Only natural-born or naturalised British subjects who have been engaged in general practical bush and mill work in the industry will be eligible for nomination and appointment, if elected.

PLUMBING (GERALDTON). (Registered 24/10/1929.)

No. 21 of 1929.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925, this Fourteenth day of October, 1929, between Fitzpatrick and Co. and Stephen Haddy, Executor of Estate of the late John Henry Scott (hereinafter called "The Employers"), of the scott (hereinarter called "The Employers), of the one part, and the W.A. Plumbers and Sheet-metal Workers' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (herein-after called "The Union") of the other part, witnes-seth, that for the considerations hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree, the one with the other as follows:-

1.-Scope of Agreement.

This Agreement shall apply to workers employed to do in or about a building any work of a permanent nature in lead, or any of those metals which have superseded lead, particularly including the following classes of work:

- (a) (i.) Work in sheet-lead, galvanised iron, or sheet-metal by other generally used plumbers;
 - (ii.) Pipe work in lead, sheet-metal, wroughtiron, cast-iron, copper or brass;
 - (iii.) Work connected with the installation of gas, water (including appliances for heating same), steam or air for heating purposes;
 - (iv.)
 - (iv.) Sanitary and general plumbing;
 (v.) Fitting and fixing baths, m troughs, and metal sinks. metal water
- (b) Workers employed in ship or chemical plumbing;
- (c) Workers employed in fitting and fixing of corrugated asbestes.

2 -Hours

Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked in six days.

3.—Wages.

Base-£4 7s. 0d. per week. The minimum rate of wage payable to workers under this Agreement, other than a duly registered apprentice or probationer, shall be 2s. 9d. and six-elevenths of a penny per hour.

Where the work involves opening up drains four inches in diameter and upwards, for the purpose of clearing chokages, there shall be paid in addition to the prescribed rate of wage the sum of one penny per , with the minimum of one shilling for any such hour additional payment.

Workers employed on ships 1s. per day extra. "Chemical plumbing": In chemical and manure works journeymen plumbers engaged on all repairs and renewals on superphosphate mixing plants and pyrites furnaces shall receive one and one half-pence per hour additional to the rate prescribed.

Any licensed journeyman plumber called upon to use his license for his employer on work for which a per-mit from the Geraldton Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Department is necessary in the first instance shall, for such time as he is himself actually engaged upon such work pursuant to such permit, be paid 1s. per hour in addition to the ordinary rate herein prescribed.

3. (a) The contract of employment shall be an hourly one, terminable on either side by one hour's notice, and the worker shall, in the event of notice, be entitled to payment up to the hour when such notice terminates.

4.---Casual Employees.

Any employee who is employed for a period of less than five consecutive working days exclusive of hours of overtime worked, shall be classed as a casual employee, and shall be paid one shilling per day extra for the time employed. Provided, that this shall not apply in the case of a worker dismissed for misconduct or incompetence or owing to weather conditions.

5.—Overtime.

Overtime shall be paid for all work required to be performed outside the usual working hours, as fol-lows:-Time and a half until midnight; double time from midnight till the usual starting time. All travelling time from and to the employer's place of business or from one job to another during the bours of work shall be paid for by the employer at The employer shall pay all fares in ordinary rates. connection with such travelling,

7.-Payment of Wages.

Workers shall be paid at the shop or on the job within fifteen minutes of the time of ceasing work.

8,-Holidays.

All work performed on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Eight Hours' Day, Christmas Day, and Union Picnic Day shall be paid for at double time rate.

9.-Country Work.

Any worker sent by his employer to a job at such a distance that he cannot return to his home each night shall be paid six shillings per day extra, unless the employer shall provide board and lodging. All travelling time not exceeding eight hours in any one day to and from the job shall be paid for at ordinary rates. The employer shall pay all fares.

10.---Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union, stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate, upon the application of such worker, after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the magistrate upon such applica-tion. After having given notice to the Secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be articled to work for and be meltioned. be entitled to work for and be employed at the pro-posed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said Secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the Union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to repre-sent the Union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

11.—Apprentices.

(a) In this Agreement a "duly registered appren-tice" means an apprentice of a start (a) In this Agreement a univ registered appren-tice' means an apprentice of whose apprenticeship notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause, and a ''duly registered probationer' means a person work-ing as an apprentice on production of proceedings. ing as an apprentice on probation of whose probation-ary period notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause; Provided that an apprentice or a probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the period of fourteen days allowed for registration.

(b) Any employer hereafter taking an apprentice (b) Any employer hereafter taxing an apprentice or probationer shall, within fourteen days thereafter, register such apprentice or probationer by giving notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court in the pre-

scribed form (Form B and G in the Appendix hereto). (c) If at the date of this Agreement any employer is employing any person as an apprentice or a proba-tioner who has not been duly registered as such, he shall register such apprentice or probationer within fourteen days thereafter.

(d) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to every two or fraction of two journeymen employed by him: Provided, that an employer who is himself a certificated plumber working at the trade and employing at least two journeymen, shall be counted as a journeyman for the purpose of ascertain-ing the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time: Provided, however, that in the case of a partnership only one partner shall be entitled to be regarded as a journeyman for this purpose. Provided further, that an apprentice in his fifth year shall be counted as a journeyman for the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time.

(e) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time the number of journeymen employed shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the six months immediately preceding such time.

(f) The term of apprenticeship shall be five years. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful. Such probationary period

shall be deemed portion of the term of apprenticeship. (g) Should any employer from unforescen circum-stances be unable to carry out his obligations to his apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer, but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of the date of such transfer and when such apprenticeship commenced. (Form -Transfer of Apprenticeship in the Appendix hereto.) (h) The following provisions shall apply in respect

- of all apprenticeships:-
 - (1) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this Agreement and shall, subject to the provisions of Subclause (o), pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.
 - (2) At the end of the period of apprenticeship, the employer shall give the apprentice a certifi-cate (Form-Certificate of Competency in the Appendix hereto) to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original em-ployer's place of business willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the rate of wages prescribed by this Agreement, accord-ing to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of such trans-ter in the form provided (Form--Transfer of Apprenticeship in the Appendix hereto). Tt shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall never-theless give him a certificate for the time actually served.
 - (3) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.
 - (4) When an apprentice is discharged for cause the employer shall send notice in writing of the discharge, and the cause thereof, to the said Clerk of the Court (Form 3 in the Appendix hereto).

j) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners, hereinafter constituted, once in every year of his service when called upon by the Clerk of the Court so to do.

(k) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at such place as shall be from time to time appointed by the Clerk of the Court, and it shall be the duty of each employer to supply such necessary material and machinery as may be re-quired, and in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination.

(1) The examination will be held in the month of May in each year. The Board of Examiners shall consist of one person skilled in the trade, to be nominated

by the Workers' Union, one person skilled in the trade, to be nominated by the Master Plumbers' Union, and one person to be nominated by the Director of Education, or, failing such nomination or nominations, such person or persons as may be appointed for that pur-pose by the Court. The examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.

(m) The examiners shall report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination.

(n) The Clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate a certificate showing the result of his ex-amination (Form 4 in the Appendix hereto), and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing in accordance with the scale set forth in Subclause (i) hereof from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners.

(o) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for prima facie guilty of a breach of this Agreement, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.

(p) Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the ex-aminers as the Court shall allow.

(q) It shall be provided in every agreement of apprenticeship that technical instruction of the apprentice, when available, shall be at the employer's expense and shall be in the employer's time, except in places when such instruction is given after the ordinary working; hours.

(r) It shall be provided in every agreement of apprenticeship that in the event of any apprentice, in the opinion of the examiners, not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed, at the employer's expense, to enable such apprentice to reach the necessary standard.

12.---Tools of Trade.

The following tools shall be provided by the employer:—Metal pots, plumbing irons (but this shall not include copper soldering bits), mandrills, long dum-mies, stork and dies for iron and brass pipes, cutters, all tongs over 12in., vyces, hack saws and blades, taps and drills, hatchets, files, cramps, caulking tools, and chisels for brick and concrete.

The employer shall also supply all tools required for work to be performed on wrought iron and lead pipes over 2in. in diameter.

The worker shall supply only the usual kit bag of tools and blow lamp.

13 .- Time and Wages Book.

A Time and Wages Book shall be kept by each employer, in which book shall be entered the name of ployer, in which book shall be entered the name of each worker, the nature of the work he is doing, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages re-ceived by him each week. The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the proper posting of the book each week. The said book shall be open to the inspection of the Secretary of the Union during working hours. during working hours.

14.—Area.

This Agreement shall operate over the area com-prised within a radius of twenty-five miles from the General Post Office in the town of Geraldton.

15.---Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be three years from the 14th October, 1929. Provided, that either party may, after the expiration of twelve months from its date, apply to the Court of Arbitration to alter, amend, or revise the same.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this fourteenth day of October, 1929, between Fitzpatrick and Co. and Stephen Haddy, Executor Estate of the late John Henry Scott (hereinafter called "The employers"), of the one part, and The W.A. Plumbers and Sheet-Metal Workers' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (herein-after called "The Union"), of the other part, wit-nesseth that for the consideration hereinafter appearing nesseth that for the consideration hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:-

1.-Interpretation.

In this Agreement-

(a) "Casual hand" shall mean a worker employed for less than one week; (b) "First-class bench hand" shall mean a worker

required to be able-

(i) to work from blue prints, drawings, or measurements (whichever is required of him) for completed articles and to make the articles throughout; or

(ii) to do work, the ability to do which involves the ability to do the work specified

in (i). The expression "blue prints, drawings, or measurements'' means blue prints, drawings, or measurements furnished by the customer to the employer for the purpose of specifying the nature and/or dimensions of the article ordered or part thereof, or blue prints, drawings, or measurements of a similar nature; but the expression does not include drawings, sketches, or measurements supplied to the individual work-man for the purpose of assisting such workman to understand the nature of and to carry out the work required of him;

(c) "Stock hand" shall mean a tinsmith or sheetmetal worker, employed except as above, in manufacturing or partly manufacturing articles out of any class of sheet-metal of ten gauge or lighter, or out of wire work up to eight gauge.

2.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to workers employed to do work in galvanised iron, sheet-tin, and other sheet-metal, including stove and oven-making, and canistermaking.

3.—Hours.

Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work and shall be worked in five and a half days.

4.—Wages.

5.—Dirt Money.

One penny half-penny per hour shall be paid to workers employed outside the works of the employer in removing old stoves or ranges, or installing new stoves or ranges where the work is of a specially dirty nature.

6.—Overtime.

All time worked in excess of the ordinary working hours in any one day shall be deemed to be overtime, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter for the first two hours and double time thereafter.

7.-Payment of Wages.

Workers shall be paid at the shop or on the job within five minutes of the time for ceasing work.

8.—Holidays.

Each worker shall be entitled to twelve days annual Each worker shall be entitled to twelve days annual leave on full pay, or, should the period of continuous employment be less than one year, the worker shall be paid holidays in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment. The following shall be days upon which, if the employer's establishment be closed, payment may be deducted:—New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Eve, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Labeur Day, Foundation Day, and Union Picnic Day. Provided, however (if it suits the convenience of the employer and employee), the employer shall be entitled to grant five employee), the employer shall be entitled to grant five of the holidays above-mentioned as paid holidays, and if such five days are granted in this manner they shall be deducted from the twelve days' annual leave.

Holidays without deduction of pay, whether granted annually or in the manner set out in the above proviso, shall be limited to twelve days for each year of service.

In the event of an employee being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such holidays are not equal to the holi-days during the shall with holidays are not equal to the holidays given to the other employees, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other employees of such employer are on holidays on full pay. This clause shall also apply to apprentices.

9.—Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the worker, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the Secretary of the Union stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate, upon the application of such worker, after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said Secretary, who shall have been given by him to the said Secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the Secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period, until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said Secretary in the manner prescribed. The Secretary of the Union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hear-ing of the application before the Magistrate.

10—Apprentices.

(a) In this Agreement a "duly registered apprentice" means an apprentice of whose apprenticeship notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause; and a "duly registered probationer" means a person working as an apprentice on probation, of whose probationary period notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause; Provided, that an apprentice or a probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the period of fourteen days allowed for registration.

(b) An employer hereafter taking an apprentice or probationer shall, within fourteen days thereafter, register such apprentice or probationer by giving notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court in the prescribed form (Form B in the Appendix).

(c) If at the date of this Agreement any employer is employing any person as an apprentice or a probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall register such apprentice or probationer within fourteen days thereafter.

(d) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to every three or fraction of three journeymen employed by him.

(c) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the number of journeymen employed shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the six months immediately preceding such time.

Provided that an employer who is himself a tradesman and actually working at the trade may be included as a journeyman for the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices that may be taken. (f) The term of apprenticeship shall be five years.

(f) The term of apprenticeship shall be five years. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful. Such probationary period shall be deemed portion of the term of apprenticeship.

(g) Should any employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to his apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer; but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of the date of such transfer and when such apprenticeship commenced (Form 2 in the Appendix).

(h) The following provisions shall apply in respect of all apprenticeships:-

An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this Agreement, and shall, subject to the provisions of Subclause (n), pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided;
 (2) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the

(2) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the Registrar shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form 5 in the Appendix) to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable dis-

tance of the original employer's place of business willing to continue to teach the apprentice and pay the rate of wages prescribed by this Agreement, according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of such transfer in the form provided (Form 2 in the Appendix). It shall not be obligatory on the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall nevertheless give him a certificate for the time actually served.

(3) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to another employer willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.
(4) When an apprentice is discharged for cause the

(4) When an apprentice is discharged for cause the employer shall send notice in writing of the discharge, and the cause thereof, to the said Clerk of the Court (Form 3 in the Appendix).

Provided, that no apprentice shall be employed on a press until he has attained his third year.

The wages of apprentices under this Agreement shall be subject to alteration by the Court or by this Board when the wages of journeymen under this Agreement are reviewed.

(j) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners hereinafter constituted, once in each year of his service, when called upon by the Clerk of the Court so to do.

arter constituted, once in each year or his service, when called upon by the Clerk of the Court so to do. (k) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at such place as shall be from time to time appointed by the Clerk of the Court, and it shall be the duty of each employer to supply such necessary material and machinery as may be required and in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination.

(1) The examination will be held in the month of May in each year. The Board of Examiners shall consist of one person skilled in the trade to be nominated by the workers' Union; one person skilled in the trade, to be nominated by the employers, and oue person nominated by the Director of Education, or, failing such nomination or nominations, such person or persons as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. The examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.

(m) The examiners shall report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination.
(n) The Clerk of the Court shall supply to each can-

(n) The Clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate a certificate showing the result of his examination (Form 4 in the Appendix), and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing in accordance with the scale set forth in Subclause (i) hereof from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners.

(o) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed prima facie guilty of a breach of this Agreement under Section 97 of the Act, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.

(p) Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.

11.-Time and Wages Book.

A time and wages book shall be kept by each employer, in which book shall be entered the name of each worker, the nature of the work he is doing, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received by him each week. The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the proper posting of the book each week. The said book shall be open to the inspection of the secretary of the Union during working hours.

12.--Tools.

The employers shall supply the whole of the tools required.

14 .-- Contract of Hiring.

The contract of hiring of every worker, excepting apprentices, shall be deemed to be a contract of hiring by the day.

15.-Absence from Employment.

No worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for more than six days during each year of service.

16.—Disputes.

If any dispute arise as to the interpretation of this Agreement, it shall be referred to this Board for determination.

17.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be three years from the 14th October, 1929. Provided, that either party may, after the expiration of twelve months from its date, apply to the Court of Arbitration to alter, amend, or revise the same.

18.—Area.

This Agreement shall operate over the area comprised within a radius of twenty-five miles from the General Post Office, in the Town of Geraldton.

(Registered 24th October, 1929.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this 23rd day of October, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, between D. G. Carter & Co.; Rogers Bros.; J. J. Golding & Co.; W. Potter & Co.; B. P. Chidlow; Northam Co-operative Society, and P. Prince (Princess Shoe Stores) (hereinafter called the "employers"), of the one part, and The Shop Assistants & Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. (Northam Branch), (hereinafter called the "Union"), of the other part, witnesseth, that for the considerations hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its effects to the area comprised within a radius of fifteeu miles from the Post Office, Northam.

2.—Term.

The currency of this Agreement shall be three years from the date hereof.

3.—Definitions.

In this Agreement, unless the context otherwise indicates:---

- The term "Shop assistant" includes employees in country order departments, cashiers, and carpet and linoleum layers and planners.
- The term "Packer" means a person who packs goods for transport by rail or ship. The term "Despatch hand" shall mean an employee
- The term "Despatch hand" shall mean an employee who may handle goods or receive goods from departments and passes them over to the packing room, or prepares and hands over packages to carters for delivery, and who shall be responsible for the proper checking off of such packages, and for the proper branding and marking thereof, and keeping the necessary records such as rail notes and eart notes.
- The term "Casual hand" shall mean an employee engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave the employer's service at any moment without notice: Provided, a casual hand shall be employed for not less than four hours in any one day.
- The term "Casual hand" shall mean an employee engaged by the week and whose employment shall be terminable by not less than one week's notice on either side. Such week's notice cannot be continued from week to week: Provided, that any worker employed for a period of four consecutive weeks or less shall be classed as a casual hand, and paid not less than the minimum rate of wages herein prescribed for a casual hand, but this proviso shall not apply in cases where a worker employed as a "Weekly hand" has been dispensed with for incompetence or unsuitableness or any cause referred to in paragraph 12 hereof.
- cause referred to in paragraph 12 hereof. The term 'Grocer's carter' shall mean an employee engaged in driving a horse or motor vehicle.

4.-Hours.

Except as provided in Subclauses (a), (b), and (c) hereof, the ordinary working hours for shop assistants shall be in conformity with "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," insofar as the provisions of that Act limit the number of hours which shop assistants may be employed during any one day or week; but the time for commencing work shall not be earlier than 8.30 o'clock a.m. and the finishing time shall not be later than 6 o'clock p.m. on every Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday.

The time for finishing work on Wednesdays shall be the finishing time usually and customarily observed prior to January 16th, 1929.

The time for finishing work on Saturdays shall be 9 o'clock p.m.

(a) On any Wednesday immediately preceding Good Friday the finishing time shall not be later than 6 o'clock p.m.

(b) On the Thursday immediately preceding Good Friday the finishing time shall not be later than 9 o'clock p.m. (c) On the day mutually agreed upon by the parties hereto to be observed as Christmas Eve for the purpose of a late shopping night, the ordinary hours of work may be extended by agreement between the parties.

5,---Overtime,

Except as provided in Clause 4 (a), (b), and (c), all time worked after the usual finishing time on the weekly half holiday, and all time worked on Sundays and/or the holidays prescribed in this Agreement, shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

All other overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

6.—Holidays.

(a) The following days shall be observed as holidays and paid for during the currency of this Agreement:-----New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day. Any work done on the foregoing days shall be paid at the rate of double time.

(b) One holiday of one week on full pay shall be granted to each of the workers affected by this Agreement on the completion of each year's service. A worker not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holidays in the same proportion to the length of his or her services. This clause shall not apply to any worker summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

7.—Wages.

Basic wage-Males-£4 7s. 0d. per week; females-£2 7s. 0d. per week.

A carter who is required to attend horses on Sunday shall be paid 2s. 6d. for each Sunday in addition to the wage herein prescribed.

At least one employee in each establishment where a horse is used in the delivery of goods shall be rated as a carter and receive not less than the rate prescribed for Grocers' carters.

8.-Ratio of Juniors to Seniors.

(a) The number of male junior assistants shall not exceed the proportion of one to one for the first five male seniors, and thereafter one junior to every two male seniors or fraction thereof. Where no female assistant is employed one junior female assistant may be employed.

(b) Where one senior female assistant is employed two junior female assistants may be employed.

Where two senior female assistants are employed three junior female assistants may be employed.

Where three senior female assistants are employed four junior female assistants may be employed.

Where four senior female assistants are employed five junior female assistants may be employed.

And thereafter the proportion shall not exceed five junior female assistants to four senior female assistants.

For the purpose of determining the ratio of juniors to senior assistants under the clause, all employers or managers, when actively engaged in conducting the business of the establishment, shall be deemed to be senior assistants.

9.-Casual Hands.

The minimum weekly rate of wages payable to casual hands shall be as follows:---

- (a) Adults: Male and female, the rates prescribed herein, plus 3d. per hour.
- (b) Juniors: The rates prescribed herein, plus 1½d. per hour.

10.-Higher Duties.

A worker required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Agreement than that which he or she usually performs shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate whilst so employed.

11.-No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle any employer to reduce the wage of any worker who, at the date of this Agreement was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his or her class of work.

12.—Engagement.

One week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss an employee for neglect or refusal to obey orders, or for misconduct, or if, after receiving one week's notice, he does not carry out his duties as he did prior to such notice.

13.-Time and Wages Book.

Each employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a book containing the names of each of his workers to whom this Agreement applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each such worker, and the time during which he or she has been employed. Such book shall be signed by each worker each week. The time and wages book shall be open to inspection by a representative of the Union at least one day in each week between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

14.--- Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who, by reason of old age or infirmity, is unable to earn the minimum adult wage prescribed by this Agreement may be employed at such lesser wage (if any) as may be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the Secretary of the applicant Union. If within twenty-four hours after the worker has notified the Secretary of his or her desire to work at a lesser wage than the said minimum the Secretary and the worker do not agree as aforesaid, then the worker may apply to the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate for a permit to work at such lesser wage. The permit shall entitle the worker to work at the wage therein mentioned for such period as may be therein stated until the wage shall have again been settled by the Magistrate on the application of the said Secretary.
