WHEREAS by "The Government Railways Act Amendment Act, 1907," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette declare that any Branch, Spur, or other Railway shall be a District Railway: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby declare that the Branch Railway known as the Collie-Griffin Railway, 2 miles 67 chains or thereshouts, and running from Collie to chains or thereabouts, and running from Collie to Griffin, shall be a District Railway.

BY virtue of the powers in that behalf vested in it by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Council of the Municipality of Midland Junction do hereby make the following By-law to regulate the control and man-agement of Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds vested in the Municipality; original By-law No. 19 is hereby repealed and undermentioned By-law num-bered 19, inserted in lieu thereof:—

- 1. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be opened to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in this By-law.
- 2. The Council shall have the power to grant the exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves within the Municipality or under the control of the Council, for holding sports or amusements, to any responsible person or persons for any time not exceeding three conceptions does achieve any time not exceeding three consecutive days, subject to such conditions as may be decided upon by the Council, and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, erections, and trees upon and enclosing such park lands or recreation grounds, and shall pay to the Council a fee to be fixed. The public shall have the right to enter upon such lands, on payment to the persons so using and occupying as aforesaid, a sum of not more than 1s, per head per day, and subject to the rules and regulations made by the person or persons so using or occupying; provided that an extra charge of not more than 2s, per head may be made to any part of the grounds set apart as a special reserve or stand, and all vehicles and horses at 6d, each.

 3. No cattle, pigs, goats, or loose horses shall be alto such conditions as may be decided upon by the Coun-
- 3. No cattle, pigs, goats, or loose horses shall be allowed upon any park lands, or whether in harness or in saddle, shall be allowed therein without the previous consent in writing of the Council.
- 4. All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming and orderly manner, and any person creating a disturbance or annoyance to the public, or playing an unlawful game, or any game which in the opinion of the Council is dangerous, shall be liable to be expelled therefrom by any police constable or officer of the Council, or person or persons using or occupying as referred to in this By-law or their assistants.
- 5. The Council may in its discretion prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation ground, or reserves on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.
- 6. No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, fruit, or merchandise in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves without first having obtained

the written consent of the lessee or the Council, and shall pay a fee, the amount of such fee to be fixed by and paid to the Council or lessee.

- No person shall damage any tree, shrub, or plant, building, erection, or other property within any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, or do any damage to the soil or surface thereof.
- to the soil or surface thereof.

 8. When any party, secrety, company, club, or organisation of any kind shall play any game or games or picnic on the said lands they shall, immediately prior to their leaving the ground, collect and remove, or cause to be collected or removed, all waste materials, broken glass, scraps, litter, and rubbish of any kind brought or made upon the ground by them. In the event of non-observance of this regulation, the actual cost of thoroughly performing the necessary duty by the officers or employees of the Council employed in the work shall be charged and recovered from any of the participants in the play, game, or picnic, before any one or more Justices of the Peace, with costs of such recovery.

 9. No person shall enter any park lands or recrea-
- 9. No person shall enter any park lands or recreation ground, except through gates opened by the Council for that purpose.
- 10. No person shall climb over or under or in any manner pass over any fence surrounding or upon any park lands or recreation ground.
- 11. No person shall, without the permission in writing of the Council, enter or be upon the playing area of the lands known as the Midland Junction Recreation Ground.
- 12. Every person offending against any portion of this By-law shall on conviction forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding £10.

Koorda Road Board.

P.W. 919/28.
WHEREAS by "The Dog Act Amendment Act, 1928." a Local Authority may, for the protection of the owners of stock, make By-laws for the controlling of dogs, the Koorda Road Board, in pursuance of powers vested under the said Act, and of every other authority en-

abling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the following:-

- 1. All dogs shall be kept chained or otherwise under effective control from sunset to sunrise, and it shall be lawful for the Board to destroy, without further notice, any dog not so kept under control and found wandering at large between these hours.
