HIS Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator in Executive Council has approved of the Regulations made under "The Secession Referendum Act, 1932," and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th day of January, 1933, being amended by adding thereto, after Regulation 26, a further Regulation, to stand as Regulation 27, as follows:—

Remuneration to Officers.

27. Persons acting in connection with the Secession Referendum as Returning Officers, Deputy or Assistant

Returning Officers, Presiding Officers, Assistant Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks, or Doorkeepers shall be entitled to receive as remuneration for their services the following fees, viz:—

- (a) Where they are engaged only in connection with the Secession Referendum, the same fees and allowances as are prescribed for and payable to them respectively in Regulation 11 of the regulations in force under "The Electoral Act, 1907"; or
- (b) Where at the same time they are engaged in connection with the Secession Referendum and also in connection with an election for the Legislative Assembly, the same fees and allowances as are prescribed for and payable to them respectively in Regulation 11 of the regulations in force under "The Electoral Act, 1907," for and in respect of their services in connection with the election aforesaid, together with an additional amount equal to twenty-five per centum of the fees prescribed for and payable to them respectively in paragraph (d) of the said Regulation 11 for and in respect of their services in connection with the Secession Referendum.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7 Subsection 1 of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930," and Amendment Act, 1931, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default or breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement of sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or his estate or effects during the operation of such Stay Order. Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer, but not beyond judgment.

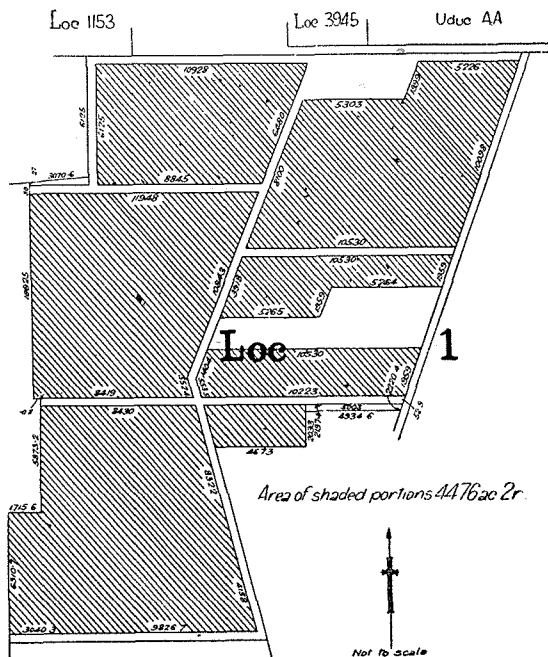

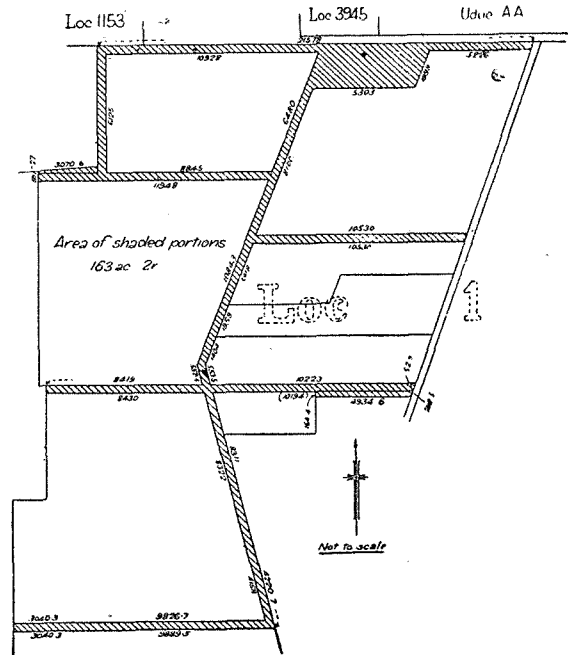
