# Agricultural Products Act, 1929. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 9 of "The Agricultural Products Act, 1929," that the Governor may make Regulations for the purposes therein mentioned: make Regulations for the purposes therein mentioned: And whereas the Governor made certain Regulations under and for the purposes of the said Act in relation to potatoes, which Regulations were published in the Government Gazette on the 13th day of February, 1931: And whereas it is now deemed expedient to amend Regulation 14 of the said Regulations in the manner hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, doth hereby amend Regulation 14 of the Regulations made under and for the purposes of the said Act and published in the Government poses of the said Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 13th day of February, 1931, as follows:—

Regulation 14 is amended by deleting the first five ines of paragraph (1) commencing with the word 'Potatoes' and ending with the word 'namely," and by inserting in lieu thereof words as follows:-

Potatoes grown in Western Australia and intended for sale either in the State of Western Australia or in any other State of the Commonwealth of Australia, and potatoes grown outside of Western Australia and imported into Western Australia for the purpose of sale in Western Australia shall, before being offered for sale in Western Australia or before being exported from Western Australia tralia, as the case may be, be graded according to the following grades, namely:-

Forests Act, 1918. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1732/31. ### THE LUNACY ACT, 1903-20.

Chief Secretary's Department, Perth, 11th July, 1932.

HIS Excellency the Administrator in Council has been pleased to approve the amendment of the Regulations under "The Lunacy Act, 1903-20," by deleting Regulation 33, dealing with uniforms, and inserting the following in lieu thereof:—

# Uniform Regulations.

- (1) Each employee required by the department to wear a uniform shall be provided with same free of charge, when necessary.
- (2) Uniforms shall be of a design approved by the department, and shall remain the property of the department. Uniforms shall be worn at all times when an employee is on duty, and shall be given up on termination of service, unless permission is given by the Managing Secretary for it to be retained by the employee. In such cases payment shall be made by the employee as under:-

For one month from issue, 80 per cent. of cost; two months, 60 per cent.; three months, 40 per cent.; four months and over, 20 per cent. This does not apply to water-proof coats, which shall remain the property of the department.

(c) When the services of a worker are not required owing to the operation of subclauses (a) and (b) hereof, the employer shall give the worker one day's notice thereof;

(d) When the provisions of subclauses (a) and (b) hereof are availed of, holidays as prescribed in Clause 6 of the Agreement or pay in lieu

shall be reduced pro rata;

(e) The provisions as to overtime in Clause 5 of the Agreement shall not be affected hereby, nor Agreement shall not be affected hereby, nor shall the worker's right under Clause 11 of the Agreement be annulled in the event of the worker being dismissed permanently from his employment. Where a worker is engaged as a casual worker the provisions of Clause 7 (Casual hands) shall still apply.
