PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir Robert Furse
TO WIT.
R. F. McMillan, K.C.M.G., Lieutenaut-Governor and Administrator in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Activalia to fix the time and place for the holding of the first and every other session of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut-Governor and Administrator, in exercise of the said power so vested in me, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly until Thursday, the 21st day of March instant, and announce

and proclaim that the Fourth Session of the Thirteenth Parliament of Western Australia shall be holden for the despatch of business on Thursday, the 21st day of March, 1929, at the hour of 3 o'clock in the afternoon, at the House of Parliament, in the City of Perth; and Members of the Legislative Council and Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.
