- (4) If any person upon or within a reserve or station for aborigines, whether with lawful authority or not, shall be found taking or attempting to take any photograph without the permit of the Minister, or contravening or attempting to contravene any condition or stipulation specified in the permit granted to him, such person, upon being requested so to do by the Superintendent or Manager of the reserve or station, shall deliver to the Superintendent or Manager the film or plate of every photograph taken by such person upon or within the reserve or station, and leave the reserve or station forthwith.''

By-Laws—Gardiner River Reserves, Class "A," Nos. 20167 and 15776, for Camping and Recreation.

- 1. The term "Board" in the By-laws shall mean the Manjimup District Road Board.
- 2. The term "Permission," throughout these Bylaws, means permission in writing from the Board or its agent in writing first obtained.
- 3. The term "Public Well" shall mean any well or other water supply constructed or maintained by the Board within the boundaries of the Reserves A20167 and A15776.
- 4. Except as hereinafter provided no person shall fell, cut, injure or destroy any tree, shrub, or plant within a radius of twenty (20) chains from any Public Well on these Reserves.
- 5. No person shall set fire to the bush on these Reserves nor light any fire without clearing or seeing that there is already cleared a sufficient fire-break to prevent the fire spreading.
- 6. No person shall enter or remain on these Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who is in a state of intoxication.
- 7. No person shall graze any cattle, horses, sheep, pigs, or goats within twenty chains of any Public Well on these Reserves.
- 8. No person shall tie up or feed any horse or domes-
- ticated animal within a radius of ten chains of any Public Well on these Reserves.

 9. No person shall erect any tent or camp within a radius of one chain of any Public Well on these Reserves.
- 10. Campers are prohibited from bringing any domesticated animals such as horses, cows, goats, pigs, dogs, or fowls into camp without permission.
- 11. Campers must keep their camping area free from rubbish and in a clean and sanitary condition at all times
- 12. All campers must use the sanitary conveniences provided by the Board, and in the absence of such conveniences improvised arrangements must be provided, such as are approved by the Board or its agent.
- 13. Campers shall use sufficient sand or other approved deodorant to thoroughly cover all nightsoil or other excrementitious matter after using sanitary conveni-
- 14. The presence of cut or broken green timber, or foliage at any camp will be held as evidence that the camper has done the damage unless it was pointed out when taking over the camping area.
- 15. Any person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall forfeit and pay on conviction such sum as may be awarded, not exceeding £20.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

C. G. MORRIS, Under Secretary for Lands.

Public Cemetery, Kojonup.—By-laws.

By virtue of all powers on that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Kojonup, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:-

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in Schedule "A," are to be paid at the time when the applications are made or orders given.

2. Any person desiring ground in the cemetery for 2. Any person desiring ground in the cemetery for any grave, private grave, vault, or tombstone, monument or enclosure, or for any other purpose, shall make application therefor on prescribed form. Upon such application being approved of, the Trustees shall cause to be issued to such person so applying a Certificate of Right of Burial in the form specified in the Act (see Schedule "B").

All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Trustees in time to allow of at least five (5) working hours' notice being given to the Secretary at the Cemetery prior to the time fixed for burial,

otherwise an extra charge shall be made.

4. The name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule "F" shall be furnished at the time

- of giving the order.
 5. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under the supervision of the Secretary, after submitting a plan of same and obtaining a written approval of the Trusor same and obtaining a written approval or the Trustees thereon and on payment of the necessary fees; and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked-in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, or iron, unless special exemption be obtained from the Trustees in writing.

 6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate, bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon.
- thereon.
- 7. Every grave shall be at least 7ft. deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with less depth than 4ft. 6in, from the top of coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground after such interment.
- 8. No interment shall be allowed in any private grave or vault without the production of the Certificate of Right of Burial, as in Schedule "B," or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except in such cases as are provided for in the following By-law.

9. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no elaim during life, the written consent of the owner shall be handed in with the application.

10. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery without a certificate from the District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, and a Common and of the burial. Such certificate or order or a Coroner's order for burial. Such certificate or order shall be, at the latest, handed to the Secretary upon the funeral entering the Cemetery.

11. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.; and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery.

At funerals no vehicles other than hearses shall

be allowed to enter the Cemetery gates.

- 14. All hearses shall proceed by such roads as directed, and the drivers shall at all times observe such directions as may be issued to the Secretary by the Trustees from time to time for the regulation of the traffic.
- 15. No headstones, footstone, kerbing, monument or other erection of any kind shall be permitted, nor shall any inscription be allowed until the plans and particulars of the same have been approved by the Trustees.
- 16. Every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, and, if required by the Trustees or their officers, such foundations shall extend to the bottom of the grave.
- 17. The materials used in every erection shall be subject to the approval of the Secretary or other officer appointed by the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor or person responsible for the erection.
- 18. All material, refuse, and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person responsible therefor.
- 19. In the event of the refuse, rubbish, or material referred to in previous By-law not being so removed. the Trustees shall have power to cause the same to be removed, and to recover the costs of such removal from the person or persons responsible therefor.
- 20. All materials required in the erection and completion of any stone or other work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before taking to the Cemetery. and all materials required by tradesmen shall be ad-

mitted at such entrance to the Cemetery and conveyed along such roads or tracks as the Secretary shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

21. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws is not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

22. The Trustees will not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment in this or any other Cemetery.

23. Before any such exceptional case, as referred to in the last By-law, be dealt with by the Trustees, a written application, setting forth the reason for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of such application being granted, the approval of the Governor, in addition to the permission of the Trustees, shall be obtained. If in the opinion of the Trustees it is necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.

24. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave

Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave and whether it is proposed to creet a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased person whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

25. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

26. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in Schedule.

in Schedule.

27. The shape and height of all graves, etc., shall be subject to the approval and supervision of the Secretary.

28. No catacomb shall be anowed.
29. No trees or shrugs shall be planted in any enclosure, except such as are approved by the Secretary.

- 30. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Secretary, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find necessary to give, and any workman committing any breach of these regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Secretary, shall be removed from the Cemetery.
- 31. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

 (a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or any other materials
 - removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other graves, and if placed on any other adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b) No saud, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing graves, except with the permission of the Secretary.

(c) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Secretary.

(d) Work in all classes to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

Any person who dresses or attends a grave, for which dressing or attention a charge is made, shall pay the prescribed annual license fee for grave dressing.

33. Children under the age of ten years shall not be admitted to the Cemetery unless in charge of some responsible person.

- 34. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the Cemetery or to discharge any fireworks therein.
- 35. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.
- 36. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any trees, shrubs, flower, border, or any erection, or in any way infringing "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," or any rule, regulation, or by-law made for protecting the Cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.
- 37. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the Cemeterv.

38. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery or its approaches, any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatever.

39. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever whilst in discharge of his duty, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetry other than that for which he receives payment from the Trustees, and any person so employed accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal,

Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be

40. Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Trustees in the form set out in Schedule "G"; such licenses to be renewed annually.

41. Subject to the directions of the Trustees the Secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals within the Cemetery.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-25," this the Twenty-seventh day of September, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, between the Amalgamated Collieries of twenty-nine, between the Amalgamated Collieries of W.A., Limited, and the Griffin Coal Mining Company, Limited (hereinafter called the employers), of the one part, and the Amalgamated Engineering Union of Workers, Collie Branch, and the Australasian Society of Engineers, Collie River District, Industrial Union of Workers, being Industrial Unions duly registered under the provisions of the said Act (hereinafter called the Union) of the other part witnessely that for the Union), of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree as follows:-

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall operate over the Coal Mining Industry in the South-West Land Division of Western Australia.

2.—Term of Agreement.

The currency of this Agreement shall be for three (3) years from the date hereof; providing that, at any time after the expiration of twelve months from the date hereof, either party may open negotiations to alter or amend same.

3.—Rate of Wages.

The minimum rate of wages which shall be paid by the employers to the classes of workers in their employment hereunder specified shall be as follows:—

Further, that present margins shall be maintained.

The foregoing rates are based on the existing price of coal, namely, nineteen shillings per ton at the pit's mouth, and, for every penny increase or decrease in the said existing price, the said wages shall increase or more decrease one penny pen deith. The the purpose may decrease one penny per shift. For the purpose of fixing the increase or decrease in the price of coal, as aforesaid, regard shall be had only to the maximum price paid by the Commissioner of the Western Austria. tralian Government Railways.

In addition to the above-mentioned rates, sixpence per day extra shall be paid to employees working afternoon or night shift.

4.—Apprentices.

The employer taking an apprentice or a probationer shall, within fourteen days thereafter, register such apprentice or probationer by giving notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration on the prescribed form. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be allowed. Such probationary period to be deemed part of the apprenticeship.

- (a) The number of apprentices allowed to the employer shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to three or part of three tradesmen employed by him on the particular branch of work. The term of apprenticeship shall be five years. Apprenticeship shall not commence before the apprentice is fifteen years of age.
- (b) Should the employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to his apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprenthe complete his term to another employer, but it shall be incumbent on the former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration of the date of said transfer on the prescribed form. It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him. When an apprentice cannot be usefully employed because of a strike, the employer shall be relieved of his obligations under the apprenticeship contract during the period of the strike.
- (c) Slackness of work may form a proper ground of transferring an apprentice to an employer willing to take the responsibility of teaching him when an apprentice is discharged; notice in the prescribed form shall be given to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration.
- (d) The minimum wage payable to an apprentice shall be:—For the first year, 25s. per week; second year, 35s. per week; third year, 50s. per week: fourth year, 70s. per week; fifth year, 90s. per week.
- (e) Every apprentice shall be bound to attend such classes at the technical school, or continuation classes, as are provided for his trade.
- (f) Apprentices shall be allowed to the following trades:-
 - Fitter and Turner.
 - Blacksmith.
 - Electrician. Millwright.

5.--Hours.

Forty hours shall constitute a week's work on pay week, and forty-two hours in the back week. No day's

week, and forty-two hours in the back week. No day's work shall exceed seven hours, but on pay Saturday five hours shall be worked and paid for as seven hours. These hours are exclusive of crib time.

In the case of a worker being permanently employed underground, his time shall be computed from bank to bank. In the event of a shop hand being engaged on underground work of a casual nature, his time shall be computed from shop to shop. computed from shop to shop.

6.—Overtime Rates.

For all work done beyond the hours of duty on any week day other than a holiday, payment shall be made at the rate of bare time for the first hour, and time and a half thereafter.

- (a) For all work performed on Anniversary Day, Xmas Day, Good Friday, and Labour Day, double time rates shall be paid, and for all work performed on Sundays, Anzac Day, Easter Monday, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, and contested State and Federal election days, shall be paid for at time and a half rates.
- (b) Any worker called upon to work on Sundays or holidays shall be paid a minimum of four hours at overtime rates.
- (c) In the event of a worker who has been employed on day work being required to work during afternoon or night shift, such worker shall be paid at overtime rates.
- (d) In the event of a worker being recalled to work after leaving the job, he shall be paid for at least two and a half hours at overtime rate.

7.-Wet Work.

If any worker under this Agreement has to work in water, i.e., if he has to stand in water while working, or water drips on him while working, he shall be paid the sum of 2s. 3d. per shift extra.

8.-Holidays.

The days to be observed as holidays are:—Anniversary Day (26th January), Anzac Day, Labour Day, Easter Monday, Good Friday, Boxing Day, Xmas Day, New Year's Day, and contested State and Federal election days.

9.—Annual Leave.

Every worker shall be entitled to an annual holiday of twelve days in addition to the above-mentioned holidays; such holidays to be taken at a time which will cause the least inconvenience to the employer.

10.—Reduction of Hands.

In the event of the manager deeming it necessary to reduce hands, the last man employed in a particular class of work in which the reduction of hands is to be made shall be the first man to go, but in the event of such worker having been shifted from one class of work to another, then he shall be treated as if he were employed at his last job from the date that he signed on at the mine.

In the event of the management restarting workers, the last man off shall be the first man to be put on, if available.

11.--Record Book.

A record or time book shall be kept by each employer, A record or time book shall be kept by each employer, in which record or time book shall be entered the name of each worker, the nature of the work he is doing, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received by him each week; the said record or time book shall be open for the inspection of the accredited representative of the Society at any time during the working hours, and he shall be allowed to take necessary extracts therefrom.

12.—Local Arbitration Clause.

Any matter in dispute of any kind whatever, in connection with the working conditions, discharge of work-men, or any other thing not provided for in this Agreement, shall forthwith be referred to a Board of Arbitration consisting of the employer or his manager, and the local Secretary of the Union or his representative, for amicable settlement. Failing a settlement, the arbitrators so appointed shall appoint an umpire to decide the matter in dispute. Should they fail to agree upon an umpire within forty-eight hours, the Inspector of Mines for the district shall act as umpire, and the decision of such person shall be final. There shall be no cessation of work whilst a settlement is being arrived no cessation of work whilst a settlement is being arrived at. The persons appointed as a Board of Arbitration as herein provided may, when determining any dispute referred for their arbitrament, direct that the costs (if any) occasioned by the proceedings shall be paid by one specified party or parties to the other or others, and the parties to this Agreement shall abide by and literally comply with any such direction.

$13. - {\bf Preference}.$

All workers under this Agreement must be members of All workers under this Agreement must be members of one of the Unions mentioned herein. Every worker engaged by the employer shall, within three weeks of his engagement, become a member, provided that the right to be a member shall apply to the Chief Mechanial Engineer or Chief Electrical Engineer, where the positions are held by separate persons at each mine when this Agreement was made, and also to any persons who may fill these positions in the future, and said Engineers shall not be liable to be called upon to leave work when a strike or lock-out takes place, and the Union herein agrees to accept him as a member.

14.—Existing Customs and Conditions.

This Agreement is based on existing customs and conditions not inconsistent with this Agreement.

SHOP ASSISTANTS (EASTERN GOLDFIELDS) (Registered 6/11/29.)

No. 24 of 1929.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925, this 28th day of October, Nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, between the Eastern Goldfields Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Union of Workers, a Union registered under the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925, and whose registered office is situated at the Trades Hall, Kalgoorlie, hereinafter called the ployees, of the one part, and the Eastern Goldfields Traders' Industrial Union of Employers, trading within the area hereinafter set out, hereinafter called the employers, of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed as follows:

The minimum rates of wages payable to employees engaged in the hardware, ironmongery, grocery, crockery, glassware, drapery, mercery, clothing, stationery, book music, boots and shoes, dairy produce, furniture, jewellery and factories departments and shops shall be as under:-

Hours.

Forty-eight hours shall be constituted for all male employees; such hours shall be worked between the hours of 8.20 a.m. and 6 p.m. on five days of the week and from 8.20 a.m. to 1 p.m. on the half holiday.

Females.

Forty-four hours shall be constituted for female employees; such hours shall be worked between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. on five days of the week and from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. on the half holiday.

Scope of Agreement.

This Agreement shall apply to the Industries mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereunder in respect to workers following vocations mentioned herein; provided, that it shall not apply to workers who are at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia, or in any Industrial Agreement registered in accordance with the Industrial Arbitration Act of 1912-1925.

Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of 25 miles from the Kalgoorlie Post Office.

The term of this Agreement shall be from the date hereof, and shall continue in force for three years, and thereafter until thirty days' notice to withdraw therefrom has been given by any party hereto shall have expired.

Definitions.

(1) In this Agreement, unless context otherwise indicates: The term shop assistant includes employees in Country Order Departments, cashier, carpet, linoleum

layers and planner, soda fountain assistants, and packers. The term packer means a person who packs

goods for transport by rail or ship.
(2) The term "Despatch hand" shall mean any employee who may handle or receive goods from departployee who may handle or receive goods from departments and passes them over to the packing room, or prepares and hands over packages to the carter for delivery, and who shall be responsible for the proper checking off of such packages, and for the proper branding and marking thereof, and keeping necessary records such as rail notes and cart notes.

(3) Female despatch hands, when making up orders or working in or about departments where a higher rate

or working in or about departments where a higher rate prevails, the rate for the department whilst so employed

shall apply.

(4) The term "Casual hand" shall mean an employee engaged by the hour, and who may be put off or leave the employer's service at any moment without notice.

(5) Provided, a casual hand shall be employed for not less than four hours in any one day; a person engaged and not permitted to commence work shall receive

two hours' pay at ordinary rate of pay.

(6) The term "Weekly hand" shall mean an emlove engaged by the week and whose employment shall be terminated by not less than one week's notice on either side; such week's notice cannot be continued from week to week; provided that, any worker employed for a period of four consecutive weeks or less, shall be classed as a casual hand, and paid not less than the minimum rate of wages herein prescribed for a casual hand, but this proviso shall not apply in cases where a worker employed as weekly hand has been dispensed with for incompetence or unsuitableness, or any cause referred to in paragraph hereof (12).

Meal Money.

(7) With the exception of all employees whose duties are usually performed after 6 p.m. for Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday, and after 1 p.m. on Wednesday, all other employees required to work after 6 p.m. on days above-mentioned, or after 1 p.m. Wednesday, be paid 1s. 6d. meal money.

Overtime.

- (8) All time worked on Sunday or holiday prescribed in this Agreement shall be paid for at the rate of double time. For all other overtime the rate shall be time and a half for the first four hours and double ti... there-
- (9) All time worked before the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time shall be deemed to be overtime.

 (10) In the computation of overtime each day's work shall stand by itself. Casual Hands.

(16) The minimum rate of wage payable to casual hands shall be as follows:—Adults—The rate prescribed herein, plus threepence an hour; juniors.—The rates prescribed herein, plus 11 pence per hour...

Canvasser.

(17) Provided that, adult male shop assistants employed as a canvasser and/or collector shall receive a weekly minimum wage of £5 2s. 0d., but where such canvasser provides his own bicycle, he shall be paid an

extra allowance of 2s. 6d. per week.

Junior canvassers shall receive the ordinary shop assistants' wages according to age, plus 5s. per week, and where junior canvasser provides his own bicycle he shall be paid an extra allowance of 2s. 6d. per week.

Change Room.

(18) Where an employer usually has more than six employees engaged under the terms of the Award, he employees engaged under the terms of the Award, he shall provide his employees with a suitable room for keeping their hats and clothing, and to use as a room for taking their meals, such room to be situated within a reasonable distance of his place of business and to be kept in a proper state of cleanliness.

Higher Duties.

(20) A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Award than that he or she usually performs, shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate whilst so employed.

Promotion of Male Juniors.

- (21) Where one senior is employed, two juniors may be employed, and where two seniors are employed, three juniors may be employed; where more than two seniors are employed, one junior to each senior may be employed. That "Senior" shall mean a person of be employed. 21 years or over.
- (22) Where no male or female assistant in receipt of the full adult wage is employed, one junior male or female assistant may be employed.
- (23) Where one senior female is employed two junior females may be employed.
- (24) Where two senior female assistants are employed
- three junior assistants may be employed.

 (25) Where three senior female assistants are employed four junior assistants may be employed.
- (26) Where four senior females are employed five junior female assistants may be employed, and thereafter the proportion not to exceed five junior female assistants to four senior female assistants.
- (27) In this clause the word "senior" shall mean a person of twenty-one years or over.

Engagement.

(28) One week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement; provided, that the employer at any time may dismiss the employee for refusal or neglect to obey orders, or for misconduct, or, if after receiving one week's notice, such employee does not carry out his or her duties in the same manner as he or she did prior to such notice.

Time and Wages Book.

(29) The employers shall keep and enter up or cause to be kept and entered up, a book containing the names; of each of his workers to whom this Agreement applies. wages and time during which he or she has been employed; such book shall be open to inspection by a representative of the Union at least one day in each week, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

By-laws for the Control of Point Walter Reserve "4" 4813.

The term "Board" in these By-laws shall mean the Board appointed under the provisions of "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," to control this Reserve.

"Permission" shall mean the permission of the Board first obtained and expressed in writing.

Control of Vehicles.

1. No person shall drive, ride, convey, or impel any motor car, motor eyele, bicycle, carriage, cart, aeroplane, or other vehicle within this Reserve except upon a declared public highway or road.

Class of Vehicles.

2. No passenger vehicle plying as an omnibus, or which plies for hire, nor any vehicle, team, cart, or wagon used for carrying any goods, bricks, stone, wood, iron, or merehandise of any kind (whether laden or not), nor any hearse, mourning coach, camel, packhorse, or ather heart of lander shall outer or ness through this other beast of burden shall enter or pass through this Reserve.

Damaging Growth.

3. No person shall injure, cut, break, deface, pull up, pick, remove, or destroy any tree, shrub, plant, flower, or grass growing on the Reserve, or remove or damage stakes or labels therein, nor hang, nor attach elething or other articles thereto.

Soil, Fences, and Grass.

4. No person shall cut up, damage, disfigure, or interfere with the soil, turf, or surface of any part of the Reserve, or the roads or footways across, around, or over the same, or with any part of the fences, buildings, electrical equipment, rockwork, watercocks, or seats around or upon the same, or pollute or interfere with any ornamental water therein, or interfere with or destroy any birds, animals, or fish therein in any manner whatsoever. whatsoever.

Rubbish.

5. No person shall deposit or leave any rubbish, refuse, paper, broken glass, china, or litter of any kind whatsoever within the Reserve except in the receptacles provided, nor break bottles, china, or other similar substances therein.

Behaviour.

6. No person shall misconduct himself, or indulge in any riotous or indecent conduct, or use any indecent or improper language, or offend against decency as regards dress on the Reserve.

Intoxicating Liquor.

7. No person shall bring into or consume within the Reserve any intoxicating liquor, nor enter thereon when visibly under the influence of liquor.

Expectoration.

8. No person shall spit or expectorate upon any path, grass, structure, or erection in this Reserve.

Camping.

9. No person shall camp, lodge, or tarry overnight, or frequent the Reserve for the purpose of camping, lodging, or tarrying overnight, nor lie or sleep during the day on the Reserve.

Seats for Ladies.

 $10.\,$ No man shall occupy a seat which is set apart for the use of ladies.

Bill Sticking.

11. No person shall post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint, or otherwise affix, distribute, or give out any placard, handbill notice, advertisement, or any document whatsoever upon any tree, fence, post, gate, wall, flagging, road, path, or any place whatever on the Reserve, and no person shall cause to be done any of the acts herein prohibited.

Fires and Shooting.

12. No person or persons shall carry or discharge any firearms, or throw or discharge any stone or other missile, or set off any fire balloon, or throw or set fire to any fireworks, or kindle or make any fire on any portion of the Reserve without permission.

Trading.

13. No person shall, without permission, sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, refreshments, fruits, nuts, confectionery, fish or other merchandise or things or solicit or offer to purchase bottles on any portion of the Reserve.

Games and Animals.

14. No person shall, upon the said Reserve without permission, play, practise, or indulge in any game, sport, or gymnastic exercise, or exercise horses, dogs, or other animals for racing.

Straying Stock.

15. No person shall cause, allow, or suffer any herse, cattle, sheep, dog, goat, camel, donkey, mule, pig, or other animal, or fowl or other bird to enter, stray, or feed upon the said Reserve without permission, nor cause, allow, or suffer any dog to enter any swimming area, nor throw sticks or other missiles therein.

Meetings.

16. No person shall organise, arrange, advertise, or take part in any fete, pienie, or concert, or engage in public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or any meeting of like character on the Reserve without permission.

Betting.

17. No person shall bet or offer to bet publicly on any part of the Reserve.

Trespass.

18. No person, except working employed in the Reserve, shall enter any place enclosed for trees, flowers, or shrubs, or plantations of young trees, nor step, nor walk upon, or jump across any plot therein which may be set apart for shrubs, plants, or flowers.

Obstructing Employees.

19. No person shall in any part of the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use or enjoyment of the gardens, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult, or neglect to obey the lawful directions of, or refuse or neglect to give his name and address, or give a wrong name or address, to any officer, gardener, keeper, labourer, workman, or other person employed in any connection therewith.

Sails.

20. No person shall spread or dry sails or other similar material upon the Reserve.

Traffic.

21. The traffic requirements in force for the time being under "The Traffic Act, 1919," and its amendments, shall be observed upon the said Reserve, but always with the limitation that no person shall at any time drive, ride, or impel any carriage, motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, tricycle, or other vehicle at a speed exceeding 12 miles an hour.

Mooring Boats.

22. No boat shall be moored or anchored, or kept or left moored or anchored or unattended opposite or near any part of the beach which may be set aside from time to time, unless such boat is and remains at least one chain below low water mark, except as hereinafter provided.

Landing Passengers.

23. If it is necessary to bring any boat nearer to the said beach than is mentioned in the preceding regulation, for the purpose of passengers or any of the crew embarking or disembarking, the purpose shall be effected as speedily as possible, and the boat shall then be immediately removed to and kept at a distance of at least one chain below low water mark.

Beaching Boats.

24. No person shall beach a boat upon the Reserve at any place other than that set apart for the purpose, and no boat thus beached shall be moved, handled, or interfered with in any way by any unauthorised person, but the Board or its employees, at the discretion of the Board, may remove or require the owner to remove at any time any boat wherever placed. The Board shall not accept any responsibility for the care of nor liability for damage to any boat wherever beached.

Destruction of Abandoned Boats.

25. Any boat which may be beached at a place not set apart for the purpose, or which may be drifting, or sunk, or, in the opinion of the Board or its employees, has been abandoned, may be taken into the possession of the Board and/or removed to such place as it may think fit, and forthwith sold or otherwise disposed of at the discretion of the Board, without redress to the owner for any loss or inconvenience to which he may be subjected thereby.

Swimming Area.

26. Notwithstanding the provisions of any other By-law, areas may be set apart for bathing and swimming, and no boat of any description shall be permitted to enter or remain in such area. Such areas may be defined from time to time by the placing of posts at intervals along the river side of such area and the posting of a notice indicating the purpose of the area thus set apart.

Permits for Camping.

- 27. Notwithstanding the provisions of By-law No. 9, camping may be permitted in areas set apart for the purpose, but not elsewhere, at this Reserve, upon the issue of a permit from the Camp Controller, and subject to the following conditions:—
 - (a) For the purposes of this By-law the term "Camp Controller" shall mean the person appointed by the Board from time to time to control and supervise the Camping Areas, and shall particularly apply to the Caretaker of this Reserve.
 - (b) The permit will indicate the site to be occupied, and the Controller's decision in any dispute shall be final.

Fees are payable prior to the issue of permits, on the scale of 5s. per week or part thereof.

Extensions of the permit may be secured upon the payment of a further fee upon the above scale.

(c) No person shall sub-let any camp, or sell, give, or otherwise dispose of any permit to any person.

person.

(d) Except by the permission of the Camp Controller, no person shall bring into or keep within the camping area any animals or birds whatever.

(e) No person shall misconduct himself or indulge in any riotous or indecent conduct, or use any indecent or improper language, or offend against decency as regards dress in the Camp-

(f) No person shall bring into or keep or consume in the Camping Area any intoxicating liquor, nor euter, nor remain thereon when visibly under the influence of liquor.

(g) Campers must keep the area, covered by their permit, in a clean and sanitary condition at all times. All rubbish capable of destruction by fire shall be burned by the occupier in the approved fireplace.

(h) All campers must use the sanitary conveniences provided, and in no circumstances will improvised conveniences or individual camping

sites be permitted.

- (i) No person shall cause or permit any damage to trees, shrubs, or grass, whether naturally or artificially planted within or surrounding the Camping Area. The presence of green timber or foliage on the area covered by any campthe holder of the permit has caused or permitted damage, unless the permit holder has pointed out the damage before taking over the camping site.
- (j) Camping permits may at any time be withdrawn by the Camp Controller, if in his opinion a breach of these by-laws has been committed, or if, in his opinion, it is desirable that the

permit shall be terminated. In the event of termination hereunder, the rental paid shall be forfeited to the Board, and no compensa tion shall be claimed or paid for loss, damage, or inconvenience suffered through the with-

drawal of the permit.

(k) Subject to the right of the Camp Controller, and the officers and employees of the Board, or any person acting under their instructions, or any Police Constable, to enter any camping site at any time, no person shall outer into or remain within such camping site except with the permission of the holder of the permit.

(1) No fires shall be lighted on any Camping Area, except in places approved by the Camp Corn-

troller.

(m) Except so far as they may be inconsistent with this By-law, the whole of the By-laws now or hereafter made by the Executive Council to apply to areas under control of the Board shall apply to Camping Areas.

Penalty.

28. Any person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £20, in addition to being immediately removed from the Reserve.
