# IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 236 of 1929.

In the matter of an Award made on the 26th day of September, 1923, between the Minister for Works, Colonial Secretary (as Minister for the State Steamship Service), and Fremantle Harbour Trust, and the Coastal Dock, River, and Harbour Works Union of Workers, and in the matter of an appli-cation by the abovenamed Union for the Court to amend the said Award.

UPON hearing Mr. William Glasson, on behalf of the Applicant Union, and by consent of the Respondents, Applicant Union, and by consent of the Respondents, the above Award, as amended on the 10th day of December, 1926, is hereby further amended in pursuance of the powers contained in Section 90 of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," in accordance with the terms of an Agreement dated the 29th day of August, 1929, between the Minister for Works, the Chief Secretary (as Minister for the State Shipping Service), and the Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, of the one part, and Coastal Dock, River, and Harbour Works' Union of Workers, Fremantle, of the other part, and the Award as so amended is hereby the other part, and the Award as so amended is hereby published:—

#### Award No. 26 of 1922.

Orders No. 513 of 1926 and No. 511 of 1926.

Minister for Works, Chief Secretary (as Minister for State Steamship Service), and Fremantle Harbour Trust, Applicants, and the Coastal Dock, River, and Harbour Works' Union of Workers, Respondent.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovementioned parties:

#### AWARD.

#### 1.—Interpretation.

"Minister for Public Works" means the Minister for Public Works in the capacity of Minister controlling the Harbours and Rivers Branch of the Public Works Department.
"The Chief Secretary" means the Minister control-

ling the State Shipping Service.

## 2.—Hours of Duty.

Except in regard to watchmen 44 hours shall represent a week's work. The ordinary working hours shall not exceed eight hours on the first five days of the week and four hours on Saturdays: Provided that in special circumstances, if considered advisable by the Winister, the 44 hours shall be worked in five days. Watchmen shall work seven shifts of eight hours each per week as at present: Provided, they shall be allowed two days' special leave on pay at the completion of each month of continuous service as watchmen. leave shall not be allowed to accumulate.

## 3.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked outside of or in excess of the usual hours shall be paid for the first four hours after the usual stopping time at the rate of time and a half, and thereafter double time: Provided that employees called to start work within an hour and a half of the called to start work within an hour and a half of the usual starting time shall be paid at the rate of time and a half until the usual starting time: Provided also that if a worker is called out for duty at or after 10.30 p.m. and before an hour and a half of the usual starting time on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday, he shall be paid double rates until the usual starting time: Provided further, that workers called out for duty at or after 5 p.m. on Saturdays whall be paid double rates shall be paid double rates.

(b) If the Minister requires au employee to work on Sundays, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day, he shall be paid at double time, except in the case of watchmen, who shall take such days as ordinary days.

(e) Provided, that it may be mutually agreed between the Union and the employer that any worker may work at ordinary rates on any or all of the days above specified to facilitate arrangement under Clause 4 (a).

### 4.—Holidays.

(a) Subject to Subclause (b) hereunder two weeks' (a) Subject to Subrates (b) hereinder two weeks leave per annum shall be granted to each employee: Provided always, that the following days:—Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day, shall be taken as they come as portion of the holidays; the balance of one

week to be granted as annual leave, at the convenience of the Department.

(b) Employees employed for a period of less than twelve months' continuous service shall, after one month's continuous service, be entitled to the proportion of two weeks' leave as the length of service is to the full period of 12 months.

(e) Approved periods of absence owing to sickness shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service,

but such periods shall not qualify for holidays.

(d) Approved periods of absence from work through accident sustained in the course of the Department's employment, up to a maximum of one month in any one period, shall not break continuity of service for the purpose of computing holidays. For approved periods of absence exceeding one month the provisions of Subclause (c) shall apply.

(e) Holiday pay shall be at the rate the worker is

in receipt of at or immediately prior to the holidays

being taken.

## 5.—Travelling Time.

(a) Travelling time shall be calculated on the ordin ary rates paid at place of departure.

(b) A worker travelling to work away from, or re

turning to, his usual place of employment, shall be paid for the actual travelling time in his ordinary working hours, and in addition thereto his actual travelling time outside his ordinary working hours shall be paid at ordinary rates up to a maximum of eight hours in one day.

(c) Sunday travelling time shall be paid for at the same rates and on the same conditions as on week days.

(d) In respect of a worker who is provided with a sleeping berth, travelling time shall not count between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m.: Provided that this shall not operate to reduce the travelling time when paid for below eight hours in any one day.

#### 6.-Wet Work.

Any worker working in water shall be paid an extra allowance of one shilling per day or part of a day. Workers called upon to work overtime in water shall of overtime worked, and wet work allowance shall be treated as a portion of the wage for the calculation of overtime. For all other purposes the extra payment shall be deemed an allowance.

## 7.—Payment of Wages.

(a) Workers inside the Metropolitan Area shall be paid weekly.

(b) All men dismissed from employment shall be paid within four office hours from the time of dismissal. If this period is exceeded they shall be paid at ordinary rates from the time of dismissal until pay-

(c) When an employee leaves his employment before the usual pay day he shall, on giving notice of his intention to leave not later than starting time, be paid his full wages on the day he leaves.

## 8.—Higher Duties.

Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate for two hours in any shift shall be paid at the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift: Provided that such mini-mum is not lower than such worker's regular rate of If he be employed for less than two hours at work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole shift.

### 9 .-- Away from Home Allowance.

When an employee is instructed to proceed on duty from the place where he is then or is usually employed to any place where he cannot return to his own abode at night, the employer shall pay all fares and an allowance at 6s. for each 24 hours, or reasonable expenses or provide board and lodging.

## 10.—Conveyance of Men.

Any employee called on to work on the side of the opposite to the usual place of work shall be ferried across or his fare refunded by the employer.

## 11.—Special Places.

Special places shall mean ballast tanks, fresh water tanks, oil tanks, airtight compartments, refrigerating chambers (when under power), bunkers, boilers, under boilers and between boilers and ship's side, tunnels, masts, funnels, bilges, chain lockers, peaks and caissons, and shall include chipping work done inside the far pot used for dipping piles, and work done in closed or confined hoppers on bucket dredges.

## (85) It is also agreed:-

- (a) That the rate of pay is fixed on a weekly basis, subject to the following condition, namely: That if in the case of any employee for any reason whatever during any portion of the working hours of any week no work is available or performed, the employee will only be paid for the time actually worked at the rate of pay as above prescribed (per week of 44 hours) apportioned to the time actually worked during the week; and
- (b) That notwithstanding the rate of pay is fixed on a weekly basis, there shall be no obligation on the part of the Minister or the employee to give a week's or any other notice to determine the employment, the position being in this respect the same as if the employee were employed at an hourly wage.

#### 17.—No Reduction.

In the case of any employee who is being paid above the minimum rate applicable under previous Award or arrangement to other workers doing the same class of work, such employees shall not suffer, by reason of this Award only, any reduction of the additional sum so paid over and above the above-mentioned minimum rate.

### 18.—Broken Time.

Should any employee not be notified before leaving work that his services will not be required next day, he shall be paid for that day if he duly presents himself for work at the appointed time, unless he cannot be employed on account of causes beyond the control of the management, in which case he shall be notified of the cause why he cannot be employed, and shall be entitled to two hours' pay.

#### 19.-Walking Time.

- (a) Owing to the remote location of the Rocky Bay Quarry, and the fact that the Quarry does not work continuously, workers employed at the Quarry or Robb's Jetty, who walk from the nearest tram or railway station shall be allowed, as a special allowance, half an hour part day per day.
- (b) Men working on the Breakwater at Geraldton shall be allowed walking time one way only, at the rate of 20 minutes to the mile, from the shore end of the viaduct to wherever they may be required to work.

#### 20.—Dirt Money.

Fitters' assistants shall be paid the same dirt money allowance as fitters whilst engaged on any work in respect of which fitters receive such allowance.

## 21.—Oilskins.

The Minister will supply oilskins free of charge to employees required by the Department to work in the

The Board of Reference shall consist of a chairman

and two other representatives nominated by the parties.

(i) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any machine, occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
(ii) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time.

(iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

### 23.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply only to workers employed by the Minister for Public Works, the Chief Secretary as Minister for State Shipping Service, and the Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, and shall operate over the coastline of the State from a point 20 miles North of Geraldton to a point 20 miles East of Esperance, and for a distance of 15 miles inland therefrom.

### 24.—Term.

The currency of this Award shall be three years: Providing that, at any time after the expiration of twelve months from its date, the Court may alter or amend the Award on application of any party or persons affected by its provision.
