AGRICULTURAL BANK ACT, 1906-1930.

HIS Excellency the Lieut.-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to repeal the regulations made under "The Agricultural Bank Act, 1906-1930," and published in the Government Gazette on the 22nd day of April, 1932, and under the provisions of Section thirty-four B of the said Act, as reprinted in the Sessional Volume of the Statutes for the year 1930, and to make in lieu of the said regulations new regulations, as follows:

Regulations.

3. The rate of interest to be charged by the Agricultural Bank on all advances heretofore or hereafter made under the provisions of "The Agricultural Bank Act, 1906-1930," for any purpose, including the effect-ing of improvements, shall not exceed five and one half per centum per annum.

The rate of interest prescribed by the preceding regulation shall have effect as from the first day of July, 1932.

(a) Adult males, £3 10s. 6d. per week. (b) Adult females, £1 18s. 1d. per week.
