Factories and Shops Act, 1920.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS His Excellency the Governor in Council may make Regulations under the provisions of "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator in Council, acting in pursuance of such powers, and on the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulation:-

The manufacture of textile bags and sacks shall be deemed a special industry for the purposes of Section 40 of the Act.

The Forests Act, 1918.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1113/32.

WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—(a) the Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation; (b) after such proposal has been laid before Parliament, the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication: And whereas His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the Twenty-fourth day of August, 1932, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest: And whereas, after such proposal had been laid before Parliament, a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forests Nos. 36 and 39 by excising those portions of such State Forests as are described in the Schedule hereto:-

THE MATTER OF THE INDUSTRIAL ARBITRATION ACT AMENDMENT ACT, 1930, AND IN THE MATTER OF THE BASIC WAGE PRE-IN SCRIBED FOR THE YEAR 1932-33.

The 28th day of February, 1933.

1N pursuance of the provisions of the above Act, and subject to the conditions therein prescribed, the Court of Arbitration hereby further adjusts and amends the Basic Wage Declaration made on the 10th day of June, 1932, so as to read and have effect as follows:

(1) Metropolitan Area, which for this purpose shall be deemed to be that portion of the State comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth:-

.. £3 9s. 0d. per week. .. £1 17s. 3d. per week.

(2) Agricultural Areas, namely, the South-West Land Division of the State, except such portion thereof as is comprised within the Metropolitan Area as defined herein:

.. £3 11s. 0d. per week. .. £1 18s. 4d. per week. Males Females ..

(3) Goldfields Areas and all other portions of the State, exclusive of the South-West Land Division:—

.. £3 18s. 0d. per week. .. £2 2s. 2d. per week.

(4) Payment shall be pro rata where the term of employment is for less than one week.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7 Subsection 1 of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930." and Amendment Act, 1931, which reads as follows:—




