FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930," and Amendment Act, 1931, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default or breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement of sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or his estate or effects during the operation of such Stay Order. 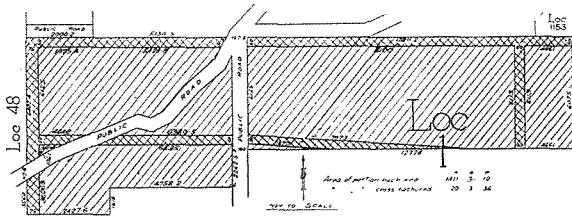

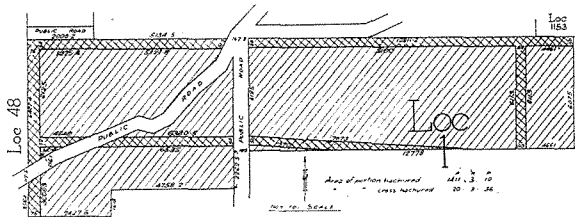

Statute No. 27.—Amendment of Statute No. 19 (Discipline).

1. Section 1 of Statute No. 19 is amended to read—  
1. There shall be a Committee of Discipline, consisting of the Vice-Chancellor and the Dean of each Faculty, to control the discipline of the students at the University. At any meeting of this Committee three members shall be a quorum.

2. Every reprint of Statute No. 19 shall be printed as hereby amended with a marginal note referring to this Statute.

THE following Statute, No. 26, which has received the approval of His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, is published in the *Government Gazette* in accordance with Section 33 (i) of "The University of Western Australia Act, 1911."

Statute No. 26.—Guild of Undergraduates.

1. There shall be a Guild of Undergraduates, which shall be the recognised means of communication between the Undergraduates and the governing authority of the University.

2. Objects.—The objects of the Guild shall be:—

- (a) to foster all that tends to the advancement of learning and the ennoblement of life;
- (b) to provide means of social intercourse between the students at the University;
- (c) to provide facilities for and to encourage amateur sport at the University;
- (d) generally to further the common interests of students at the University.

3. Membership.—The Guild shall consist of—(a) Members and (b) Associates.

- (a) Members shall comprise all matriculated students attending qualifying courses at the University. The question whether a given course is a qualifying course or not shall be decided by the Vice-Chancellor.

(b) Associates shall comprise those admitted under the following clauses:—

(i) Any member of the Staff or any person who has attended qualifying courses at the University may, at the discretion of the Guild Council (as hereinafter defined), be admitted as an associate of the Guild on payment of the usual annual subscription of the Guild;

(ii) A person may be elected as an Honorary Life Associate of the Guild, provided that—(a) one month's notice has been given of intention to nominate such person; (b) such nomination to be approved by a two-thirds majority of those present at a general meeting of the Guild, upon the notice paper of which such nomination is set down, and confirmed at the next subsequent meeting; (c) election under this clause shall be subject to the confirmation of the Senate;

(iii) A visitor from another University who possesses qualifications similar to those required from a member or an associate of the Guild may be admitted as an honorary associate for a period of one month: provided that his nomination be signed by two members of the Guild Council, or by an officer of a University Club or Society, and one member of the Guild Council;

(iv) A past member may, at the discretion of the Guild Council, be admitted to Life Associateship upon the payment of ten (10) guineas, which may be paid in one sum, if desired, provided that this section shall not apply to:—

- (1) members of University Teaching Staff;
- (2) students attending lectures or engaged in research at the University;
- (3) members of University Sporting Clubs.

(c) An associate shall be entitled to the privileges of full membership, excepting that he may not sit on the Guild Council or Sports Council, nor shall he be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Guild.

4. Management.

(a) The Guild shall be managed by a Council elected each year.

(b) The powers and duties of the Council shall be:—

- (1) to represent the students in matters affecting their interests;
- (2) to afford a recognised means of communication between the students and the University authorities;
- (3) to promote social and academic unity among students.

(c) The Council shall have power—

(i) to engage and employ servants; to expend and invest moneys; to open banking accounts; and, generally, shall have the control of the financial affairs and of the property of the Guild;

(ii) to acquire and dispose of property, and to enter into contracts; provided that no action shall be taken under this subsection without reference to the Vice-Chancellor, who shall have power to suspend action pending the decision of the Senate;

(iii) to make By-laws for the conduct of its own domestic matters: provided that these are not inconsistent with this Statute or regulations under this Statute, and such By-laws shall be reported to the next meeting of the Guild;

(iv) to impose fines on members, associates, or affiliated clubs and societies infringing any By-law; provided that the limits of such fines shall be clearly stated in the By-laws.

(d) All Guild property shall be vested in the Guild Finance Committee, consisting of the President, Treasurer, and the representative of the Senate duly appointed for the time being, subject to Clause 4 (c) (ii) above, and they shall deal with the property as directed by resolution of the Guild Council (of which an entry in the Minute Book shall be conclusive evidence) and they shall be indemnified against risk and expense out of Guild property.

(e) The Guild Council may, with the written consent of the Senate in each case first had and obtained, and subject to such terms and conditions as the Senate may impose—

- (1) take on lease any part of the University buildings or any other real property the control and management of which is at any time vested in or acquired by the University;
- (2) take on lease or on hire agreement (with or without a right of purchase) any personal property.

Every lease or hire agreement shall be taken in the name of the Guild Finance Committee.

The University shall not be directly or indirectly liable for any rent or purchase money or other money payable and or in respect of any obligation undertaken by the Guild or its Finance Committee in any such lease or hire agreement, and, further, the Guild or the Finance Committee of the Guild shall indemnify the Senate against any damage to the buildings or fittings resulting from such lease or hire agreement.

5. Expulsion of Members:

- (a) The Guild of Undergraduates shall have power to recommend to the Senate the expulsion of any member;
- (b) The Guild Council shall have power to expel any associate, subject to the right of appeal in the manner laid down by the Regulations made under this Statute.

6. The annual subscription to the Guild shall not exceed two guineas.

7. A copy of the annual balance sheet shall each year be forwarded to the Academic Board for transmission to the Senate.

8. Subject to the provisions of this Statute, the Guild of Undergraduates may make Regulations for its internal management and administration, the election of its officers, and alteration of its Regulations, and all other matters requiring regulation; but all Regulations shall be subject to the approval of the Senate.

9. This Statute shall come into operation on the first day of October, 1932.

10. Statute No. 16 is hereby repealed.
