AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, the 28th day of June, 1933, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

The Government Tramways Act, 1912, and The Public Works Act, 1902.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 2 of "The Public Works Act, 1902," that a tramway is a public work for the purposes of the said Act, and by Section 11 of the said Act that the Governor may by Order in Council authorise the Minister to undertake, construct, or provide any public work: And whereas it is enacted by Section 3 of "The Government Tramways Act, 1912," that the Minister may, pursuant to any Order in Council whereby the construction of tramways is authorised, construct such tramways on roads, and in relation thereto may do and perform all the acts, matters, and things in the said Section 3 mentioned: And whereas it is enacted by Section 2 of the said "Government Tramways Act, 1912," that all tramways the property of the Government, and declared by the Governor by Order in Council to be a Government tramway, shall be Government tramways within the meaning of this Act: And whereas the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts by Order in Council made the 31st day of May, 1933, authorised the construction of a trackless tramway, as described in the said Order in Council: And whereas it is now deemed desirable to vary the route and construction of the said tramway in the manner hereinafter mentioned, and also to declare such tramway to be a Government tramway under and for the purposes of the said "Government Tramways Act, 1912": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said two Acts respectively, doth hereby authorise the construction of the trackless tramway as described in the Schedule hereto in lieu of the construction of the tramway as authorised by the Order in

Council made the 31st day of May, 1933, as aforesaid, and also doth hereby declare that the said trackless tramway when so constructed as aforesaid shall be a Government tramway under and for the purposes of "The Government Tramways Act, 1912":—

The Schedule above referred to.

Commencing at the intersection of Kensington Street and Trafalgar Road, East Perth, and proceeding along Trafalgar Road in a Southerly direction to Brown Street; thence along Brown Street in a Westerly direction to Claisebrook Road; thence along Claisebrook Road in a Southerly direction to Wittenoom Street; thence along Wittenoom Street in a Westerly direction to Hill Street; thence along Hill Street in a Southerly direction to Wellington Street; thence along Wellington Street in a Westerly direction to Market Place; thence along Market Place under the West Perth Sub-way and along Sutherland Street in a North-Westerly direction to Stone Street; thence along Stone Street in a South-Westerly direction to Havelock Street; thence along Havelock Street in a Northerly direction to Cambridge Street; thence along Cambridge Street in a Westerly direction to Kimberley Street; thence along Kimberley Street in a Southerly direction to Railway Parade; thence along Railway Parade in a Westerly direction to Northwood Street; thence along Northwood Street in a Northerly direction to Cambridge Street; thence along Cambridge Street in an Easterly direction to Havelock Street; thence along the same relative route as described above, but in the opposite direction, as far as the intersection of Claisebrook Road and Brown Street. From this point the route is continued along Claisebrook Road in a Northerly direction to Kensington Street; thence along Kensington Street in an Easterly direction to the point of commencement at the intersection of Kensington Street and Trafalgar Road, a total distance of 7 miles 50 chains or thereabouts and more particularly delineated on Tramway Plan 128/31.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-1932.

Amendment of By-laws.

M.P.H. 8290/21; Ex. Co. No. 1195.
WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-26," a Local Health Authority may make By-laws, and may amend, repeal, or alter any By-laws so made: Now therefore, the Collie Municipal Council, being a Local Health Authority, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

No person shall apply arsenic or lead, either as a spray or powder, or in any other form whatsoever, to cabbage, cauliflower, or any other plant of the Brassica family, within four weeks of cutting for sale.

No person shall sell or attempt to sell, or receive for sale, or have in possession for sale, expose, send, forward, or deliver for sale any cabbage, cauliflower, or any other plant of the Brassica family which has adhering to it or upon any part of it any arsenic or lead or any other poisonous or deleterious substance of any kind whatsoever.

No person shall sell or attempt to sell, or receive for sale, or have in possession for sale, expose, send, for-

ward, or deliver for sale any fruit of any kind whatsoever which has adhering to it or upon it any arsenic or lead.

No person shall send any fruit or any vegetable to market for sale unless and until it is clean and free from any spray residue or any other foreign substance which is deleterious, objectionable, or injurious to health.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-25," this 23rd day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three, between the Swan Brewery Company, Limited, the Emu Brewery Company, Limited, and the Redcastle Brewery, Limited, all of Perth and Fremantle Districts (hereinafter in these presents called the "Employers"), of the one part, and the Federated Engine-Drivers and Firemen's Association of Australasia (West Australian Branch) Association of Workers, being an Industrial Association of Workers, registered under the provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-25": Whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto that the several stipulations, conditions, and provisions set out herein shall in all cases be binding upon, and shall be faithfully and promptly carried out, observed, performed, and complied with, according to the true intent and meaning thereof, by the parties hereto.

1.—Definitions.

For the purpose of this Agreement "The above-mentioned Companies" shall mean the "Employers," and the "Association" shall mean the Federated Engine-Drivers and Firemen's Association (West Australian Branch).

(a) "Engine-driver" shall mean and include any person who operates or drives any engine or engines the motive power of which is either steam, gas, air, oil, water, compressed air, or electricity.

(b) "Fireman" shall mean any person employed in a stoke hole attending a steam boiler or suction-gas generator.

(c) "Greaser" shall mean an employee who is employed mainly in oiling engines or shafting, and who assists the engine-driver as required.

2.—Schedule.

The parties to this Agreement mutually agree that the minimum rate of wages that shall be paid by the employers respectively to the persons employed by such employers in the capacities under-mentioned is as follows:—

Engine-drivers, firemen, or greasers who shall be employed on boiler cleaning work, cleaning inside of pasteuriser, or bottle soaker, shall receive an additional 1s. per hour in addition to his ordinary or overtime rate of pay.

3.—Hours.

Forty-four hours, consisting of eight hours per day, from Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and four hours on Saturday, shall constitute a week's work for engine-drivers, firemen, and greasers, who shall commence work not before 5 a.m. on any day, and the employer may require any engine-driver, fireman, or greaser to start work at any time after that time, but such work shall not be less than eight hours per day, from Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and four hours on Saturdays, so that each engine-driver, fireman, and greaser shall work forty-four hours from Monday to Saturday in every week. Where one shift only is worked, such shift shall begin not later than eight a.m.

4.

In all cases, in reckoning the time of duty, any time necessarily occupied in raising steam, in starting up or closing down engines, or in banking fires shall be included.

5.—Overtime.

If any employee works earlier than his starting time, or later than his quitting time, he shall be paid overtime at the rate of time and a half. Each day to stand alone.

6.—Record Book.

Each company shall keep a record of the name of each employee, the time he starts and finishes each day, total number of hours worked, overtime worked, wages paid to each employee, and such record book shall be open to the inspection of the secretary of, or any other person appointed by the Employees' Union, during working hours.

Each employee shall sign the record book kept for all moneys received by him.

7.—Sundays.

All work performed on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

8.—Holidays.

All holiday shifts to rotate; if no work be done, the ordinary rates shall be paid for holidays. If work is performed on a holiday, ordinary rates shall be paid in addition.

The days to be observed as holidays, according to the provisions of this Agreement, are:—Christmas Day, Good Friday, New Year's Day, Eight Hours' Day, Show Day, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Sovereign's Birthday, Annual Picnic Day, Boxing Day, the 26th January, and Anzac Day.

9.—Annual Leave.

Two weeks' annual leave on full pay shall become due to workers with twelve months' service, such leave to be taken at times to be mutually agreed on between the employees and employer, between the 30th April and 30th September in each year, in addition to the holidays enumerated above. Temporary hands with less than twelve months' service on retirement shall receive proportion of two weeks' holiday equivalent to eight hours pay per month of service.
