P.W. 2075/24. WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a Local Authority to exercise within its district any power of making regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4 of Part IV. of the said Act; And whereas it is advisable to empower the Balingup Road Board to prohibit the passage of heavy Balingup Road Board to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over specified roads within its district, and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for such purpose: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby empower the Balingup Road Board, by the by-law in schedule hereto, to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over specified roads within its district, and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for such purpose, and to impose a penalty not exceeding £20 for the breach thereof. breach thereof.

THE TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-26.

Balingup Road Board,

The Balingup Road Board, pursuant to an Order in Council under Section 43 of "The Traffic Act, 1919and in exercise of the power thereby conferred,

doth hereby make the following By-law, to have effect within the Balingup Road District:—

The passage of heavy traffic over Mardawarra Road, within the Balingup Road District, is hereby prohibited during the months of June, July, August, and Septem-

ber in every year.

For the purpose of this By-law "Heavy Traffic" means:—The traffic of all vehicles engaged in the carriage or conveyance of timber or of sleepers, or other sawn, hewn, or split timber, firewood, bricks, stone, gravel, metal, salt, lime, cement, farming produce or other material in bulk, and the traffic of any vehicle the weight whereof (including any load) exceeds twolve hand, waights her wheel exceeds twelve hundred weights per wheel

Any person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not ex-

ceeding £20.

FURTHER to notice to Mariners issued by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners dated 28th March, 1927, and published in the Government Gazette of 1st April, 1927, and to Notice issued similarly dated 22nd June, 1928, and published in the Government Gazette of 6th July, 1928, the channel across Success Bank has again been sounded and compass bearings of the channel checked.

Navigators have reported that their vessels tended to sheer in the channel about 2,000 feet distant from the Northern entrance buoys. Soundings taken over this spot have revealed a bank, apparently of sand, extending for some 600 feet along the Western edge of the channel, from about 2,000 feet from the Northern entrance buoys to about 2,600 feet along the channel, and extending into the channel to about half-way between its Western edge and the centre line. The least water found on this bank was 18 feet 6 inches at low water.

As it evidently is the existence of this bank that caused the tendency to sheer, which had been reported, mariners are advised to keep as far away from it as possible, and to watch carefully the actions of their ships when passing it.

The compass bearing of this channel has again been checked, and it is found to be 170° True, corresponding with South 5° East Magnetic.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act; 1897."

Acting Under Secretary for Lands.

PUBLIC CEMETERY, WINCHESTER. 1.

By-laws.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Winchester, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:-

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application to the Trustees.

Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.

All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Just ce's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at

least five working hours as above.
4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as

and when required.

Before any interment is allowed the "Order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the grave-

digger.

- Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six mches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.
- 7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.
- 8. No burgal shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.
 - 9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

 1st September to 30th April—Week days, from
 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.

1st May to 31st August-Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to

5 p.m.; and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

- 10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.
- No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of ten years entering the

- cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

 13. It shall be unlawful—for any person to smoke within the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks
- 14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any crection,

commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement

whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive right of bur.al" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Tructors on writing specific the least in figure 1.

Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Subject to the By-laws, the Secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule. in the Schedule.

22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a

vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cometery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of

the grave.

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the

material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall,

before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit-with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws is not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct: and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in, broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

31. No catacomb shall be allowed.

32. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions

(a) By the deletion of the words "or in chemical plumbing" where they occur in the paragraph preceding the last paragraph of the said clause.

(b) A new paragraph is added immediately before the last paragraph of the said clause as fol-

lows:—
"Chemical Plumbing: In Chemical and Manure Works journeymen plumbers engaged on all repairs and renewals on superphosphate mixing plants and pyrites furnaces shall receive one and one half-pence per hour additional to the rate prescribed."

(e) The last paragraph of the said clause is deleted and the following paragraph inserted in lieu

thereof:

"Any licensed journeyman plumber called upon to use his license for his employer on work for which a permit from the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Department is necessary in the first instance shall, for such time as he is himself actually engaged upon such work pursuant to such permit, be paid 1s. per hour in addition to

the ordinary rate herein prescribed.''
C.—A new clause, to be called 3 (a), is inserted im-

mediately before Clause 4, as follows:—
'3 (a). The contract of employment shall be an hourly one, terminable on either side by one hour's notice, and the worker shall, in the event of notice, be entitled to payment up to the hour when such notice terminates.''

D.—This Agreement shall have effect as from the eighteenth day of June, 1928. In all other respects the parties hereto confirm the said recited Agreement.
