#### Gage Roads to Owen Anchorage.

Alteration in Navigation Marks in "Naval Base" Channel across Success Bank.

#### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

FURTHER to Notice to Mariners issued by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners dated 28th March, 1927, and published in the Government Gazette of 1st April, 1927, describing the Naval Base Channel across Success Bank between Gage Roads and Owen Anchorage, which has been adopted in place of the old routes across this bank, now closed, the Commissioners now notify, for the information of those navigating vessels across Success Bank, that the undermentioned altera-tion has been made in the navigation leading marks for

the Channel, as follows, viz.:--The two pile beacons placed on the centre line of the Channel at its Southern end, one thousand feet distant form one another, for use as transit leads, have been altered by the Southernmost of these two marks being changed from a single pile holding a triangular beacon 16 feet above low water, to a three pile dolphin holding up an iron tripod on which is mounted a single pole with an inverted triangular beacon on top 36 feet above low water; the Northernmost mark has been altered by the triangular beacon mark being made an ordinary triangle in place of an inverted triangle as previously.

Both beacon marks are painted black and white in alternate horizontal stripes.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the provisions of Section 7 of "The Land Act, 1898," has been pleased to set apart and define the laud district in the Eastern Division to be known and distin-guished as Balwina Land District, the boundaries of which are as follows:

Bounded by lines starting from a point situate South 60 miles from the summit of Mt. Cornish and extending North passing through said summit to the latitude of 19deg. 30min. South; thence East to the East boundary of the State; thence South to a point due East of the starting point, and thence West to the said starting point.

#### REGULATIONS UNDER "THE LAND ACT, 1898," AND AMENDMENTS.

#### Land Board Regulations.

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 21st March, 1928.

Corres, 1995/10.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following regula-tions for the conducting of business of the Land Board, under Section 161 of "The Land Act, 1898," and its amendments.

C. G. MORRIS, Under Secretary for Lands.

1. The Land Board constituted under Section 14 (3) of "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1906," to deal with simultaneous applications for land, herein-after called the "Board," shall consist of three mem-bers duly appointed by the Minister, at least one of whom shall be an officer of the Lands and Surveys Department.

2. The Board shall elect its own chairman unless otherwise decided by the Minister.

3. The Board shall sit at such places and at such times as may be determined, and, if necessary, may adjourn from time to time.

4. There shall be an interval of at least three days between the closing of the date for applications and the date on which the Board sit. When the date of the Board has been fixed due notice will be sent to each applicant of the time, place, and date of the sitting of the Board; also a form of declaration for completion by him, should he be unable to appear before the Board.

5. Declaration forms, setting out particulars required by the Board, may be obtained at time of application at the Department, at Perth, or at any District Land and Survey Office, and if the applicant is unable to attend the meeting of the Board, he may make the declaration before a justice of the peace, a town clerk, secretary of a road board, electoral regis-trar, a postmaster, classified officer in the State or Commonwealth Public Service, a classified State school teacher, a member of the police force, or a commis-sioner for declarations under "The Declarations and Attestations Act, 1913."

Any statement, oral or otherwise, relating to means (financial or plant) shall be supported by documentary evidence, if so desired by the Board.

6. Railway tickets, at excursion rates, are granted to any person who has to appear before the Board, on production of a certificate issued by a duly author-ised officer of the Lands Department, and such certificates are obtainable on application to the Lands Department, Perth, or at any of the District Land Offices.

7. The Board shall take evidence on oath and may call any evidence or witnesses they think fit.

8. The Board shall sit in open court in connection with each block dealt with, and any objector may be allowed to give evidence or produce any documents for the inspection of the Board.

9. Members of the Board shall, in addition to being paid a travelling allowance of 12s. 6d. per day when absent from Perth on the business of the Board, receive such extra remuneration as may be approved by the Governor.

10. It shall be necessary for any person appearing before the Board on behalf of an applicant to produce to the chairman an order so authorising him to appear. 11. Any applicant for land or person appearing on behalf of an applicant who shall interview, prior to the sitting of the Board, any member of the Board, with a view to influencing an application, shall be disqualified both as an applicant and as an agent.

12. In all cases of adjudication the decision of the Board shall be final, and no applicant for land or any person acting on behalf of an applicant shall have the right to interview any member of the Board with a view to commenting on the decision arrived at.

No person shall interrupt the proceedings of 13. the Board, or cause a disturbance, and the Board may, if they think fit, while deliberating, order all persons present to retire at any time during the sitting of the Board, and such persons shall retire accordingly. Any person offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

14. There shall be a secretary of the Board, who shall be responsible for the proper recording and in-dexing of the minutes, and shall carry out all necessary work incidental to his position as may be required from time to time by the Board.

15. All previous regulations are hereby repealed.

# THE WYNDHAM MEAT WORKS EMPLOYEES.

### (Registered April 2, 1928.)

#### No. 12 of 1928.

AGREEMENT made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this First day of April, in the year One thousand nine hundred and twentyeight, between---

THE WYNDHAM FREEZING, CANNING, AND MEAT EXPORT WORKS (hereinafter known<sup>®</sup> as "the Employer"), of the one part,

and the following Unions, jointly and severally, hereinafter known as "the Unions," of the other part, namely---

- THE WEST AUSTRALIAN BRANCH OF THE AUSTRALASIAN MEAT INDUSTRY EM-PLOYEES' UNION INDUSTRIAL UNION OF WORKERS, PERTH,
- THE COASTAL DISTRICT COMMITTEE AMAL GAMATED ENGINEERING UNION OF WORKERS,
- THE WESTERN AUSTRALIAN BRANCH OF THE FEDERATED ENGINE-DRIVERS AND FIREMEN'S ASSOCIATION OF AUSTRAL-ASIA,
- THE W.A. BRANCH OF THE FEDERATED COOPERS OF AUSTRALIA, and

THE AUSTRALIAN WORKERS' UNION.

#### WHEREBY IT IS AGREED-

1. This Agreement shall apply in respect of the rates of wages and conditions of labour in connection with the tasks hereinafter mentioned at the Wyndham Meatworks.

# GENERAL CONDITIONS.

2. Clauses under this heading are to be operative only where not otherwise provided under the headings of Sections I. to VII.

#### DEFINITIONS.

3. In this Agreement, unless the context indicates otherwise, the following terms have the meanings, respectively, set out against them, that is to say:—

- (a) WEEK DAYS.—Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays.
- (b) A WEEK shall mean Monday to Saturday inclusive.
- (c) SHIFT WORK shall mean work done in time preceding, during, and following ordinary working hours by separate relays of employees.
- (d) "MUTUALLY AGREED" or "MUTUAL ARRANGEMENT" implies agreed between the Management of the Meatworks and the Union Executive at Wyndham or Perth in writing.

#### PREFERENCE.

<sup>4</sup>. Subject to Clause 5, preference of employment in respect of tasks for which rates of wages are specified in this Agreement shall be given to Members of the Unions who are parties to this Agreement, provided they are competent and qualified workmen and do their work to the satisfaction of the Management. The Employer may require a Medical Certificate of fitness in respect of any applicant for employment. The cost of obtaining such certificate to be borne by the Employer.

5. With respect to the employment of Watchkeeping Engineers, the Employer reserves the right to employ Members of any Union or Organisation who are qualified to perform the duties of Watchkeeping Engineers.

6. Subject to preference to Members of the Unions who are parties to this Agreement, the Employer shall have the right---

- (a) To select employees with due regard to their qualifications for their respective tasks;
- (b) To allot to employees their respective tasks:
- (c) In the case of an employee not fulfilling his task satisfactorily, to allot another task at the rate specified for such allotted task;
- (d) To transfer employees from one department or task to another whenever reasonably necessary to do so. In case of alleged unreasonableness the Board of Control can discuss with the Management;
- (e) To dispense with the services of any employee for incompetence, drunkenness, or unsatisfactory work.

#### GUARANTEE.

7. Subject to Clause 6 (c) and (e), a guarantee of 16 weeks' work from date of commencement of operations is given to each employee brought from Perth or Fremantle for the 1928 season. The rates applicable under this guarantee shall be the rates for the respective tasks for which employees shall have been engaged. The date of commencement of operations shall be a matter for mutual arrangement.

#### PAID HOLIDAYS.

8. Labour Day, Good Friday, Wyndham Cup Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day.

# PAID HOLIDAY RATES.

9. (a) When an employee does no work on a pail holiday he shall be entitled to wages at ordinary rate for a working day, hours or tally, as the case may be

(b) When an employee is required to work on a paid holiday, other than Labour Day dealt with in subclause (c), he shall be entitled to wages at double ordinary rate, with a minimum of a working day, hours or tally, as the case may be.

(c) When an employee is required to work on Labour Day he shall be entitled to double time in addition to the payment specified in subclause (a) of Clause 9.

#### CLOSE HOLIDAYS

10. Christmas Day and Sundays.

#### ORDINARY HOLIDAYS.

11. Anzac Day, Easter Monday, and King's Birthday.

#### HOLIDAY RATES.

12. For time or tally worked on holidays the rates shall be—

(a) On ordinary holidays, rate and a half;

(b) On close holidays, double rate;

with a minimum of two hours.

### WAITING TIME ALLOWANCES.

13. When (after expiry of the 16 weeks' guarantee), owing to completion or interruption or reduction of all or any of the operations from any cause, no employment is available for any employee who has been brought from Perth or Fremantle for the 1928 season, such employee shall be paid a waiting time allowance for each ordinary working day (excluding Sundays and holidays) as follows:--

- (a) Day wage employees-
  - Ordinary working hours for the day at half their respective task rates.
- (b) Contract slaughtermen—
   Half the minimum payment prescribed in Clause 50 (b).
- (c) Slaughterhouse assistants--
  - Half the minimum rates prescribed in Clause 59.

When an employee who is receiving Waiting Time Allowance is required to work "Outside of ordinary working hours" (Clause 21), he shall be paid (in addition to waiting time allowance) the overtime rates applicable to the work done.

#### CHANGE OF TASK.

14. When, owing to completion or interruption or reduction of all or any of the operations from any cause, no employment is available for an employee at his usual task, such employee shall, if so required by the Management, do any other work available and be paid the rate pertaining to his recognised task.

#### TRAVELLING.

15. Each employee brought from Perth or Fremantle for the 1928 season shall be entitled to-

- (a) Passage from Fremantle to Wyndham and travelling time allowance.
- (b) Passage (and travelling time allowance) by first available steamer from Wyndham to Fremantle after termination of work in his department, or when his services are not further required by the Management; provided that his duties have been performed to the satisfaction of the Management.
- (c) When such employee shall, at the request of the Management, remain in employment until the end of the succeeding season, he shall be entitled to receive payment in lieu of passage and estimated travelling time to Fremantle. This will not deprive such employee of his right to passage and travelling time (as above provided) at the end of such succeeding season.
- (d) When an employee shall have been requested by the Management to remain in employment (Clause 15 (c)), and the Management afterwards notifies that the employee's services will not be required for the succeeding season, the allowance to the employee, Clause 15 (c), shall be calculated in the proportion that the length of time he is retained bears to a period of twelve months, dating from 30th November of the current season.

16. Travelling time allowance referred to in Clause 15 shall be at the rate of Fifteen shillings (15s.) per day, and shall accrue from day of embarkation to day of landing, both inclusive.

# HOURS OF LABOUR.

17. Unless otherwise specifically mentioned herein, 44 hours shall constitute a week's work—divided into six working days as follows:—Five week days each eight hours, 40 hours; Saturday four hours, total 44 hours. A day's work shall therefore consist of eight hours on week days and four hours on Saturdays.

18. Daily rates of wages specified herein relate to a working day of eight hours.

19. Unless otherwise mutually agreed, ordinary starting time shall be 7.30 a.m. and ordinary ceasing time shall be 4.30 p.m. on week days and 11.30 a.m. on Saturdays.

20. Ordinary working hours shall comprise the hours between the ordinary starting time on any day and the ordinary ceasing time, exclusive of meal times and smokos.

21. "Outside of ordinary working hours" on any day means between midnight the previous day and starting time, and/or between ordinary ceasing time and midnight; also meal hours and smokos.

#### MEAL TIMES.

22. Unless otherwise mutually arranged, meal times shall be---

From	6.30	a.m.	to	7.30	a.m.
	11.30	a.m.	to	12.30	p.m.
	4.30	p.m.	to	5.30	p.m.
	11.30	p.m.	to	12.30	a.m.

#### SMOKOS.

23. Smokos of fifteen minutes each shall be paid for as working time and shall be allowed (at times to be mutually arranged) as follows:---

- (a) One smoko each forenoon worked, one smoko each afternoon worked, and one smoko after every two hours' continuous work done outside of ordinary working hours. This clause shall not apply to Engine Room and Boiler Room shift workers.
- (b) When employees are engaged on 12-hour shifts loading out frozen meat, three smokos each of 20 minutes will be allowed and paid for as working time for each 12-hour shift worked at the following times:—

24. When reasonably required by the Management, owing to exigencies of the work, employees shall forego their smoko until a more convenient time.

#### CRIBS.

25. (a) Employees engaged on loading and discharging steamers will be supplied with cribs as follows:—One crib at second smoko after commencing work after tea; one crib at second smoko after commencing work at 12.30 a.m.

(b) Shift workers engaged on 4 p.m. to midnight and midnight to 8 a.m. shifts will be supplied with one crib during their shift.

#### MINIMUM OF OVERTIME.

26. Subject to any mutual arrangement, employees called back to work, after a meal time, following ordinary ceasing time, shall be provided with the following minimum periods of work, or shall be entitled to payment for such:—

(a) On week days and Saturdays-two hours.

(b) On Sundays-four hours.

#### GENERAL.

27. The Management shall give the delegate reasonable notice of workers required to work overtime. The delegate shall then be responsible on behalf of the Union for supplying such workers. The Management shall give due regard to distribution of overtime.

28. When an employee works at more than one task on any one day he shall be paid for that day at the highest rated of such tasks.

29. Day wage employees shall be paid in the employer's time and contract and tallymen within reasonable time after ceasing work.

30. The employment and rates of pay of boys shall be a matter for mutual arrangement.

31. Wages shall be paid fortnightly in eash, or any employee may have his wages lodged to his credit with the State Savings Bank if he so desires.

32. Employees shall be provided without charge with accommodation in the quarters erected for that purpose, including stretcher, mattress, and pillow.

33. Each employee engaged under this Agreement who boards at the Works canteen agrees to have the amount of 25s, per week deducted from his wages fortnightly.

34. When employees under this Agreement are temporarily required to work away from the Works (outside of a two-mile radius) they shall be paid a victualling allowance of 6s. per day, provided it be found inconvenient to send a cook out with such employees.

35. All delegates shall be officially recognised by the Management.

#### DISPUTES.

36. Should any dispute arise as to the construction or meaning of this Agreement, or touching anything arising out of its operation, the work is nevertheless to be carried on without any interruption, and the matter in dispute shall be submitted to a conference between the Management and representatives of the Union concerned, such conference to be held at the Meatworks as soon as can be arranged.

37. Should no settlement be arrived at by above conference, the matter in dispute shall then be discussed between the Management and the local Board of Control of the Unions.

38. In the event of a settlement not being arrived at by discussion (referred to in Clause 37), the matter in dispute shall be submitted to the arbitration of an umpire to be chosen by one representative appointed for that purpose by the Employer and one representative appointed for that purpose by the Unions who are parties to this Agreement; and the decision of such umpire shall be final and conclusive. The umpire may determine by whom the costs of the arbitration shall be paid and may fix such costs. 39. Every reasonable facility will be afforded by both parties to enable arbitration to be completed within 12 hours of the beginning of any dispute in connection with Waterside work.

40. The rates of pay herein mentioned are based on a Basic Wage of £4 5s. per week for males.

# SECTION I.

# SECTIONAL CONDITIONS

### (pertaining to this Section).

41. Being responsible for the quality and condition of products, foremen may attend personally to such of the operations as they may consider necessary to ensure satisfactory results. Such operations include the making-up and attention to cold and hot pickles; the pumping and filterpressing of soups, and the finishing off of extracts, the setting and supervision of tinshop dies; the refining and weighing of tallow and edible fats and other processes of a like nature.

42. All freezing chamber employees working outside chambers shall be allowed 15 minutes for cooling down before entering freezing rooms.

### SHIFT WORK.

43. Shift of eight hours may be worked in departments where operations are continuous or where they require attention for more than twelve hours in the twenty-four.

44. Shift workers shall be entitled to the prescribed overtime rates for work done during Sundays, holidays, meal times or smokos. For other time worked outside of ordinary hours shift workers shall only be entitled to rate and a half for any time worked in excess of eight hours per shift.

#### OVERTIME.

45. Subject to any special provision herein, overtime rates shall be paid—

- (a) Outside of ordinary working hours—rate and a-half.
- (b) Meal times and smokos-double rates.
- (c) Sundays:
  - Midnight Saturday to 6 p.m.—double rates. 6 p.m. to midnight—treble rates.

46. Provided that ordinary rates and conditions shall apply during ordinary working hours, and rate and a-half for one hour before ordinary starting time or for one hour after ordinary ceasing time, to men doing preparatory or finishing work on preserving, cook room, cellarman handling meats for canning purposes, in any place set aside for curing purposes, open-air boners, retort and traymen, and chillroom men, as is now customary.

- 45 cattle per slaughterman per day on week days, and

Subject to the provisions of Clauses 57 to 59. as to the minimum wages per day, and subject also to Clauses 45 and 12 as to the overtime and holiday rates, beef slaughter house assistants shall be paid on tally rates based upon the numbers of cattle treated per slaughterman (*i.e.*, grounders and backers of the contract gang).

54. The tally rates specified hereunder are at per head of cattle treated per contract slaughterman, and relate to work done in ordinary working hours excepting holidays.

#### MUSICIANS (PERTH AND DISTRICTS).

(Registered 28th March, 1928.)

No. 11 of 1928.

THIS Agreement made, in pursuance of "The Indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this 28th day of trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this 28th day of March, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, between the Western Australia Musicians' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the one part, and the Entrepreneurs' As-sociation Industrial Union of Employers of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the employers"), of the other part, whereby it is agreed between the Union and members thereof, and the employers and each of them, diations of employment of musicians employed by the employers shall be as prescribed herein.

#### 1.-The Industry.

This Agreement relates to the industry of professional musicians-being an industry in or in connection with the theatrical, vaudeville, production, distribution, and exhibition of motion pictures, concerts, general amusements, and entertainments.

#### 2.---Parties Bound.

This Agreement shall be binding upon employers in respect of each and every person employed by them in the said industry, whether members of the Western Australian Musicians' Industrial Union of Workers or not, and upon the said Union and the members thereof.

3.—Definitions.

- In this Agreement— (a) "Weekly employee" means an employee engaged by the week; (b) "Intermittent weekly employee" means an
  - employee engaged for all night performances on which the theatre or place of amusement is regularly opened for less than six performances a week, and on other stated days or nights in each week as may be agreed upon between the employer and the employee;
  - (c) "Casual employee" means an employee engaged other than by the week; (d) ''Or any stoppage of work by any cause the
  - employer cannot reasonably be held respon-sible for," as mentioned in Clause 11 (g) means: that when any place of entertain-ment is closed by any Act of Parliament, any Government order, or Proclamation, the employer may deduct payment for any time the employee cannot be employed, through such Act of Parliament, Government order, or Proclamation ;
  - (e) "Orchestra" means an orchestra of three or more players;
  - "Conductor Lender" means the member of the (f)orchestra who plays and directs an orchestra ;
  - "Leader" is a first or principal violin in an (g) orchestra where there is a conductor.

#### 4.--Rate of Wage.

The minimum rate of wage to be paid by an employer who is a party to this Agreement to a musician em-ployed by him shall be the rates set out hereunder, and where a number of performances and/or rehearsals are prescribed in connection with any weekly rate, such pro-vision means that in respect of such weekly rate the employer in each week of the employment is entitled to the service so prescribed if he requires the employee to render such service, and the employee shall render such service if required to do so, and the rates set out hereunder are based on the basic wage of £4 5s. 0d. per week.

E2.-The leader in an orchestra, when there is a con. ductor, shall be paid, in addition to the amount received by each performer for general theatrical, picture shows, and other engagements for all work done by him an ad ditional sum equal to one-sixth of the rate prescribed for those not leaders.

#### F.—Playing an Extra Instrument.

Where an employee is required to play an extra in strument, the employee shall receive 12s. 6d. per week in addition to the ordinary rates.

#### G.-Special provisions as to Rehearsals.

H .--- The rates prescribed for rehearsals are for rehearsal between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m., pro-vided that where the rehearsal is with the actors, finishing time shall not be later than 4 p.m.; provided also that in continuous picture shows the rehearsal may start at 9 a.m., but such rehearsal shall be held in the place where the musician is usually employed, er in a place within half a mile thereof. The cost of trans-ferring the double bass and the drums shall be borne by the employer. Provided that the rehearsals in respect to night pictures theatres may be divided into three periods of one hour each, and held on three separate days between the hours of 6.30 p.m. and 8 p.m. Provided also, that should any person fail to attend a rehearsal such person shall be penalised to the following extent by paying to the employer a sum equal to what he, the musician, would have been paid had he attended such rehearsal.

H2.-Rehearsals after 4 p.m. and concluding not later than 11 p.m.-15s. each.

H3.-Except where players are engaged in weekly en-gagements of two performances each day, no rehearsa! shall be held on the same day as a matinee unless paid for as a performance, except on Saturdays, when a re-hearsal may be held at ordinary rates.

-Where a performance is held on any day, not more than one rehearsal shall be held on that day, unless such extra rehearsal is paid for as a performance; provided, that where one rehearsal is held on any such day, and such rehearsal is continued beyond the period of three hours, overtime only shall be paid in respect of the period by which such rehearsal exceeds three hours. In respect of an employee in receipt of a weekly wage under section B of clause 4, more than one rehearsal may be held on any one day, where there is no performance on that day, but the rehearsals (with performances, if any) in respect of which the weekly wage is paid are seven or thirteen, as the case may be, in any week and no more. Provided, that if the employees desire an ad-journment for luncheon before the rehearsal is finished, or if the actors refuse to go on before the rehearsal is finished without an adjournment for luncheon, then the huncheon period (not exceeding one hour) is not to be included when calculating the period from which overtime is to be paid.

5.-No deduction for Meals supplied. No deduction from any of the rates herein prescribed shall be made for meals supplied by an employer to an employee.

#### 6.—Time of Performance.

Where members employed in an orchestra are ready and prepared to start playing at the time when the members are notified by the employer to be ready to start playing, such time shall be the starting time. In cases where no such notification is given it shall be deemed that such members were notified to be ready to start playing at the advertised time for starting the performance. Where members are not ready and prepared to start at the time notified, or at the advertised

time of the performance or rehearsal, the starting time shall be the time when the orchestra actually starts playing.

7.-Duration of Performance and Rehearsals.

Except where otherwise provided, the duration of the performance for which the rates are prescribed by this Agreement for weekly, intermittent weekly, or casual employees are as follows:—

- (a) In picture shows, two and three-quarter hours;
- (b) In general theatrical performances other than pantomime, three hours, and in pantomime until the end of the performance; if the performance is longer in duration than such hours, all time in excess shall be paid for at overtime rates;
- (c) Rehearsals shall not exceed three consecutive hours in duration, between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m., or where the orchestra is rehearsing with the actors, between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.; provided that if the employees desire an adjournment for luncheon before the rehearsal is finished, or if the actors refuse to go on before the rehearsal is finished without an adjournment for luncheon, the luncheon period (not exceeding one hour) is not to be included when calculating the period from which overtime is to be paid. Luncheon adjournment shall be between 12 noon and 2 p.m. Overtime shall be paid if the rehearsal continues beyond 3 p.m., or where the rehearsal is with the actors beyond 4 p m.
- (d) Where a performance exceeds two and onequarter hours an interval of ten minutes shall be allowed and such interval shall be included in the time worked.
- (e) Where a casual employee is employed for a performance exceeding four hours, such employee shall, unless meals are provided, be paid not less than 3s. 6d. for refreshment expenses in addition to the rates herein set out.
- (f) Whenever it happens that an employer or his representative requires an orchestra, or any member or members thereof, to play over any part or parts of a production immediately after a matinee performance of same has been completed, for the purpose of rectifying or rearranging any part of the score or performance of the play, the musicians so employed shall be paid overtime rates as prescribed in Clause 8 (a) of this Agreement; provided, that the orchestra or such member or members thereof shall not be kept more than one hour for such purpose.

# 8.-Overtime.

(a) Where the limit for any rehearsal or performance is exceeded, the amount to be paid shall be 1s. 6d. for each fifteen minutes or portion thereof up to midnight, and 2s. 6d. for each fifteen minutes or portion thereof after midnight.

(b) Where the time limit for any performance is exceeded, the first five minutes shall not be considered as overtime. All overtime worked shall be considered weekly in the aggregate and shall be paid for at the rate above described; provided that no overtime shall be payable on the first night of general theatrical productions which are produced for at least six nights at the theatre, to which the proviso is applied; the alteration in items of a production shall not constitute a new production.

# 9.—Provisions as to Overtime, etc., apply to all Employees.

The provisions of this Agreement as to duration of performance or rehearsal, time of performance or rehearsal, and overtime, apply to all employees, whether casual or otherwise.

#### 10.-Lower Rates may be agreed.

When the Union executive agrees with any respondent that for special reasons lower rates should be accepted by the employee, rates may be fixed at such rates as may be agreed upon between the parties.

#### 11.-The Contract of Employment.

(a) Where an employee is not expressly engaged as a casual employee shall be deemed to be engaged as a

weekly employee or an intermittent weekly employee (as the case may be). A casual employee may at any time enter into an agreement with his employer to become a weekly employee, but such agreement shall not affect any casual rates payable by the employer to the employee before such agreement is entered into: Provided, that if a casual employee is employed as a weekly employee within three days of his employment as a casual employee his employment as a weekly employee shall in such case date from the beginning of his employment.

(b) An employee to become entitled to the payment of the wage prescribed for a weekly employee or for an intermittent weekly employee is to perform such of the prescribed work as the management shall from time to time require, on the days and during the hours usually worked by the elass of employees affected.

(c) Any employee not attending for duty will lose his pay (at the employer's option) for the actual time of such non-attendance.

(d) The weekly wage prescribed by this Agreement shall be paid to each weekly employee and intermittent employee who is ready and willing to perform his stipulated work during any week, whether he is required to perform such work or not, and this provision is to apply to all engagements whether for open-air performance or otherwise.

(e) The employment of a weekly employee or of an intermittent weekly employee is to be terminated only by a week's notice on either side, but such notice may be given at any time during the week. This shall not affect the right of the employer to dismiss any employee without notice for malingering, inefficiency, neglect of duty or misconduct, and in such cases wages are to be paid up to the time of dismissal.

(f) Where an employee is engaged as a weekly employee for any fixed number of performances per week, such engagements shall not be altered to a weekly engagement for which a less sum is prescribed by this Agreement, except on a week's notice to the employee.

(g) The employer may deduct payment for any day the employee cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the claimant organisation or of any other union, or through any breakdown of machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause the employer cannot reasonably be held responsible for, other than the weather.

#### 12.—Discrimination.

When engaging a musician employers shall not dis criminate against the members of the claimant organisation.

#### 13.-Sundays and Holidays.

Work done (whether a performance or rehearsal) on Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday shall be paid for at the rate of double time. Work done on any other holiday shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter; provided, that where the regular weekly rehearsal is held on such other holiday, the payment to be made in respect thereof shall be 5s. in addition to the ordinary weekly wage covering such rehearsal. The following days are holidays for the purpose of the Agreement:—The day observed as New Year's Day, Anniversary Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzae Day, Eight Hours' Day, King's Birth day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, and, in addition, all other days which are proclaimed by the Federal Government as public holidays, or are regarded and ob served as holidays throughout the States of the Commonwealth. Provided, that a member of the claimant organisation shall not be entitled, when he moves from one State to another, to more than one of such holidays, by reason of the fact that any such holiday is observed on one day in one State and on another day in another State.

#### 14 .- Travelling Allowance and Transit.

(a) For all engagements or performances outside a 30-mile radius of the city or town where the musician is engaged, the employee shall be provided with firstclass return boat or train accommodation; provided, that on the journey from Port Angusta to Kalgeorlie, the employee shall be provided with second-class accommodation; provided, also, that when a poat exceeds 6,000 tons, or where such boat carries first, second and third-class passengers, the employee shall, is required to

do so, accept second-class accommodation. In addition to the rates herein set out, the employee shall be allowed fil for the trip from Adelaide to Perth, and 10s. for the trip on board any ship, and all other cases 10s. for each day (including Sunday) in ældition to the rates herein set out. The engagement and allowance starts herein set out. The engagement and allowance starts from the first day and from the place where the em-ployee first starts travelling. Where the part spent in travelling of the starting and of the part so spent of the returning day are together not more than 24 hours, 10s. shall be paid for the whole combination of such parts; where they are more than 24 but not note than 36 hours, 15s, shall be paid, and where they are more than 36 hours, 20s. shall be paid.

Provided, that where the employee starts and returns from the trip of the same day, 10s. shall be paid in respect of that day.

Employees when travelling by train at night shall be provided with sleeping accommodation. If such sleep ing accommodation is not provided, the employee shall be paid the sum which is charged to the public by the appropriate Railway Department for such sleeping accommodation.

(b) In all casual engagements where the employee has to pay more than 6d. for fares, the employer shall pay cost of return transit, computed as from the post office in the city or town where the musician is engaged.

15.-Performing outside the Orchestra Pit or Well.

(a) Where an orchestra is required to perform on the stage in view of the audience, each performer shall re-ceive not less than 2s. 6d. per performance, or 15s. per weck in addition to the rates hereinbefore prescribed.

(b) Where a member of the orchestra is required to play either solo, or as one of a duet, trio, or playing other than as part of a complete orchestra in view of the audience, he shall receive not less than 3s. per performance, or £1 per week in addition to the rates fixed by this Agreement.

#### 16.-Supply of Music, etc.

(a) Where the music is supplied by the employee and not by the employer, the employee shall be paid 10s. 6d. per week in addition to the rates hereinbefore prescribed.

(b) The rates prescribed by this Agreement do not include any sums to be paid to a conductor leader, or leader, or any other employee for arranging parts, or doing any orchestration.

17.-Time when Employee is to be paid.

An employee shall be paid all moneys due to him under this Agreement within 48 hours from the termination of his engagement.

#### 18.-Supply of Uniforms.

Where an employee is required to wear special uniform other than evening dress, such uniform shall be supplied by the employer and must be clean and in good condition. Cost of renovation, etc., must be paid by the employer.

#### 19.-Employer to keep Books.

The employer shall keep books, properly posted in ink, showing the names and times worked by each employee and the amount paid to each employee. Such record or time book shall on demand be produced by the employer for inspection to an official of the claimant organisation, duly authorised in writing by the president or secre-tary of the claimant organisation at the place where the record or time book is kept, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. on any day, except pay day. No authority to inspect shall be given by the claimant organisation unless the president or the secretary has good reason to suspect a breach of the Agreement has been committed by the employer whose time sheets are to be inspected. One day's notice to be given to the employer of any intended inspection.

#### 20.—Area.

This Agreement shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of twenty-five niles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

#### 21.---Term.

This Agreement shall continue in force for a period of three years from its date; provided, that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from its date the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.
