WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the City of Perth Municipal Council has rewhereas the City of Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain lands, named and described in the Schedule hereunder, which have been used for streets or ways within the Municipality of the City of Perth, be declared public highways. Now, therefore I, the said Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said lands to be public highways, and such lands shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as highways within the solutely dedicated to the public as highways within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—(a) the Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation; (b) after such proposal has been laid before Parliament, the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication: And whereas His Excellency the Administrator did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposals dated the Fourth day of August, 1931, and Seventeenth day of November, 1931, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest: And whereas, after such proposals had been laid before Parliament, resolutions were passed by both Houses that such proposals should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forests Nos. 29 and 32 by excising those portions of such State Forests as are described in the Schedule hereto.
