 By His Excellency Colonel Sir William Robert Campion, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St Michael and St. George. D.S.O., Gov-ernor in and over the State of West-ern Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1884," I, the Governor of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint Wednesday, 8th February, 1928, a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday in the Town of Dowerin.

> Land Drainage Act, 1925. Njookenbooroo Drainage District. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 1516/18. WHEREAS by Section 12 of "The Land Drainage Act, 1925," the Governor may at any time by Order in Council replace, vary, or amend any of the provisions of any previous Order relating to any district: And whereas it is desirable to extend the boundaries of the Njookenbooroo Drainage District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby extend the Njookenbooroo Drainage Area in accordance with the Schedule hereto attached :

#### Schedule.

Commencing at the junction of the East side of Main Street with the North side of Green Street; thence

South-Westerly in a direct line to the junction of the South-Westerly in a direct line to the junction of the North side of Dodd Street with the West side of Dag-lish Street; thence South along the West side of Daglish Street to the North side of Grantham Street; thence West along the North side of Grantham Street and its prolongation Westward to the Eastern boundary of Location Am; thence South along the Eastern boun-dary of Location Am and its prolongation to the North side of Cambridge Street; thence Westward along the North side of Cambridge Street to its junction with the prolongation Northward of the Eastern boundary of the prolongation Northward of the Eastern boundary of Location Ak; thence North along the said prolongation to the Southern boundary of Location Am; thence West along the Southern boundary of Location Am to its South-West corner; thence North along the Western South-West corner; thence North along the Western boundaries of Locations Am and 1251 to the North-Liast corner of Location 1911; thence Easterly to the South-West corner of Location Ao; thence North along the Western boundary of Location Ao and its prolonga-tion through Location 1347 and along the Western boundary of Queenscliff Road to the North-West corner of Location 2000 the North-West corner of Location 1296; thence. South-Easterly along the Northern boundary of Location 1296 to its junction with the prolongation Southwards, across the road, of the East side of Lake View Terrace; thence North along the East side of Lake View Terrace to the Northalong the Last side of Lake View Terrace to the North-ern side of North Beach Road: thence South-Fasterly along the Northern boundary of North Beach Road to its junction with the North side of Green Street: thence Fast along the North side of Green Street to the point of commencement on the East side of Main Street, as shown in red on the plan attached, P.W.D., W.A. 25536.

# BARMALDS AND BARMEN (METROPOLITAN).

(Registered 19th January, 1928.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this fifteenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, between the Western Australian Barmaids and Barmen's Union of Workers (hereinafter called the ''Union''), of the one part, and Thomas Lalor, James Noonan, Bartholemew Cornelius O'Brien, Lewis John Harris, and William Lightly, carrying on business in the State of West-een Australia (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the other part, witnesseth that for the consideration hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually cove-nant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

#### Definitions.

In this Schedule, and unless the context otherwise indicates, and without limiting the ordinary meaning of the term, "Barmaid" or "Barman" means any person ever the age of twenty-one (21) years employed for more than two (2) hours in any day in the sale of liquor by retail in any hotel licensed under a publican's general license, hotel license, or wine and beer license.

#### Wages.

2. (i) This Agreement is based on a basic wage of £4 5s. per week for males and £2 5s. 11d. per week for females.

(ii) The wages of a barmaid or barman shall be five pounds five shillings (£5 5s.) per week, without board and lodging, and shall be paid weekly.

(iii) Where the Board of Reference or the Union grants a permit for the employee to lodge and/or board on the premises of the employer, the sum of one pound five shillings (£1 5s.) may be deducted from the herein-before stipulated wages for board and lodging charges.

(iv) The Board of Reference shall consist of the Secre-tary of the Licensed Victuallers' Association, the Secre-tary of the Western Australian Barmaids' and Barmen's Union, with the Clerk of the Arbitration Court as Chairman.

#### Residence.

(i) Except as hereinafter provided, no barmaid or barman shall board and/or reside upon the licensed premises of the employer by whom she or he is employed. (ii) The above shall not apply to-

- - (a) any barmaid or barman who is the son or daughter of the licensee of the hotel in which she or he is working;
  - (b) any hotel to which, in the opinion of the Board of Reference, or the Union, it is inexpedient that it should apply.

#### Hours.

4. All work done in excess of forty-eight (48) hours in any one week, or of nine (9) hours in any one day, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a third, such evertime rates to stand alone and be paid for separate and apart from the ordinary week's wages.

Christmas Day, Good Friday, Sunday, Labour Day, and Anzae Day.
5. All work done on Christmas Day, and Good Fri-day and Sunday, shall be paid for at the rate of three shillings (3s.) per hour, or portion of an hour, in addi-tion to the weekly wage. All work done on Anzae Day and Labour Day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a third: Provided that Anzae Day remains as at pre-sent—virtually a Sunday in the trade. Should the sent-virtually a Sunday in the trade. Should the resent conditions under which it is honoured be altered, then the provision for payment of time and a third for that day be discharged automatically from this Agreement. Any overtime worked on Labour Day shall stand alone and be paid for separately and apart from the ordinary week's wages.

#### Race, Show, Sports, and Casual Hands.

6. (i) A barmaid or barman employed in booths on racecourses or at the Royal Show Ground, or as extra hand at hotels for football matches, shall be paid twentytwo shillings and sixpence (22s. 6d.) per shift.

(ii) All work done in excess of eight (8) hours in any one day shall be paid for at the rate of time and onethird.

(iii) A barmaid or barman employed at the Trotting Grounds shall be paid at the rate of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per hour, with a minimum of ten shillings (10s.). The time for starting work shall be the time she or he is told to be at the grounds.

(v) In cases not otherwise expressly provided for in this Agreement, a casual barmaid or barman may be employed for not less than eight (8) hours per day at twenty-two shillings and sixpence (22s. 6d.) per day.

#### Uniform.

7. Where the employers insist upon a barmaid or barman wearing a uniform whilst at work, the employer shall provide and maintain the same in a reasonable state of cleanliness. Should the washing of white coats be done by arrangement at the cost of the employee, the sum of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) shall be provided by the employer per week to defray this cost.

#### Meal Time.

8. A barmaid or barman shall be allowed one (1) hour between the hours of twelve (12) noon and three (3)o'clock in the afternoon for dinner, and on every even-ing when required to work after half-past six (6.30)o'clock, one (1) hour between the hours of five (5) and eight (8) o'clock for tea.

#### Weekly Half-holiday.

9. The weekly half-holiday shall commence not later than one thirty (1.30) p.m. on some one week day in each week: Provided that should it be agreed that a barmaid or barman shall work during their usual halfholiday, then they shall receive payment of one (1) day's wage over and above the usual weekly wage.

#### Holidays and Annual Leave.

10. A barmaid or barman shall be entitled to two (2) weeks' leave on full pay after the expiration of each twelve (12) months' service. Such leave may be applied for at any time after it becomes due, and in no case shall the money be paid instead of the holiday. A barmaid or barman whose services have been terminated bafene turble, here available the articled before twelve (12) months have expired shall be entitled to payment for one (1) day for each calendar month worked.

#### Notice.

11. Twenty-four hours' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either side.

#### Term.

12. This Agreement shall operate for a period of three (3) years from its date, there to be no alterations within that period excepting only in wages, which may be revised from time to time, at the request of either party, to bring them into conformity with periodic de-elarations of the basic wage (if any) made by the Arbitration Court.

#### Record Book.

13. (i) Each employer shall keep or cause to be kept at his business premises Record Books in which shall be entered the name of each worker, the time each worker commences and ceases work each day, the total number of hours, and the amount of overtime worked, the time worked on a Christmas Day, Good Friday, Anzae Day, Labour Day, and on any Sunday, and the amount of vages and overtime paid, and the worker's signature

for the same. (ii) The worker and the employer shall be jointly responsible for the proper posting of the Record Books daily

(iii) Such Record Books shall be so kept as to be open to and available for inspection by an accredited repre-sentative of the Union during business hours.

#### Schedule of Wages and Working Conditions.

14. Each employer shall keep on some portion of his business premises a copy of this schedule of wages and working conditions, where it shall be open to the inspection of the worker at all reasonable times.

#### Area.

15. This Agreement shall apply to the area comprised within a radius of twenty (20) miles from the General Post Office, Perth, and any portion of the Fremantle Licensing District situated beyond that radius.

#### Common Rule.

16. All parties to this Industrial Agreement hereby agree to have the same made a Common Rule.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this 26th day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, Detember, One thousand mine mindred and twenty-seven, between the Western Australian Barmaids and Barmen's Union of Workers, Perth, W.A., hereinafter called the "Union," of the one part, and the Fremantle Workers' Social and Leisure Club, of Fremantle, hereinafter called the "Employers," of the other part, whereby it is agreed as between the Union and the members thereof, and the employers and each of them that the terms, conditions, and provisions set out in the schedule hereof shall be binding upon the Union and the members thereof, and upon the employers and each of them, and that the said terms, conditions, and provisions shall be deemed to be and are hereby incorporated into and declared to form part of this Agreement, and it is further agreed that the Union and the members thereof, and the employers and each of them, shall respectively do, observe, and perform every matter and thing by the said terms, conditions, and provisions required to be done, observed, and performed, and shall not do anydone, observed, and performed, and snall not do any-thing in contravention of the said terms, conditions, and provisions, and shall in all respects abide by and observe and perform the same, and it is further agreed that this Industrial Agreement shall apply to the Fremantle Workers' Social and Leisure Club.

#### Definitions.

1. In this Agreement, unless the context otherwise indicates and without limiting the ordinary meaning of the term :--

"Barman" means any person over the age of twenty one (21) years usually employed in the sale or supply of liquor in a club which has obtained a license or certificate of registration, as the case may be, authorising the sale or supply of liquor under the provisions of "The Licensing Act, 1911," or any amendment thereto. "Usually employed" means employed as aforesaid for more than two (2) have a said

for more than two (2) hours during any day.

#### Wages.

This Agreement is based on the basic wage of £4 5s.

per week for males. 2. (1.) The wages of a barman shall be £5 10s. per week without board and lodging, and shall be paid weekly.

(1a.) No barman employed by the Fremantle Workers' Social and Leisure Club now in receipt of more than the wages herein referred to shall be reduced in wages during the operation of this Industrial Agreement.

#### Notice.

3. Twenty-four hours' notice of termination of employment shall be given on either side.

#### Overtime.

All work done in excess of forty-four hours in any 4. week or of nine hours in any one day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half: Provided that not more than three nine-hour days may be worked in any one week.

#### Hours.

Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's 5. work. The working week shall be from Monday to Saturdays inclusive.

The longest spread of shifts in any one day shall not be more than twelve (12) hours, with the exception of the weekly half-holiday, when the shift shall close at one (1) p.m. sharp on some one week-day.

#### Christmas Day, Good Friday, Labour Day, Sunday, and Anzac Day.

All work done on Christmas Day, Good Friday, 6. and Labour Day shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

Sunday and Anzac Day time when required to be worked shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

#### Uniform.

Where the employer insists upon a barman wearing uniform whilst at work, the employer shall provide such uniform, and shall maintain the same in a reasonable state of cleanliness. If the employer desires the employee to keep the uniform in a state of cleanliness, the sum of three shillings (3s.) per week shall be allowed.

#### Weekly Half-holiday.

8. The weekly half-holiday shall commence not later than one (1) o'clock on some one week-day in each week.

If through any unforeseen circumstances a barman is compelled to work on his half-day off, or any portion thereof, and cannot be given an extra half-day the following week, the rate of pay shall be a day's pay for the half-day or portion thereof worked.

#### Holidays and Annual Leave.

9. A barman shall be entitled to two (2) weeks' leave on full pay after the expiration of each twelve months' service. Such leave shall be taken when it becomes due; and further, that a barman whose service has been terminated before the twelve months have expired shall receive payment for one day for each month worked by him.

#### Record Book.

10. The employer shall keep or cause to be kept a Time and Wages Book, wherein shall be entered the name of each worker, and the wages due therefor. Such Time and Wages Book shall be signed daily, if correct, by each worker, and the employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the proper daily posting of the Time and Wages Book; such Time and Wages Book shall be kept in a convenient place and shall be open to inspection by a duly authorised representative of the Union.

#### Residence.

11. No barman shall board or reside on the premises of the Club where he is employed.

#### Term.

12. The currency of this Industrial Agreement shall be for three years from the date hereof: Provided, that after the expiration of twelve months from the date hereof, the parties may amend or revise this Agreement.

#### Area.

13. This Agreement shall have effect over the area iu which the Fremantle Workers' Social and Leisure Club shall have their premises.

#### AUSTRALIAN WORKERS' UNION (WESTRALIAN GOLDFIELDS MINING BRANCH) INDUS-TRIAL UNION OF WORKERS (APPLICANT), AND INGLISTON CONSOLS EXTENDED GOLD MINE AND OTHERS (RESPONDENTS).

#### Award of Industrial Board.

1. Term.—The currency of this Award shall be from the 17th day of January, 1928, to the 2nd day of August, 1929.

2. Area and Scope.—This Award shall operate over the Murchison, Yalgoo, Peak Hill, and Gascoyne Goldfields, and the area outside those goldfields in Western Australia comprised within the 24th and 26th parallels of latitude, and shall apply to all classes of mining.

3. Classifications and Rates of Wages: Basic wage at the rate of £4 5s. per week.

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The above wages are payable under a contract of daily service.

4. Allowances.—In addition to the wages prescribed in Clause 3 of this Award, an allowance of threepence per shift above the rate provided for the nearest town shall be paid for six days a week to workers employed at mines situated five miles from a Government railway line.

5. Hours:

years of age

(a) Forty-eight hours, exclusive of crib time, shall constitute a week's work for surface workers. If more than one shift is worked on the surface the forty-eight hours shall then be inclusive of crib time.

(b) Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work underground, including crib time.

(c) On Mondays to Fridays inclusive eight hours, including crib time, and on Saturdays four hours, excluding crib time, shall comprise a week's work for underground workers.

(d) A day's work on the surface shall be deemed to be satisfied if time of duty be eight and three-quarter hours on five days in each week and four and a quarter hours on one day.

(e) Six hours shall constitute a shift's work in all rises, or in sinking specially wet shafts and winzes, and for men engaged inside the gas or water spaces of any boiler or flue in cleaning or scraping work, and for men engaged in cleaning dustbins or dust flues. In case of boiler cleaners working broken shifts, one hour on the above description of work shall count as one hour and twenty minutes. In the case of Lancashire and Cornish boilers all time necessary for boiler cleaner to come out for a spell shall count as time worked in the boiler.

(f) For all men employed the hours of labour shall commence on the surface with the whistle, and shall end on the surface with the whistle.

6. Overtime:

(a) For work done beyond the hours of duty on any ordinary day, payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Work done on holidays shall be paid at double time, except work in connection with repairs to machinery which has broken down and caused a stoppage of operations.

(c) All work done on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a third, and any work done in excess of eight hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and double time thereafter, based on ordinary day rates.

(d) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time due to private arrangement between the employees themselves, or which is necessary for effecting periodical rotation of shifts, or which is owing to a relieving man not coming on at the appointed time. The time for which any worker may be paid at ordinary rates instead of overtime, due to a relieving man not coming on at the proper time, shall not exceed two hours, after the expiration of which overtime rates shall apply for the whole shift.

7. Wet Places.—In all wet or hot places eighteenpence extra per shift shall be paid in addition to the rates set out. This extra payment shall not apply to Subclause (e) of Clause 5. 8. Dry Crushing Plants.—No dry crushing plants

8. Dry Crushing Plants.—No dry crushing plants shall be operated unless under such conditions as obviate dust as far as is reasonably practicable. It shall be the duty of the Inspector of Mines to make an examination of all dry crushing plants in his district, once in each month, and at such other times as he may be requested so to do by the secretary of the Union. He shall examine and report to the State Court of Arbitration, and such report shall be *prima facie* evidence of the facts stated therein.

9. Piece-Workers.—There shall be implied in every contract in which a worker is engaged to perform any kind of work at or for a remuneration other than the rates fixed by this Award:—

(a) Where the engagement is for a period of time, such period shall not be determined before the expiration thereof without the written consent of the worker.

(b) Where the engagement is to perform a specified quantity of work, the amount of work to be performed shall not be curtailed by a greater amount than five per cent.

(c) The rate of remuneration agreed upon shall not be decreased during the engagement.

(d) The actual remuneration paid for the work done shall not be less than the amount which the worker would have received for the period of his work if he had been working for that period at the rate of wages fixed by this Award for the work done.

(c) The price of any article supplied by the employer for the use of the worker during the period of his engagement shall not be increased during the period.

(f) Where the work is to be carried out by a body of workers acting together, the number of workers to be employed shall be specified in the contract. In the event of the specified number of workers not being present during any shift, the employer may provide a substitute in the place of any worker absent, and shall pay such substitute wages at the rate fixed by this Award, or by the contract, whichever shall be the greater, for the work done by him during the time he is so employed as a substitute, and may charge such payment against any money found due under the contract.

for the work done by him during the time he is so employed as a substitute, and may charge such payment against any money found due under the contract. (g) Where any workers are employed to work by or with the contractors at a wages remuneration, the employer shall be entitled to pay the amount due to such wage workers for the period of their several employment by the rate fixed by this Award, or the rate fixed by the contract, whichever shall be the greater, and to charge the payment so made against the amount found due to the contractors.

(h) A copy of these conditions shall be kept exhibited in the Change Room on the mine.

10. Holidays.—The following shall be holidays:— Christmas Day, Easter Monday, and Labour Day. If Christmas Day falls on a Sunday the following Monday shall be kept.

shall be kept. 11. Casual Workers.—Men employed for less than one week shall be considered casual, and shall receive one shilling per shift above the rates specified for the work. This shall not apply to a worker who is employed as a substitute for a regular worker who has failed to give bis employer notice, when knocking off his previous shift, that he will be unable to work.

give bis employer notice, when knocking off his previous shift, that he will be unable to work. 12. Drinking Water.—Good drinking water shall be supplied on all levels where men are working, and kept cool and free from dust.

13. Free Water.—In all districts where free water is supplied by the employer, single men shall get three gallons and married men six gallons per day.

14. No Reduction.—Any worker who may be at the date of the signing of this Award in receipt of a higher rate of pay for his particular class of work than is herein prescribed shall not suffer by reason of this Award any reduction in the amount which such worker was receiving above the rate prescribed herein. 15. Mixed Functions.—Any worker carrying out

15. Mixed Functions.—Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate for two hours in any shift shall be paid at the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift: Provided that such minimum is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he be employed for less than two hours at work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole of the shift. 16. Change Rooms.—If more than four persons are employed underground in any mine in one chift arfi

16. Change Rooms.—If more than four persons are employed underground in any mine in one shift, sufficient accommodation shall be provided above ground near the principal entrance to the mine, and not in the engine room or boiler house, for enabling the persons employed in the mine to conveniently dry and change their clothes, and in no case shall men change their clothes upon a boiler.

Hot and cold water for wash bowls and showers shall be provided.

17. Reduction of Hands.—Should occasion arise to reduce the number of men employed the management, in selecting those to be retained, shall give full weight to the consideration of length of service, and, all things being equal, shall retain those who have been longest in the employ of the Company.

18. Accident Pay.—In the event of an employee meeting with an accident during the shift, or being required to attend to one who has met with an accident, he shall be deemed to have rendered duty during the whole of the shift, and be paid accordingly.

19. Full Payment for Shift.—(a) After beginning a shift, workers shall not be paid less than for a full shift, unless they leave of their own accord, or are dismissed for misconduct. This shall not apply in matters beyond the control of the management.

(b) If before an employee leaves the works at the end of his shift, and because he is not so informed, he attends at the next shift willing to work it, and there is no suitable work which he is allowed to perform, he shall be paid the wages he would have been entitled to if he had worked the shift he was ready and willing to work. This shall not apply in matters beyond the control of the management.

20. Payment of Wages.—Pay day shall be in accordance with Section 55 of "The Mines Regulation Act, 1906." Any worker leaving or being discharged shall be paid the full amount of wages due to him within one hour of ceasing work, or within one hour of the opening of the mine office, or, if such office was closed at the time of his ceasing work, or if the work done requires to be measured or assessed, within two hours of ceasing work, wherever same be practicable.

21. Hours in Hot Places.—No person shall be allowed to work for a longer period than six hours in any part of the underground working of a mine when the temperature in that part, ascertained by the reading of the wet bulb thermometer, exceeds 76 degrees Fahrenheit, for a period of four consecutive hours. The reading of the thermometer shall be ascertained at intervals of one half-hour, over four hours, and the average of such readings shall be taken as the temperature during that period. The Inspector of Mines shall take readings when required so to do by any worker, or by the secretary of the Union. A Workmen's Inspector may be present when readings are taken. The manager of the mine shall provide a wet bulb thermometer.

22. Annual Holiday.—A fortnight's holiday, including twelve working days, on full pay shall be granted once in each year to every worker, provided he has worked 298 shifts at ordinary rates of pay, and, should he have worked less than 298 such shifts when the said holiday is taken, or at the termination of his employment, he shall be paid for a proportionate number of holidays. Payment for the said holiday shall be at the rate of pay the worker is receiving immediately before the holiday is taken or employment terminated. Provided further, that where the worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct he shall not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this clause. A piece-worker shall be entitled to be paid, when on holiday, the minimum rate for his grade. Annual holidays shall be taken and at a time suitable to the convenience of the employer.

23. Underground Workers.—All men who have to go underground to work, and the bracemen, shall work the same hours as miners.

24. Explosives.—Any person using explosives where boring is necessary shall be classed as a miner.

25. Lime.—Lime used in the reduction of ore shall not be mixed in battery bins.

26. Provision of Oilers.—When employees are ordered to sink a wet shaft, the management shall provide an oilskin coat and hat when required. One such outfit per year, when necessary, shall be provided.

27. Collecting Union Fees.—A duly accredited official of the Union shall be allowed to collect Union fees at the offices of the mine on pay days, and shall be allowed to inspect time and pay sheets relating to any worker affected by this Award, and make extracts therefrom.

28. Definitions:-

"Wet places" --- Should any dispute arise as to whether any place is wet, or especially wet, within the meaning of Clause 5, Subclause (e), such dispute shall be referred to a Board constituted of a representative appointed by the employer and a representative appointed by the Miners' Union of which the worker concerned is a member, with the Warden of the Goldfield in which such mine is situated as Chairman. The decision

of the majority of the Board shall be final. "Timberman" (ordinary).—Timberman shall mean a worker engaged in underground timber work, but a miner timbering his own workings shall not be classed

as a timberman. "Timberman" "Timberman" (shaft).—A shaft timberman shall mean a worker engaged in shaft timbering or timber work, but a miner timbering his own shaft shall not be classed as a shaft timberman.

"Braceman" shall mean a worker in charge of a cage at the mouth of a shaft; if more than one cage, each worker shall be classed as a braceman, but shall not include any worker who may be temporarily assist-

not include any worker who may be temporarily assist-ing a braceman in loading. "'Platman'' or ''Skipman'' shall mean any worker in charge of a cage or skip: if more than one cage or skip, each worker so in charge shall be classed as a platman or skipman. 'Lander.''--A lander shall mean a worker in charge

of a main shaft where sinking is in operation and for landing where the material is hauled by bucket in lieu "Leading Fireman'' shall mean a fireman who

"Leading Fireman" shall mean a meman who attends to feed pumps, feed water, gauge glasses, etc., and/or where only one fireman is employed on more than one boiler, he shall be classed as in charge. "Hot Places" shall mean places underground, where the temperature exceeds 76 degrees Fahrenheit using

the wet bulb. "Winch Drivers."-Drivers of Holman hoists

friction winches shall not be deemed to be "Winch

drivers.'' ''Scalers'' shall mean men employed in a mine bar-ring down loose ground, but the term shall not apply to a miner scaling down his own workings. ''Platelayer.''-Platelayer shall mean a worker lay-'' remaining truck roads underground, or in open

ing or repairing truck roads underground, or in open

cuts, or on the surface. "'Pumpman.''-Pumpman shall mean a worker who attends to pumps, packing and replacing valves and minor repairs.

"Shaft pitman."-Shaft pitman shall mean a worker who is in charge of shaft pumps, lifts, and columns. "Roaster fireman."-Roaster fireman shall mean a

worker who is engaged in firing the roaster furnaces. "Timber dresser."—Timber dresser shall mean a

worker who prepares or dresses timber for use in the mine.
