The Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1926, ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 35 of "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1926," that the Governor may make regulations prescribing all matters which by this Act are required or permitted to be prescribed, or which it may be necessary or convenient to prescribe for giving effect to this Act: And the Governor made regulations declaring Fruit Fly (Ceratitis capitata) to be a disease to which the provisions of Section 8A of the said Act should apply, and for the prevention and eradication of such disease, and the said regulations were published in the Government Capatana or the 27th deep of Name. in the Government Gazette on the 27th day of November. 1925: And whereas it is now deemed expedient to repeal the said regulations and to make other regulations in lieu thereof: Now, therefore, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby repeal the said regulations published in the Government Gazette on the 27th day of November, 1925, as from the date of the publication

hereof in the said Gazette, and doth hereby make in lieu thereof the regulations hereinafter mentioned to take effect as from the publication hereof in the Government Gazette, namely:

- 1. Fruit Fly (Ceratitis capitata) is hereby declared to be a disease to which the provisions of Section 8A of "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1926," shall apply.
- 2. In every orchard containing from one tree to two hundred trees inclusive where fruit fly (Ceratitis capitata) exists the occupier shall do or cause to be done the following things, namely:-

(a) gather all fallen fruits from the ground at least once in every 24 hours;
(b) gather all fruits infested with larvae of fruit

fly (Ceratitis capitata) from the ground and trees at least once in every 24 hours and destroy the same by boiling;

(c) place in each tree fruit fly lure contained in two

suitable containers, and made in accordance with the formula prescribed in Regulation 3, and empty and refill all containers with fresh fruit fly lure at least once in every seven days during such time as the fruits in the orchard are in such a state of growth and ripeness as may enable fruit fly (Ceratitis capitata) to use the same as a depository for eggs.

3. The formula for making fruit fly lure for use as provided by Regulation 2 (c) is as follows:—Pollard, 8 ozs.; powdered borax, 8 ozs.; arsenate of soda. (poison), ¼ oz.; water, 1 gallon. The ingredients must be steeped for 12 hours and the amber liquid then drawn off and be used in the manner prescribed.

In every orchard containing more than two hundred trees where fruit fly (Ceratitis capitata) exists the occupier shall comply with all the provisions of Regulation 2, save and except that, instead of complying with the provisions of paragraph (c) of the said regulation, he may apply or cause to be applied to the trees having fruits thereon with a hand syringe or small spray pump fruit fly bait made in accordance with the formula prescribed in Regulation 5, using not less than one gallon of bait to every eighty trees at least once in every seven days, during such time as the fruits are in such a state of growth and ripeness as may enable fruit fly (Ceratitis capitata) to use the same as a depository for

The formula for making fruit fly bait for use as provided in Regulation 4 is as follows: -Powdered arsenate of lead, 2½ ozs.; molasses, 4 lbs.; fruit syrup (preferably orange), 1 gallon; water, 3 gallons.

Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty-five pounds.

THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1906.

Municipality of Claremont.

P.W. 1552/25.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Claremont made under Part XV. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," for the regulation and control of buildings for dwellings and numbered Section 50 of By-law 123: In pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Municipality of Claremont doth hereby order as follows:—

Section 50-Repeal.

Section 50 of By-law 123, made by the Municipality of Claremont under the powers of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and published in the Government Gazette dated 31st July, 1914, is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

Section 50-By-law 123.

50. No person shall erect, or cause to be erected, any building which is to contain any habitable room or rooms, unless the following provisions are complied with:—

(a) every such room shall have a cubic capacity of not less than eight hundred cubic feet;

(b) every such room shall be in every part at least ten feet six inches in height from the floor to the ceiling;

- (c) every such room shall have at least one window opening directly into the external air, and the total superficial area of such window, or, if there be more than one such window, then the total superficial area of all such windows shall be exclusive of the sash frames and clear of all obstructions equal to at least one-twelfth of the floor area of such room, and every such window shall be so constructed that a portion of it equal to at least one twenty-fourth of such floor area can be opened, or, if there be more than one such window, then the aggregate of the portions which can be opened of all such windows shall be equal to at least one twenty-fourth of such floor area, and the opening of every such window shall extend to a height of at least seven feet above the floor level of such room:
- room;
 (d) For the purposes of Subclause (d) a window opening directly into the external air shall be deemed to mean either—
 - (1) a window facing directly and without any obstruction on to a public street,
 - road, or way; or

 (2) a window facing on to an air space which shall be without any overhead obstruction and which shall be enclosed on not more than three of its sides, and which, when the building is of one storey only, shall be not less than six

feet, and when the building is of more than one storey, shall not be less than eight feet in width throughout its whole length and height: Provided that, when such window faces the boundary of the allotment upon which the building is erected, then every part of such window shall, when the building is of one storey only, be not less than three feet, and when the building is of more than one storey, shall be not less than four feet, measured at right angles from the boundary of the said allotment, and every part of the wall in which such window is situated shall, throughout its whole length in one direction at least from such window, when the building is of one storey only, be not less than three feet, and when the building is of more than one storey, be not less than four feet measured at right angles from the boundary of the said allotment;

- (e) every such room, whether used or to be used for the purpose of habitation, or for the assemblage of people for any purpose whatsoever, shall be well and properly ventilated by the insertion of air-bricks below the floor, and by openings in the sleeper walls, also by inlet ventilators in the walls, and by outlet ventilators in the ceiling, or at the top of the walls, of such rooms, with sufficient flues and pipes thereto, according to the position and size of each room;
- (f) every basement room having a weeden floor, other than a floor constructed of solid wood bedded on concrete, shall have a sufficient space between the ground and the under side of the floor to admit of ventilation by means of air flues formed in the wall connected with air-bricks or otherwise above the ground level.
