Courts of Session Act, 1921.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, | By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. | K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and JAMES MITCHELL, Lieutenant-Governor. and its Degendencies in the Common-[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements.-City of Perth-King's Park:-Proposed thirty-inch diameter water main in King's Park, from Mount Eliza Reservoir to Thomas Street (length about 56 chains), with valves and all necessary apparatus, as indicated in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 5295.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the Nineteenth day of January, 1934.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following Rules and Regulations made by the Southern Cross Hospital Board, under the provisions of "The Hospitals Act, 1927."

SOUTHERN CROSS DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

Rules and Regulations.

1.-Name.

The name of the Institution shall be the Southern Cross District Hospital.

2.-Board.

There shall be a Board of Management, consisting of seven members appointed by the Governor for a period of two years and selected as hereinafter provided.

3.-Definition of Subscriber.

Any person who subscribes 1s. 6d. per week, or 6s. per month, or 18s. per quarter, or £3 10s. per year, shall be termed a subscriber.

4. In these Rules and Regulations the term "Sub-scriber" shall mean any subscriber (male or female) who has paid his or her subscription, and is financial, and has paid at least two weeks' subscription prior to seeking any benefit or privileges; and shall include, so far as medical and hospital treatment is concerned, only the wife or husband, parents, or female relative occupying the position as head of the household, or children up to the age of sixteen years; provided they are residing with the subscriber and dependent upon him or her.

5. Subscribers and their dependants, as defined in Rule 4, shall be entitled to medical attendance as outpatients or as in-patients, by the Medical Officer of the Fund, subject to his discretion.

6. Subscribers shall be entitled to not more than four weeks' treatment in the Southern Cross District Hospital free of charge for themselves or their dependants.

7. Subscribers shall not be entitled to benefits in cases of-1, Accouchements, abortive or otherwise; 2, over-indulgence in intoxicants; 3, venereal disease; 4, insanity; 5, workers' compensation cases; 6, dental operations; 7, operations of choice.

8.-In-patient Charges.

(a) Subscribers, after first four weeks ... 6s. per day.
(b) Non-subscribers ... 9s. per day.

Out-patient charges.

.. Free. ••

(a) Subscribers . .(b) Non-subscribers . . • • • • 2s. 6d. per visit.

9. Any non-subscriber applying for treatment shall, if required, on entering the Hospital provide, or there shall be provided for such non-subscriber, a satisfactory guarantee, to be approved by the Secretary, for the payment of fees in accordance with the Rules and By-laws of the Institution.

10.-Honorary Members.

Any person, not being a subscriber within the mean-ing of Rule 4 hereof, who shall make a donation of not less than two guineas in each or any year, shall be en-titled to one vote in the selection of members of the Board, when and so long as such selection takes place within the twelve calendar months next following from the date on which such person shall have made such donation, but such donation shall not entitle the person making it to any other privilege or privileges which may be enjoyed by the subscribers in respect to the Institution.

11.—Retirement.

In July in every year, to begin in 1934, there shall retire from the Board in the first year three members, and in the year next following, four members, and so on alternatively thereafter such members shall retire by effluxion of time. Retiring members to be eligible for re-selection.

12.—Annual Meeting.

There shall be an annual meeting of subscribers, early in July of every year, at which a selection for the vacancies on the Board shall be held.

13.—Notice of Annual Meeting.

The secretary shall give notice of the annual meeting at least 14 days before the day of meeting, and such notice shall be advertised in such manner and at such places as the Board for the time being shall direct.

14.—Business at Annual Meeting.

The order of business at the annual meeting shall be-The Medical Officer's Report: The Board's Report for the previous year: The Secretary's Report; Any business of which seven days' notice has been given: Selection of members of the Board, and any other business.

Nomination papers for candidates for selection to the Board must be in the hands of the secretary at least twenty-one days prior to the date fixed for the annual selection, and such nomination papers must bear the sig-natures of two financial subscribers, and the written consent of the subscriber nominated to act, if selected. Such nominees must be financial subscribers.

16.—Selection.

If there are no more candidates than the number of vacancies, such candidates shall be declared selected. If there are more candidates than the number of vacancies, the secretary shall, at least 14 days prior to the date of selection, cause to be supplied to each financial subscriber a ballot paper containing the names of all the seriber a ballot paper containing the names of an the candidates. Such ballot paper shall be returned to the secretary, and be received by him not later than seven o'clock in the afternoon on the day of the election, in envelope sealed and indorsed "Ballot Paper." The names of any candidates for whom a subscriber votes shall be left intact, and the remaining names scored through with a pen or pencil. No subscriber shall have more than one vote for each of the vacancies. Sub-scribere must vote for as many candidates as are to be seribers must vote for as many candidates as are to be selected, otherwise the vote shall be declared informal. All ballot papers shall be opened by the Chairman at the annual meeting, in the presence of two scrutineers appointed by the Board to check the votes, and the can-didates according the lowerst number of rotes shall by didates receiving the largest number of votes shall by the Chairman be declared selected. In the event of the number of votes for any two or more candidates being found to be equal, the Chairman shall, by his casting vote, decide which of the candidates shall be selected. The omission by the secretary to supply to, or the non-receipt of any ballot paper by, any financial subscriber within the time aforesaid, or at all, shall not in any manner invalidate the selection.

17.--Special Meetings.

A special meeting of the subscribers shall be called by the secretary at the request of the Board, or by the by the secretary at the request of the Bohrd, or by the secretary, on a requisition signed by at least twenty financial subscribers, the same notice being given as in the case of the annual meeting and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting other than that for which it is called. All resolutions passed at such special meeting shall be absolutely final and binding.

18.—Vacancies.

The Board may recommend to the Governor that the seat of a member of the Board shall be declared vacant-1, If after 10 days' notice such member remains unfinan-cial; 2, If such member has been absent from three or more consecutive monthly meetings of the Board with-out leave obtained from the Board in that behalf, and a resolution has been passed by the Board recommending that the seat be declared vacant.

19.-Vacancies Extraordinary.

When a vacancy arises from any cause except annual retirement, the subscribers shall select, upon a day to retirement, the subscribers shall select, upon a day to be fixed by the Board, a person to fill the vacancy, and of which notice shall be given as the Board shall direct, and nominations for the filling of any such vacancy shall be made, and such selection shall be conducted in the same manner as provided for an annual selection, except that for such purpose the word 'annual' shall be omitted from the notice.

20 .- Meeting of Board.

The Board shall meet at least once a month, at a time and place to be fixed by resolution of the Board, which time and place may be altered at any time by notice.

21.—Quorum.

A quorum of the Board shall be a majority of the members.

22.-Chairman.

At the first meeting of the Board after appointment, the members shall appoint one of their number to be Chairman. The Chairman shall hold office until the con-clusion of the next annual selection of members of the Board. The Chairman shall, when present, preside at all meetings of the Board. In the absence of the Chair-man from any meeting or if, after being present, he ratives the wombers present may select one of their retires the members present may select one of their number to be Chairman. In the absence of the Chair-man from the State, or in the case of illness of the

Chairman, the members present at any meeting may elect one of their number acting Chairman during such absence or illness.

23 .- Order of Business at Board Meeting.

The secretary shall arrange the order of business. Every question coming before the Board shall be de-cided by open voting, and by the majority of the members present. Each member, including the Chair-man, shall have one vote and, in the case of an equality of votes, the question shall be declared "car-ried in the negative."

-Notice of Special Meeting of Board.

A special meeting of the Board may be called at any time and place by the Chairman or two members of the Board, in writing, through the secretary. Each member of the Board shall receive twenty-four hours' written notice of any ordinary or special meeting of the Board.

25.-Audit of Books and Accounts.

The books and accounts of the Hospital shall be audited by auditors, who shall be appointed by the Board.

26.—Payments.

All payments shall be made by cheque, which shall be signed by the secretary and countersigned by the Chairman or another member of the Board.

27.-Visiting Committee.

The Board shall appoint two of their number at each ordinary meeting of the Board to be a visiting Com-mittee. The visiting Committee shall meet at the Hospital once at least every week to inspect the In-stitution in every department; make inquiry as to the quality of the provisions supplied, and recommend any improvements to the Board meeting next ensuing.

28 .- Appointment of Staff.

The Board may appoint from time to time Medical Officer, Secretary, Matron, nurses, orderlies, cook and other servants, as may be deemed necessary, and may assign reasonable remuneration for their services, and may remove them and appoint others in their stead. Written agreements must be made between the Board and all officers and servants.

29.-Medical Officer.

The Medical Officer shall be a registered Mcdical Practitioner. He shall have authority under the Board as regards the admission and treatment of patients.

30. He shall visit the Hospital wards daily, at such times as may be necessary.

31. He shall carefully examine all drugs, chemicals, and surgical appliances brought into the Hospital, Foth as to quality and quantity, and report any defect in either to the Board.

32. The Medical Officer shall notify the Board, when he is called away on urgent business during the hours set apart for his attendance at the Hospital.

33.—Duties of Secretary.

The secretary shall attend all meetings, whether ordin-The secretary shall attend all meetings, whether ordin-ary or special; take minutes of all proceedings; conduct correspondence; keep a register of subscribers and hon-orary members, and keep a debtor and ereditor account of all monetary transactions. He shall render to the Board at each ordinary monthly meeting a report, which shall include a financial statement of the position of the institution. He shall file and preserve all documents, produce receipts for all payments made by him, and be produce receipts for all payments made by him, and be answerable at all times to instructions from the Board. He shall visit the Hospital and inspect the reports of the Matron, and collect all subscriptions. He shall give the Board a satisfactory guarantee by furnishing bonds-men to their approval, or insure in an approved insur-ance company for an amount to be fixed by the Board, who shall pay the premium.

34.-Matron.

The matron shall have charge of all nurses and ser-The matron shall have charge of all nurses and ser-vants of the Institution, and shall report to the Chair-man or secretary of the Board any misbehaviour or neglect of duty or disobedience of orders on their part. She shall be responsible for the good order and cleanli-ness of the Institution, the clothing of the patients, the preparation and service of meals, and the proper and efficient nursing of patients. She shall keep a record of all furniture and other articles in the Hospital. She shall have charge of all money and valuables belonging to the patients. She shall keep a register of all patients received into the Hospital, showing their full names, so far as she can ascertain, date of admission and discharge, and such other particulars as the Board may at any time determine; also a register showing the date and quantities of all provisions received by the Institution. She shall not leave the Institution without the consent of the secretary of the Board. The matron shall not make public any matter or matters connected with the Hospital. Termination of services to be by 14 days' written notice on either side.

35.—Nurses.

Each nurse shall be responsible to the matron for the efficient nursing of the patients, the charge of all linen, furniture and other articles, and the cleanliness and management of the wards. She shall strictly obey the orders of the matron and shall take such day or night duties as the matron shall direct. Her conduct shall be quiet and orderly, and she shall not receive any visitors without the permission of the matron. The matron shall allow two half-days' leave in every week and alternate Sundays off duty. All nurses shall reside on the premises. Termination of services shall be by 14 days' notice on either side.

36.—Servants.

The cook and other servants shall be ready to carry out orders at any time, and shall be entitled to two half-days' leave in each week and on alternate Sundays, or equivalent time off. They shall faithfully execute all orders of the Medical Officer and matron and be respectful and orderly in conduct. They shall not receive any visitors or be absent from duty without leave of the matron. All servants shall reside on the premises.

37.—Orderlies.

The orderlies shall carry out any instructions which they may from time to time receive from the Medical Officer, matron, secretary, or nurse-in-charge.

38.—Payment of Employees.

All employees of the Hospital shall be paid fortnightly.

39.—Cases only admissible to Hospital; in Cases of Emergency.

There shall not be admitted to the Hospital, except in cases of emergency, as a patient for treatment, any of the following persons:—Any insane person or idiot, in respect of such insanity or idiocy; any person suftering from primary syphilis or chronic paralysis; any person who in the opinion of the Medical Officer is unsuitable to be admitted.

40.-Cases becoming Chronic.

When any person shall have been admitted to the Hospital suffering from an ailment which is not sufficiently advanced for the Medical Officer to declare it to be of a chronic nature, and which ailment subsequently develops into one of a chronic nature, such person shall be allowed treatment for a period of one calendar month from the date of his admission to the Hospital, after which date his position shall be subject to review by the Board.

41.—Subscribers' Benefits.

Subscribers shall be entitled to medical attendance at their homes or as in-patients at the Hospital, subject to the discretion of the Medical Officer.

42.—Out-patients.

The Medical Officer shall be in attendance at the Hospital daily during the hours defined by the Committee, and, in addition, shall attend in case of emergency, whenever summoned by the matron. The hours of attendance defined shall be posted in a conspicuous position at the Hospital and in any other place the Committee may direct.

43.—Visiting Days.

Visiting days for the public shall be Sundays and Wednesdays from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m., and at any time by permission from the Medical Officer or matron.

44.-Complaints.

All complaints made by subscribers and non-subscribers with respect to the administration, or the staff of the Institution, shall be in writing, signed by the complainant and addressed to the secretary, and such complaint shall be brought before the Board at the next meeting and may be adjourned from time to time, as may be necessary for the proper investigation of the matter complained of. The Board may require any member of the staff to attend a meeting of the Board in respect to any complaint made under this rule. Any complaint by any member of the staff shall be made in writing immediately to the secretary, who shall bring the matter before the Chairman of the Board without delay.

45.—Residential Rule

No persons, other than patients or those employed by the Hospital Board, shall reside on the hospital premises.

46.—Alteration and/or Amendment of Rules.

Any rule may be altered or resended, or a new rule may be added at a special meeting of financial subscribers called for the purpose, by a resolution passed by at least two-thirds majority of the financial subscribers present and voting at such special meeting.

47.--By-laws.

The Board shall have power to make, alter, and amend from time to time By-laws net inconsistent with these Rules, for the management of the Institution.

48.—Obligatory.

All persons being or becoming subscribers to the Institution, and all non-subscribers being or becoming patients at the Hospital, shall be deemed or taken to have subscribed to these Rules and By-laws.
