### PROCLAMATION

M.R.B. 494/27.

WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," the Governor may on the recommendation of the Board declare by Proclamation that any road shall be a main road, and in like manner and on the like recommendation declare that any main road shall cease to be a main road; and whereas the Main Roads Board has recommended that the road specified in Schedule A hereto shall be declared to be a main road, and that the road specified in Schedule B hereto shall cease to be a main road: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby declares that the road specified in the Schedule A hereto shall be a main road within the meaning of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," and that the footpaths, if any, of such road be excluded from the main road, and that the road specified in Schedule B hereto shall cease to be a main road.

Albany-Denmark Road. (Albany Road District.)

#### Schedule A.

That portion of a public road commencing at the Southern boundary of Plantagenet Location 2781, at the junction of Road No. 2605 (as shown on Lands Department Lithographs 451/80 and 457/80); thence in an Easterly, North-Easterly, and South-Easterly direction generally along the Southern boundaries of Location 2781 aforesaid, and Locations 2665, 2662, 2449, 2450, 2782, 662, 661, and 658 to the intersection with the

Northern boundary of Reserve 801; thence South-Easterly through said Reserve 801 to the Western side of the Great Southern Railway; thence South-Easterly crossing the said railway to its Eastern side; thence South-Easterly along the Southern side of Locations 723 and 944 to the South-Eastern corner of said Location 944; thence South-Easterly and Easterly to the South-Western corner of Location 823; thence Easterly and South-Easterly along the Southern boundaries of Location 823 aforesaid and Locations 824, 531, 560, and 2684 to the South-Eastern corner of said Location 2684; thence South-Easterly and Easterly generally through A over 6 of Location 401 to the South-Western corner of Location 527; thence South-Easterly along the Southern boundaries of said Location 527 and Locations 5489, 5490, 488, 2174, 399, 229, and 220 to the junction with the Perth-Albany Road at the South-Eastern corner of Location 220 aforesaid (as shown on Plan M.R.B., W.A., 748).

#### Schedule B.

That portion of the Albany-Denmark Road as proclaimed in the *Government Gazette* on 17th June, 1927, commencing at the North-Western corner of Location 2754; thence along Road No. 2605 to junction with railway line South of Location 1343; thence along North side of railway line to and along Road No. 1682 to the boundary of the Municipality of Albany. (Lithos. 451 and 457; Plan M.R.B., W.A., 318.)

WHEREAS it is provided by "The Vermin Act, 1918," that "Vermin" means and includes any animal or bird mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act, and such other animals or birds the names of which the Governor may by Proclamation add to the said Schedule; and it is further provided by such Act that any such Proclamation may be restricted in its operation to any portion of the State to be defined by the Proclamation; and whereas it is desirable to declare Kangaroos to be vermin within the portions of the State hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council,

do by this Proclamation add "Kangaroos" to the Third Schedule of the said Act; provided, however, that this Proclamation shall be restricted in its operation to the Gascoyne-Minilya Vermin District.

The Road Districts Act, 1919.

Bruce Rock Road District.—Redivision into Wards.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 822/28.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council redivide a Road District into Wards; and whereas it is desirable to redivide the Bruce Rock Road District into Wards and increase the number of members and realloot them to the various Wards: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf doth hereby—

- (a) redivide the Bruce Rock Road District into nine Wards, with the names and boundaries as described in the Schedule;
- (b) increase the number of members from eleven to thirteen and realloot them to represent the various Wards as set out against each Ward in the Schedule.

### BRUCE ROCK ROAD DISTRICT.

#### Description of Ward Boundaries.

#### Town Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by lines commencing at the intersection of the North-East boundary of Avon Location 15795 with the production West of the South boundary of Location 16262, and extending East along said production and South boundary to the North-East corner of Reserve 17470; on the Eastward by the East boundary of the said Reserve and of Reserve 15578 and of Bruce Rock Lots 162 to 172 inclusive, the South boundary of Lot 172 and its prolongation West to the Eastern side of the Wickepin-Merredin Railway Reserve; thence South along said side of the Railway Reserve to the production East of the North boundary of Location 21690; on the South by lines commencing at the intersection of the East side of the Wickepin-Merredin Railway Reserve with the production East of the North boundary of Location 21690, and extending West along said production and part of the said North boundary to the South-East corner of Location 21689; on the Westward by lines commencing at the South-East corner of Location 21689 aforesaid, and extending Northward along the East, a South, and the North-East boundary of the said location, the Easternmost boundary of Location 13697 and part of the North-East boundary of Location 15795 to the starting point. (1 member.)

#### Kwoiyin Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by part of the district boundary from the North-West corner of Kwoiyin A.A. Lot 98 to the North-East corner of Avon Location 15303; on the Eastward by lines commencing at the said North-East corner, and extending South along the East boundaries of Locations 15303, 15304, 16539, 23033, 15313, and 23142 to the Southern side of the Quairading-Bruce Rock Railway Reserve; on the Southward by lines commencing on the Southern side of the said Railway Reserve at its intersection with the prolonga-

tion South of the East boundary of Location 21342, and extending Westward along said side of the Railway Reserve to the Western corner of Location 20210; thence Northward to and along the Western boundary of Location 25359 and part of the Western boundary of Location 15313, a South-Eastern and a North-Eastern boundary of Location 21577; thence along the Northern side of the said Railway Reserve to the Eastern end of the Shackleton Station Yard Reserve; thence by the Southern side of the said Railway Reserve to the production South of the West boundary of Kwolyin A.A. Lot 150, thence to and along part of the West boundary of said Lot 150, part of the South boundary of Lot 118, and the East boundary of Lot 245, and again along the Northern side of the Railway Reserve to the District boundary; on the Westward by part of the district boundary to the starting point. (2 members.)

#### Shackleton Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by part of the South boundary of the Kwolyin Ward from the district boundary to an East corner of Location 21577; on the Eastward by lines commencing at the said Eastern corner, and extending Southward to and along the Eastern boundary of Reserve 20076, part of the Northern and the Eastern boundary of Location 16161, the East and part of the South boundary of Location 15325 to the production North of the East boundary of Location 14877, and South along said production and East boundary and East boundaries of Locations 13703, 23158, 15327, 18106, 13188, and 19158, North boundaries of Locations 22487, 18890, 25657, 20470, 20078, and 20077, the East, the Southernmost, a West, and a South boundary of Location 19461 the South boundary of Location 18880, a South and an East boundary of Location 16857, East boundaries of Locations 11183 and 10479, and part of the South boundary of the last-mentioned location, the Easternmost boundaries of Locations 11184 and 22634, part of the North and the Western boundary of Location 17618 to the district boundary; on the Southward and Westward by part of the district boundaries to the starting point. (2 members.)

#### Belka Ward.

Bounded on the Westward and Northward by part of the district boundaries from the North-West corner of Location 20316 to the South-Western corner of Location 17077; on the Eastward by lines commencing at the said South-Western corner, and extending Southward along West boundaries of 17070 and 22528 and part of the Southern boundary of the last-mentioned location, a West, a North, a West, and again a North boundary of Location 16296, Western boundaries of Locations 16296, 22469, 16300, and 24535, and part of the Westernmost boundary of Location 16302 to the South-Eastern corner of Location 16309; on the Southward by lines commencing at the said South-Eastern corner, and extending Westward along South boundaries of Locations 16309, 26299, 20478, 23196, 16943, 16944, part of the East boundary of Location 20187, part of the North-Eastern and the North boundary of Location 20023, the North boundaries of Locations 20028 and 20019, part of the East and North boundary of Location 20238, the North boundary of Location 20136 to the starting point. (1 member.)

#### Central Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by the South boundary of the Belka Ward from its intersection with the district boundary to the South-Eastern corner of Location 16309; on the Eastward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned South-Eastern corner, and extending Southward along the Eastern and part of the Southern boundary of Location 16930; thence along the Western side of the Wickepin-Merredin Railway Reserve to the North boundary of the Town Ward; thence by part of the North, the Western, and the Southern boundaries of the Town Ward and again along the Western side of the Railway Reserve to the South boundary of Location 16216, part of the South boundary of said Location 16216, the West boundaries of Locations 14534, 14525, and Reserve 12985, the North, the Western and part of the South boundary of Ardath Townsite, and again along the Western side of the Railway Reserve to intersect the East boundary of Location 20096; on the Southward by lines commencing at the said intersection, and extending along part of the East and the North boundary of said Location 20096 and the North boundaries of Locations 20095, 20094, and 20093, part of the Easternmost and the North boundary of Location 20092 to intersect the East boundary of the Shackleton

Ward; on the Westward by part of the East boundary of the Shackleton Ward and part of the boundaries of the Kwolyin Ward and part of the district boundary to the starting point. (2 members.)

#### Babakin Ward.

Bounded on the Westward and part of the Northward by part of the East boundary of the Shackleton Ward and by the South boundary of the Central Ward, from the South-West corner of Location 17618 to the intersection of the Western side of the Wickepin-Merredin Railway Reserve with the West boundary of Location 14523; thence by part of the West boundary of said Location 14523, the Westernmost, a South, a West, the Southernmost, an East and South boundary of Location 14499, part of the East boundary of Location 14496, the North boundary of Location 19540, and the Northernmost boundary of Location 14492 to the North-East corner of the last-mentioned location; thence to and along the North boundaries of Locations 21243 and 14647 to intersect the district boundary; on the Eastward and Southward by part of the district boundary to the starting point. (2 members.)

#### Ardath Ward.

Bounded on the North by lines commencing at the South-West corner of Avon Location 16216, and extending East along the South boundaries of Locations 16216, 16215, and 16214, the East boundary of Location 14530, the Easternmost boundary of Location 14531, part of the East boundary of Location 14529, the South and part of the Eastern boundary of Location 15897, the South boundary of Location 15906, the West and South boundaries of Location 15925 to the South-East corner of the last-mentioned location; on the Eastward by lines commencing at the said South-East corner, and extending Southward along the Eastern boundary of Location 21035, the Easternmost boundary of 15899 and part of the East boundary of Location 15883 to the district boundary, and along said district boundary to the North-East corner of the Babakin Ward (North-East corner of Location 14647); on the Southward by part of the North boundary of the Babakin Ward to the intersection of the West boundary of Location 14523 with the Western side of the Wickepin-Merredin Railway Reserve; on the Westward by part of the Eastern boundary of the Central Ward to the starting point. (1 member.)

#### Coodarin Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by lines commencing at the South-West corner of Location 16280, and extending Eastward along the South and part of the East boundary of said Location 16280, North boundaries of Locations 16281, 20201, and 20200, part of the West and the South boundary of Location 16972 and the South boundary of Location 19490 to the district boundary; on the Eastward by part of the district boundary to the South-West corner of Location 15901; on the Southward by part of the Northern boundaries of Ardath Ward to their intersection with the Eastern boundary of the Central Ward; on the Westward by part of the Eastern boundary of the Central Ward and part of the boundaries of the Town Ward and again part of the Eastern boundary of the Central Ward to the starting point. (1 member.)

#### Totadjin Ward.

Bounded on the Northward and Eastward by part of the district boundary from the North-West corner of Location 17070 to the South-East corner of Location 19490; on the Southward by the North boundary of the Coodarin Ward; on the Westward by part of the boundary of Central Ward and the Eastern boundary of the Belka Ward to the starting point. (1 member.)

#### THE STOCK DISEASES ACT, 1895. Regulations.

1. No store cattle on stations affected with pleuro-pneumonia, or on stations adjoining affected stations, in the West Kimberley District shall, during the operation of these Regulations, be removed therefrom except to the Owen's Anchorage Quarantine Area, Fremantle, for slaughter, or thence under quarantine restrictions for slaughter at Midland Junction.

2. With regard to clean stations in the West Kimberley District on which no pleuro-pneumonia has been found to exist, store cattle from any such clean stations may be allowed to go to Owen's Anchorage Quarantine Area, and thence to the country for depasturing: Provided such clean station shall not adjoin a holding affected with such disease, but subject to the following conditions and not otherwise, and any breach thereof shall be an offence against this regulation:—

(a) Such cattle shall be inoculated before leaving the Quarantine Area, Fremantle, against pleuro-pneumonia;

(b) such cattle shall be sent to a property approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock, which shall be declared a quarantine;

(c) such cattle shall not be removed from such station without the written consent of the Chief Inspector of Stock.

3. No cattle from West Kimberley shall be permitted to depasture in that portion of the State bounded on the North by the 30th parallel of latitude and on the East by the 119th meridian of longitude.

4. No cattle shall be overlanded from West Kimberley further South than the 19th parallel of latitude.

5. Any person who commits a breach of any of the foregoing regulations shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not exceeding five hundred pounds.
