The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 934/33.
WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22 and 23 of the said Act:-

Description of Proposed Sewerage Works Approved and Exempted.—Municipality of East Fremantle:—4-inch and 6-inch reticulation sewers, with all manholes and other apparatus connected therewith:—Commencing at a point in the centre of Oakover Street opposite the North boundary of Lot 291, Oakover Street, and proceeding South along the centre of Oakover Street to a point opposite the South boundary of Lot 300, Oakover Street; thence West across Oakover Street and along the South boundaries of Lots 300, Oakover Street, and 232 Trwin Street, and the prolongation of same to the 232, Irwin Street, and the prolongation of same to the centre of Irwin Street; thence North along the centre of Irwin Street to a point opposite the South boundary of Lot 208, Irwin Street; thence West across Irwin Street and along the South boundary of Lot 208, Irwin Street, to the South-West corner of Lot 208, Irwin Street; thence North along the West boundaries of Lots 208 and 207, Irwin Street to the North-West corner of Lot 207,

Irwin Street; thence East along the North boundary of Lot 207, Irwin Street, to and across Irwin Street and along the North boundaries of Lots 241, Irwin Street, and 291, Oakover Street, and the prolongation of same to the point of commencement, as shown in pink on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 5301.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the Fifth day of January, 1934.

REMARKS: Dredging operations are about to be started South of the Entrance Channel, working Westward. The following dredging marks will be erected and should not be mistaken for navigation marks:—

A triangular beacon surmounted by a fixed red light at night will be erected at a height of 7 feet 6 inches, at the West end of South Mole and North of the existing Mole light tower.

An inverted triangular beacon surmounted by a fixed red light at night will be erected at a height of 16 feet on the foreshore adjacent to and South of the Slipway, Arthur Head.

Perth Road Board.

By-laws-Hawkers and Stall-keepers.

P.W. 259/25.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Board of any Road District is empowered to make Bylaws for all or any purpose in the said Act mentioned, the Perth Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Interpretation.

- 1. (a) The word "Fish" shall include fish, whether fresh, salt, smoked or dried, oysters, crayfish, crabs, prawns and shrimps.
- (b) The word "Stall" shall mean a movable or temporarily fixed stall, hand-cart, and barrow for the sale of any meat, fish, poultry, game, fruit, vegetables, drink, eatables, or other articles of merchandise.
- (c) The word "Stall-keeper" shall mean any person who keeps and conducts a stall, and shall include any person who assists in the keeping and conducting of a stall, or in the sale of articles of merchandise from a stall.
 - (d) "The Board" shall mean the Perth Road Board.
- (e) "The Secretary" shall mean the secretary or acting secretary of the Perth Road Board.
- (f) "Tuspector" shall mean and include any person appointed by the Board as an inspector and any acting or assistant inspector.
- (g) "District" shall mean and include the whole of the Perth Road Board District.
- 2. No person shall hawk any meat, fish, poultry, game, fruit, and vegetables, or any articles of merchandise, or keep or conduct any movable or temporarily fixed stall, or assist in the keeping and conducting of any stall, or in the sale of any article of merchandise from any stall, in or near any street or way, for the sale of any meat, fish, poultry, game, fruit, vegetables, drink, catables, or any articles of merchandise within any section in the District, unless and until he shall have applied for and obtained a license from the Board.
- 3. Every person who wishes to obtain a hawker's or stall-keeper's license shall apply to the secretary therefor, stating the term and kind of merchandise for which he desires to be licensed. The granting or refusing of a license shall be in the absolute discretion of the Board and, when granted, shall be not transferable. The Board may refuse to grant a license for any reason it may see fit. Licenses shall be in such one of the forms set out in Schedule A hereto as shall be applicable, and shall be issued on payment of such fees as are set forth in Schedule B hereto.
- 4. No person shall hawk, or be licensed to hawk, any kind of merchandise, including fish, in that portion of the district West of the Eastern boundary of the Esplanade, extending from the South-West corner of Swan Location 1097 Northwards to the North-West corner of Swan Location 1032, and no person shall be licensed to conduct a movable or temporarily fixed stall for the sale of articles of merchandise within the above-mentioned portion of the district.
- 5. Every stall-keeper taking up a position on a stand shall take up such position thereon as shall be alloted to him by the inspector.
- 6. No stall-keeper shall take up a position, or allow his vehicle to be or remain upon any stand, except between the hours of 7 a.m. and 11.30 p.m.
- 7. No stall-keeper, whilst upon any stand, shall deposit or store any box or basket under his vehicle, or on the roadway or footpath.
- 8. No stall-keeper, whilst upon any stand, shall shout his wares, or make any violent outcry, noise, or disturbance to the annoyance of the inhabitants or of persons passing by.
- 9. Every stall-keeper taking up a position on a stand shall place and keep his vehicle or stall parallel to the kerb, and in such a position that the distance between the kerb and his vehicle or stall shall not exceed one foot.
- 10. No stall-keeper, whilst upon any stand, shall place or allow to remain on his vehicle or stall any flag or streamer.

- 11. No person licensed to hawk shall take up a position in any street or public place for the purpose of soliciting custom, or shall remain stationary at any one spot in any street or public place for a longer period than shall be necessary for the purpose of serving a customer then offering to buy.
- 12. Every hawker, whilst plying his trade, and every stall-keeper, whilst on his appointed stand, shall carry with him his license, and shall at all times produce the same, on demand, to the inspector or secretary of the Board or Police officer.
- 13. Every hawker, whilst plying his trade, and every stall-keeper, whilst on his appointed stand, shall have his name, the number of his license, and the words "Licensed hawker" or "Licensed stall-keeper," as the case may be, legibly painted on some conspicuous part of his cart, barrow, basket, vehicle, bundle, bag, package, tray, or stall.
- 14. Should the inspector at any time be of opinion that it is necessary to move any stall-keeper from any appointed stand or place, it shall be lawful for him to direct the said stall-keeper to move to any place he shall deem fit, and any stall-keeper who shall refuse to obey such directions shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.
- 15. Every stall-keeper standing on any appointed stand shall at all times act under the direction of the inspector, and any stall-keeper who refuses to obey such instructions shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.
- 16. Where anything by these By-laws is directed to be done or forbidden to be done, or where authority is given to the inspector or secretary to direct anything to be done or to forbid anything to be done, and such act so directed to be done remains undone, or such act forbidden to be done is done, in every such ease the person making such default as to such direction and prohibition respectively shall be deemed guilty of a breach of these By-laws shall be liable for every such offence, besides any cost which may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person guilty of such offence, as well as any costs or expenses which may be incurred in the execution of the work directed to be so executed and not so executed, to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
- 17. The secretary or inspector appointed by the Board may demand from and require of any individual committing or suspected of committing any offence against or breach of these By-laws his name and address, and every person who shall neglect or refuse to give his name and address, when required so to do, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
