WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," the Governor may on the recommendation of the Board declare by Proclamation that any road shall be a main road; and whereas the Main Roads Board has recommended that the road specified in the Schedule the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby declares that the road specified in the Schedule hereto shall be a main road within the meaning of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," and that the footpaths, if any, of such road be excluded from the main road.

"Chairman"-The Chairman of the Wongan-

Ballidu Road Board. "Secretary"-The Secr Ballidu Road Board. Secretary of the Wongan-

No owner or builder within the meaning of these By-laws shall erect any building upon any land in the townsite unless he first submits to the Board a copy of the plans and specifications of the building to be erected, and setting out clearly the number of build-ings proposed to be built on each particular lot or parcel of land, the measurements, material of construc-

tion, and use for which the building is internet. 3. No building shall be commenced unless a copy of the plans and specifications shall have been laid before and approved by the Board, and such copy of the plans and specifications shall receive approval by endorsement set thereto by the hands of the Chairman and Secretary.

4. The Board may reject any plans or specifications which have not, by reason of inflammable material proposed to be used, or other reason, proper regard for the safety of persons or other buildings in the event of fire.

The Board may reject any plans or specifications which, in the opinion of the Board, do not bear proper

consideration of size or design of construction or architecture to the adjacent buildings.
6. No builder or owner shall open up any road or footpath which by reason of building operations is found necessary unless he first obtains a permit from the Deard or which the permit of the line of the permit of the the Board, and such openings shall be covered or railed and provided with lights to ensure safety to the gen-eral public using the road or footpath. 7. Every builder or owner shall, within reasonable

time from the completion of any building, fill in and repair to the satisfaction of the Board's authorised inspection officer, all openings on any road or footpath which by reason of building operations it has been found necessary to open. 8. The Board shall have the right to declare any

street or streets, or parts of a street, an area wherein no owner or builder may erect buildings of any kind other than of brick, stone, or concrete, with the excep-tion that the Board may permit outhouses to be erected of any material, providing that special applica-

9. The footpath in all made roads in the townsite shall be 12 feet wide from the building line.
10. The Board shall withhold its permission to and for living purposes only

build premises to be used for living purposes only

- (a) to be built not less than 15 feet from the building line;
 - (b) to have a picket or other suitable fence enclosing the block on which the building is to be erected;
 - (c) to be equipped in the case of a one-roomed building with a tank having at least a capa-city of 1,000 gallons; in the case of a building having from two to four rooms, with a tank or tanks having a minimum capacity of 2,000 gallons; in the case of a building hav-ing more than four rooms, with a tank or tanks having a minimum capacity of 3,000 gallons

UNIVERSITY OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

Statute.

THE following new Statute, which has received the approval of the Governor, is published in the Government Gazette in accordance with Section 33 (i) of "The University of Western Australia Act, 1911":----

Statute No. 20-Conditions of Awarding Hackett Bursaries and Research Studentships.

1. Under the terms of the Will of Sir John Winthrop Hackett, first Chancellor of the University, the Senate shall offer each year Bursaries and Research Student-ships "for the assistance and maintenance of descrying students of the University whose means make it difficult

for them to take a University ourse." Under the terms of the Will as interpreted by the Order of the Court, No. 20 of 22nd December, 1926, no amendment of this Statute "shall depart from the fundamental object of granting assistance and/or main-tenance to those students only who are deserving and of limited means."

2. The Bursaries shall be given under the following conditions:-

(a) The Chancellor shall have received satisfactory assurance that the applicant's own means, and those of his parents or guardians are such as to make it difficult for him to bear the cost of attending the University as a full-time student without the assistance of a Bur-

sary. (b) The bursar shall attend the University as a fulltime student.

(c) Applications for Bursaries should reach the Vice-Chancellor not later than January 15th in each year from persons who have qualified or who expect to qualify for matriculation before the commencement of next session of the University.

(e) The Bursar shall hold his Bursary only long as he shows himself to be diligent and of good conduct and satisfies the Board of Examiners at each annual examination and while his means and those of his parents or guardians are such as to make it difficult for him to hear the cost of attending the University as a full-time student without the assistance of a Bursary

(f) Subject to the above conditions, the Bursary may be held from the date of the student's entry on the course as a matriculated student for the duration of the course for a pass or Honours degree.

(g)

(i) Undergraduates who have already gone through part of the course, and have then become unable to finish their course without help.

(ii) Unmatriculated students pursuing a full-time course for a Diploma.

3. The Research Studentship shall be given under the following conditions:

(a) Post Graduate Studentships of a value not ex-ceeding £150 per annum are open to graduates of the cecang 2100 per annum are open to graduates of the University. An additional sum not exceeding £100 per annum may be spent under the direction of the Super-visor of the research for the provision of books, ap-paratus, and other expenses incidental to the student's work. These books and other materials shall remain the property of the University. (b) The Chancellor shall have received satisfactory

assurance that the applicant's means are such as to make it difficult for him to continue as a full-time research student, without the assistance of a Studentship.

(c) That the Studentship shall be tenable for one year in the University of Western Australia but may be continued for a period to be determined by the Professorial Board, and may then be made tenable elsewhere. When a studentship is held outside the State, a certain proportion of the sum set apart for books, apparatus, etc., may be spent on travelling expenses. This propor-tion shall be fixed by the Vice-Chancellor and shall not in any case exceed two thirds of the sum so set apart.

(d) Applications should reach the Vice-Chancellor not

(d) Applications should reach the vice of alterior for the later than the third Tuesday in August in each year.
(e) Applicants must submit a scheme of work for the approval of the University.
(f) The awards will be made by the Professorial Board after reports have been received from the Facultarian terms and the scheme of the scheme of the facultarian terms and the scheme of the The Faculty concerned shall, in each case, appoint ties. a supervisor of the student's research. No awards shall be made in any year unless applicants of sufficient merit present themselves, but additional Studentships may be awarded in a subsequent year.

(g) Payment of the grant under the Studentship may be made in instalments, at such times as may be de-cided, each instalment, with the exception of the first, which will be paid in advance, being payable only on receipt by the University of sufficient evidence that the bolds of the Studentship is sufficient evidence that the holder of the Studentship is satisfactorily pursuing his studies.

(h) At the close of the year of tenure the Research student shall be required to supply a full report to the University on the progress he has made with the work

originally undertaken, including copies of any theses or publications resulting from his work. (i) Whenever publication is made of any work car-ried out under a Hackett Research Studentship, the published work shall include a statement to this effect.

(j) Notwithstanding anything contained in Section 3. Subsection (c), any holder of a Research Student-ship may, irrespective of the date of his or her gradua-tion in the University of Western Australia, be per-mitted under special elementations to commence or committed under special circumstances to commence or con-tinue such Research Studentship at another University or at a Research Institution outside the State, the grant or at a Research Institution outside the State, the grant of such permission and the duration of the period that, may be so spent outside the State to be in the disertion of the Professorial Board. (k) Temporary provision.—Notwithstanding Section (c) above, students who graduated at least one year prior to the institution of the Research Studentships

may be allowed, in special circumstances, to hold a Re-search Studentship from the outset at another Uni-versity or at a Research Institution outside the State.
