WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," that the expression "Public Holiday" shall mean certain days therein specified, and any other day declared by Proclamation to be a public holiday for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, acting under the powers contained in the said Act, and every other power me in this behalf enabling, do hereby proclaim and declare that Thursday, the 26th day of December, 1929, and Thursday, the 2nd day of January, 1930, shall be public holidays throughout the State for the purposes of the said Act, and shall be observed as public holidays under every part of the said Act in which the expression occurs.

do by this Proclamation add "Goats" to the Third Schedule of the said Act: Provided, however, that this Proclamation shall be restricted in its operation to the Port Hedland Vermin District.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 26th day of November, 1929, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Public Service Act, 1904.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 84 of "The Public Service Act, 1904," that the Governor may make, alter, or repeal regulations for the carrying out of any of the provisions of the said Act; and whereas it is deemed expedient to amend the Regulations governing the admission of Engineering Cadets, Public Works and Water Supply Departments, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th day of March, 1926, by repealing Regulation 15 thereof and inserting in place thereof a new Regulation 15, and by adding an Appendix to the said Regulations: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby amend the said regulations by repealing Regulation No. 15 thereof, and by inserting a new Regulation No. 15 in place thereof, and by adding an Appendix to the said regulations as follows:—

Agreement and Bond.

15. Before any person is accepted as a cadet under these Regulations an agreement in the form or to the effect of Form No. 1 in the Appendix hereto shall be executed by such person and his legal guardian and the Head of the Department concerned; and a Bond in the form or to the effect of Form No. 2 in the said Appendix shall be executed by the said legal guardian and by one or two sureties to be determined and approved by the Head of the Department concerned.

When the Cadet shall have satisfactorily completed his cadetship and obtained his certificate of qualification he will, if required so to do, serve in the Public Service of the State for a period of three years, in accordance with and subject to the provisions contained in Regulation 13 of the said Regulations or any amendments for the time being in force thereof.

4. In consideration of the premises the (n) _____ will during the said term take and accept the Cadet attached to the Public Works and Water Supply Departments and employ and instruct as an Engineering Cadet under and in accordance with the said Regulations or any amendments for the time being in force thereof.

Sandalwood Act, 1929.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1478/29.

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 2 of "The Sandalwood Act, 1929," the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during a period therein stated: And whereas it is desirable to limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during the period from the fourth day of December, 1929, to the thirty-first day of January, 1931, to 4,750 tons: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during the period from the fourth day of December, 1929, to the thirty-first day of January, 1931, to 4,750 tons, exclusive of sandalwood required for oil distillation within the State.

The Pearling Act, 1912-24.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 45 of "The Pearling Act, 1912-24," it is made lawful for the Governor to close any portion of a pearl-shell area and to prohibit the gathering, collection, or removal of any pearls or pearl-shell within or from the portion so closed, for a specific period; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the whole of that portion of the Shark Bay Pearl-shell Area known as South Passage Section, other than those portions held under Exclusive License, shall be closed, and that the gathering, collection, or removal of pearls or pearl-shells within or from that portion so closed shall be prohibited: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby directs that the above-mentioned portion of the said Pearl-shell Area shall be closed, and that the gathering, collection, or removal of pearls or pearl-shells within or from the portion so closed shall be prohibited for a period of twelve (12) months from the fourteenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and
Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 140/29.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: and whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted.—Metropolitan Reticulation Main Extension.—South Perth Road District:—Proposed four-inch diameter cast-iron water main commencing at the existing four-inch diameter main at the intersection of Leonora Street and Henley Street and proceeding thence in a Westerly direction along Henley Street to the junction of Henley Street and Mary Street; thence in a Northerly direction along Mary Street to the intersection of Mary Street and Gale Street; thence in a Westerly direction along Gale Street to the junction of Gale Street and Melville Parade; thence in a Northerly direction along Melville Parade to a point opposite Lot 188 (length about thirty-five chains).

The above main to be complete with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 5022.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Board of any Road District is empowered to make By-laws for any or all of the purposes mentioned in the said Act, the Gascoyne-Minilya Road Board doth, in exercise of the powers aforesaid, and of every power enabling it in this behalf, hereby make and publish the following By-law:—

Motor and Cycle Traffic.

The roads described in the Schedule hereunder shall be and the same are hereby set apart for motor and cycle traffic only as from the date of publication in the *Government Gazette* of this By-law.

Schedule.

1. A road commencing at Cooralya Woolshed on Lease No. 2194/96 and running approximately South-West for approximately 12 miles to connect with a gazetted road for motor and cycle traffic between Grierson's Tank and Booloogooroo Homestead, at a point about one mile North-East of Grierson's Tank.

2. A continuation for about three miles in a South-Westerly direction of the road for motor and cycle traffic only connecting Grierson's Tank and Booloogooroo Homestead published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd day of October, 1926, page 2163.

THE INDUSTRIAL ARBITRATION ACT, 1912-1925.

Rope and Twine Industrial Board.

No. 16 of 1929.

Between The Metropolitan Rope and Twine Manufacturers' Employees' Industrial Union of Workers (Applicant), and The West Australian Rope and Twine Company Proprietary, Limited (Respondent).

Award.

1.—Scope of Award.

This Award shall apply to all workers who are employed in or in connection with the manufacture of rope and twine, or goods manufactured from rope and twine: Provided that this clause shall not apply to workers in the industry who are already covered by an Award or Industrial Agreement made under the provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925."

2.—Area.

This Award shall operate over the area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

3.—Term.

This Award shall continue in force for a period of three years from the date hereof, subject to the provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925."

4.—Hours.

(a) For females and junior males under sixteen years of age forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked as follows:—Monday to Friday—8 a.m. to 12 noon; 12.45 p.m. to 4.45 p.m. Saturday—7.45 a.m. to 11.45 a.m.

(b) For males over sixteen (16) years of age forty-eight (48) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked as follows:—Monday to Friday—7.30 a.m. to 12 noon; 12.45 p.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday—7.30 a.m. to 11.45 a.m.

(c) Night Shift: The hours of work on night shift for senior males shall be forty-eight (48), and for junior males forty-four (44) per week. Employees so engaged shall be paid at the rate of five shillings (5s.) per week, in addition to the ordinary day work rate. A worker shall be deemed to be engaged on night shift when he is called upon to work a full shift outside the hours prescribed in Subsection (a) of this clause as relating to junior males, and Subsection (b) as relating to senior males. Any employee taken from day work for night shift shall have his position on day work guaranteed to him when the night shift is finished.

5.—Holidays.

(a) The following holidays shall be allowed and paid for as they occur, viz.:—Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Labour Day, New Year's Day, Anzac Day, and four days intervening between Boxing Day and New Year's Day.

(b) Employees working on any of these days shall, except as hereinafter provided, be entitled to ordinary time for the time worked in addition to the weekly wage: Provided that any worker so employed shall receive a minimum of four hours' pay.

(c) Employees engaged on repair work or the cleaning of the plant on any of the above prescribed holidays, or on Sunday, shall be paid for such work on holidays at the rate of half time in addition to the ordinary weekly wage, and for such work on Sundays at the rate of ordinary time in addition to the weekly wage.

(d) The holidays provided for in Subclause (a) shall be deemed to be in lieu of annual leave. Any worker not completing one year of service shall be entitled to pay in lieu of the above twelve paid holidays in proportion to the length of his or her service.

6.—Overtime.

Except as relating to night shift, all work performed before the usual starting times or after the usual finishing times, or in excess of eight and three-quarter hours in the case of adult males, or eight hours in the case of junior males or females, in any one day, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

7.—Time and Wages Book.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a book containing the names of each of his employees to whom this Award applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each such employee, and the time during which each such employee has been employed. Such book shall be open for inspection by a duly authorised representative of the Union between the hours of ten o'clock a.m. and four o'clock p.m.

8.—Engagement.

(a) All workers other than casuals shall be engaged and paid by the week, and one week's notice shall be given by either party: Provided, however, that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct: Provided further, that any worker not attending for duty will lose his pay for the actual time lost, unless he produces evidence satisfactory to the employer that his non-attendance was due to personal ill-health or accident necessitating such absence, but he shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the grounds of personal ill-health or accident arising out of his employment for more than six days in each year.

(b) The year referred to in the preceding clause begins on the date on which this Award comes into force and the said six days may be apportioned accordingly.

(The term "Assistant ropemaker" shall mean a man who actually assists the ropemaker in making ropes, but shall not be deemed to include the junior male worker who is employed on the traveller.)

(a) Any female employed as a head splicer shall be paid five shillings (5s.) per week above the rates herein prescribed for females, and all other females employed as splicers shall be paid two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per week above the rates herein provided.

(b) All females and male juniors employed on spooling shall be paid two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per week in addition to the above rates.

(c) Workers employed as oilers, or in the caustic soda and moisture preparation, shall receive two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per week in addition to the above rates.

10.—Casual Workers.

"Casual hand" shall mean a worker whose services are terminated by the employer within one week of his being engaged, and such "casual hand" shall be paid as follows:—Adults, 3d. per hour above the rates specified, on an hourly basis; Juniors, 1½d. per hour above the rates specified, on an hourly basis.

11.—Mixed Functions.

Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his usual rate shall be paid whilst engaged on such work at the rate prescribed therefor: Provided that, where no record of such work is kept, the worker shall be paid at the higher rate for the whole of the day on which the work was performed.

12.—Aged and Infirm Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four (24) hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the Secretary of the Union stating his desire that such wage shall be agreed upon such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient Industrial Magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four (24) hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said Secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the Magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the Secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said worker in the manner prescribed. The Secretary of the Union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

SANDALWOOD ACT, 1929.

Forest Regulations.

Forests Department,
F.D. 1478/29. Perth, 11th December, 1929.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the amendment of "The Forest Regulations, 1925," by the addition of Regulations made pursuant to the provisions of "The Sandalwood Act, 1929," as follows:—

Removal of Sandalwood.

109. (1) No person shall pull or remove sandalwood from alienated land, unless such person (being the grantee or lessee thereof, or lawfully claiming under him) is authorised to do so by a license in the prescribed form granted to him by the Conservator of Forests.

(2.) Application for a license under the foregoing regulation shall be made to the Conservator of Forests in writing in the Form 14 in the Sixth Schedule.

(3.) Any person applying for a license other than the grantee or lessee of alienated land from which it is desired to pull or remove sandalwood may be required to produce to the Conservator of Forests authority in writing from the grantee or lessee to pull sandalwood from the land therein specified.

(4.) A license to pull or remove sandalwood from alienated land may be in the Form No. 15 in the Sixth Schedule, and shall authorise the licensee to pull and remove the quantity of sandalwood therein specified on and from the alienated land therein defined.

110. A license under Regulation 109 may be issued for any period not exceeding six months from the date thereof. No extension of any license shall be granted in the event of a licensee failing to fully exercise his rights by pulling and removing the quantity of sandalwood therein specified within the term of the license: provided, however, that a licensee may make application for a further license in respect of sandalwood not pulled or removed under a previous license, and such application shall be dealt with in order of its priority.

111. No sandalwood pulled under the authority of a license granted under "The Sandalwood Act, 1929," shall be removed from the location or lease from which it has been pulled unless and until it has been inspected and branded by an Inspector of the Forests Department. Payment for such inspection shall be in accordance with the requirements of the Forest Regulations.

112. It shall be an offence for any person to furnish any false, incorrect, or misleading statements, particularly with reference to the ownership of alienated land, or the ownership of sandalwood on alienated land, with a view to obtaining a license under these Regulations.

113. Any person who shall commit a breach of any of the foregoing regulations shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty of not exceeding One hundred pounds. The minimum penalty shall be one-twentieth of the maximum, as provided under Section 53, Subsection (2) of "The Forests Act, 1918."
