Belmont Park Road Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a Local Authority to exercise within its District any power of making regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4 of Part IV. of the said Act: And whereas it is desirable to empower the Belmont Park Road Board to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over a specified road within its District, and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for such purpose: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the consent and advice of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act, and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby empower the Belmont Park Road Board, by the by-law in the schedule hereto, to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over a specified road within its District, and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for such purpose; also to impose a penalty not exceeding £20 for the breach thereof.

Belmont Park Road Board.

The Belmont Park Road Board, pursuant to an Order in Council under Section 43 of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," and in exercise of the power thereby conferred, doth hereby make the following by-law, to have effect within the Belmont Park Road District:—

The passage of any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic over that portion of Ensom Avenue from its intersection with the Kalamunda Road to the river within the Belmont Park Road District is prohibited.

For the purposes of this by-law "Heavy traffic" shall be as defined by Regulation 3, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st day of June, 1928.

Any person who commits a breach of this by-law shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding £20.

In the matter of "The Licensing Act, 1911" (Consolidated) and in the matter of a Petition for authority to grant a new License.

To His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia. THE humble petition of the undersigned sheweth as follows:—

1. That your Petitioners are the majority in number of the Electors for the Nelson District, in the State of Western Australia, living in an area comprised within a circle having a radius of five miles from the Post Office at Northcliffe.

2. That there has been an increase of population in such area and that such increase is likely to be permanent.

3. That there are insufficient licensed premises to meet public requirements within such area and there is no Gallon License in such area.

4. Your Petitioners therefore humbly pray that the Licensing Court may, pursuant to the powers in that behalf contained in "The Licensing Act, 1911" (Consolidated), have authority to grant a Gallon License in the said area.

Perth Road Board District—By-laws for the Management of Reserves under the control of the Board and the Playing of Games thereon.

P.W. 259/25.

THE Perth Road Board, under and by virtue of the power conferred on them by Section 196, Subsection 44, of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," and of every other power enabling it in this behalf, do hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

1. In the construction of this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires, the word "match" shall mean and include any test between opposing sides or teams in any game of athletics.

2. No match shall be played upon any public reserve and no person shall play or take part in any such match, unless and until a permit authorising the same shall have been first obtained from the Secretary.

3. No match or game shall be played, and no person shall be allowed to enter the reserve, for the purpose of training or practising on Sundays.

4. No person shall interfere with any property in and belonging to the Perth Road Board on any reserve or throw stones or any other missile, or cause any nuisance therein, or leave therein any litter of any kind.

5. Any person found in a state of intoxication in any reserve, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or using any foul or indecent language, or committing any act of indecency therein, may be forthwith removed from such reserve by the caretaker or by any officer or servant of the Board, or by any member of the Police Force, and shall be, moreover, liable to prosecution for an offence against this by-law.

6. No person, except those in the employ of or authorised by the Board, shall bring into any reserve any horse or other animal or any vehicle.

7. No person shall be allowed to enter any reserve for the purpose of training, or for practising for any sport, unless he has first obtained a permit to do so.

8. No person shall bet, gamble, or call the odds, or offer to bet or gamble within any reserve, and any person found betting, gambling, or calling the odds, or offering to bet or gamble within any reserve, may be forthwith removed by the caretaker, or by an officer or servant of the Board, or by any member of the Police Force, and shall also be liable to prosecution for an offence against this by-law.

9. No person shall enter any dressing or training room, on any reserve, or use any of the lockers unless authorised.

10. No person shall camp, lodge, or tarry overnight, or frequent for the purpose of camping, lodging, and tarrying overnight in any reserve without the written consent of the Board having first been obtained.

11. No person shall post, stick, stamp, stencil, pin, or otherwise affix, or cause to be posted, stuck, stencilled, pinned, stamped, or otherwise affixed any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, or any document whatsoever upon any portion of any reserve without the written consent of the Board having been first obtained.

12. No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, merchandise, or things on any portion of any reserve unless the consent in writing of the Board shall be previously obtained.

13. No person shall light any fire within any reserve without having first obtained the consent of the Board.

14. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law may forfeit or pay on conviction a sum not exceeding £20.

EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the following amendments to the Regulations of the Education Department:—

Regulation 3:

Add the following paragraph:—"Students between the ages of 14 and 21 years may be enrolled for certain correspondence courses without fee, although they have ceased to devote their full time to school work. If students over 21 years of age are enrolled for any course they will be required to pay a fee of 10s. per quarter for each subject."

Regulation 7:

In the third line of paragraph 2 delete the words "such a course" and substitute the word "them."

Regulation 9:

In the second and sixth lines delete the word "District" and substitute the word "intermediate."

Regulation 12:

Delete the words "Elsewhere in" in line 3 of paragraph (a) and in line 2 of paragraph (c) and substitute the words "in any of" therefor.

Regulation 16:

Add the following:—"under the old 'C' syllabus or a 'pass with credit' under the present 'C' conditions" after the words "60 per cent." in line six. Delete the words "Reading and Recitation" in lines two and three.

Regulation 17:

Delete the word "shall" in line one and substitute "will."

Regulation 24:

Add the word "Permanent" before the words "Head Teacher" in line one of Clause (e).

Add the word "Permanent" before the words "Head Teacher" in line one of Clause (f).

Regulation 25:

Delete the words "in the case of" from line two and substitute the word "for."

Regulation 27:

Add the word "head" before the word "teacher" in line two of paragraph (b).

Add the word "head" before the word "teacher" in line two of paragraph (c).

Regulation 28:

Add the following:—" ; provided that the Board may add to the promotion list, at any time during the year, the name of any teacher who has completed all the necessary qualifications, such addition to take effect from the date upon which the qualifications are completed."

Regulation 29:

Clause (a): Add "The Teachers shall have the right to elect a deputy representative, who shall take the place of the representative if any question arises in which the interests of the representative are involved."

Clause (c): Delete and substitute the following:—"no teacher is eligible for election as representative or deputy representative unless he holds the A1 Classification and is drawing a salary equal to or greater than that provided for a Head Teacher in a Class 1 school. The elected teachers shall hold their positions for two years and shall be eligible for re-election. A returning officer shall be appointed, by agreement between the Department and the Teachers' Union, to conduct the election."

Delete the last paragraph and substitute the Clause (j) following:—"For teachers who have served in the localities where a District allowance is payable, an additional 50 per cent. shall be added for service in such localities up to the end of April, 1926, and an additional 25 per cent. for service in such localities since that date. A similar addition shall be made, for those who served abroad in the expeditionary forces, for the period from the date of enlistment to the date of discharge."

Clause (k): Delete the words "lies between 75 and 80 inclusive" in line six, and substitute the words "is under 81 but not below 75."

Clause (m): Add "and the Board shall take these into consideration."

Clause (l): Add "When a teacher considers that owing to his absence on long service leave or on sick leave or for any just cause his reports for any of the four years should not be included for the purpose of assessing his efficiency mark, he may appeal to the Board in writing, setting out the grounds of his appeal, and the Board shall decide whether or not such report or reports shall be included."

Clause (m): Add "If a teacher's work has not been reported on during the year, he may submit a request for an inspection. Should the Department find it impossible to comply, the teacher may write to the Board, representing the special circumstances, and the Board shall take these into consideration."

Clause (n): Add "This time limit does not apply to appointments of First Assistants nor to the special positions mentioned in Regulation 30. Transfers may be made after less than two years if special circumstances are considered to warrant them."

Clause (p): Delete and substitute "All vacancies for Head Mistresses of schools above Class VI. shall be advertised and appointments shall be recommended, in accordance with these regulations, from applicants duly qualified. All vacancies for First Assistants and all special positions shall be advertised, and recommendations shall be made after the claims of all applicants have been considered."

Clause (q): New Clause: "If a teacher is moved at his own request to an inferior position, the Board of Classifiers shall decide whether he shall have the right to be restored, when he so desires, to a position equivalent to that which he vacated, on the occurrence of a suitable vacancy, and whether he shall be retained in his position on the list for promotion to a school of the class above that of the school which he vacated."

Regulation 35:

Delete the words "of Education" in the first line of paragraph one.

Regulation 36:

Delete Subsection (b) and substitute the following:—"Assistants in the Claremont Practising School, and such Assistants in the Claremont Central School and the Claremont Infants' School as are selected to deal with students in training, shall receive an additional £30 (men) or £25 (women) while they continue to hold such positions. A Headmistress of the Claremont Infants' School demonstrating and lecturing to students in training shall receive an additional £25."

Delete Subsection (c) and substitute the following:—"if a teacher is transferred from a first assistantship in a first class or second class school to the charge of a class above Class VI. in a central school, he may continue to receive the salary formerly paid to him as first assistant for a period not exceeding two years."

Delete Subsection (d) and substitute the following:—"no male assistant of the age of 21 shall receive less than £200 per annum and no female assistant of the age of 21 years shall receive less than £156 per annum."

Delete Subsection (e) and substitute the following:—"Women First Assistants with B1 or B2 Certificates in Class II. and I. schools shall receive an allowance of £5."

Regulation 43:

Delete the following towns from the list following line three of Regulation 43:—"Onslow, Peak Hill, Comet Vale, Kurawa, Goongarrie, Edjudina, Mt. Ida, and Riverina," and add the following:—"Beadon, Broad Arrow, Circle Valley, Grass Patch, Red Lake, Richmeadows, and Zanthus."

Regulation 48:

Delete the last paragraph and substitute the following:—"A teacher who is too unwell to attend to his duties, but who is not confined to the house, may be required to take his long service leave, except in cases where a specialist, or medical referee selected by the Department certifies that the applicant for leave cannot carry on his duties, even though not confined to the house, and that the illness is not due to causes within the applicant's own control."

Regulation 49:

Delete the words "continued in the service of the Education Department for at least" from Subsection (a), and substitute "continuous service in the Education Department."

Delete the words "continued in the service of the Education Department for" from Subsection (b) and substitute the words "continuous service in the Education Department."

Regulation 51:

Delete the words "nor more than 21 years old" from the fourth line and substitute the words "years old."

Regulation 59:

Delete and substitute:—"Monitors may also be appointed to Household Management Classes. Such Monitors shall be subject to the usual conditions of admission, except that they shall be required in addition to satisfy the Department that they have shown good promise in their school course in Domestic Subjects. After one year's satisfactory service, they shall be eligible to enter the Teachers' College for a two years' course of training, as prescribed."

Regulation 61:

Delete and substitute the following:—"A Monitor or Probationer may be appointed also as Sewing Mistress. The wife of a Head Teacher may be appointed as Sewing Mistress in her husband's school. A sewing Mistress will not be required where there is a female teacher competent to teach sewing, and her appointment will lapse on the appointment of such a teacher. The maximum period of employment for Sewing Mistresses will be three hours per week."

Regulation 64:

Delete the amount "£1" in the fifth paragraph and substitute "30s."

Regulation 80:
