AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, Perth, this 31st day of May, 1933, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1069/26.

WHEREAS Section 74 of "The Constitution Act. 1889," provides that the Governor in Council may vest in Heads of Departments, or other officers or persons within the State, power to make minor appointments: And whereas it is desirable that power of appointment of foremen and other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Departments of Public Works and Labour and of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage (exclusive of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Department) should be vested in Hugh McLean Wilson and John Charles Hutchinson respectively: And whereas by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 5th day of February, 1932, power of making similar minor appointments was vested in F. H. Prior, David Muir Hutchinson, A. S. Walton, and H. Bregenzer: And whereas the said F. H. Prior was transferred, the said David Muir Hutchinson is now deceased, the said A. S. Walton has retired from the Public Service of the State, and the said H. Bregenzer is about to retire from the Service: And whereas it is deemed expedient to revoke the said Order in Council, in so far as it relates to F. H. Prior, David Muir Hutchinson, A. S. Walton, and H. Bregenzer: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice of the Exceutive Council, hereby vests in Hugh McLean Wilson and John Charles Hutchinson respectively, and any person or persons appointed to act temporarily in each of their respective places, power of appointment of foremen and other persons employed at a daily rate of wages on such works as aforesaid; and, further, hereby revokes the said Order in Council published on the 5th day of February, 1932, in so far as it relates to the said F. H. Prior, David Muir Hutchinson, A. S. Walton, and H. Bregenzer.

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ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Government Tramways Act, 1912," it is provided that the Minister for Railways may, pursuant to any Order in Council whereby the construction of tramways is authorised, construct such tramways on roads: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut. Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby authorise the construction of the following trackless tramway, namely:—

Commencing at the intersection of Kensington Street and the Western alignment of Trafalgar Road, East Perth, and proceeding along Kensington Street in a Westerly direction to Claisebrook Road; thence along Claisebrook Road in a Southerly direction to Wittenoom Street; thence along Wittenoom Street in a Westerly direction to Hill Street; thence along Hill Street in a Southerly direction to Wellington Street; thence along Wellington Street in a Westerly direction to Market Place; thence along Market Place under the West Perth subway and along Sutherland Street in a North-Westerly direction to Stone Street; thence along Stone Street in a South-Westerly direction to Havelock Street; thence along Havelock Street in a Northerly direction to Cambridge Street; thence along Cambridge Street in a Westerly direction to Kimberley Street; thence along Kimberley Street in a Southerly direction to Railway Parade; thence along Railway Parade in a Westerly direction to Northwood Street; thence along Northwood Street in a Northerly direction to Cambridge Street; thence along Cambridge Street in an Easterly direction to the intersection of Kimberley Street, a distance of 4 miles 13 chains or thereabouts.
