AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 8th day of June, 1932, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

The Road Districts Act, 1919.

Denmark Road Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1775/23.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 20 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," that in every District there shall be a Board consisting of not less than five or more than thirteen members, as the Governor from time to time declares by Order in Council, and that if the District is divided into Wards the Governor shall from time to time determine the number of members for each Ward: And whereas it is enacted by Section 14 of the said Act, inter alia, that in a change being made under this Act in the number of members of a Local Authority, the Governor may by Order in Council declare and direct whether a new election of members shall be held for any District affected, and, if so, when such election shall be held: And whereas it is enacted by Section 13 of the said Act that on a District being divided or redivided into Wards all the members of the Board shall go out of office on the day appointed by the Minister: And whereas until recently the Denmark Road District was divided into five (5) Wards, and the Board thereof consisted of seven (7) members and whereas by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 22nd day of April, 1932, the said Road District was pursuant to the provisions of the said Act redivided into five (5) Wards, and in accordance with the provisions of Section 13 of the said Act the Minister has appointed the 11th day of November, 1932, as the day upon which the members of the Denmark Road Board shall go out of office as such members: And whereas upon the redivision of the Denmark Road District into five Wards as aforesaid it is deemed expedient to increase the number of members of the Denmark Road Board from seven to nine and to determine that the members shall be allocated as follows: Town Ward, 2 members; Scotsdale Ward, 2 members; Shadforth Ward, 1 member; Kent Ward, 2 members; Nornalup Ward, 2 members, and also to direct that there shall be an election for the purpose of electing the said nine members and that such election shall be held on the 26th day of November, 1932: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and all other powers thereto enabling him, doth hereby declare that as from the 26th day of November, 1932, the Denmark Road Board shall consist of nine (9) members, instead of seven (7) members as formerly, and that the members shall be allocated as follows: Town Ward, 2 members; Scotsdale Ward, 2 members; Shadforth Ward, 1 member; Kent Ward, 2 members; Nornalup Ward, 2 members; and also that an election shall be held for the purpose of electing the said nine members of the said Denmark Road Board and that such election shall be held on the 26th day of November, 1932.

Road Districts Act, 1919. Three Springs Road Board. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 973/31.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 14 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," inter alia, that on any portion of a Ward being transferred under the said Act to a Ward the Governor may by Order in Council declare and direct whether a new election of members shall be held and, if so, when such election shall be held, and whether any and which of the existing members shall go out of effice and at what time: And whereas by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 22nd day of April, 1932, a portion of the Arrino Ward of the Three Springs Road District was severed therefrom and annexed to the Kadathinni Ward of the said District; and a portion of the Dudawa Ward of the Three Springs Road District was severed therefrom and annexed to the Womarden Ward of the said District. Now therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, acting with

the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and all other powers thereto enabling him, doth hereby declare and direct that a new election of members of the Three Springs Road Board shall be held and that such election shall be held on the 12th day of November, 1932, and that the dates for the events leading up to such election shall be as follows:—Preparation of list—3rd September, 1932; exhibition of list—10th September, 1932; last day for receiving claims and objections—17th September 1932; Revision Court—1st October, 1932; signing of roll—8th October, 1932; nomination day—29th October, 1932; election day—12th November, 1932; and that all the existing members of the said Board shall go out of office on the 28th day of October, 1932.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919-1930," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a Local Authority to exercise within its District any power of making Regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4 of Part IV. of the said Act. WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919-1930," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a Local Authority to exercise within its District any power of making Regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4 of Part IV. of the gold Art. Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914. Harvey No. 2 Irrigation District. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914," it is provided that the Governor may on the recommendation of the Minister acting with the advice of the Commissioners appointed under the said Act by Order in Council constitute any defined part of the State au Irrigation District for the purposes of the said Act, specify the boundaries of such District, assign a name to such District, state the particulars of the scheme of local works for the service of such District, state the estimated cost of such scheme and state the quantities of water assigned to such District and the sources from which, the seasons at which, and the conditions under which and subject to which they are to be received: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, on the recommendation of the Minister, acting with the advice of the said Commissioners, doth hereby: sioners, doth hereby:

- (a) Constitute that portion of the State defined in the Schedule hereto an Irrigation District for the purposes of "The Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914," with the boundaries set forth in the said Schedule;
- (b) Assign the name to such District as the Harvey No. 2 Irrigation District;
  (c) State the particulars of the scheme of local works for the service of the said District as follows:—Raising of the existing Harvey No. Irrigation Area Reservoir and consequent enlarging of Storage Basin across the Harvey River and the construction of Main Supply Channels, together with all necessary subsidiary channels, pipe lines, stops, drops, occupation and road crossings, drains, etc., within the area bordered blue and as generally indicated on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 27074;
- (d) State the estimated cost of such scheme at £192,000;
- (e) State the quantity of water assigned to the District as 2,275 million gallons from the Harvey River and tributaries to be delivered during the season November to April, not exceeding 15 inches per acre (equivalent to approximately 340,600 gallons), to be applied by periodic waterings of approximately 4 inches or 90,000 gallons of water per acre;

  (f) Declare that this Order in Council shall take effect as from the 10th day of June, 1932.

#### Schedule.

Commencing at the South-Western corner of Uduc Agricultural Area Lot 2 and proceeding North along Agricultural Area Lot 2 and proceeding North along the East boundary of Richardson Road, across Road No. 2009, Clarke, Forrest, and Crampton Roads to the North-West corner of Lot 26; thence East along the North boundary of the said lot to its North-East corner; thence North across Smith Road and along the West boundaries of Lots 28, 29, and 32 to Stirling Road; thence East along the North boundary of Lot 32 to its North-East corner; thence South across Smith Road and along the West boundaries of Lots 28, 29, and 32 to Stirling Road; thence East along the North boundary of Lot 32 to its North-East corner; thence South along the 32 to its North-East corner; thence South along the 32 to its North-East corner; thence South along the East boundary of said lot to its South-East corner; thence East across Gibbs Road and along the North boundary of Lot 39 and continuing East across Babbage Road to the West boundary of Lot 53; thence North along said West boundary to the Northern corner of said lot; thence South-Easterly along the Eastern boundary of the said lot to a point opposite the North boundary of Wellington Location 3164; thence East across Jackson Road and along the North boundary of the said location to the Western boundary of the said location to the Western boundary boundary of the said location to the Western boundary of Harvey Main Drain Reserve; thence South-Easterly along the said Western boundary and across Harvey Road to the Eastern boundary of said road; thence proceeding in a Northerly direction across Harvey Main Drain Reserve and along said Eastern boundary of Harvey Road to the North-Western corner of Korijekup Estate Lot 132; thence Easterly along the Northern boundaries of Lots 132 and 145, across road, along the Northern boundaries of Lots 146 and 181, across road and along the Northern boundaries of Lots 182 and 194 to the North-East corner of Lot 194; thence Southerly along the Eastern boundaries of Lots 194 and 193, across road, and along the Eastern boundaries of Lots 192 and 191 to the South-East corner of Lot 191 on its Southern boundary; thence Westerly

along the Southern boundary of said lot to its intersection with the Western boundary of Warawarrup Townsite Reserve; thence Southerly and Easterly Townsite Reserve, thence Southern boundaries of said Townsite Reserve to the Western boundary of the South-Western Railway Reserve; thence Southerly along the said Western boundary to its intersection with the crossing of Plain Paddock Main Supply Channel; thence across the said Railway Reserve and in a generally Southerly and Easterly direction along the generally Southerly and Easterly direction along the Northern boundary of said Supply Channel to the Western boundary of the Perth-Bunbury Road; thence across said road to its Eastern boundary and continuing in a Southerly direction along said boundary to the right bank of the Harvey River; thence in a generally North-Westerly direction along the said right bank and in a generally Westerly, Southerly, and Easterly direction along the boundary of the Harvey No. 1 Irrigation District as redefined in the Government Gazette of 13th July, 1917, and as shown margined in pink on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 27074, to the junction of Udue and the Perth-Bunbury Road at the North-East corner of Lot 1 of Wellington Location 50A; thence corner of Lot I of Wellington Location 50A; thence in a South-Westerly direction along the Western boundary of the said Perth-Bunbury Road to its junction with the South-Western Railway Reserve, North of Wokalup Siding; thence across the said Railway Reserve and continuing in a Southerly direction along the Eastern boundary of the said Perth-Bunbury Road to a point opposite the South-East corner of Lot 35 of Wellington Location 1; thence across said Road and continuing West along the South boundaries of Lots 35, 34, 33, 32, and 31 to the South-West corner of the said Lot 31; thence in a Northerly direction along the Western boundary of Lot 31, across Hope Avenue, and continuing along the Western boundaries of Lots 30 and 28 to the South boundary of Marriott Road (No. 3195); thence West along said South boundary to a point opposite the Western boundary of Harvey Road; thence Northerly across Marriott Road and along said Western boundary to the South-East corner of Location 3579; thence West and North along the South and West boundaries of said location to the South and West boundaries of said location to the South boundary of Location 3580; thence West along said boundary and across Waller Road to the East boundary of Lot 3 of Uduc Agricultural Area; thence South and West along the East and South boundaries of said lot, across Forrest Road and continuing West along the South boundary of Lot 2 to the point of commencement.

Commencing again at the South-Western corner of Wellington Location 3048 (Water Reserve 15515) at Road No. 804 and proceeding North along the West boundary of said location to its North-West corner; thence Easterly along its Northern boundary to the top water level of the Reservoir extension; thence across Road No. 1918 and in a Northerly and Southerly direction around the said top water level in Location 1037 and across Road No. 1918 to the Northern boundary of Location 3048, and continuing Easterly along said Northern boundary and Southerly along the Eastern boundary of said location to the Northern boundary of the land resumed for Reservoir extension; thence in a generally Easterly, Southerly, and Westerly direction along the Northern, Eastern, and Southern boundaries of the said land resumed for Reservoir extension to the Eastern boundary of Location 3048; thence Southerly along the said boundary to and across Road No. 804; thence in a Westerly, Southerly, Northerly, and Westerly direction along the Southern, Eastern, Western, and Southern sides of Road No. 804 as diverted to a point opposite the Western boundary of Location 3048 and across road to the point of commencement.

Commencing again at the intersection of the West boundary of Location 3048 with the Harvey River, proceeding in a generally Westerly and Southerly direction and including the full width of the said River, along the course of the Harvey River to the Intercepting Weir, and including the whole of the area covered by the water impounded by the said weir; thence continuing generally in a Westerly direction, including the full width of the Western Feeder Channel, along the said Channel, across the Perth-Bunbury Road and Baker Street, along Roy Street and across Harper Street to the South-Western Railway Reserve; thence across the said Railway Reserve and continuing Northerly along the West boundary of said Railway Reserve for a distance of approximately 9 chains; thence in a generally Westerly direction along the said Channel across Young Street, and Third, Fourth, Fifth,

Sixth, Seventh, Eighth, Ninth, and Tenth Streets and Harvey Road to the junction with Boronia and Wattle Channels opposite the Eastern boundary of Location 468; thence Northerly and including the full width of Boronia Channel, along Harvey Road to a point opposite the North boundary of Yamballup Avenue.

Commencing again at the junction of Western Feeder Channel with Boronia and Wattle Channels; thence Southerly, and including the full width of Wattle and Waratah Channels, along Harvey Road to a point opposite the Southern boundary of Uduc Road.

Commencing again at the Eastern side of the top of the Chute on Western Feeder Channel, near the most Southern corner of Korijekup Estate Lot 99, proceeding in a North-Westerly direction and including the full width of the pipe track, through Lots 99, 98, and 97 to the Perth-Bunbury Road and across the Harvey River to its right bank at the Plain Paddock Main Supply Channel.

Commencing again at the take-off point of Southern Extension Main Supply Channel, on the Western Feeder Channel in Lot 266 of Wellington Location 50A, proceeding in a Southerly direction and including the full width of Southern Extension Main Supply Channel, through Lot 266, across road, and through Korijekup Estate Lots 200 and 205 and across Udue Road to its Southern boundary.

Commencing again at the take-off point of No. 3 Channel on Western Feeder Channel in Young Street, proceeding in a generally Northerly and Westerly direction, and including the full width of the No. 3 Channel, along said Channel, across Third and Fourth Streets to the junction with No. 4 Channel in Fifth Street; thence continuing in a generally Northerly and Westerly direction, including the full width of No. 4 Channel, following said channel along Fifth Street, across Sixth and Seventh Streets to Eighth Street; thence North along Eighth Street to Yamballup Avenue and West along said Avenue to Ninth Street to the junction with the main channel to Green Pool Paddock, on the North boundary of Yamballup Avenue.

Commencing again at the take-off point of No. 1 Channel on Western Feeder Channel in Young Street, proceeding Southerly and including the full width of No. 1 Channel, along Young Street to and across Uduc Road.

Commencing again at the junction of No. 2 Main Channel with the West boundary of part lot 12 of Location 50A, proceeding Westerly and including the full width of the said Channel, across road and Korijekup Estate Lots 119, 118, 117, 116, 115 and Drain Reserve and along Uduc Road to the North-West corner of Lot 105.

All as indicated in blue on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 27074.

#### FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930," and Amendment Act, 1931, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default or breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement of sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or his estate or effects during the operation of such Stay Order. Provided that by leave of a judge any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer, but not beyond judgment.

THE Honourable John Alfred Northmore, Chief Justice of Western Australia, and The Honourable Thomas Percy Draper, and The Honourable John Patrick Dwyer, Puisne Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers contained in "The Supreme Court Act, 1880," and of every other power them in this behalf enabling, make the following

Rule, which shall be added to and form part of the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1909:—

#### ORDER XI.

The following new Rule is hereby inserted in Order XI. after Rule 10:-

- (1) Service out of the jurisdiction may be allowed by the Court or a Judge of the following processes or of notice thereof, that is to say:—
  - (a) Originating summonses under Order LIV. or Order LV., Rules 4, 5, or 7, in any case where, if the proceedings were commenced by writ of summons, they would be within Rule 1 of this Order;
  - (b) Any originating summons, petition, notice of motion, or other originating proceedings (1) in relation to any infant or lunatic or person of unsound mind, or (2) under any statute under which proceedings can be commenced otherwise than by writ of summons, including an application under Section 11 of "The Guardianship of Infants Act, 1920," or (3) under any Rule of Court or Practice whereunder any proceedings can be commenced otherwise than by writ of summons;

(c) Without prejudice to the generality of the last foregoing sub-head, any summons, order, or notice in any interpleader proceedings or for the appointment of an arbitrator or umpire, or to remit, set aside, or enforce an award in an arbitration held or to be held within the jurisdiction:

- (d) Any summons, order, or notice in any proceedings duly instituted, whether by writ of summons or other such originating process as aforesaid.
- (2) Where the person on whom an originating summons, petition, notice of motion, or other originating proceeding or a summons, order or notice is to be served is neither a British subject nor residing within British Dominions, a copy of the originating summons, petition, notice of motion or other originating proceeding or summons, order or notice, instead of the original, shall be served, together with an intimation in writing that a process in the form of the copy has been issued or other-
- (3) Rules 3, 4, 6, 8, and 9 of this order shall apply mutatis mutandis to service of any process under this
- (4) Nothing herein contained shall in any way prejudice or affect any practice or power of the Court under which when lands, funds, choses in action, rights or property within the jurisdiction are sought to be dealt with or affected, the Court may, without affecting to exercise jurisdiction over any person out of the jurisdiction, cause such person to be informed of the nature or existence of the proceedings, with a view to such person having an opportunity of claiming, opposing, or otherwise intervening.

#### THE TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-31.

Traffic Regulations, 1931, Additions and Amendments. P.W. 320/31.

REGULATION No. 21, published in the Government Gazette on the 13th day of February, 1931, is amended

- 1. Subparagraph (1) (b) (as amended by notice published in the Government Gazette on the 6th day of November, 1931), by deleting the words "Two shillings and sixpence" in the third line and inserting the words "one shilling" in lieu thereof.
- 2. Subparagraph (1) (c), by deleting the word "motor" in the first and second lines; also by deleting the words "seven shillings and sixpence" in the third and fourth lines and inserting the words "five shillings"
- 3. Subparagraphs (d) and (e) of paragraph 6 (as amended in *Gazette* of 1st May, 1931) are hereby deleted and two new paragraphs inserted in lieu thereof, as follows:
  - (d) For any cart or carriage for private use—yellow numbers or letters and numbers on a blue ground, or red numbers or letters and numbers on a black ground, as may be determined by resolution of the Licensing Authority. When numerals are capable of being reversed, plates shall have a line or stripe at the foot of plate one-eighth or one-quarter of an inch wide in the same colour as the numerals.
  - (e) For any cart or carriage intended to be used for the carriage of passengers or goods for hire or reward—blue numbers or letters and numbers on a yellow ground or black numbers or letters and numbers on a red ground, as may be determined by resolution of the Licensing Authority. When numerals are capable of being reversed, plates shall have a line or stripe at the foot of plate one-eighth or one-quarter of an inch wide in the same colour as the numerals.
- 4. Regulation No. 41 (published in the Government Gazette on the 13th day of February, 1931) is hereby amended by inserting in paragraph (8), after the word "reflex," in the fifth line, the words "at least one and a half inches in diameter, surrounded by a white band at least one inch in width."

5. Regulation 245 (published in the Government Gazette on the 13th day of February, 1931) is hereby amended by deleting paragraph (2) and inserting in lieu thereof new paragraphs as follows:-

(2) for the purposes of paragraph (1) of this regula-tion, the following roads and parts of roads are hereby set apart for traffic in a specified direction, according to the directions specified in relation thereto respectively in the tabulation hereunder:
