WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Board, declare by Proclamation that any road shall be a main road: And whereas the Main Roads Board has recommended that the road specified in the schedule hereto be so declared: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby declares that the road speci-fied in the schedule hereto shall be a main road within the meaning of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," and that the footpaths, if any, of such road be excluded from the main road.

PORT OF FREMANTLE.

Gage Roads-Loss of Anchor. NOTICE TO MARINERS.

THE Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust give notice for the guidance of navigators generally that, during a heavy squall from W.N.W. at 7 a.m. on 2nd instant, the French Mail Steamer "Commissaire Ramel' lost a 4-ton Stockless Anchor and 75 fathoms of Cable in Gage Roads. The position of the ship when the cable parted is given as Lat. 32deg. 3min. 45sec. South and Long. 115deg. 42min. 18sec. East, North Mole Lighthouse bearing true 58 degrees, and Smelters' chimney true 115 degrees. The depth of water is given as 9 fathoms. as 9 fathoms.

Steps are being taken to lift the anchor and cable, but in the meantime navigators are warned against dropping anchors in the vicinity of the spot indicated as the anchors may foul the lost tackle.

Regulation for the Sale of Lots at Herdsman Lake.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under Section 161 of the above Act, of the following Regulation for the sale of Suburban Lots at Herdsman Lake.

Conditions of Sale of Herdsman's Lake Suburban Lands.

1. The land offered for sale will be particularised in the notice headed "Land Sales," published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time, and will be sold subject to the terms and conditions of "The Land Act, 1898," and the Regulations hereunder, and to a depth of 200 feet below the natural surface.

2. The highest bidder shall be the purchaser, and, if any dispute arise, the lot in dispute shall be put up again and resold.

3. Each lot shall be offered at the upset price and, if no advance be made, the applicant for the same shall be declared the purchaser at that price; but if any advance be made, the highest bidder shall be the purchaser as aforesaid. Bidding shall advance at the rate of not less than one pound per acre.

Should the applicant not be the purchaser his depositwill be refunded in due course.

4. The purchaser shall, immediately upon the fall of the hammer, pay to the Minister for Lands, or his agent, a deposit of $\pounds10$ of the purchase money, unless

he has already paid a sufficient deposit on application, and any such deposit shall be considered as payment of the purchase money so far as the same will extend. Should the purchaser fail to pay the deposit as required, the purchase shall be void and the lot shall be offered again immediately for sale.

5. The balance of purchase money, plus interest at the rate of six pounds per centum per annum, shall be paid to the Minister for Lands, or his agent, in thirty years from the first of the quarter preceding the date of sale, by equal half-yearly instalments on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year, the first instalment to be adjusted to date of sale; the Crown grant fees shall be 1 ayable with the last instaiment of purchase money; provided that nothing shall prevent the balance of purchase money and fees being paid at an earlier date shall the purchaser so desire, but no Crown grant shall issue until the Minister is satisfied that the improvements prescribed below have been effected and maintained. The payment of the purchase money plus interest shall be subject to the provisions of Section 136 of the Act aforesaid.

6. (a) Each lot shall be fenced, on the surveyed boundaries, within two (2) years from the date of sale, with a fence of the description prescribed by the said Act: Provided that the Minister may, if he thinks fit, dispense with the division fence between two or more adjoining lots purchased or held by one person.

(b) In addition to the above each lot shall, within one year, have at least one-tenth of its area, and within three years, one-fourth of its area, cultivated *bona fide* as a vegetable garden.

7. In default of payment of any one of the several instalments after the same is due or, if the conditions as to fencing and cultivation have not been complied with within the times prescribed, the land shall be absolutely forfeited, together with all purchase money, interest, and fees that may have been paid.

8. 11. No person shall (without the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands first obtained) acquire or hold under lease more than two suburban lots in this suburban area.

12. No person under 16 years of age shall be eligible to acquire a lot under these Regulations.

13. The lots bracketed together in the notice in the Government Gazette shall be sold as one lot, and the smaller of such lots shall be occupied for residential purposes, to the satisfaction of the Minister, within six months from the date of purchase.

14. Any purchaser may surrender the residential site within thirty days from the date of sale.

15. If for any reason either of the lots bracketed together is forfeited, the remaining lot shall also be forfeited.

16. No transfer prior to the issue of the Crown Grant will be approved, except it includes all the land bracketed in the *Government Gazette* notice and sold as one lot to the purchaser.

17. No person shall be permitted at any time to hold more than one residential site.

Yilgarn District Road Board-Building By-laws. P.W. 9/26.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on it by the Second Schedule to "The Road Districts Act, 1919," Building Regulations 36 and 37, the Yilgarn District Road Board doth make and publish the following Bylaws, and doth order that such By-laws shall apply to the Townsite of Southern Cross:

1. No person shall erect any building or alter or add to an existing building, or shall permit any person to erect any building, or alter or add to an existing build-ing on land of which he is the owner or of which he has the control, except such building, alteration, or addition is created in conformity with these By-laws. 2. No person shall build any structure intended to be used for human habitation or occupation, or capable

of being used as such, or shall alter or add to any such existing structure without having obtained a Building License from the Board and paying the fees prescribed

- (a) The fee for Building License;
 (b) the fee for the use of the portion of the street abutting on the building during building operations and deposit as security for the re-instatement and repair of such portion of such street;
 - (c) the charge of the Local Health Authority for providing the necessary pans and lids for the privy.

3. Before such Building License is issued plans and specifications, in the form prescribed herein, shall be submitted to the Surveyor, and a license will not be granted before seven days after the submission of such plans and specifications, unless in special circumstances, of which special circumstances the Surveyor shall be the sole judge.

4. Plans shall be in ink, on tracing linen or on paper sufficiently strong to stand the erasure of "H" pencil marks without injury to the paper; and specifications shall be in typewriting or in ink manuscript clearly

written and on strong paper. 5. Plans shall show clearly such ground plans, ele-vations, and sections as are sufficient to make plain the construction and dimensions of the proposed structure. The sizes of rooms and thicknesses of walls shall be written on, in figures. Specifications shall show clearly, both as to materials and sizes of same, the construction of the foundations, floors, internal and external walls, ceilings, and roof; also the ventilation of the structure, the number of privies and the construction of same, and shall provide for at least one privy of the prescribed construction provided with the pan supplied by the Local

Health Authority. A block plan, signed by the builder or owner, shall be supplied, showing clearly the position of the intended structure on the block of land on which it is to be erected, and the position of the privy. Such plan will be retained by the Board.

6. If the plans and specifications submitted are in accordance with these By-laws and the prescribed fees paid, the Surveyor shall sign them on behalf of the Board and issue a Building License, in the form pre-scribed herein, and for the period set forth in such license, but if the plans and specifications contain any matter which in the opinion of the Surveyor is contrary to the principles of sound or sanitary construction, and such matter is not covered by these By-laws, the Sur-veyor shall refer such matter to the Board at its next meeting, and the Board shall have power to decide any matter referred to in Clauses A to K of Section 37 of the Building Regulations when such matter is not defined by these By-laws, and a Building License will not be granted until the Board decides on such matter; pro-vided that such decision will not be unreasonably delayed.

Within that portion of Antares Street, bounded on The North by Ackernar Street and on the South by Orion Street, no external wall shall be erected on the building line nor nearer than ten (10) feet to such building line, unless constructed of brick, stone, or concrete.

8. On behalf of the Board the Surveyor may au-8. On behalf of the Board the Surveyor may au-thorise the internal linings, partitions, and ceilings of any dwelling, if such building is not nearer than ten feet to any boundary of the block of land on which it stands, to be constructed wholly or partly of inflammable material. Such authority shall hold good for not more than twelve months after the date fixed for the expiration of the Building License, but may be extended by the Board from time to time on the application of by the Board from time to time on the application of the then owner. If no such extension of time is granted such inflammable material shall then have become erected contrary to the provisions of Section 14 of the Building Regulations, within the meaning of the said section, and the Board may at any time proceed in the manuary of forth in the said Section 14. manner set forth in the said Section 14.

9. No wall other than brick, stone, or concrete shall be crected within 2 feet 6 inches of the boundary of the block of land on which it stands, and no brick, stone or concrete wall shall be crected at a lesser distance than 2 feet 6 inches from the boundary, unless it is a parapet wall rising to a height of not less than one (1) foot above the roof gutter, and the Board will not approve of any subdivision of land which would have the effect of leaving an existing wall in conflict with this provision.

No street verandah shall be erected except in 10 accordance with the plan submitted to and approved of by the Board, and every such verandah shall be provided with a suitable gutter to carry the water falling on such verandah. If the water from such gutter discharges into the street, it shall be carried into the street gutter by a cast or wrought iron downpipe, of such size as the Board may direct, and such downpipe shall dis-charge into the street gutter in such manner as the Board may direct.

Any such street verandah, gutter, and downpipe shall at all times be kept in repair by the owner of the building in front of which it is built, to the satisfaction of the Board, and the owner shall carry out any repairs in such manner as may be ordered by the Board.

11. No privy shall be erected nearer than six feet to the block of land adjoining that on which it stands. Where a right-of-way adjoins such block, the privy must abut on such right-of-way.

12. Before the construction of any building is com-menced a privy shall be provided on the land for the use of the workmen.

Fees payable. For a Building License: Two shillings and sixpence for each 1,000 square feet of floor space or part thereof. The term ''Floor Area'' shall mean the space occu-

pied by each floor of the building, including basement, but not including a verandah open on three sides.

For permission during the erection of a building to occupy any part of a street abutting on such building: For the first three months, Ten shillings; for every subsequent three months, One pound.

Deposit for the repair of such part occupied: One pound, and the Board may at any time require the amount of such deposit to be increased to such amount as ordered, on giving notice to the builder by post or by leaving the notice at the building, and the Building License shall be suspended until the order of the Board is complied with.
