shiftworkers any variation from 48 hours per week shall be made by the order of the State Arbitration Court.

Clause 16 .- Settlement of Disputes.

Should any question or dispute arise regarding this Agreement or any matter not provided for herein, it shall be referred to a representative of the employers and of the union, who shall meet and endeavour to effect a settlement.

This clause shall not be taken to interfere with any rights of either of the parties to proceed for a penalty for a breach of this Agreement.

Clause 17.-Locality of Agreement.

This Agreement shall apply in Pertl to an area comprised within a circle of five miles from the Perth Town Hall as centre, and in Fremantle to an area comprised within a circle of five miles from the Fremantle Town Hall as centre.

Clause 18 .- Basic Wage.

The basic wage as declared by the State Arbitration Court being adopted as the standard in this Agreement, any variation of the basic wage declared by the Court will become the standard in this Agreement, and all other rates will be altered so as to preserve the margins shown in this Agreement.

Clause 19.—Duration of Agreement.

Hours of Labour.—The hours of labour shall be 44 hours per week in all sections, and no day shall be longer than eight hours, without payment at overtime rates, for the week days, Monday to Friday, and four hours on Saturdays hours on Saturdays.

3. Starting and finishing time shall be 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday to Friday, 8 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturday, except wherein otherwise specified.

MINING DEVELOPMENT ACT, 1902. Regulations for Mining Boards.

Perth, 9th November, 1927. 1655/12. 1053/12. French, 5th November, 1927. HIS Excellency the Governor in Excentive Council has been pleased to cancel the Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of the 25th day of February, 1927, relating to Mining Boards constituted under the provisions of "The Mining Development Act Amend-ment Act, 1924," and to substitute the following.

S. W. MUNSIE, Minister for Mines.

Central Mining Board.

1. The Central Mining Board of five members shall be appointed by the Minister at his discretion, and shall consist of three officers of the Mines Department and two persons who are not otherwise in the Public Setvice of the State.

The officers of the Mines Department shall be, $\mathbf{2}$. ex officio:-

(i) The Under Secretary for Mines;
(ii) The State Mining Engineer;
(iii) The Government Geologist;

but from time to time the Minister may authorise any out from time to time the Minister may authorise any officer or officers of the Mines Department to act as deputy or deputies for any of these members of the Board, and such deputies while so acting shall have all the powers and duties of the officers represented by them so far as the proceedings of the Board are con-cerned cerned.

3. The two unofficial members of the Board will be persons whom the Minister may select as suitable repersons whom the Minister may select as suitable re-presentatives of the principal interests concerned with prospecting and mining development operations, and he may from time to time appoint deputies to act when such members are not available, and such deputies shall have all the powers and duties of the members for whom they are seting whom they are acting.

The Chairman of the Central Mining Board shall 4. the the Under Secretary for Mines, or a departmental officer duly authorised by the Minister to act in his stead. The Chairman shall have a deliberative vole, and also a casting vote in the event of equality of voting.

5. The Minister may appoint a suitable officer of his department to be Secretary to the Central Mining Board, and such Secretary shall have charge of the cierical work and records of the Board, but shall not take any part in its deliberations and actions.

6. The proceedings of the Board shall be conducted m accordance with customary practice of board mect-ings, as may be directed by the Chairman. If the Chairman's ruling be challenged by more than one member of the Board, it shall be referred to the Minis-ter, whose decision shall be final.

7. The Board shall meet in Perth as often as may be required and directed by the Minister, who may also instruct it to visit any mine or mining centre for the purpose of carrying out its duties.

8. The Central Mining Board's duty shall be to make such inquiries, reports, and investigations as it may deem necessary to enable it to advise the Minister, and make recommendations to him on any matter in connection with the development of mining which may be referred to it by him, either directly or through his departmental officers.

9. A quorum of the Board shall consist of not less than three members.

District Mining Boards.

10. District Mining Boards, each consisting of three members, will be appointed by the Minister at his discretion at-

- Kalgoorlie-to deal with cases arising in the North-Coolgardie, Broad Arrow, North-East Coolgar-die, East Coolgardie, Coolgardie, and Dundas die, East Goldfields.

- Yilgarn-to deal with cases arising in the Yilgarn

Goldfield. 11. One of the members of each Board shall be appointed by the Minister to be Chairman of such

Board. 12. The Minister may appoint any suitable officer of the Mines Department to be Secretary to each Board, and such officers shall be responsible for keeping proper records of the proceedings of the Boards and for their limited work

clerical work. 13. Members of District Mining Boards shall be persons chosen by the Minister on account of their knowledge of the matters likely to come before their respective Boards for consideration, and deputies may be appointed by the Minister from time to time to act where and while the regular members are not available. 14. The proceedings of the District Mining Boards shall be conducted as in the case of the Central Mining Board, as laid down in the foregoing Regulation 6. 15. The District Mining Boards shall meet at such times and places as may be fixed from time to time by the Minister.

the Minister. 16. The District Mining Boards shall advise the Minister through the Central Mining Board in regard in regard Minister through the Central Mining Board in regard to any matters relating to the development of mining in their districts or which may be referred to them by the Minister or the Central Mining Board. 17. A quorum of a District Mining Board shall con-sist of not less than two members. 18. Every member of a District Mining Board and deputy appointed under Regulation 13 shall be author-ised to receive applications for prospecting assistance from prospecting or prospecting to prospect

from persons prospecting or proposing to prospect within his District, and he shall deal with such appli-cations as required by Regulation 19. For such service each member of a District Mining Board who is not otherwise in the Public Service of the State may be paid fees, at the discretion of the Minister, not exceeding a total of Ten pounds (£10) per annum, and in the

case of deputies who are not in the public service similarly, not exceeding Six pounds ($\pounds 6$) per annum, such fees being in addition to any which may be payable under Regulations 25 and 26.

19. Applications for prospecting assistance shall be iodged in duplicate with the local member of a District Mining Board or a deputy, and after endorsement thereon with any comments and recommendations by such local member or deputy, one copy shall be forwarded to the Secretary of the Mining Board for the District and one to the Chairman of the Central Mining Board at the Mines Department, Perth; by the first available mail. The Secretary of the District Mining Board shall retain all applications received for record and reference and submit them to the next following meeting of the District Mining Board.

General.

20. Forms of application for prospecting assistance will be obtainable from all Mining Registrars, Deputy Mining Registrars, and Inspectors of Mines.

21. Parts of the State not mentioned in the districts specified in Regulation 10 aforesaid for which District Mining Boards are appointed shall be under the Central Mining Board directly.

22. The Minister may at any time direct that the duties of any District Mining Board shall be performed by the Central Mining Board.

23. The Chairman may invite any officer of the Mines Department to attend any meeting of the Central or any District Mining Board and take part in discussion of cases under consideration, but such officer shall not have any vote at such meetings.

24. The Minister, by notice in writing to such member, may cancel the appointment of any member or members of any Board, and at his discretion may appoint other members from time to time.

25. Any travelling expenses necessarily incurred by members to enable them to attend meetings of any Board, whether in Perth or elsewhere, shall be paid to them in accordance with the scales of payment in the Regulations under "The Public Service Act, 1904," applying to the travelling expenses of superior officers of the Public Service.

26. A fee of one guinca will be paid to each member of each Mining Board, whether Central or District, who is not in the Public Service, for each meeting at which he attends the full sitting, but fees shall not be payable for partial attendance at any meeting unless such partial attendance shall have been permitted by the Chairman.

1. In Regulation 3 the words "twelve o'clock at noon on" are inserted after the word "than" in the ninth line thereof.

2. The words 'at a meeting of the Board convened for the purpose,' in Regulation 4, are deleted, and the words 'at the office of the Board at noon on the 17th day of December, 1927,' are inserted in place thereof; and the following words are added to the said regulation, namely, "Each candidate may be present at the scrutiny, or may appoint a scrutineer to be present on his behalf at the scrutiny."

THE DAIRY CATTLE COMPENSATION ACT, 1926.

The Stock Diseases Act, 1895.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Dairy Cattle Compensation Act, 1926," and these regulations, apply in the district defined by Order in Conneil published in the *Gazette* on the 11th day of November, 1927, and in such other districts as may from time to time

be de ined for the purposes of the said Act. 2. An application for the registration of dairy cattle shall be made by the owner in writing addressed to the Director of Agriculture, at the Department of Agriculture, Perth, in the Form No. 1 in the schedule hereto.

The prescribed registration fees shall be tendered with the application.

3. On receipt by the Director of Agriculture of an application for registration, together with the prescribed fees, the tion for registration, together with the presented fees, the Chief Inspector of Stock shall arrange for a veterinary in-spection of the animals desired to be registered, for the purpose of inspecting, describing, and recording animals to be registered. The result of such inspection shall be sub-mitted to the Chief Inspector of Stock by the examining officer in the Form No. 2 in the schedule hereto, together it is recommendations. with his recommendations.

4. All cattle submitted for registration shall bear a registered fire brand for the purposes of recording and indentification.

Registration pursuant to an application shall be effected by an entry in the register kept at the Department of Agriculture; and such register shall make provision for a complete record as to the name and address of owner, date of a complete record as to the name and address of owner, date of application, date of registration, and particulars of dairy cattle as to number, sex, etc. Provision shall also be made for an appended list furnishing detailed particulars of in-dividual animals, giving age, colour, breed, descriptive marks or markings, brands, etc. (Form No. 3 in the schedule hereto). A revision of such register shall be made at the end of each value war of each calendar year.

6. Registration shall be effected annually in the prescribed manner and on payment of the prescribed fees; and every registration shall be in force from the date on which it is made until the first day of January next ensuing, but no longer: Provided that registration effected prior to the 1st January, 1928, shall continue in force until the 31st December in that year.

7. The fees for annual registration shall be at the rate of two shillings per head of all dairy cattle registered : Pro-vided that no fee shall be charged for the registration of a heifer, if such heifer is, and during the period of registration will be, under the age of two years.

A certificate of registration shall be issued to the owner in the Form No. 4 in the schedule hereto. In the event of loss of a certificate of registration a duplicate may be obtained on payment of a fee of two shillings and sixpence.

9. The register to be open to inspection on payment of a search fee of two shillings and sixpence. 10. On notification to the Director of Agriculture of a change of ownership during the currency of such annual registration, the certificate of registration may be trans-formed to the new ownership ferred to the new owner.

11. Every owner of dairy cattle shall, when requested by the Chief Inspector of Stock, or any person acting under his authority, muster such dairy cattle from time to time for the purposes of inspection and recording, at such time and place as may be required by the Inspecting Officer, and shall render to such officer all reasonable assistance.

12. Every owner of dairy cattle, notwithstanding that the cattle are registered, shall notify the Director of Agri-culture of any animal that may be visibly affected by disease, or may show signs whereby such animal is suspected of disease.

13. Dairy cattle condemned under the provisions of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," or any other Act or statu-tory regulation, shall, if so required by an Inspector of Stock, by a notice to the owner in or to the effect of the Form No. 5 in the schedule hereto, be dealt with by the owner, in accordance with the directions of the Inspector, as set out in the notice. By such notice the owner may be required either to convey the dairy cattle to, and deliver the cattle at, an abattoir for slaughter at the owner's expense, or to destroy at the owner's expense the cattle within the meaning of the word "destroy" in "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895." Every person to whom notice is given under this regulation shall comply therewith.

14. If condemned dairy cattle are suffering from or suspected of suffering from disease within the meaning of that term in "The Dairy Cattle Compensation Act, 1926" (tuberculosis or actinomycosis), the value of the condemned cattle shall be ascertained in pursuance of that Act.

15. In case of disagreement between an inspector and the owner as to the value of cattle suffering or suspected of suffering from disease, and of it becoming necessary for such value to be determined by a competent and impartial person nominated by the Minister, the inspector may in his discretion stay the destruction of the cattle on compliance by the owner with such conditions of isolation and other instructions as may be made and given by the inspector.

16. (1) If pursuant to Section 5 of " The Dairy Cattle Compensation Act, 1926," the value of the cattle referred to in the notice given under regulation 13 (Form 5) is determined by agreement between the owner and an inspector, a mem-orandum thereof shall be indorsed on a duplicate of the notice, and shall be signed by the owner and the Inspector and forwarded by the Inspector to the Director of Agri-outhure culture.

(2) If in default of such agreement the values determined by a person nominated by the Minister, a memorandum of such detormination shall be indorsed on a duplicate of the notice, and shall be signed by the person so nominated and forwarded by him to the Director of Agriculture.

17. (1) If by such notice (Form 5) the owner is required to convey the cattle to an abattoir, a copy of the notice shall be forwarded by the Inspector to the Controller of Abattoirs (Form 6).

(2) The Controller of Abattoirs or his deputy shall, on receipt of such notice, give instructions for the slaughter of the animals mentioned therein, and for the realisation of the carcases.

(3) On receipt of such notice and the animal or animals referred to therein, the Controller of Abattoirs shall forward such information, in the Form No. 7 in the schedule hereto, to the Accountant, Department of Agriculture, and the Chief

to the Accountants, Department of Agencies (4) In the event of an animal being destroyed by the direction of an Inspector of Stock on the premises of the owner, or at a place other than an abattoir, the Chief In-spector of Stock shall advise the Accountant of the Department of Agriculture thereof.

(5) Any animal ordered for slaughter at an abattoir shall be marked with a distinctive paint mark, as the Inspector
