WHEREAS it is provided by "The Game Act, 1912-13," that the Governor may by Proclamation declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof: And whereas by a Pro-clamation dated the 14th day of April, 1926, and pub-lished in the Government Gazette of the 16th day of April, 1926, it is proclaimed and declared that Finches and Weaver Finches (exclusive of Silver-eyes) are strictly preserved within District "G," namely, the Kimberley Division as defined in "The Land Act, 1898," as from the beginning of January to the end of August in each year: And whereas it is desirable that all that portion of the said Proclamation referring to Finches and Weaver Finches (exclusive of Silver-eyes) shall be varied: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, and of every power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare as follows:-

That notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of April, 1926, the close season for Finches and Weaver Finches (exclusive of Silver-eyes) in those portions of District "G," namely, the Kimberley Division as defined in "The Land Act,

1898," being, firstly, that portion comprised within an imaginary circle having a radius of 20 miles from the Police Station at Wyndham, and, secondly, that portion of the said District outside an imaginary circle having a radius of 50 miles from the said Police Station, shall be the period commencing on the 1st day of September and ending on the 31st day of December in each year; and that the proclamation aforesaid is hereby varied accordingly.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a Local Authority to exercise within its District any power of making regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4 of Part IV. of the said Act; and whereas it is desirable to empower the Bunbury Road Board to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over a specified road within its District, and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for such purpose: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut. Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act, and of every other authority enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby empower the Bunbury Road Board, by the By-law in the Schedule hereto, to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over a specified road within its district, and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for such purpose, and to impose a penalty not exceeding £20 for the breach thereof.

For the purpose of this By-law "Heavy traffie" means all vehicles engaged in the carriage or conveyance of sleepers or timber, as expressed and under conditions laid down in Regulation 149 of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26.

Any person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £20.
