Declaration of Main Road.

M.R.B. 850/27.

WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Board, declare by Proclamation that any road shall be a main road; and whereas the Main Roads Board has recommended that the road specified in the Schedule hereto be so declared: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby declares that the road specified in the Schedule hereto shall be a main road within the meaning of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," and that the footpaths, if any, of such road be excluded from the main road.

The Schedule.

Clackline-Piawaning Road.—(Toodyay Road District).

A strip of land, one chain wide, commencing at the Southern corner of Reserve 2614 at its junction with the Midland Junction-Merredin Road; thence continuing in a Northerly direction along Newcastle Road to the Clackline-Toodyay and Piawaning Branch Railway, crossing same at this point to its Western side in Location 10766; thence continuing in a Northerly and North-Easterly direction following the Clackline-Toodyay and Piawaning Branch Railway to 55 M.; thence continuing in a North-Easterly direction to Huddy Well at the Western side of the Clackline-Toodyay and Piawaning Branch Railway; thence crossing the said Railway at this point to its Eastern side; thence continuing in a North-Westerly direction through Location 1911 along Road No. 209 to the North-Western corner of Location 764 at the Eastern side of the Clackline-Toodyay and Piawaning Branch Railway; thence continuing in a North-Easterly direction through the Subway and continuing in a Northerly direction along surveyed road to Lloyd's Crossing at the Western side of the Clackline-Toodyay and Piawaning Branch Railway; thence crossing the said Railway at this point to its Eastern side; thence continuing in a North-Easterly direction along

surveyed road to the junction of Road No. 106; thence continuing in a North-Westerly and Northerly direction along Road No. 106 to the South-Western corner of Lot 19; thence continuing along Stirling Terrace in a North-Westerly and Westerly direction to its intersection with Harper Road; thence crossing the Avon River Bridge and continuing in a Northerly direction along Road No. 146 to Coondle Station; thence crossing the Clackline-Toodyay Piawaning Branch Railway at this point to its Western side; thence continuing in a Northerly direction following the said Railway to Location 27; thence crossing the Clackline-Toodyay Piawaning Branch Railway at this point to its Eastern side; thence continuing along Road No. 146 in a North-Easterly direction following the Clackline-Toodyay Piawaning Branch Railway to 8 M.; thence crossing the said Railway at this point to its Western side; thence continuing in a North-Easterly direction along the Road No. 146 following the said Railway to 9.8 M.; thence crossing the Clackline-Toodyay Piawaning Branch Railway at this point to its Eastern side thence continuing in a North-Easterly direction past Culham Siding along Roads Nos. 146 and 19 to its intersection with Road No. 5308 (Western Road) at the Western boundary of the Townsite of Bejoording; thence continuing in a North-Easterly direction along Third Road to Seventh Road; thence continuing in a North-Westerly direction along Seventh Road to Tenth Road; thence continuing in a North-Easterly direction along Tenth Road to Ninth Road at the Eastern boundary of the Townsite of Bejoording; thence continuing in a North-Easterly direction along Road No. 1155 to the North-Eastern corner of Location 1708; thence continuing in a North-Westerly direction along Road No. 1155 to the North-Western corner of Location 1832; thence continuing in a North-Easterly direction along Connor Road to the North-Eastern corner of Location 1832; thence continuing in a North-Westerly direction along Bolgart Road to Lindsay Road at the Southern boundary of the Victoria Plains Road District as shown on Plan M.R.B., W.A., 401.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 4829/19.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter By-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such By-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 17255, for Recreation, at Quecrearup Lake, should be placed under the control of the Woodanilling Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of the Woodanilling Road Board as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter By-laws for the control and management of the said Reserves, for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon, for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

Educ. 1213/28.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has approved of the deletion of Regulation 67 of the Education Department and the substitution of the following amendment:—

Delete Regulation 67 and substitute:—

No. 67. The classification of students leaving the College will depend upon—

- (a) the record of class work and College examinations;
- (b) the record of teaching practice.

The classification will be provisional and will not be confirmed until they gain the Practical Skill Pass from their Inspectors. Their provisional classifications and salaries will be liable to reduction if the Practical Skill Pass is not obtained within two years.

The classification provisionally awarded may be B2, C1, or C2, in accordance with the conditions laid down from time to time in the College Calendar.

Students who have completed a two years' course satisfactorily will, except as provided hereunder, rank as "ex-students" (*see* Regulation 38) for two years. Students who have completed a three years' course satisfactorily will rank as "ex-students" for one year, with the second grade of salary. Students who have completed a four years' course satisfactorily will be paid as assistants. For all purposes of classification and reckoning of seniority, students who have taken extended courses shall be ranked as though they had held their classifications from the completion of their second year of training.

A student graduating at the end of the first year of training, if taking the two years' course, will, at the conclusion of the period of training, be eligible for appointment on the same conditions as students who have been through the three years' course of training. Similarly, a student graduating at the end of the second year, if taking the three years' course, will, at the conclusion of the period of training, be eligible for appointment on the same conditions as students who have been through the four years' course of training.

A student graduating at the close of his first year will receive for the second year of his course an allowance equal to that paid a student of the post-graduate course.

South Perth Road Board—By-laws relating to Crossings over Footways and Channels.

P.W. 376/23.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any district is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the South Perth Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

(a) No person shall wilfully and without lawful excuse ride, drive, or lead any horse or other animal, or drive or wheel any carriage, cart, or other vehicle upon, along, or across any footway, or any water channel or gutter, herein called channel, by the side of any street or road, save in each such case upon and by or at some crossing already made or to be made as hereafter mentioned;

(b) When any person in the course of, or when any person who is responsible for the carrying out of any work or undertaking, desires by himself, his workmen, servants, or agents to have access to any land adjoining or abutting upon any footway of any street or road with animals and/or vehicles, and if access to such land from such street or road cannot be had without riding, driving, leading, or wheeling such animals and/or vehicles upon or across the said footway or the channel (if any) lying along the outer edge thereof, then, provided he shall have first given notice in writing of such his desire to the Board, and in such notice described the land in question and the nature of the proposed crossing, and deposited the sum of Two pounds with the Board as security for the due performance of these By-laws, it shall be lawful for every such person, with the consent in writing of the Board, or some officer of the Board appointed for the purpose first obtained at his own cost, to make such crossing. Every such crossing shall be constructed of planking, boarding, or other sufficient material, which shall prevent any misuse or obstruction of or any damage or injury to the said footways and/or channels;

(c) Every person making or constructing any such crossing as aforesaid shall keep and maintain the same, and all material connected therewith whilst in use, so as to prevent any misuse or obstruction of or damage or injury to the said footways and/or channels, and shall remove the said crossing when no longer required, and shall restore the said footways and/or channels to the same order and condition as the same were before any such crossing was made or constructed. The report or opinion of the duly appointed officer of the Board shall be final and conclusive as to whether such restoration and repairs have been properly carried out by the person required to do or make the same as aforesaid.

(d) If any crossing has been made in any respect contrary to these By-laws it shall be lawful for the Board, if they see fit, to cause the same to be altered so as to conform to these By-laws, and to recover the expenses of such alteration from the person making or using such crossing;

(e) If any person does any act contrary to or neglects or omits to do any act required to be done by any of the four last preceding By-laws, such person shall incur a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such offence, and a further penalty not exceeding forty shillings for every day during which such offence continues.

THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919.

South Perth Road Board—By-laws relating to the Prevention and Abatement of Nuisances.

P.W. 376/23.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Board of a Road District is empowered to make By-laws for any of the purposes in the said Act mentioned; and whereas the South Perth Road Board, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers competent to it under and by virtue of the said Act, and of every power or authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Interpretation.

"Act" means "The Road Districts Act, 1919."
"District" means the South Perth Road District.
"Board" means the South Perth Road Board.

Prevention of Nuisances.

1. No building shall be erected or used for a purpose which in the opinion of the Board is calculated to be or to become or cause a nuisance, and the Board may refuse to approve of or sanction the erection of any building which the Board may ascertain, or may have reason to believe is intended to be used for a purpose which in the opinion of the Board may be or become or cause a nuisance, or a public inconvenience, or disturbance, or annoyance to the neighbourhood or residents in the immediate neighbourhood of any such building.

Application and Plans.

2. In every application which shall at any time be submitted for approval of the Board to the erection of any building wherein or in connection with which machinery, gearing, or mechanical appliances is or are intended to be used or applied, or to be installed on any land within the jurisdiction of the Board, then and in every such case the applicant shall, when lodging any application for approval of the Board, furnish full particulars and description of such machinery, gearing, and mechanical appliances, and state the purpose for which the same is to be used or intended to be used, and the applicant shall also, if required by the Board, lodge with his application a plan of such machinery, gearing, and mechanical appliances: Provided that the Board may, if it see fit, dispense with the necessity for submission of a plan if the Board be satisfied that the machinery, gearing, or mechanical appliances proposed to be installed or erected are not likely to cause or be responsible for any nuisance or public inconvenience, disturbance, or annoyance. The plan, where such is required, shall show the relation of the site of the proposed installation of machinery, gearing, or mechanical appliances to the boundaries of the site and to all buildings or structures thereon.

Approval—Proviso as to.

3. The Board may, upon giving its approval to such application as above-mentioned, impose conditions as to the method or manner of working such machinery, gearing, or mechanical appliances, and that same is not to be operated or used between certain hours, and may define and limit such hours.

Installation and License.

4. No person shall instal or erect or commence the installation or erection of any machinery, gearing, or mechanical appliances, or use or work same without first having obtained from the Board a written license for the installation or erection or use of same.

Every such license shall be issued and shall remain in force, unless sooner cancelled, until the 30th day of June first following the date of issuing such license, and the same shall be renewed by the person referred to from year to year as from the date of expiration of every such license. Every person to whom any such license shall be issued shall pay to the Board such fees as may be prescribed.

Time for Completion.

5. The installation or erection of any machinery, gearing, or apparatus as set forth in the preceding provision must be completed within six months from the date of the issue of the license, or within such other time as the Board shall allow or permit. Such permission to be instanced by the Board in writing.

Fees.

6. The fees payable in respect of all applications licenses and renewals given by the Board herein shall be:—

- (1) In all cases of application where a plan is required, the sum of twenty shillings (20s.); and
- (2) in all other applications the sum of 2s. 6d.
- (3) For every license and renewal thereof 2s. 6d.

Erection of Fences, Storing of Goods, Vehicles, and Machinery.

7. No person shall erect or cause to be erected any fence or structure, or shall add to any fence or structure, or shall store any goods, materials, vehicles, or machines, or any part or parts of such goods, materials, vehicles, or machines in such a manner as to be unsightly to the public, or so as to cause or which would be likely to cause any nuisance, or be or become or cause a public inconvenience or annoyance.

Penalties.

8. Any person who shall commit any breach of or who fails, refuses, or neglects to comply with all or any of the provisions or stipulations of these By-laws, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), and any license issued to the person committing any breach as aforesaid, or failing, refusing, or neglecting to comply with such By-laws, may at any time be cancelled by the Board.

The Board may in all cases abate any nuisance or nuisances arising under the provisions of these By-laws, and may take all such necessary steps, and do all such necessary acts or act for the prevention or abatement of any such nuisance or nuisances hereunder.
