THE PRISONS ACT, 1903-18.

Chief Secretary's Department, Perth, 18th December, 1928. 1538/21.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to amend Regulation 82 of the Regulations under "The Prisons Act, 1903-18," published in the Gazette on the 19th day of January, 1923—

(1) By adding to the offences therein mentioned the following further offences, viz.:—

"Any other act or omission which is declared to be a breach of or an offence under the Act or these regulations.'

"Any other disgraceful or improper conduct as an officer."

"Any other disgraceful or improper conduct otherwise than as an officer by reason whereof an officer ceases to be a fit and proper person to continue in his employment as an officer.'

(2) By adding after the offences in the said regula-

tions a proviso as follows: "Provided that if the Superintendent of the Fremantle Prison, or the Officer-in-Charge of any prison other than Fremantle is of the opinion that any offence brought under his notice is of such a nature, or has been committed under such circumstances as to call only for a caution or reprimand, such Superintendent or Officer-in-Charge may caution or reprimand the offending officer, but shall report having done so, with full particulars relating to the offence to the Comptroller General."

(3) To approve of an additional regulation -- "82. (a) If any officer is on an inc "82. (a) If any officer is on an indictment convicted of any offence he shall be deemed to have forfeited his office, and shall thereupon cease to perform his duties, or receive his salary."

And to cancel Regulations 88 to 91 inclusive of the beforementioned Regulations, and to substitute in lieu thereof the annexed regulations.

THE PRISONS ACT, 1903-1918.

Cancellation of Regulations 88 to 91, inclusive, and substitution of the following Regulations in lieu thereof.

Inquiries, etc.

88. For the purpose of inquiries against officers pursuant to the provisions of Regulation 82, the following rules shall apply, namely:—

(1) Charges against an officer may be made by any

officer having authority and control over such officer.

- (2) Charges shall be made on the officers' charge sheet, and, at Fremantle Prison and penal outstations thereof, shall be forwarded to the Superintendent, and at other prisons shall be forwarded to the Comptroller General.
- (3) Charges shall be made and forwarded as provided as soon as possible after the alleged offence has been committed.
- (4) An officer charged with an offence shall be furnished forthwith with a statement in writing of the charge made against him, signed by the officer making the charge, and bearing the date when such charge is made. Upon receipt of such statement the officer charged shall forthwith state in writing to the Comptroller General, Superintendent, or other officer having authority or control over the officer charged, as the case may be, whether he admits or denies the truth of such charge, and he may with such statement or at any time thereafter before an inquiry is held, give any written explanation relating to the alleged offence.
- (5) If the charge is admitted no inquiry shall be necessary, and the Comptroller General or the Superintendent, as the case may be, shall deal with the matter and impose such penalty as a person holding an inquiry as hereafter provided may do at the conclusion of an inquiry held by him. In such case it shall be necessary only to record sufficient evidence to show the nature and gravity of the offence and the statement (if any) by the officer charged.
- (6) If the offence with which an officer is charged is so serious or of such a nature as in the opinion of the Superintendent or officer in charge of the prison where the officer charged is employed to render it inadvisable that the officer charged shall continue to carry out his duties pending the dealing with the charge where the same is admitted or the inquiry into the charge where the same is denied, such Superintendent or officer in charge of prison may suspend the officer charged from duty, but he shall report such suspension forthwith to the Comptroller General who may upon receipt of such report either confirm such suspension or direct the removal thereof as he may think fit.
- (7) If the charge is not admitted, and the officer charged is employed at Fremantle Prison or any penal outstation thereof, an inquiry shall be held by the Superintendent of Fremantle Prison or by the person for the time being occupying that office, but etherwise an inquiry shall be held by the officer in charge of the prison in which the officer charged is employed: Provided always that if the officer charged is an officer in charge of a prison the inquiry shall be held by the Comptroller General.
- (8) Inquiries shall be held as soon as conveniently may be; not less than three days' notice in writing of the date, time and place appointed for the holding of an inquiry shall be given to the officer charged; and he shall attend personally at such inquiry. If the officer charged shall fail to attend the inquiry, then upon proof being given that the officer charged has received such notice, the inquiry may be held in his absence or may be adjourned as the person holding the inquiry shall think fit.
- (9) Witnesses may attend the inquiry and may be examined, cross-examined, and re-examined by the officer conducting the case in support of the charge, and by the officer charged in answer thereto, in accordance with the practice of courts of law on the trial of an action, and the officer conducting the case in support of the charge, and the officer charged may address the person holding the inquiry in the same manner and in the same order as counsel may address the Court on the trial of an action: Provided that any informality in the conduct of the inquiry shall not invalidate the finding.
- (10) The person holding the inquiry may admit any evidence both oral and documentary as may in his opinion be material and relevant to the charge and may reject any evidence which in his opinion is not so material and relevant. He shall take and record in writing in a narrative form any oral evidence admitted by him; he shall read the same over to the witness giving such evidence, correct any errors therein, and then obtain the signature of the witness upon the record of his evidence.
- (11) When the cases against and for the officer charged have been concluded the person holding the inquiry shall as soon as conveniently may be consider the evidence and (subject to paragraph 15 hereof) shall make his decision thereon and fix the penalty (if any) imposed by him. When such decision has been made

- and penalty (if any) imposed, he shall forthwith record the same and communicate the same to the officer charged.
- (12) If the person holding an inquiry is the Superintendent of Fremantle Prison or the person for the time being occupying that office, and he finds the charge to have been proved but is of opinion that the offence committed is of such a nature or was committed in such circumstances as to be sufficiently dealt with by a caution, reprimand or small fine, he may caution or reprimand or impose a fine not exceeding one pound for each offence upon the officer charged, but shall report forthwith in writing to the Comptroller General what he has done in the matter.
- (13) If the person holding an inquiry is the Superintendent of Fremantle Prison or the person for the time being occupying that office, and he finds the charge to have been proved and is of opinion that the offence committed is so serious or of such an aggravated nature as to justify a substantial fine or dismissal, he shall suspend or continue the suspension from duty of the officer charged and forthwith torward to the Comptroller General the full and original notes of the inquiry, and the Comptroller General may deal with the matter in the manner hereinafter provided as he shall think fit.
- (14) If the person holding an inquiry is an efficer in charge of a prison other than Fremantle Prison and penal outstations thereof, he shall forward to the Comproller General the full and original notes of the inquiry together with a report of his finding and a recommendation as to the punishment (if any) which in his opinion should be imposed, and the Comptroller General may deal with the matter in the manner hereinafter provided as he shall think fit.
- (15) In all cases referred to the Comptroller General by the persons holding inquiries under this regulation and upon inquiries held by the Comptroller General as provided herein, the Comptroller General shall consider the notes of the inquiry sent to or taken by him, and decide whether or not in his opinion the charge has been proved. If he decides that the charge has not been proved, he shall dismiss the charge, and thereupon any suspension from duty shall be removed, and the officer shall receive his salary in full for the period of his suspension; but if he decides that the charge has been proved then the Comptroller General may do any one or more of the following things:—
 - (a) reprimand the offender;
 - (b) impose a fine upon the offender;
 - (c) deprive the offender of any leave within a specified period;
 - (d) reduce the offender to a lower rank or salary;
 - (e) if the offender is an officer other than an officer in charge of a prison, dismiss the offender from his employment;
 - (f) if the offender is an officer in charge of a prison, make a recommendation to the Governor that the offender be dismissed from his employment.
- 89. For the purposes of Regulation 88, paragraph 15, sub-paragraph (e), the Governor shall be deemed by this regulation to have delegated to the Comptroller General the dismissal of prison officers under the provisions of Section 15, Subsection 3, of "The Prisons Act, 1903-1918."
- 90. If an officer is dismissed by the Comptroller General in accordance with these regulations, then subject to such dismissal being set aside on appeal as hereinafter provided in these regulations, such officer shall not be entitled to any salary in respect of any period during which he may have been suspended.
- 91. (1) If the Comptroller General shall make a recommendation to the Governor that an officer in charge of a prison be dismissed from his employment, such officer shall have a right of appeal against such recommendation under Regulation 32 hereof, and such recommendation shall not be submitted to the Governor until the appeal has been heard and dismissed, or the time for such appeal has expired.
- (2) If upon the due submission of such recommendation to the Governor such officer is dismissed from his employment by the Governor, there shall not be any appeal against such dismissal, and the officer in charge shall not receive any salary in respect of any period during which he may have been suspended unless the Governor otherwise directs.

(3) Upon the due submission of such recommendation to the Governor, the Governor may, instead of dismissing the officer in accordance with such recommendation, refer the matter back to the Comptroller General with a direction that he impose upon the offender any of the punishments other than dismissal provided in Regulation 88, paragraph 15, and upon receipt of such direction the Comptroller General shall impose punishment upon the offender accordingly, and there shall not be any appeal against the same.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," in lieu of those previously published, which are hereby cancelled.

PUBLIC CEMETERY, MARGARET RIVER.

By-laws.

By virtue of the powers vested in them the Board of Trustees make the following By-laws and Regulations:—

- 1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in Schedule "A," are to be paid at the time when the applications are made or orders given.
- 2. Any person desiring ground in the Cemetery for any grave, private grave, vault, or tombstone, monument or enclosure, or for any other purpose, shall make application therefor on prescribed form. Upon such application being approved of the Trustees shall cause to be issued to such person so applying a Certificate of Right of Burial in the form specified in the Act (see Schedule "B").
- 3. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Trustees in time to allow of at least five (5) working hours, notice being given to the Secretary at the Cemetery prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application and order therefor be handed in at the office in time to allow of at least six (6) working hours' notice being given as above.
- 4. The name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of deceased, and any other particulars mentioned in Schedule "D," shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
- 5. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under the supervision of the Secretary, after submitting a plan of same and obtaining a written approval of the Trustees thereto, and on payment of the necessary fees; and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special exemption be obtained from the Trustees in writing.
- 6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate, bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon.
- 7. Every grave shall be at least 6ft. deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with less depth than 3ft. from the top of coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground after such interment.
- 8. No interment shall be allowed in any private grave or vault without the production of the Certificate of Right of Burial, as in Schedule "B," or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except in such cases as are provided for in the following By-law.
- 9. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written consent of the owner shall be handed in with the application.
- 10. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery without a certificate from the District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial. Such certificate or order shall at the latest be handed to the Secretary upon the funeral entering the Cemetery.
- 11. The hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.
- 12. No burial shall be allowed to take place at any other hour, except by written permission of the Trustees.
- 13. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery.
- 14. At funerals no vehicles other than hearses shall be allowed to enter the Cemetery gates.

- 15. All hearses shall proceed by such roads as directed, and the drivers shall at all times observe such directions as may be issued to the Secretary by the Trustees from time to time for the regulation of the traffic.
- 16. No headstones, footstone, kerbing, monument or any other erection of any kind shall be permitted, nor shall any inscription be allowed until the plans and particulars of the same have been approved by the Trustees.
- 17. Every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, and if required by the Trustees or their officers, such foundations shall extend to the bottom of the grave.
- 18. The materials used in every erection shall be subject to the approval of the Secretary or other officer appointed by the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor or person responsible for the erection.
- 19. All material, refuse, and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person responsible therefor.
- 20. In the event of the refuse, rubbish, or material referred to in previous By-law not being so removed, the Trustees shall have power to cause the same to be removed, and to recover the costs of such removal from the person or persons responsible therefor.
- 21. All materials required in the crection and completion of any stone or other work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance to the Cemetery and conveyed along such roads or tracks as the Secretary shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.
- 22. The Trustees will not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment in this or any other Cemetery.
- 23. Before any such exceptional case, as referred to in the last By-law, be dealt with by the Trustees, a written application, setting forth the reason for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of such application being granted, the permission of the Chief Secretary, in addition to the permission of the Trustees, shall be obtained. If in the opinion of the Trustees it is necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.
- 24. The shape and height of all graves, etc., shall be subject to the approval and supervision of the Secretary.
- 25. No trees or shrubs shall be planted in any enclosure, except such as are approved by the Secretary.
- 26. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Secretary, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find necessary to give, and any workman committing any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Secretary, shall be removed from the Cemetery.
- 27. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—
 - (a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or any other materials removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other graves, and if placed on any other adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
 - (b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing graves, except with the permission of the Secretary.
 - (c) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Secretary.
 - (d) Work in all classes to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.
- 28. Children under the age of ten years shall not be admitted to the Cemetery unless in charge of some responsible person.

- 29. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.
- 30. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any trees, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or in any way infringing "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," or any rule, regulation, or by-law made for protecting the Cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.
- 31. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery or its approaches, any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.
- 32. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever whilst in discharge of his duty, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the Trustees, and any person so employed accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to sunmary dismissal.
- 33. Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Trustees in the form set out in Schedule "E'; such licenses to be renewed annually.
- 34. Subject to the directions of the Trustees, the Secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals within the Cemetery.
- 35. The Trustees shall have power to cancel the annual license of an undertaker for a breach of any Bylaw, and prohibit any unlicensed undertaker from undertaking or conducting any funeral in the Cemetery.
