PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,
TO WIT. Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and
St. George, Lieutenant-Governor in and
over the State of Western Australia
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting: WHEREAS it is provided by Clause XIII. of Letters Patent under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet issued on the 29th day of October, 1900, that in the event of the office of Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia becoming vacant that the Lieutenant-Governor should during His Majesty's pleasure administer the Government of the State, first taking the Oaths as therein mentioned: And whereas on the 30th day of June, 1932, Sir John Alfred Northmore, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Bachelor of Laws, was appointed Lieutenant-Governor of the said State and its Dependencies: And whereas the said Sir John Alfred Northmore resigned the said office of Lieutenant-Governor on the 11th day of July, 1933, and the office of Governor being then

vacant, I, Sir James Mitchell, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, was appointed Lieutenant-Governor of the said State and its Dependencies by a Commission under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet bearing the date of the 11th day of July, 1933: Now this is to give notice that I, the said Sir James Mitchell, have duly taken the Oaths required by the Letters Patent and have, in pursuance of the said Commission, this day assumed the administration of the Government, and by the terms of the said recited Commission His Majesty doth command all and singular his officers. Ministers. doth command all and singular his officers, Ministers, and loyal subjects in his said State and its Dependencies, and all others whom it may concern, to take due notice thereof and to give their ready obedience accordingly.
