Prorogation of Parliament.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, | By His Excellency Sir John Alfred | Northmore, K.C.M.G., Administrator in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly from time to time by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall think fit: Now, therefore I, the Administrator, in exercise of the power conferred by

the said Act, do hereby prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly until Thursday, the 28th day of July, 1932.
