WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements.—Perth Municipality.—Proposed 30-inch diameter water main, commencing at the 30-inch diameter main in Vincent Street and extending thence along Ethel Street, Grosvenor Road, Norfolk Street, and Burt Street to the 18-inch main in Walcott Street; length about 65½ chains; together with valves, specials, and all necessary appraratus, as indicated in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 4700.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 19th day of May, 1928.

THE DOG ACT (AS AMENDED BY "THE DOG ACT AMENDMENT ACT, 1922").

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has approved of the following Regulations, numbered 1 to 9, under the provisions of "The Dog Act, 1903," as amended by "The Dog Act Amendment Act, 1922," to come into operation in every Municipal and Road District throughout the State on and from the 1st day of July, 1928:-


The Dog Act (as amended by "The Dog Act Amendment Act, 1922").

All Regulations previously made under the Act shall be and are hereby repealed as from the 30th day of June, 1928.

2. These Regulations shall come into operation and have the force of law in every district throughout the State on and from the 1st day of July, 1928.

State on and from the 1st day of July, 1928.

3. The registration label for the financial year ended the 30th June, 1929, required by Section 9 of "The Dog Act, 1903," as amended by "The Dog Act Amendment Act, 1922," is hereby prescr.bed to be a flat piece of brass, of the size and shape depicted hereunder, inscribed with the name of the district, the year of registration, and the registration number on the obverse side and the emblem of the State flag upon the reverse



4. The registration label, as prescribed to these Regulations, shall be securely affixed to a collar and continually worn round the dog's neck.

5. Registration shall be effected on or within 21 days from 1st day of July, 1928.
6. The registration fees for dogs shall be as set forth in the Third Schedule to the principal Act, as amended by Sections 5 and 16 of the amending Act of 1922, namely:

(a) Dogs, 7s. 6d.; bitches, 10s. (except those used for tending cattle and sheep);
(b) When any person makes use of any dog or dogs when any person makes use of any dog or dogs in or about the droving or tending of not less than five head of great cattle or twenty head of small cattle, he shall, on making application in the prescribed form, be entitled to register any such dog at half the prescribed rate, namely:—Dogs, 3s. 9d.; bitches, 5s.

7. The description of cattle shall be as set out in the Second Schedule of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," namely:—Horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, mule, bull, ox, cow, heifer, calf, camel, deer, and foal—"Great Cattle." Ram, ewe, sheen, wether, and lamb, good bridge and side (Second sheep, wether and lamb, goat, kid, and pig—"Small Cattle."

8. The form for application is hereby prescribed as Form "A" in the Fourth Schedule to "The Dog Act, 1903," as issued by the Department of Works and Labour, It must be stated definitely in the last column of the form the number of cattle or sheep for which the dog is used for tending.

9. Any person or persons who contravene any provisions of these Regulations, whether by act or omission shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

Plans and Specifications of Buildings.

3. No dwelling-house, residence, shop, factory building nor public building as mentioned in paragraph 2 shall be commenced or alterations to an existing buildshall be commenced or alterations to an existing building begun until a plan and specification thereof, in accordance with Regulations 2 and 3 of the Building Regulations, the Second Schedule of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," and Section 122, Subsection (1), of "The Health Act, 1911-1919," be submitted to the Surveyor, the license fees paid, and his approval on behalf of the Board, obtained for the proposed works. At the same time a locality plan, and also a plan or tracing not less than 22in. by 15in. in size of the ground plan (scale 8ft. to 1in.) of all buildings, showing the size of all rooms, positions of doors and windows, the thickness of walls, and the covered floor area of such thickness of walls, and the covered floor area of such buildings, and the relative position of all boundaries, out-buildings, proposed drains, and dry-wells; also the relative position and nature of building on the adjoining property, if within 10ft. of the common boundary, shall be deposited with the Surveyor, to remain permanently in his custody.

7. Rooms intended for sleeping in shall not be less cubic capacity than five hundred (500) cubic feet and less height than ten (10) feet. Where a skillion is erected, height at the lowest side shall not be less than eight (8) feet.

All other rooms shall not be less than ten (10) feet

in height.

8. Every person offending against the provisions of these By-laws shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds (£10).
