Evidence of the necessity for such attendance shall be furnished before the grant of leave, and a certificate of attendance shall be produced to the Permanent Head at the conclusion of the camp, school, class, or course of instruction.
- 2. Leave of absence granted in pursuance of this regulation may, at the option of the officer, be deducted from recreation leave due and, in respect of the period so deducted, shall be granted with full pay. If not so deducted, it shall be granted without pay, unless the amount of pay which the officer would have received if he had been on duty exceeds the amount of pay, excluding pay for Sundays and holiday, received as a member of the Naval or Military Citizen Forces, in which case he shall be paid the difference.

- 3. Leave of absence with full pay may be granted by the Permanent Head—
 - (a) to officers who are Senior Cadets to perform the training required by Section 127 of "The Defence Act, 1903-1918," which the officers are required to perform within the ordinary hours of duty; and

THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919.

Koorda Road Board -- By-laws.

P.W. 919/28.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any district is empowered to make bylaws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Koorda Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act, and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following Palawa. ing By-laws:-

Part 1.—Interpretation.

1. In these By-laws the interpretation set out in "The Road Districts Act, 1919," shall apply, in addition to which the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them in the Road Districts Act, or respectively, that is

The Act-"'The Road Districts Act, 1919," and all amendments thereto which may hereafter come into force.

Board-The Koorda Road Board.

Board Room shall be the office, hall, or building in which the meeting of the Board is held from time to time.

District—The District under the jurisdiction of the

Koorda Road Board.
Secretary—The Secretary of the Board.
Chairman—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.
Member—A member of the Board, and includes the

Chairman.

Road or Reserve Any road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board. Person shall include the plural and also a body

corporate.

Footpath or Footway shall include any part of the roadway set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, and whether the same be made or kerbed or otherwise.

Permission of the Board-The consent of the Board given in writing. All other interpretations to be prescribed in the Road Districts Act, or other Acts or Regulations thereunder.

Duties of Secretary.

- 2. The duties of the Secretary shall be:-
- (a) To attend all Board meetings;
- (b) to attend all Committee meetings;
- (c) to take notes of minutes, and prepare reports of Committees;
- (d) to conduct all correspondence, and to give the other officials instructions, as directed by the minutes, and carry out the resolutions of the Board as contained in such minutes;
- (e) to answer all questions on the Board's business; (f) to see that the accounts are audited quarterly, and the balance sheets prepared and published in the Government Gasette yearly, and any other duties specified under "The Road Dis-

tricts Act, 1919.''
(g) to prepare and place before the Board the monthly financial statement at the end of each month of the financial year;

- (h) to supervise the preparation of the Rate Books and the Board's electoral lists, to examine proof of the latter, and to arrange for the distribution of copies prior to the elections; also to attend all Courts of Revision or appeal; to make the necessary arrangements for the elections, to issue instructions to the supervisor, in accordance with the Board's resolutions;
- (i) to summon the members to Board and Committee meetings;

(j) to keep all books up to date, in accordance with instructions issued by the Minister and additional instructions of the Board;

(k) to check all accounts sent into the Board, and see that all accounts for works have stated in them the authority under which such works have been done, and to check all returns made by the collector or other of the Board's officers, and see that the counterfoils of the receipt and see that the counteriors of the recept book accompany all returns; to supervise and attend to the due payment of all moneys coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board; (1) to report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto

(m) to see that no payments to the credit of the Board shall be made by any officer except through the Secretary, or such other officer as

may be acting temporarily in that capacity;
(n) to readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and to attend to all other matters affecting the finances and welfare of the Board and not herein speci-

(o) to see that all bonds and other forms of security. to be taken from the contractors are prepared and that the security required of servants is taken within due time, and report as to such matters to the Board;

(p) to report to the Chairman any servant of the Board who has been guilty of any neglect of

duty, or who is incapable of performing the duties allotted to him;

(q) to exercise, subject to any directions given by the Board or Chairman, control over all servants of the Board;

(r) to see that no receipt is on any other than the forms prescribed by the Acts and Regulations under which authority is given for the issue of such receipts;

(s) to be responsible for the issue of receipts on the proper prescribed forms, and that all receipts

issued are in proper sequence.

Appointment of Officers.

- 3. No permanent appointment shall be made to any office under the Board until after an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such an appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.
- 4. The election of all officers shall be conducted by a show of hands unless a ballot be demanded.
- The salary or allowance attached to the office under consideration of the Board shall be fixed in all cases preceding the appointment, and the salary of any officer when fixed shall not at any time be considered with a view to its increase or reduction unless specially authorised by a meeting of the Board, at which at least a quorum is present.
- 6. All complaints against servants of the Board must be in writing, and must in every case be signed by the person or persons complaining, and no notice whatever shall be taken of any complaint not made in accordance with this By-law. All such complaints as are receivable shall be addressed to the Chairman, who, upon the receipt of such complaints, shall have power to investigate the same, and he shall report thereon to the Board at their next meeting.

Meetings and Proceedings.

- 7. Notice shall be given in writing by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary or regular meeting adjourned.
- 8. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds— "Ordinary" and "Special." Ordinary meetings are the regular meetings held in pursuance of these Bylaws for the transaction of the general business of the Board, including meetings adjourned for the purpose of any incomplete business, but an adjourned meeting would not exclude any business which was considered necessary to transact. Special meetings are those called under Section 130 of the Act, and shall include those called by the Chairman in response to a requisition signed by three members, and the notices for such special meetings shall have such special business notified therein for which the meeting was called, and for which each member shall receive seven days' notice. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called for: Prowided that any matter of emergency can be discussed, with the ruling of the Chairman and the consent of those present. The ratepayers' meeting shall consist of one called under Section 143 of the Act, and the Standing Orders shall, so far as the Act allows, apply to the proceedings, but the provision of the Act shall be first complied with.
- 9. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the office of the Board on the day and at the hour appointed from time to time by resolution of the Board.

10. A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed by the Act, but the Chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business will be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless a quorum is

11. At any meeting of the Board it shall rest with the majority of the members of the Board present to exclude the public from such meeting when, in their opinion, it is expedient to do so.

12. At all meetings of the Board, when there is not

a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present, or within 30 minutes after time for which the meeting is called), such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

The first business of all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting aloud, with a view to their confirma-

Voting.

14. Each member (including the Chairman) shall have one vote, and such Chairman shall, in case of equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meetings shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present. All motions and amendments shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a division is demanded, before the next business is proceeded with.

Minutes of Meetings.

15. The Minute Book prescribed by the Act shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be entered by the Secretary. Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting. No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of proceedings, except as to their accuracy, or for the rectification of a clerical error.

Standing Orders.

The order of business at all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be as follows, that is to say:

(a) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last or-

dinary, also special meetings (if any).
(b) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.

- (c) Questions of which due notice has been given by members or officers of the Board.

 (d) The Chairman shall have the right of directing attention at any meeting to any matter or subject within the jurisdiction or official cognisance of the Board, by a minute signed by himself, and such minute shall, when introduced, take precedence of all business before or to come before the Board, and the adoption thereof may be put by him from the Chair as a motion without being seconded, but he shall confine himself to the questions contained therein.
- (e) Reports of sub-committees and officers.

(f) Deputations and presentation of pet memorials; and consideration thereof. of petitions or

- (g) Reading of correspondence received and, at the option of the Board, despatched, and taking action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
- (h) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.

(i) Presentation of monthly statement and passing of accounts for payment.

Motions of which previous notice has been given. Motions without notice (by leave of the Board under By-law 19).

(1) General business. (m) Notice of motions.

17. In the event of any member having urgent business to place before the meeting, he may move the suspension of the Standing Orders, and, if agreed to by the Board, such business shall take precedence of all

Tenders.

18. Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matter of the tenders comes on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a committee appointed for the purpose. The Board may require a deposit of 5 per cent. of the amount of the tender to accompany such tender, or two satisfactory sureties.

Order of Debate-Speakers must not digress.

19. A member, when speaking, shall not digress from the subject of debate.

Consideration of Reports.

20. (a) Any report of a committee or any portion thereof may be amended by the Board in any matter if it may think fit, or may be referred back to the committee for further consideration.

(b) The recommendations of any committee,

adopted by the Board, shall be resolutions of the Board.

Precedence of Chairman.

21. When the Chairman rises in his place during the progress of a debate, any member when speaking or offering to speak shall immediately resume his seat, and every member shall preserve strict silence, so that the Chairman may be heard without interruption, but the member who was speaking may resume when the Chairman takes his seat.

Notice of Motion-Absence of Mover.

22. In the absence of a member who has placed a notice of motion on the business paper for any meeting, any other member may at such meeting move the same, or such motion may be deferred until next ordinary meeting of the Board.

Withdrawal of Motions.

23. Except as elsewhere provided, no motion, after being placed on the business paper, shall be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

Motions to be seconded.

24. No motion shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

Motions not to be withdrawn without consent.

25. When a motion has been proposed and seconded it shall become subject to the control of the Board, and shall not be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

Amendment may be moved.

26. When a motion has been proposed and seconded, any member shall be at liberty to move an amendment thereon, but no such amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

Motions and Amendments to be in Writing.

27. No motion or amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been reduced to writing, if the Chairman so directs.

28. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.

29. In submitting a motion or amendment the Chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

Further Amendment may be moved on Amended Question.

30. If an amendment has been carried, the question as amended thereby shall become itself the question be-fore the Board, whereupon any further amendment upon such question may be moved.

How subsequent Amendments may be moved.

31. If an amendment, whether upon an original question or amended as aforesaid, has been negatived, then a further amendment may be moved to the question to which such first-mentioned amendment moved, and so on until there are no further amendments and the question is decided by the final vote in the affirmative or negative: Provided that not more than one question and one proposed amendment thereof shall be before the Board at any one time.

Motions for Adjournment.

32. No discussion shall be permitted upon any motion for adjournment of the Board. If upon the question being put on any such motion the same is negatived, the subject then under consideration or next on the business paper shall be discussed, and it shall not be competent for any member to again move a motion for adjournment until half an hour has elapsed from the time of moving the one that has been negatived.

Mover of Adjournment, when entitled to priority. 33. On resuming any discussion which has been adjourned, the mover of such adjournment shall be entitled, if he has not already spoken on the subject under discussion, to speak first.

Notice of Question to be given.

34. Sufficient notice of every question shall be given to the Chairman or member expected to reply, and, if necessary, reference to other persons or to documents.

Questions to be put without argument.

35. Every question shall be put categorically and without argument.

Replies and Objections.

36. No discussion shall ensue upon any reply or refusal to reply to any questions except by permission of the Board.

Mode of addressing Board.

Members shall, on all occasions when at a meeting, address the Chairman and speak to each other by their official designation, as Chairman or Secretary, etc., as the case may be, and, with the exception of the Chairman, shall rise in their place and stand while speaking (except when prevented from doing so by bodily infirmity).

Speaker not to be interrupted if in order. 38. No member shall be interrupted while speaking, except for the purpose of calling him to order, as here-inafter provided for in pursuance of By-law.

Limitation as to number of speeches.

39. The mover of an original motion shall have the right of general reply to all observations which have been made in reference to such motion, and to any amendment thereon, as well as the right to speak upon every such amendment. Every member, other than the mover of an original motion, shall have the right to speak once upon such motion and once upon every amendment moved thereon. No member shall, without the consent of the Board, speak more than once upon any one question, or for longer than ten minutes at any one time, unless when misrepresented or misunderstood, in which case he may be permitted to explain without adding further observation than may be necessary for the purpose of such explanation.

Determination of questions.

40. (a) All questions shall, if not otherwise decided by law, be determined thus: Upon a question being put the Chairman shall call for a show of hands for and against the question, and shall declare whether the question has been affirmed by the majority of members present or otherwise. The decision of the Chairman shall be final, unless such decision be immediately challenged and any member rise and demand a division. lenged and any member rise and demand a division.

(b) Where any member dissents he may request that his name be recorded in the minutes as opposed to the

motion, and it shall be so recorded.

Divisions.

41. Upon a division being so called for, the question shall first be put in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the Chairman and all members present shall vote by a show of hands, and the names and votes of the Chairman and members present shall be recorded in the minutes by the Secretary.

Chairman may repeat question.
42. The Chairman shall be at liberty to put any question as often as may be necessary to enable him to form his opinion as to the result of the voting and declare same.

Acts of Disorder.

43. Any member who at any meeting of the Board or any Committee commits a breach of any By-law, or who moves or attempts to move any motion or amendment embodying any matter beyond the legal jurisdiction of the Board or Committee, or who in any other way raises or attempts to raise any question or addresses or attempts to address the Board or Committee upon any subject which the Board or Committee shall have no legal right to entertain or discuss, or uses any language which, according to the common usage of gentlemen, would be disorderly, or makes use of any expression inconsistent with good order and decorum, or who says or does anything calculated to bring the Board or Committee into contempt, shall be guilty of an act of disorder.

Ruling of Chairman.

(a) The Chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or pre-cedent applicable to the case, without further argument or comment, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.

(b) If the ruling of the Chairman be disagreed with then the usual Parliamentary procedure may be adopted.

Members called to order more than once.

45. Any member who, having been called to order by the Chairman for any infringement of any of the provisions of this By-law, or for any breach of decorum shall, upon the request of the Chairman, withdraw from the Board room for the remainder of the meeting.

Removal from Board Room-Penalty for continued

Breach of Order, etc.

46. In the event of a member declining to withdraw from the Board room on being requested so to do by the Chairman, the Chairman may order his retirement until the termination of the sitting, and should such member disobey such order he shall be deemed guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one pound.

Disorder.

47. If disorder arises at any meeting, the Chairman may adjourn the meeting for a period of fifteen min-ntes and quit the chair. The Board on resuming shall, on question put from the chair, decide without debate whether the business be proceeded with or not.

Appointment of Committee.

48. The Board may at any time appoint one or more members as a Committee to inquire into any matter and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or a resolution of the Board.

Finance and Accounts.

All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the finance committee meeting and the ordinary general meeting, and after being certified as correct shall be paid by cheque. An account shall be opened with such Bank as the Board may from time to time direct, and all moneys received from whatever source, with the exception of moneys paid to the credit of the Board at the Treasury, shall be paid to the credit of the Board's account at such Bank. All cheques and orders drawn against the Board's Bank or Treasury accounts must be signed by the Chairman and any one member of the Board, and in all cases countersigned by the Secretary of the Board.

50. All moneys belonging to the Board shall, within 24 hours after they come into the hands of any officer, servant, or clerk, be paid to the Secretary or responsible officer directed by the Board to receive same.

The regulations numbered 21 to 41 inclusive, made by His Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council under Section 197 of the Act on the 2nd August, 1922, are deemed to be incorporated in these By-laws.

Unauthorised Expenditure.

51. Every item of expenditure, and every liability incurred by any Committee or member of the Board otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure and a breach of this By-law by such person.

Common Seal.

52. The Common Seal of the Board shall be kept in the Board's safe. The Common Seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument except by order of the

Discount on Rates.

53. The Board may, by resolution, allow a discount of 5 per cent. for prompt payment of rates.

Offences, Omissions, or Neglects.

54. The following acts, omissions, or neglects are forbidden, and any person guilty of any of the following offences shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not ex-

ceeding Twenty pounds:—

(a) Riding or driving cattle or horses or other animals, or wheeling any barrow, or driving any motor car, carriage or cart upon or along any

footpath;
(b) placing any timber, bricks, or other material upon any footpath, channel, surface drain, or road without the permission of the Board having

been first obtained;
(c) burning any shavings or other material or matter in any road or open or public place;

(d) leaving any inflammable matter or material in any public place or shed, or on any open space or near any building, without first having obtained the permission of the Board;
(e) damaging or destroying any well, dam, tank,

pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, or gate, or other property belonging to in charge of, or under the control of the Board;

(f) placing any placard or other document, writing, painting on or otherwise defacing any house or building abutting on or contiguous to any public road, or on any wall, fence, gate, finger or lamp post, without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof;

(g) opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footpath or road without the permission of the Board first having been ob-

tained;

(h) rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bow and arrow, or playing at any game, to the annoyance of any person in any public place, or allowing any cart or animal to remain upon any footpath, placing goods upon any footpath, or otherwise obstructing any footpath or road;

(i) throwing or discharging any stone or other missile in any road or public place to the damage or danger of any person;
(j) having an awning upon or over any footpath in

- any road not being eight feet clear above the footway, by hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway, without the permission of the Board;
- (k) blasting any rock, stone, or timber, in or near any road, without the permission of the Board, and not attending to such directions in regard

thereto as shall be given by the Board;
(1) furiously or negligently riding or driving along

any road;

(m) making any cellar door or other opening from the footway of any road without the consent of the Board.

No person shall poison, kill, or main any horse, cow, camel, pig, bullock, dog, or other animal, and leave the same in any part of the district without making proper provision for the burial or burning of the carcase thereof, and any person so doing shall commit au offence against these By-laws; and upon conviction shall pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and shall pay all expenses attending on the proper burial or burning of any such animal.

To prevent obstructions on Footpaths and Roads.

56. No person shall permit any box, case, coal, firewood, sand, goods, wares, merchandise, or other articles or effects to remain on any part of a road or footpath within the district after sunset, nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing and

removing the same.

57. No person shall place, lay, deposit, shoot, or discharge any rubbish or material whatsoever on the surface of any road, footway, or public reserve within the district without having first obtained the permis-

sion of the Board.

Every person shall, after having received from the Board, as in the last preceding section provided, a permit to deposit rubbish or material on the surface of any road, footway, or public reserve, have and keep sufficient and continuous light burning thereon from sunset to the following sunrise, during the time such rubbish or material shall remain or continue so de-

Preservation of trees.

Any person who shall earelessly, wilfully, wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree or shrub, or plant standing in any of the roads, enclosures, public places or reserves, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, desdrive against any of the tree-guards, fences, or other protection to such trees, shrubs, or plants aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10), and in addition thereto shall also pay the Board a sum equal to the damage so done.

Prescribing removal of verandahs.

Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footway or roadway, or is dangerous, and all other obstructions on the footways or roadways, or over the same, shall be removed, when ordered, within such time

as shall be notified by the Board, and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah or balcony or other obstruction, whether removed by the Board or otherwise; and any person whatsoever interfering or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Encroachment, etc.-removal of.

61. On the order of the Board the Secretary or other appointed officer may direct the removal within fourteen days of any building, fence, or obstruction or encroachment in or upon any street, lane, or public place under the control of the Board.

In any case where, after service of notice for such removal, any such obstruction or encroachment has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove same at the cost and charges of the person so offending and to proceed against the offender for the breach of this By-law, the penalty for which shall not exceed £20 for every day or part of a day during which such offence shall be committed or continued after the expiry of the notice prescribed therein.

Lighting.

Any unauthorised person who shall light, put out when lighted, or in any other way interfere with any lamp belonging to the Board, or shall damage or destroy such lamp shall pay, in addition to the value of such damage, if any, on conviction, a sum not ex-

ceeding £5.
63. Within the townsite of Koorda all vehicles shall, when parking, run front-on to the footpath or kerb at an angle of approximately 45 degrees.

Damaging roads.

64. No person shall either wilfully or negligently damage or destroy by means of horse team or any other means any road under construction or repair; any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20. Any person who-

(a) Cuts or removes, without the consent of the Board, timber, earth, stone, or other material

from a road or reserve; or

(b) erects, without the consent of the Board, upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or

(c) draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the waterside of a road, or across a drain, except over a properly constructed approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle; or

(d) draws upon any road, timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material when carried princi-pally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle to drag or trail upon a road or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage any portion of which or any portion of chains attached thereto or any portion of other attachment trails or drags upon a road,

shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these Bylaws and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5

for every such offence.

Any person taking any plough, cultivator, or other implement over or along any road and thereby damaging or marking such road in such a manner which in the opinion of the Board may indirectly cause ultimate damage to the road, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

66. Any person who draws upon any road any vehiele the wheel or wheels of which are locked, unless there is placed at the bottom of such wheels some sufficient protection to prevent damage to such road, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

To protect bridges from fire.

67. Any person who shall light a fire (except by the order of the Board) or who shall place any rushes or other inflammable substance under, near, or against any bridge in the district, for the purpose of making a camp or sleeping place, or for any other purpose, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £1 and not exceeding £20.

Prevention of trees falling across road.

68. No person shall make or leave a fire near any or reserve without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading.

68A. No person shall ringbark or set fire to any standing tree upon or near to any road or track.

Park lands, reserves, and recreation grounds.

69. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in these By-laws. The Board shall have power to grant exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves placed under its control within the district, for holding public sports or amusements to any responsible person or persons or club, and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, or trees, or other improvements upon or enclosing such park lands recreation grounds or reserves, and shall pay to the Board the fees as set out hereunder, and comply with the provisions of these By-laws and any other regulations passed by resolution of the Board under which such exclusive rights are granted.

Hawking.

70. No person shall be permitted to hawk fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables or any article of nierchandise without having first obtained a license from the Board and payment of fees as per Schedule "A" hereto annexed:-

Schedule "A."

Fees for a Hawker's License.

For a license to hawk fish, meat, poultry, game, fruit or vegetables-5s.

For a license to hawk merchandise-£5.

A hawker's license shall be issued for a term of twelve months from date of issue.

Penalties.

71. Where any person by these By-laws, or any of them, is required to do or perform any act and such act is not done or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

72. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By laws, and, where not otherwise provided shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

73. All penalties or other sums recovered under provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Board, except so much as may be paid to any informer.

Throwing Dangerous Substances on Footways or Roads.

74. Any person who shall throw vegetable or other offensive, noxious, or dangerous substances upon any footway within the district shall forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every such offence. Any person or persons placing or causing to be placed, or broken, in or upon any road, footway, reserve, or park lands under the control or supervision of the Board, any glass, metal, or earthenware bottles or utensils without first having obtained the consent of the Board so to do, shall be liable, beyond the costs and charges incidental to the removal of any such glass, metal or earthenware, to a fine upon conviction not exceeding Two pounds, in addition to the amount of damages caused thereby.

Signboards, etc.

75. Any person who shall erect or place any signboard, swing, awning, blinds, overhanging lamps, or other things over or near any footway or roadway without obtaining the consent of the Board shall forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every such offence.

Heavy Traffic.

76. The owner of every vehicle or engine which, together with its load, shall weigh more than five tons, shall travel the roads, bridges, and culverts at his own risk, and shall be liable to pay for the damage done.

77. The Board may, by notice affixed to any bridge or culvert, declare the maximum weight of any engine, agricultural or other machine, or vehicle of any kind, and of any load of material which shall be permitted to cross such bridge or culvert, and also the pace and speed at which such engine, machine, vehicle or load. speed at which such engine, machine, vehicle or load shall be driven, led, or taken over any such bridge or culvert; and any person who shall cross such bridge or

culvert in contravention of this By-law shall, in addition to any liability for damage he may have caused, be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten nounds.

Careless Use of Fire.

78. No person shall make or leave a fire on or near any road, track, or reserve under the jurisdiction of the Board without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading, and any person offending against this By-law shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Lamp Posts, etc.

79. No lamp post, bridle post, telegraph, telephone, or electric light pole, or flagstaff shall be erected by any person upon any road without the written consent of the Board, and upon such consent being obtained, such post, pole or flagstaff shall be placed in such position, and shall be painted at least once in every three years, or as may be directed by the Board, and the Board may order the removal by the owners of all bent, dangerous, or unsightly posts and poles. Any person offending against this By-law shall upon conviction pay a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every such offence.

Vacant Lots in Townsites.

80. The owner of any vacant lot in any Townsite shall, upon notice served on him by the Board, clear such vacant lot of trees, scrub, and undergrowth to the satisfaction of the Board. Penalty: Two pounds.

Part II.—Hall By-laws.

By-laws for the Management and the Use of the Koorda Public Hall.

1. Application for the hire of the hall or any room or furniture shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Koorda Road Board not less than 24 hours before the time that such hall, room, or furniture is required.

2. The name and place of abode of the actual and responsible person or persons hiring any hall, room, or fuprniture shall be given in the application for the use of any hall, room, or furniture.

3. The rent of the hall, room, or furniture (inclusive of the use of crockeryware) shall be paid with each application, and shall be as follows:— Charges:

Travelling Companies-Week nights, £2; after midnight 10s.

Travelling Companies-Saturday nights, £3; after midnight 10s.

Travelling Companies—Sunday nights, 35s. Local Companies—Week nights, 30s. Local Companies—Saturday nights, 30s.; after midnight 10s.

night 10s.
Rehearsals, day or night—10s.
Political meetings, day or night—20s.
Anterooms (meetings), day or night—10s.
Sample rooms, day or night—21s.
Bazaars, etc., daytime—21s.
Religious services, cost of light and cleaning only. In all confetti dances or where confetti is used, 5s. extra.

The above charges include the use of light and the

use of such crockery as the Board possesses.
Skating will not be permitted under any considera-

4. The hours for which any hall, room, or furniture shall be hired shall be: Day—from 9 o'clock a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m.; Night—from 7 o'clock p.m. to 12 o'clock midnight, after which the prescribed fee shall be paid in addition to ordinary payment.

5. The Board may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of such engagement.

6. The Board reserves the right to refuse to let any

The Board reserves the right to refuse to let any

hall, room, or furniture to any applicant for the hiring of same without assigning any reason for such refusal.

7. The Board may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of any hall, room, or furni-

In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any hall, room, or furniture for the same date and hour, the Board may, without con-sidering priority of application, determine to which ap-plicant the hire of such hall, room, or furniture shall be granted.

9. The hirer of any hall, room, or furniture shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, the Entertainments Tax Act, and any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such hiring and using of any hall or room. If, in the opinion of the Board, all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts mentioned above, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of engagement forbid and prevent the use of such hall or

in the event of the use of any hall or room being stopped under the last preceding By-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of such hall or room as if the hire had been duly fulfilled, and the Board shall not be responsible to the

hirer by reason of such stoppage.

11. No spirituous liquors, wine, ale, beer, porter, cider, or sherry or any other intoxicating liquor shall be brought into or consumed in any hall or room except when expressly permitted by the Board.

12. No person shall smoke any tobacco, cigar,

- cigarette, or objectionable substance, nor strike or otherwise ignite any light in any hall or room during any ball or public entertainment, or at any gathering of persons in the said hall or rooms, whether such per sons have been admitted by payment of money or otherwise, except at a banquet or smoke social where those present comprise men only.
 - No person shall in any part of the buildingenter or be allowed to enter whilst intoxicated;

(b) use profane or improper language;

- (c) be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever; (d) damage, mark, or deface any wall or other part of the building. Any person who does, perof the building. Any person who does, permits, or suffers any such damage shall be liable to pay the cost of all such damage in addition to any penalty imposed by these By-
- (e) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoin the passage-way or any part of the building. Any person so doing shall immediately disperse on being requested to do so by the Secretary or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable, whether in uniform or otherwise.
- 14. No offensive personalities or representations of living persons, nor anything calculated to produce riot or a breach of the peace, shall be permitted in any hall

or any part thereof, or in any room.

15. No encouragement shall be given to improper characters to assemble in any hall or room.

- 16. The Secretary of the Board, or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable when dressed in uniform or otherwise, if known as such to the hirer or his servant, shall be permitted to have free ingress to the hall or any part thereof at all times during the term of engagement, and shall be given every facility for seeing that these By-laws are duly carried out.
- 17. The hirer of any hall or room shall maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour in such hall or room, and shall be solely and entirely responsible for the carrying out of these By-laws, and for any damage done to the building, fixtures, fittings, furniture or crockeryware, and shall pay such damages as shall be assessed by the Board. Any article of crockeryware not accounted for or in a cracked or broken condition shall be paid for at current rates or prices.
- 18. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.
- 19. Children under 10 years of age must be under responsible supervision when in the building or any part thereof.
- 20. Rooms shall be open on week days from 9 o'clock a.m. to 9 o'clock p.m., and on Sundays by arrangement with the Secretary.

Part III.—Building By-laws.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on it by the Second Schedule to "The Road Districts Act, 1919," Building Regulations 36 and 37, the Koorda Road Board doth make and publish the following By-laws, and doth order that such By-laws shall apply to all Townsites within Koorda Road District:—

1. No person shall erect any building or alter or add to an existing building, or shall permit any person to erect any building or alter or add to an existing building on land of which he is the owner or of which he has the control, except such building, alteration or addition is erected in conformity with these By-laws.

2. No person shall build any structure intended to be used for human habitation or occupation, or capable of being used as such, or shall alter or add to any such existing structure without having obtained a Building License from the Board and paying the fees prescribed herein, namely:-

(a) The fee for Building License.(b) The fee for the use of the portion of the street abutting on the building during building operations, and deposit as security for the reinstatement and repair of such portion of such street.

(c) The charge of the Local Health Authority for providing the necessary pans and lids for the

privy.

Before such Building License is issued plans and specifications, in the form prescribed herein, submitted to the Surveyor, and a license will not be granted before seven days after the submission of such plans and specifications, unless in special circumstances of which special circumstances the Surveyor shall be the sole judge.

4. Plans shall be in ink, on tracing linen or on paper sufficiently strong to stand the erasure of "H" pencil marks withet injury to the paper; and specifications shall be in typewriting or in ink manuscript

clearly written and on strong paper.

5. Plans shall clearly show ground plans, elevations, and sections as are sufficient to make plain the construction and the dimensions of the proposed structure. The size of the rooms and thickness of walls shall be

written on in figures.

Specifications shall show clearly both as to materials and size of same, the construction of the foundations, floors, internal and external walls, ceilings, and roof; also the ventilation of the structure, the number of privies and the construction of same, and shall provide for at least one privy of the prescribed construction, provided with the pan supplied by the Local Health Authority.

The ground floor level of any building to be erected abutting on any footpath shall not be less than ten inches above the level of the kerbing of the footpath upon which the building abuts, nor greater than ten inches above such kerbing, unless provision is made in the plan and specifications for safe ingress and egress at all doorways by means of either a suitable ramp or steps.

- A block plan, signed by the builder or owner, shall be supplied, showing clearly the position of the intended structure on the block of land on which it is to be erected, and the position of the privy. Such plan will be retained by the Board.
- 6. If the plans and specifications submitted are in accordance with these By-laws and the prescribed fees are paid, the Surveyor shall sign them on behalf of the Board, and issue a Building License in the form prescribed herein, and for the period set forth in such license; but if the plans and specifications contain any matter which, in the opinion of the Surveyor, is contrary to the principles of sound or sanitary construction, and such matter is not covered by these By-laws. the Surveyor shall refer such matter to the Board at its next meeting, and the Board shall have power to decide any matter referred to in Clauses A to K of Section 37 of the Building Regulations, when such matter is not defined in these By-laws, and a Building License will not be granted until the Board decides on such matter; provided that such decision will not be unreasonably delayed.

Where two or more shops or dwellings are built ad joining, the dividing wall shall be of brick or reinforced concrete, and shall be constructed not less than four feet above the height of the walls of such build-

7. On behalf of the Board the Surveyor may authorise the internal linings, partitions, and ceiling of any dwelling, if such building is not nearer than ten feet to any boundary of the block of land on which it stands to be constructed wholly or partly of inflammable material. Such authority shall hold good for not more than twelve months after the date fixed for the expiration of the Building License, but may be ex-

tended by the Board from time to time on the application of the then owner. If no such extension of time is granted such inflammable material shall then have become erected contrary to the provisions of Section 14 of the Building Regulation within the meaning of the said section, and the Board may at any time proceed in the manner set forth in the said Section 14.

- 8. No brick, stone, or concrete wall shall be erected nearer than two feet to the boundary of the block of land on which it stands unless it is a parapet wall rising to a height of not less than one foot above the roof gutter, and the Board will not approve of the subdivision of land which would have the effect of leaving an existing wall in conflict with this provision.
- 9. No structure of any kind shall be erected upon, over, or under any street, footpath, or public way unless the plans and specifications have been first submitted to and approved by the Board, and no verandah or signboard will be allowed over any footpath unless a clear way of not less than eight feet above such footpath is provided.
- 10. No street verandah shall be erected, except in accordance with a plan submitted to and approved by the Board, and every such verandah shall be provided with a suitable gutter to carry the water falling on such verandah. If the water from such gutter discharges into the street, it shall be carried into the street gutter by a cast or wrought iron downpipe of such size as the Board may direct, and such downpipe shall discharge into the street gutter in such manner as the Board may direct.

Any such street verandah, gutter, and downpipe shall at all times be kept in repair by the owner of the building in front of which it is built, to the satisfaction of the Board, and the owner shall carry out any repairs in such manuer as may be ordered by the Board.

- 11. No privy shall be erected nearer than six feet to the block of land adjoining that on which it stands. Where a right-of-way adjoins such block, unless otherwise in special circumstances approved by the Board, the privy shall be erected so that the service door is three feet from such right-of-way, screened from observation therefrom, and accessible by means of an opening or gateway at one end of such screen.
- 12. Before the construction of any building is commenced a privy shall be provided on the land for the use of the workmen.

Fees Payable.

13. A Building License will be issued on payment

For permission, during the erection of a building, to occupy any part of a street abutting on such building:—For the first three months, Ten shillings per week; for every subsequent three months, One pound per week.

Deposit for the repair of such part occupied: -One pound, and the Board may at any time require the amount of such deposit to be increased to such amount as may be ordered, on giving notice to the builder by post or leaving the notice at the building, and the Building License shall be suspended until the order of the Board is complied with.

Minimum width of Shop Fronts.

- 14. No plan of any new building or part of a building intended to be used as a shop shall be approved by the Board unless each such shop designed or intended to be let as a separate tenement has at least a width of twelve feet internal measurement of frontage to a street, and no alteration of any existing building shall be approved unless the provisions of this By-law are
- 15. Application for a Building License shall be made in the form of Schedule "A" hereto annexed.
- 16. A Building License shall be in the form of Schedule "B" hereto annexed.
- 17. Any person who contravenes or does not comply with any one of the provisions of these By-laws shall be guilty of an offence against such By-laws and for every such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds and not less than ten shillings.

Between Amalgamated Road Transport Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and Aherns, Limited, and other the Respondents set out in the second column of the Schedule annexed hereto, Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia hereby makes the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:-

AWARD.

1.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to the industries mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereunder in respect of workers following the vocations mentioned herein: Provided that it shall not apply to workers who are at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia or in any Industrial Agreement registered in accordance with "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925."

2.-Area.

This Award shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

3.—Term.

This Award shall come into operation as from the date hereof and remain in force for three years.

4.-Wages.

Basic wage, £4 5s. per week.

The minimum weekly wage to be paid to all employees, with the exceptions mentioned in Clause 5 hereof, shall be as follows:-

- 5. The exceptions referred to in Clause 4 are as follows:
 - (a) Casual hands shall be paid 2s. 3d. per day in excess of the rates prescribed in Clause 4. If employed only part of the day the extra 2s. 3d. shall be paid. If a permanent employee is engaged as a casual hand within three weeks of the Easter or Christmas holidays, the rate of pay shall be 3s. per day in excess of the rates prescribed in Clause 4.

(b) All persons engaged on tarred metal, tarred blocks, or spreading tar shall be paid 1s. per

day extra.

(c) Where a driver is called upon to provide stabling for his horse or horses he shall be paid 5s. per week for each horse stabled in addition to the rate of wages he is receiving at the time. All feed for horses so stabled shall be provided by the employer.

(d) Drivers who are required to collect money during any week or portion of a week as part of their duties and account for it shall be paid 1s. for such week in addition to the rate of

wage prescribed by Clause 4.

6.-Hours.

- (a) The hours of duty shall be forty-eight per week.
 (b) In any week in which there is a holiday forty hours shall constitute a week's work, and in any week in which there are two holidays thirty-two hours shall constitute a week's work: Provided that this subclause shall not apply in the case of milk carters and/or ice
- (c) Any hours worked on any day or days to make up the hours of duty in any week shall be worked in a continuous shift, except in the case of employees in livery stables, milk carters, and stablemen.
- (d) The working hours for casual employees shall be eight hours and forty minutes on five days in the week, and four hours and forty minutes on Saturdays.

7.—Meal Times.

Employees are entitled to a break of one hour for meals on all the days in the week, except Saturday. Where an employee is required to work on Saturday beyond 2 p.m. he shall be allowed a break of half an hour for a meal or an hour if he has to continue after 3 p.m.

8.—Starting and Finishing Time.

The starting time for the purpose of calculating overtime shall (with the exceptions hereinafter mentioned) be 7 a.m. or after, and the finishing time, on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, shall not be later than 6 p.m. and on Saturdays not later than 1 p.m.

The exceptions referred to are:-

- (a) Drivers employed at fish, fruit, vegetable, and pastrycooks' shops or stores;
- (b) Ice carting and parcel express carting;
- (c) Milk carters, stablemen and yardmen;(d) Drivers employed by mail contractors.

, and the only to by many contractors.

9.—Overtime.

For all time of duty before the prescribed starting time or after the prescribed finishing time, or after eight hours and forty minutes on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, and four hours and forty minutes on Saturdays, or in excess of the hours prescribed in Clause 6, payment shall be made at the rate of time and a quarter for the first two hours and time and a half thereafter. In the case of juniors under eighteen years of age overtime shall be paid at the rate of time and a half. All overtime shall stand alone and shall be paid for in addition to the ordinary weekly or casual wage.

10.—Sunday Work.

For all time of duty on Sundays, with the exceptions hereinafter mentioned, payment in addition to the weekly wage shall be made at the rate of double time. The exceptions referred to are:—

- (a) Stablemen who have one clear day off in the week;
- (b) Milk carters;
- (c) Drivers feeding and attending horses.

In the case of drivers feeding and attending horses, the rate to be paid shall be the ordinary rate paid for the other six days of the week.

11.-Holiday Pay.

All time of duty on holidays shall stand alone and be paid for in addition to the weekly wage at the rate of ordinary time. Any employee required to work on a holiday shall be paid at least half a day's pay at holiday rates: Provided that this clause shall not apply to milk carters and/or ice earters.

12.—Termination of Employment.

One week's notice at any time on either side shall be required before the engagement of any but a casual hand shall be determined: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss an employee for refusal or neglect to obey orders, misconduct, carelessness in the performance of his duties, or if after receiving one week's notice he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice: Provided also that, except for the reasons mentioned in the first proviso to this clause, the engagement shall not be terminated by any notice expiring within a week of the Christmas or Easter holidays if it is intended to reengage the employee immediately or very shortly after the holidays mentioned, and men in permanent employment shall not be changed to casual employees within one week of the Christmas or Easter holidays.

ment shall not be changed to casual employees within one week of the Christmas or Easter holidays.

Notice given every week to determine the employment without any intention to determine the employment at the end of the week, but only with a view to dismissing men at any time, shall not be deemed notice for the purpose of this Award unless given during a general or shipping or coal strike.

13.-Heavy Work.

Where employees are called upon to handle, without proper mechanical appliances, heavy stone, wool, or gunney bags over two hundredweight an extra man shall be provided.

14.-Time and Wages Book.

Each employer shall provide a time and wages book, to be kept in a place where it is easily accessible to both the employer and the worker. Such book shall show the name of the worker, the time he starts and finishes work each day, the number of hours worked by and the wages and overtime paid to each worker, and his signature for the same. The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the proper posting of such book daily. Such book shall be open on one day in each week, during working hours, to inspection by the secretary of the Union or any other person authorised in writing by him.

15 .- Travelling Allowances.

Employees engaged on work from which they are unable to return to their homes at night shall be paid such personal expenses as they reasonably incur, but they shall be paid at the rate of 7s. 6d. a day at the least. An employee prevented from returning with his turn-out to the depot or yard from which he started shall be paid any travelling expenses he has to incur and for the time he reasonably takes to get to his home beyond the time he would have taken to get to his home from the depot or yard.

16.—Pay Day.

All wages shall be paid on either Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday of each week, but the day, once fixed, shall not be altered more than once in three months or without two weeks' notice to the employees. Such pays shall be available within ten minutes of the time the employee ceases duty, where it is practicable to pay the employee on pay day at the yard or depot. If not made available within that time through any fault or delay of the employer, or because the employee ceases work at a place which causes more than ten minutes' delay, overtime shall be paid for any excess of the ten minutes referred to. No employer shall hold more than one day's wages in hand.

17.—Payment for Highest Function.

Where an employee is called upon to perform two or more classes of work on any one day he shall, for the purposes of assessing the wages to be paid, be deemed to have worked the day at the class for which the highest rate of wages is prescribed.

18.—Commencing and Finishing Work.

Work shall commence when an employee signs on at the yard or depot in the morning and finish when he

signs off on leaving in the evening, except where the horses are stabled at the driver's own home. In such a case the driver shall be allowed twenty minutes in the morning and fifteen minutes in the evening to per-form the necessary stable work. Drivers of milk carts need not sign on and off when they start and leave off work, but they shall sign once a day.

19 .-- Temporary Change of Stable.

Where an employer transfers an employee, after he comes to work, from one stable or yard situated more than two miles distant from the stable or yard at which he usually works, fares to and from such altered stable or yard shall be allowed by the employer. If he is transferred temporarily to work at a stable which requires him to travel one mile or more from his home beyond the distance he usually travels, the fares to and from and excess time shall be paid for by the employer.

20.—Proportion of Juniors.

Juniors may be employed in the proportion of one junior to every five adult drivers employed: Provided that grocers, greengrocers, retail milk vendors, pastrycooks, and/or wood merchants who do not employ five adult drivers shall be permitted to employ one junior.

21.-Annual Holidays.

(a) All employees, except ice carters and/or milk carters, shall be given one week's leave of absence on full pay after the expiration of each twelve months' service. Such leave shall be given to and taken by the employee within two months of becoming due. the engagement of any worker to which this subclause applies is terminated after one month's continuous service or after any period of continuous service from the date on which the previous annual holidays became due, he shall be paid in lieu of holidays in proportion to the length of his service.

(b) Ice carters shall be given two weeks' leave of absence on full pay after the expiration of each twelve months' service. Such leave shall be given to and taken by the employee within two months of becoming due. Where the engagement of any worker, to which this subclause applies, is terminated after one month's continnous service, or after any period of continuous service from the date on which the previous annual holidays became due, he shall be paid in lieu of holidays in proportion to the length of his service.

(e) Milk carters shall, if required generally speaking to work continuously seven days in the week, be allowed two weeks' holiday on full pay at the expiration of each twelve months' service: Provided, that if the engagement is terminated after the completion of six months' service but before the completion of twelve months' service, one day's pay shall be allowed for

each month of service.

22.—Boarding and Lodging.

Except in the case of parent and son, or retail milk carters, no employee shall board or lodge with his employer or on his premises. Where an employee boards and/or lodges with his employer in accordance with this clause, the employer shall be permitted to deduct from the wages of such employee for board £1 per week, and for lodging 7s. 6d. per week: Provided that nothing in this clause shall apply to stablemen.

23.-General.

(a) Stablemen shall be entitled to receive one clear day's rest in seven. If they work on seven days in any week they shall receive Sunday rates for all time worked on Sunday of such week.

(b) Stablemen required to live at the stable shall be provided with suitable housing accommodation for a stableman free of cost, but if proper housing accommodation is provided for a stableman and his wife and family, and they elect to live there, the employer shall be entitled to charge a rent not exceeding half the rent a similar house in that locality would readily let at not exceeding ten shillings a week.

(c) No reduction shall be made from wages when an

employee is learning the round.

(d) No junior under nineteen years of age shall be allowed to drive or be in charge of more than one horse in the City of Perth or in Fremantle.

(e) Employers shall, when engaging employees, state definitely whether such employee is engaged as a weekly or casual hand.

- (f) Casual hands shall be notified at the end of the day if their services are not required next day. ing such notice, a full day's wages shall be paid.
- (g) Employers shall notify their employees on the working day preceding a holiday if their services are required next day. Failing such notice the employee shall be entitled to take the holiday and to receive a full week's wages.
- (h) Employees shall be provided free by the employer with all shovels and other tools necessary for the loading and unloading of goods or material on to or from any vehicle.
- (i) Each employee, with the exception of milk carters and/or ice carters, shall be entitled to holidays, and all carters and drivers shall be entitled to a half holiday from the hour of 1 p.m. on some working day in the week.
- (j) A copy of this Award shall be exhibited by each employer where the industry is carried on by being posted or hung up in a place where it is easily accessible to the employees.
- (k) Weekly hands ready and willing to work for the whole week, and not dismissed during the week for any reason set out in Clause 12 of this Award, shall be entitled to a full week's wages.
- (1) Where an employer desires to vary or change his starting and finishing time (in accordance with the provisions of Clause 8 of this Award) he shall give two weeks' notice of such variation or change to his employees, and post a notice of the intended change at the depot or yard.
- (m) No employee at present employed shall be dismissed or reduced in pay by reason of this Award.

24.—Definitions.

For the purposes of this Award:-

(a) "Junior" shall mean any person under the age of twenty years in receipt of less than the adult wage.
(b) "Casual hand" shall mean an employee com-

petent to do the work he is engaged to do, who is dismissed or refused work without any fault of his own before the expiration of six days from the date he starts

- (c) "Horse-driver's assistant" and "motor-driver's assistant" shall mean and include any employee who accompanies the driver to assist in loading, unloading, or delivering.
- (d) "Loaders" shall mean and include all employees engaged exclusively in loading or unloading any goods, wares, merchandise, or materials on to or from any vehicle.
- (e) "Jinker" shall mean a vehicle with a fore-carriage and a bow axle under which the load is slung.

 (f) "Boiler truck" shall mean a vehicle on four low
- wheels, with or without springs, generally used for the carrying of boilers.

 (g) "Float" shall mean a vehicle on four wheels,
- with or without springs, generally used for carrying plate-glass or other heavy material.

 (h) "Holidays" shall mean the days on which New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Anzae Day, Christmas Day, and Poving Day are observed.
- Christmas Day, and Boxing Day are observed.
 (i) "Saturday," for the purpose of this Award, means either Saturday or such other day as is at present observed as the half holiday in particular industries or districts.
- (j) "Yardmen" shall include all employees not otherwise specified employed in or in connection with
- a stable yard or garage.
 (k) "Head stableman" shall mean pointed to be in charge of or directing the work of
- other stablemen.
 (1) "Horse" shall mean any beast of burden, except bullocks.
- (m) "Road" shall mean and include any road or where goods, merchandise, implements, materials are being conveyed or drawn by horse or motor power, but shall not include any dairy farm, orchard, or market garden.

FOOD AND DRUG REGULATIONS, 1929.

12.—DECLARATION OF CERTAIN DRUGS.

Ex. Co. 2842; MPH 1062/28.

(1) There shall be written in bold-faced sans-serif capital letters of not less than six points face measurement in the label attached to every package containing medicines or medicinal preparations for internal or external use by man, in which are present any of the substances named in this Regulation, or preparations, alkaloids, glucosides, or poisonous chemical derivatives thereof, a statement of the name of the substance or substances or of the preparation, alkaloid, glucoside, or poisonous chemical derivative contained in it, and of the quantity or proportion present, in the following form:—

THIS MIXTURE INCLUDES [or alternatively] THE CONTENTS OF THIS PACKAGE INCLUDE [here insert the name of the drug or drugs required to be declared, and the quantity or proportion of each contained in the mixture or package], or EACH OF THESE TABLETS [pastilles, cachets, or capsules] CONTAINS [here insert the name of each substance required to be declared, and the quantity or proportion of each contained in each tablet, pastille, cachet, capsule, etc.].

Acetanilde. Hydrocyanic Acid. Aconite, Hydroquinone, Adrenalin, or its substitutes, Hyosevamus, Alphacaine (A. Eucaine or Eucaine A.), Iodine. Amyl nitrite, Isopral, Anilides, Lead, Antimony, Lobelia, Mercury, Arsenic, Barbitone (Veronal), Nitroglycerin, Nux Vomica, Barium. Belladonna, Oil of Parsley, Benzamine (Betacaine, B. Eucaine, or Eucaine B.), Oil of Pennyroyal, Bromine, Oil of Rue, Oil of Savin, Cannabis indica, Cantharides. Oil of Tansy, Carbolic Acid, Opium, Chlorbutol (Acetone Chloroform or Chloretone), Paraldehyde, Chloral, Paraphenylenediamine, or other irritant organic Chloroform, bases. Phenacetin. Coca. Copper, Phenazone, Cotton Root, Phenetidines, Creosote, Phosphorus, Cresols (Cresylic Acid), Proponal, Digitalis, Pyrazolones. Ergot, Pyrogallic Acid, Ether, Stramonium, Gelsemium, Strophanthus, Gamboge, Sulphonal,

Trional, and any other natural or synthetic hypnotic, or analgesic or antipyretic substances, or any reputed emmenagogue or reputed abortifacient substance and any other drugs being or containing any poisonous chemical derivative, alkaloid, glucoside or similar potent principal, or any derivative thereof, and any preparations of thyroid gland, pituitary gland, or any animal product being or containing a potent principal.

For the purposes of this Regulation, a preparation is a mixture of substances in any form, or a solution of any substance or substances, prepared for internal or external use by man, which contains as one of its constituents any substance or compound thereof mentioned in the list given above as requiring declaration.

- (2) Any substance included in this Regulation, but not specifically named in the list, shall be described by the name most commonly applied to the substance in the English language in the Pharmacopoeias of Great Britain and of the United States of America, or in the British Pharmaceutical Codex.
- (3) This Regulation shall not apply to a drug dispensed and supplied on prescription or order signed by a legally qualified medical practitioner, nor to a mixture supplied by a registered pharmacist extemporaneously prepared for a specific and individual case.
- (4) The label or advertisement relating to any drug or medicine for sale shall not contain any statement or claim which directly or by implication indicates or suggests that it will remedy or cure Bright's disease, cancer, consumption, cerebro-spinal meningitis, diabetes, dropsy, drunkenness, epilepsy, fits, infantile paralysis, plague, locomotor ataxia, lupus, paralysis, rupture, scrofula, venereal disease; or that the drug or medicine is a universal panacea, infallible cure for baldness, cure for drunkenness, or the liquor habit; will develop the bust, raise the height, eradicate wrinkles; or that recommends or suggests its use for any disease arising from sexual intercourse, sexual weakness, or impotence.
 - (5) The label or advertisement relating to any drug or medicine for sale shall not contain any statement which-
 - (a) indicates or suggests that the medicine is an abortifacient;
 - (b) bears the name of a fictitious person in connection therewith;
 - (c) contains any fictitious testimonial.
- (6) A proprietary preparation or patent medicine shall not be named or advertised in such a way as to conceal its proprietary character or lead the purchaser to believe that it is a simple chemical or vegetable drug ordinarily purchasable in small quantities instead of a proprietary substance or mixture of substances.

Provided that this Regulation shall not apply to the advertising of drugs in medical journals, bona fide trade journals, or price lists by or on behalf of manufacturers to the retail trade only.

Approved by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, this eighth day of October, 1928.
