The Shipping and Pilotage Consolidation Ordinance.

#### PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, TO WIT. K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and JAMES MITCHELL, Lieutenant-Governor, and its Dependencies in the Common wealth of Australia, ILS.

773/29.

WHEREAS it is provided by "The Shipping and Pilotage Consolidation Ordinance, 1855," that the Governor may by Proclamation from time to time frame, alter, amend, or repeal rules and regulations not repugnant to any of the provisions of the said Ordinance, to be observed by all Masters and Commanders of all ships or vessels in any of the ports or harbours of Western Australia, and by all persons duly appointed or licensed to act as Harbour Masters or Pilots in such ports or harbours, and may substitute others in their stead, but so that all such rules and regulations shall be promulgated by Proclamation in the Government Gazette at least one month before the same shall be in full force and effect: And whereas the Governor did by Proclamation dated the 14th day of November, 1917, and published in the Government Gazette on the 16h day of November, 1917, make regulations, in accordance with the said Ordinance which are still in force: And whereas it is now deemed desirable to amend the said regulations by repealing the regulations Numbered 8 to 11, both inclusive, therein regulations Numbered 8 to 11, both inclusive, therein and by substituting new regulations in place thereof: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the said Ordinance, do hereby amend the said regulations made under the said Ordinance by a Proclamation dated the 14th day of November, 1917, and published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of November, 1917, in the manner following, that is to say, the regulations Numbered 8 to 11, both inclusive, are hereby repealed, and new regulations as set out in the Schedule hereto and new regulations as set out in the Schedule hereto are hereby inserted in the said regulations in lieu of the particular regulations, which are hereby repealed as aforesnid: And further, I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, do declare that this Proclamation and the new regulations hereby made shall come into force one month after the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette.

## SIGNALS ON VESSELS.

- 8. (1) Signals for Pilots:-The following signals, when used or displayed together or separately, shall be deemed to be signals for a pilot:—

  - (a) By day—
    1. The International Code Signal "G."
    2. The International Code Signal "P.T."

    - 3. The Pilot Jack hoisted at the fore.
  - (b) By night-
    - 1. The pyrotechnic light, commonly known as a blue light, shown every fifteen minutes. A bright white light flashed or shown at short
    - or frequent intervals just above the bulwarks
    - for about a minute at a time.
      3. The International Code Signal "P.T." by flashing.

No master of a vessel shall use or display, or cause or permit any person under his authority to use or display any of the aforesaid signals for a Pilot for any other purpose than that of summoning a Pilot, or shall use, or cause, or permit any person under his authority to use any other signal for a Pilot.

- (2) Quarantine Signals:—The following signals are to be shown on arrival by vessels requiring or required to show their state of health.
  - (a) In the daytime-Q flag-signifying "My ship is 'Healthy' and I request free pratique.

- Q flag over first substitute (QQ)—signifying "My ship is 'Suspect,' i.e., I have had cases of in-fectious diseases more than five days ago, or there has been unusual mortality among the rats on board my ship."
- Q flag over L flag (QL)—signifying "My ship is "Infected," i.e., I have had cases of infectious diseases less than five days ago."

(b) By night-

- Red light over a white light signifying—''I have not received free pratique.'' (Only to be exhibited within the precincts of a port. The lights should not be more than 6 feet apart.)
- Miscellaneous Signals:-The following signals shall be used for the purposes mentioned, on vessels in

Customs Officer Required:—International Code Flags "E,H,C."

Medical Assistance Required:—International Code Flag "W."

- Police required:—
  (a) By day—International Code Flags "S.T."
  (b) By night—Two white lights shown vertically
  - five feet apart from peak or other prominent place.

Tug boat required:-

- (a) By day-
- 1. International Code Flags "YA." (If more than one required, indicate number by International Code Flags); or
- 2. Two blasts on whistle, one prolonged and one short.
- (b) By night-Two blasts on whistle, one prolonged and one short.

Water required:—International Code Flags "Y.J." Ash boat required: -- International Code Flags "F.S." Lighter required:-International Code Flags "Q.N." (If more than one required, indicate number by International Code Flags.)

Mails on Board:-International Code Flag "Y." Explosives and Inflammable Cargo aboard:-

- (a) By day-International Code Flag "B" st foremast head or other prominent position;
- (b) By night—A red light, of such character as to be visible all round the horizon for a distance of one mile, shown from a prominent position clear of all other lights on the vessel.
- 10. (1) Signals of Distress:—The following signals, when used or displayed together or separately, shall be deemed to be signals of distress:—
  - (a) By day-
  - 1. A gun or other explosive signal, fired at intervals of about a minute.
    The International Code Signal "N.C."

  - 3. A continuous sounding with any fog signal ap-
  - 4. The signal S.O.S. made by radio telegraphy.
  - 5. The distance signal, consisting of a square flag, having either above or below it a ball or anything resembling a ball.
  - (b) By night-
    - 1. A gun or other explosive signal fired at intervals of about a minute.

  - Flames on the vessel (as from a burning tar barrel, oil barrel, etc.).
     Rockets or shells, throwing stars of any colour or description, fired one at a time, at short in-
  - 4. A continuous sounding with any fog signal apparatus
  - The signal S.O.S. made by radio telegraphy.
- (2) And any master of a ship who uses or displays, or causes or permits any person under his authority to use or display any of the said signals, except in the case of a ship in distress, shall be liable to pay compensation for any labour undertaken, risk incurred, or loss sustained in consequence of such signal having been supposed to be a signal of distress; and such compensation may, without prejudice to any other remedy, be recovered in the same manner in which salvage is recoverable.
- 11. Steering Sound Signals Day or Night:-When vessel are in sight of one another, a steam vessel under way, in taking any course authorised by the steering and sailing rules for preventing collisions embodied in

Description of Proposed Sewerage Works Approved and Exempted.—City of Fremantle.—4-inch and 6-inch reticulation sewers, with all manholes, inspection shafts, and all other apparatus connected therewith:—Commencing at a point in the centre of Swanbourne Street opposite the North boundary of Lot 1031, Swanbourne Street, and proceeding East across Swanbourne Street and along the North boundary of Lot 1031, Swanbourne Street, to the North-East corner of the said Lot 1031, Swanbourne Street; thence South along the East boundary of Lot 1031, Swanbourne Street; thence South along the East boundary of Lot 1031, Swanbourne Street, and along the East boundaries of Lots 1032 to 2 of 1036, Swanbourne Street, and the prolongation of same to the centre of Knutsford Street; thence West along the centre of Knutsford Street to the centre of Swanbourne Street; thence North along the centre of Swanbourne Street to the point of commencement, as shown in pink on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 5327.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 1121/33.
WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1939," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater Drainage Works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been compared with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Licutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Coun il, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to andertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements.—Canning Pipe Line:—Proposed 6-inch diameter water main from Corner's Brook Weir to Canning Pipe Line, complete with valves and all necessary apparatus, length approximately 60 chains; construction of timber chlorinating tank; 5,000 gallous overhead tank; and raising the crest of the existing Corner's Brook Weir, as indicated in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 5297.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 9th day of February, 1934.

# The Sandalwood Act, 1929. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1478/29.
WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 2 of "The Sandalwood Act, 1929," the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and aliented land during the period therein stated: And whereas it is desirable to limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and aliented land during the period from the First day of January, 1934, to the Thirtieth day of June, 1934, to 800 tons: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during the period from the First day of January, 1934, to the Thirtieth day of June, 1934, to 800 tons, exclusive of sandalwood required for oil distillation purposes within the State.

- (2) A second-hand case used for containing fruit intended for sale, or for conveying fruit to a packing shed for packing prior to sale or export under the authority aforesaid, which is so used in any part of the State South of the thirty-third parallel of South latitude, may be sent or carried to any part of the State North of the thirty-third parallel of South latitude aforesaid, but any such case which has been sent or carried North of the said thirty-third parallel of South latitude shall thereafter be a second-hand case under and for the purposes of Subclause (1) of this Regulation.

# KOORDA AND DISTRICTS CENTENNIAL HOSPITAL.

## Rules

- The name of the Hospital shall be the Koorda and Districts Centennial Hospital.
- The Board of Management shall consist of seven members appointed by the Governor. They shall be selected in the month of July of each year, at the annual general meeting. They shall be appointed for a period of three years, with the exception, that of the members selected at the annual general meeting to be held in July, 1934, three members shall be appointed for a period of one year; two members for a period of two years, and two members for a period of three years from the 1st August, 1934.
- 3. An honorary secretary and/or an honorary treasurer shall be members of the Board ex officio. This clause to come into effect from the day of the annual general meeting held in 1934.

## Annual General Meeting.

- The annual general meeting shall be held in the mouth of July. The Chairman or secretary shall give notice of such annual meeting at least seven clear days before the day of the meeting, and such notice shall be advertised in the local Press.
- 5. The order of business at the annual general meeting shall be:-

Minutes of the previous annual meeting; Report of the Board for the year ending 30th of June immediately past; Treasurer's report and financial statements; Medical officer's report;

Election of new members; Election of auditor;

Election of treasurer; Notice of motion;

General business.

Copies of the financial statements, if available, shall be presented to the public prior to the commencement of the meeting.

#### Auditor.

6. An auditor, who shall not be a member of the Board, shall be elected at the annual general meeting.

#### Treasurer.

- 7. An honorary treasurer shall be appointed at the annual general meeting.
- S. The honorary treasurer shall receive all moneys due to the Board, and give official receipts for same, and pay same into the Board's banking account. He shall prepare an annual report, financial statements, and balance sheet, and keep the necessary books for a proper record of accounts. He shall pay accounts passed for payment, and present the relative receipts to the Board at the next monthly meeting.
- 9. All accounts are to be paid by cheque, which shall be signed jointly by the Chairman, secretary and Treasurer. The treasurer shall have authority to indorse cheques when placed to the credit of the Board's banking account.

#### Secretary.

10. The secretary shall be appointed by the Board, He shall conduct the correspondence, and have charge of all documents pertaining to the Board, with the exception of those bound up in the duties of the treasurer. He shall summon and attend all meetings of the Board, and shall keep a minute book, in which all proceedings of the meeting shall be inserted, and shall see that, as far as is practicable, all resolutions and orders passed at such meetings are carried into effect.

#### Special Public Meetings.

11. Special public meetings may be called by the Chairman or the secretary, with the authority of the Board, if thought necessary, or on requisition by twenty adult bona fide residents of the Districts. The same notice, stating the business to be transacted, shall be given as in the case of the annual general meeting.

#### Board Meetings.

- 12. The Board shall hold a regular meeting at least once in each calendar month. A special meeting may be called by the Chairman or secretary, or by the secretary when requested to do so by three members of the Board. In each case all members of the Board are to be notified.
- 13. The order of business at Board meeings shall be:-

Minutes of the last meeting; Business arising from minutes; Reports; Correspondence; Accounts;

Notice of motion;

General.

14. In the case of any member of the Board being absent from three consecutive meetings, without reasonable explanation or leave of absence, the Board may recommend to the Governor that his seat be declared vacant.

## Vacancies.

15. Should a vacancy occur on the Board during the year, the Board shall recommend a suitable person to the Governor for appointment, until the next annual general meeting; provided that such vacancy does not occur by the resignation of a member, and such resignation be in the nature of a protest, in which case a public meeting shall be called for the purpose of electing a member to fill the vacancy.

#### Duties and Power of Board.

- 16. The Board shall, as they think fit, make provision for all matters affecting the management, care, control, and superintendence of the Hospital and the fulfilment of the purposes thereof, including the entering into of any agreement or lease, as may be necessary.
- 17. A quarterly inspection by the Board, in the company of the Medical Officer, shall be made of the precinct of the Hospital.
- 18. The Chairman and the treasurer shall, at the end of June in each year, and at the termination of any lease, prepare and submit to the Board an inventory of all equipment under control of the Board.

#### Ministers of Religion.

19. Ministers of religion shall have free access to patients of their respective denominations, but, prior to entering the ward, must obtain the matron's permission.

#### Complaints from Patients.

20. Complaints from patients shall be made or taken in writing, and lodged with the Chairman or the secretary of the Board within fourteen days of the occurrence, or within such further time as the Board shall decide. Such complaints shall be dealt with by the Board, and their decision shall be binding on all parties.

The Board may refuse to inquire into any complaint which is not lodged within the specified time.

## Admission of Patients.

- 21. No infectious diseases to be treated in the Hospital, except in cases of emergency.
- 22. No patient suffering from V.D. or delirium tremeus to be admitted to the Hospital, except in cases of emergency.
- 23. All patients admitted to be under the control of the Medical Officer, who may discharge any patient, should be think fit.

#### Residential Rule.

24. No person to be resident at the Hospital, except staff and bona fide patients.

#### Staff.

25. The matron shall provide a qualified substitute, in the event of illness or absence from duty, other than for a short period, when notice of the intended absence shall be given to the Medical Officer.

#### Additions and Alterations.

26. Any alterations, deletions, or additions to these By-laws must be submitted to a public meeting for ratification.

## KOJONUP DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

## Rules and Regulations.

- 1. The name of the Institution shall be the Kojonup District Hospital.
- 2. The Board of Management shall consist of seven members appointed by the Governor. They shall be selected in the month of July in each year, at the annual general meeting of subscribers. Retiring members shall be eligible for re-election. The Board of Management shall be responsible for the entire control of the Institution.

#### Subscribers.

- 3. (a) Every person subscribing not less than twenty guineas in one amount shall be entitled to be declared a life governor.
- (b) Every person subscribing ten guineas in one amount shall be appointed a life member.

Benefit subscribers shall be defined as:-

- (a) any married person who subscribes three guineas per annum; or
- (b) any unmarried person who subscribes two guineas per annum;
- (c) a general subscriber shall be defined as any person who subscribes five shillings per annum;
- (d) no person other than life governors, life members, benefit subscribers, general subscribers or adult persons covered by the benefit subscription shall be permitted to vote on any question relative to the management of the Hospital or selection of the Board of Management.
- 4. Benefits for Subscribers.—Except in the case of general subscribers, who shall have a voice in the management only, the following benefits shall be allowed:—Married benefit subscribers, with wife and family up to 16 years of age, shall have free general

hospital treatment; single benefit subscribers shall have free general hospital treatment. These benefits shall not be given in maternity cases. Benefits become operative 14 days after acceptance by the Committee, and lapse in case of the subscription being one month overdue. Each application for enrolment shall be treated on its merits by the Committee.

No benefit subscriber shall be entitled to any of the privileges regarding treatment or hospital accommodation for any conditions for which he is already covered by insurance under the terms of the Workers' Compensation Act.

#### Annual Meeting.

- 5. The annual general meeting of subscribers shall be held in the month of July in each year, and not less than fourteen days' notice in writing shall be given of such meeting by the Chairman and secretary.
- 6. A special general meeting of subscribers shall be called within fourteen days, on the requisition to the Chairman, of at least ten financial subscribers. The requisition shall state the business of the meeting, and no other business shall be dealt with at such special general meeting.
- 7. The order of business at the annual meeting shall be and include:-

Confirmation of minutes of the previous annual meeting:

Report of the Board for the previous year;

Secretary's report, balance sheet, and statement; Auditor's report;

Business of which due notice has been given;

Selection of the Board of Management and Auditor;

Any other business allowed.

#### Appointment of Officers.

- The Board shall, after it has been duly appointed and at its first meeting after such appointment, elect one of its members to be Chairman.
- 9. The Chairman shall, when present, preside at all meetings of the Board, and shall be ex officio member of all sub-Committees.
- 10. The secretary and treasurer shall be appointed by the Board, and shall retain office at the Board's discretion
- 11. An auditor, who shall not be a member of the Board, shall be elected annually by the subscribers. The books and accounts shall be audited up to and including the thirtieth day of June in each and every
- 12. The Board shall nominate persons for appointment by the Governor to fill all vacancies. It shall also fill all vacancies of Chairman, secretary, treasurer, and auditor, or any other office which may become vacant.

#### Order of Meetings.

- The Board shall meet at times and places as fixed from time to time by resolution.
- 14. The order of business at Board meetings shall be:-
  - (1) Minutes, confirmation and business arising therefrom:
  - (2) Correspondence, business arising therefrom;
  - (3) Finance, statement and accounts;
  - (4) Reports;
  - (5) Motions of which notice has been given;
  - (6) General and other business.

## Special Meetings.

15. Special meetings of the Board shall be called by the Chairman or by the secretary, upon the written requisition of three members of the Board.

## Seats declared Vacant.

16. In the case of any member of the Board who is absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of the Board without having obtained leave of absence, the Board shall recommend to the Governor that the seat of such member shall be declared vacant as from the date such vacancy is gazetted.

#### Notice of Meetings.

17. Every member shall receive at least seven days' clear notice in writing of all meetings.

## Appointment of Committees.

- 18. Committees shall be framed as follows:-
- (a) Finance Committee: A Committee of three members, with the Chairman, shall be elected by the Board. It shall be the duty of this Committee to deal with all matters connected with finance. No accounts shall be passed for payment unless the same have been recommended by the Committee. All accounts passed for payment shall be recorded in the minute book.
- (b) House Committee: A Committee, consisting of three members of the Board, shall be elected. Subject to the direction of the Board, the House Committee shall have control of the Institution. Its members shall inspect the Hospital buildings generally, and regularly make such inquiries as will fit them to make a full report to the Board upon the compliance of these By-laws. Whenever possible, the Committee shall consist of two lady and one gentleman members of the Board.

## Management.

19. The House Committee may from time to time issue directions to the staff for the internal management of the Hospital, and the same shall have the same force and effect as if adopted by the Board.

## Duties of Secretary,

- 20. The duties of the secretary shall be:-To attend all meetings of the Board;
  - To attend all committee meetings;
  - To take notes of minutes and prepare reports;
  - To conduct all correspondence and carry out all resolutions of the Board as contained in the minutes;
  - To answer all questions on the Board's business; To prepare and place before the Board the monthly financial statement;
  - To keep proper books of accounts, issue receipts, attend to all due payments of moneys;
  - pay into the bank, after receipt, all moneys which in the aggregate amount to five pounds and over, but no moneys shall be held for a period of longer than seven days; readily and cheerfully obey all lawful com-
  - mands of the Board, and to attend to all matters affecting the finances and the welfare of the Board or Hospital which are not here enumerated.

## Duties of Matron.

- 21. The matron shall, subject to the direction of the Board, have full control of the internal administra-tion of the Hospital and all things appertaining thereto.
- 22. The matron shall be responsible for the good order and cleanliness of the Institution and the clothing of the patients, the preparation and service of meals, and the proper and efficient nursing of patients. She shall see that the Hospital is at all times left in charge of a competent nurse, that the report books are entered up regularly daily, shall be responsible for the stores, and see that the directions of the Medical Officer are carried out, take charge of all moneys and valuables of patients, and, in the case of insanity or death, hold the same to the order of the Board. A report shall be drawn up at the end of each month, showing the record of the Hospital for that period. The report shall be written by the matron and handed to the secretary for presentation to the Board. All accounts shall be checked by the matron, and the same shall, after being checked, be certified as to their correctness or otherwise. The matron shall receive such payment for her services as shall be defined by the Board from time to time, and she shall be entitled to two weeks' leave annually for every completed year of service on full pay.
- 23. The matron shall, on taking charge, check and sign a stock book containing a list of all furniture, bedding, linen, clothing, glass, crockery, entlery, cooking and kitchen utensils, etc., and be responsible for
- 24. The matron shall requisition the Board for clothing, bedding, linen, glass, cutlery, crockery, utensils, and appliances of every kind required for the use of the Hospital. She shall enter them in the stock book and be responsible for them.

25. The matron shall not permit strangers or visicrowd around any bed, but shall quietly request such visitors to retire; and, if such request is not at once complied with, shall report the same to the Board.

## Admission of Patients.

- 26. All patients shall be examined by the Medical Officer, or, in his absence, by the matron, before admission. No distinction shall be made between those who are able to pay and those who are not able to pay, nor shall any intimation to either effect be made upon any bed card or otherwise, nor shall any ward be set apart for either.
- 27. Patients leaving the Hospital of their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leave ing, or such declaration shall be signed by the friend removing such patient.

#### Complaints.

28. Complaints of all kinds affecting the internal management of the Hospital, whether made by subscribers, patients, staff, or others, shall be made directly to the secretary in writing, within seven days of the occurrence, and such complaint shall be dealt with by the Board after receiving the matter. with by the Board, after receiving the matron's report thereon. The decision of the Board shall be final. The Board may refuse to consider any complaint that is not lodged as herein provided.

### Residential Rule.

No person, other than patients, or those employed by the Board, shall reside on the premises or have any meals at the Institution. No visitor to employees shall, under any circumstances, be permitte! to remain at the Institution after nine o'clock p.m., without the matron's consent.

## Ministers of Religion.

- 30. Ministers of religion shall have access at all times to the patients of their respective denomination, but, prior to entering the ward, must have the matron's
- 31. No more than two (2) visitors shall be allowed to visit any patient on the same day, without special permission from the matron. Visitors shall be admitted to see patients daily, between the hours of 2.30 p.m. and 4 p.m., or, at other times, by special permission of the matron.
- 32. Visitors must remain at the bedside of the patient they are visiting, and shall not visit other patients, unless by permission of the matron.

## Nursing and Domestic Staff.

- 33. Each nurse shall be responsible to the matron for the efficient nursing of the patients, the charge of all linen, furniture, and other articles under her charge, and the cleanliness and management of her ward. She shall strictly obey the orders of the matron, and take such day or night duties as directed by the matron. Unless otherwise approved by the Board, all nurses shall reside on the premises.
- 34. Each probationer shall be responsible to the matron, who shall lay down a programme of duties from time to time. Probationers' salaries shall be dealt with by the Board at intervals of six months, and no increase shall be granted unless the same has been recommended by the matron.
- 35. All members of the domestic staff shall be ready to carry out orders at any time. They shall carry out faithfully all orders of the matron, and shall be respectful and orderly in conduct.

# Leave and Time Off Duty.

- 36. Two weeks annual leave shall be granted to nurses, probationers, and all other employees of the Board, in addition to one half-day per week and one day per month time off. Arrangements in regard to time off shall be left in the hands of the matron, but no member of the staff shall be absent from the Hospital for more than 24 through the staff that the same with the same than 24 through the same through t pital for more than 24 hours, without the consent of both the Chairman of the Board and the matron. All applications for leave, including sick leave and special leave, shall be made through the matron to the Board.
- 37. The matron or any member of the nursing staff shall be entitled to one month's notice of the intended termination of her services, and any other employee shall be entitled to fourteen days' notice thereof.

- 38. It shall be the policy of the Board, in respect to holiday pay, as follows:—In the case of an employee having completed one year of continuous service, and part thereof, not less than six months continuously, the Board may, at its discretion, pay a sum equal to the amount of holiday pay on a pro rata basis, for the part of the year over and above the full year. This clause in no way makes any request from an employee for additional holiday pay an obligation on the part of the Board for the payment of any such sum whatsoever.
- 39. Except in cases where an employee is engaged under extraordinary circumstances, such as the rules of a union, travelling expenses shall be paid to and/or from the place of engagement only after a period of six months' continuous service. No payment for holidays shall be allowed where such travelling expenses are paid, unless the committee deem the circumstances extraordinary.

#### Hospital Charges.

- 40. Before a patient leaves the Hospital, all fees must be paid to the matron or secretary, or a satisfactory guarantee of payment left in the hands of the matron or secretary.
  - 41. The scale of charges shall be as follows:-General Hospital Treatment Fees: 9s. per day; maternity treatment:-whilst waiting, 6s. per day; after accounchement, 12s. per day; theatre fees and other extras shall be in addition to the ordinary charges.

### Common Seal.

42. The common seal of the Board shall be kept in the office of the Board, in the custody of the secretary, and shall only be affixed to documents by the chairman for the time being at a meeting of the Board, upon a resolution carried at such meeting authorising The secretary shall keep a record of all documents to which the seal shall have been affixed.

### Amendment of Rules.

43. These Rules shall not be altered, amended, varied, or added to, except under notice given in writing to the secretary, stating the proposed alteramember of the Board not less than seven days' clear notice in writing thereof prior to the proposed alteration being discussed.

## WILUNA PUBLIC HOSPITAL.

Rules and Regulations.

#### Name.

1. The Institution shall be known as "The Wilma Public Hospital.

## Objects.

2. The objects of the Hospital shall be to afford medical and surgical treatment, and to provide medicine and surgical dressings to subscribers and dependants, and to paying and indigent patients.

#### Subscribers' Qualifications and Privileges.

- 3. Any person who subscribes 2s. per week, or the sum of 26s. per quarter, or any male person under the age of 18 years or single woman or widows who subscribe the sum of 1s. per week, shall be termed a sub-
- 4. In these Rules and Regulations the term "Subscriber" shall mean any subscriber (male or female) who has paid his or her subscription and is financial, and has paid at least two weeks' subscription prior to seeking any benefit or privileges; and shall include, so far as medical and hospital treatment, only the wife or husband, parents or female relative occupying the position as head of the household, or children up to the age

- of sixteen years, provided they are residing with the subscriber and dependant upon him or her.
- 5. All employees subscribing through any gold mine or mining company shall be deemed to be financial as from the date of their employment: Provided that the mine management undertakes the collection of their subscriptions from wages due.
- Subscribers may nominate to have their names placed on the list of any Medical Practitioner approved by the Board, in accordance with the provisions of Rule
- 7. Every subscriber shall be entitled to surgical and medical treatment at the Hospital as an indoor or outdoor patient, and to medical and surgical dressings and appliances, subject to the conditions and limitations set forth in the Rules and Regulations, and for so long as the Medical Officer or Medical Practitioner on whose list the subscriber's name is, deems necessary, free of
- 8. No subscriber, not being an indoor patient, shall be supplied with any medicines or dressings, except on the authority of the Medical Officer or Medical Practitioner on whose list the subscriber's name is, or the matron, who shall record same in a diary, to be kept for the purpose.
- 9. Subscribers shall not receive free treatment in any of the following cases:
  - (a) Incurable diseases;
  - (b) Disorders for the cure of which other establish-
  - ments are provided;
    (c) Any person requiring food and not medicine, and who is more properly a subject for a benevolent institution;
  - (d) Any person whose admission might endanger other patients;
  - (e) Any person from the gaol or lock-up, unless an urgent case and the police provide attendaut or custodian, if necessary;
  - (f) Any infant on account of the condition of the mother alone;
  - Venereal diseases;
  - Alcoholism;
  - Dentistry;
  - (j) Insanity.
- 10. Subscribers shall be entitled to free Hospital accommodation, but will be required to pay the Medical Officer or Medical Practitioner concerned his private fee, in the following cases:—(a) Pregnancy; (b) surgical operations.

Urgent surgical operations, necessitated by accident or dangerous illness, will be performed free of charge by Medical Officer or Medical Practitioner on whose list the subscriber's name is, where such operations can be performed in Wilma. In such cases the Hospital Board will pay the Surgeon one-half of the usual fees for Anaesthetist, and assistant, when necessary, and the subscriber concerned will pay to the Hospital Board one-half of the amount so paid to the Surgeon.

11. No subscriber shall be entitled to any of the privileges regarding treatment or Hospital accommodation for any conditions for which he is already covered by insurance under the terms of the Workers' Compensation Act.

# Administration.

12. The administration of the Hospital shall be vested in a Board of Management of nine members, appointed by the Governor, two of whom shall be nominated by the Wilma District Road Board and who shall hold office only while they are members of such Road Board; and the remainder shall be selected by the subscribers.

The members selected by the subscribers shall hold office for two years, with the following exception: Of the seven members selected to hold office as from 16th August, 1933, three (to be decided by the drawing of lots) shall retire at 31st July, 1934.

#### Election of Committee.

- 13. Nominations must be lodged with the secretary at least fourteen days prior to the date of ballot, and must be signed by a proposer and seconder (who must be subscribers), and have the consent of the candidate (who shall also be a subscriber) indorsed thereon.
- 14. The ballot for selection of members shall be held on the 14th day of July in each year. When this date falls on a Saturday or Sunday, the ballot shall be taken on the Monday next following. After candidates have

- been selected, their names shall be submitted to the Governor, through the Medical Department, with a recommendation for appointment.
- 15. The members of the Board shall elect one of their number to be Chairman at the first meeting after the appointment of the Board. The Chairman shall, when present, preside at all meetings. In the absence of the Chairman from any meeting, the members present may elect one of their number to be Chairman for that meet-The Chairman shall be a member of all sub-Committees.
- 16. If any member of the Board shall be absent from more than two consecutive meetings without leave of absence, or shall cease to be a subscriber, the Board may recommend to the Governor that his seat be declared vacant, and also recommend the appointment of another person in his stead.

#### Finance Committee.

- 17. The Board shall elect two of their members to rm a Finance Committee. The Finance Committee form a Finance Committee. shall submit to the Board accounts which it recommends for payment, and present a statement of receipts and expenditure for the past month, and an estimate for the ensuing month.
- 18. No account shall be passed for payment unless it is initialed as correct by the secretary, Medical Officer, or matron.
- 19. All payments authorised by the Board shall be paid by cheque, made payable to the order of the credi-tor, signed by the Chairman and one member of the Finance Committee, and countersigned by the secretary.

#### Auditor.

20. One Auditor shall be appointed by the Board of Management, who shall receive such remuneration as the Board may think fit.

## Order of Business.

- 21. The order of business at meetings of the Board shall be:-
  - (a) Minutes of the previous meeting to be read, and, if approved confirmed;
  - Correspondence, outward and inward, to be read and discussed;
  - Reports;
  - (d) Questions;
  - Finance;
  - (e) Finance;(f) Discussion of notices of motion;
  - (g) Receiving notice of motion;
    (h) General business.
- 22. At all meetings of the Board all the members present shall vote on any question submitted, and the question shall be decided by the majority. Each member including the Chairman, shall have one vote, and, in the case of an equality of votes, the question shall be de-clared carried in the negative. The election of executive clared carried in the negative. officers shall be by ballot.
- 23. Special meetings of the Board may be convened at any time, on 24 hours' notice in writing being given to the members, either at the request of the Chairman or of any four (4) members.
- 24. Any resolution of the Board may be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, either by the unanimous vote of all the members, or by a vote of a majority of the Board, subject in such last-mentioned case to the condition that, seven days at least before such subsequent meeting, notice in writing thereof, and of the proposal to alter or revoke such resolution, shall have been given to each member.
- The Board may, from time to time, appoint a sub-Committee of any number, with such powers, rights, and privileges, and subject to such conditions and restrictions as the Board may at such appointment or thereafter determine.
- 26. The Board shall regulate the several departments of the Hospital, in accordance with the Regulations or any By-laws, and more particularly in reference to all sanitary matters, and shall take immediate steps to rectify any defects that may require prompt attention.
- 27. No ball, bazaar, sports meeting, or other enter-tainment or function shall be held in aid of the Hospital funds without the consent and authority of the Board.

#### House Committee.

28. The Board of Management shall appoint from among themselves a House Committee of two (2), to be elected bi-monthly, who shall attend to the internal man-

agement of the Hospital and such other matters as may be delegated to them. They shall furnish mouthly reports to the Board of Management.

29. The House Committee shall report to the Board any repairs, etc., which may be necessary, and give attention to same during the progress of any works. They shall also see that all fittings and appliances are in an efficient state.

## Patients' Circumstances.

30. The secretary shall cause full inquiries to be made into the circumstances of indigent patients.

#### Meetings of Subscribers.

- 31. The annual general meeting of subscribers shall be held on the first Sunday after the ballot for the selection of Board members, the financial year terminating on the 30th June. Subscribers to be notified by advertisement at least two weeks before the date of such meeting, and ten per cent. of the number of subscribers at the date of meeting to form a quorum.
- 32. At the annual meeting, the annual reports and balance sheet of the Hospital shall be presented by the Chairman; such balance sheet to be published at least seven days before the meeting, and to be signed by the Chairman, secretary and auditor.

#### Special Meetings.

- 33. The secretary shall, whenever required by the Chairman, Board, or upon a requisition in writing signed by not less than nine (9) subscribers, convene a special meeting of subscribers. The requisition shall express the objects of the meeting, and shall be left with the secretary, who shall forthwith convene a special meeting. In the event of the secretary failing to do so within ten days from the time of the requisition being received by him, the requisitionists, or any number of them, may convene a special meeting.
- 34. At least fourteen clear days' notice of the annual and every special meeting shall be given each subscriber by advertisement in the local paper, or other means, as the Board shall direct. Such notice shall specify the place, the day, and the hour of meeting and the general nature of the business.
- 35. At an annual or special meeting, ten per cent. of the number of subscribers shall form a quorum. If within fifteen minutes from the time appointed for the meeting a quorum of subscribers is not present, the meeting, if convened upon the requisition of subscribers, shall be dissolved. In another case it shall stand adjourned to a time and place to be fixed.

#### Scale of Fees.

- 36. Indoor Patients:—The fees for non-subscribers shall be 10s. 6d. per day for maintenance and nursing, but not including medical attendance. Drugs and dressings shall be charged for in addition.
- 37. Maternity Cases:—The fees for maternity cases (non-subscribers) shall be 10s. 6d. per day (but not including special nursing, medical fees, or fees for operative midwifery).

### Complaints.

38. Any subscriber or member of the staff having any complaints or other business to bring before the Board, should submit the same in writing to the Board, and, if required, shall attend personally the meeting of the Board.

#### Outdoor Patients.

- 39. All outpatients requiring treatment, and who in the Medical Officer's opinion are in need of treatment, shall be attended to, and the Medical Officer shall enter such patient's name in the book provided for outpatients, under the heading to which they belong. All fees collected or paid to be handed to the secretary.
- 40. Any outdoor patients receiving bottles must leave a deposit of sixpence (6d.) on each bottle, to be refunded on return of bottle.
- All patients who, in the Medical Officer's opinion, require treatment, shall attend at the Hospital when-ever required to do so by him. But the Medical Officer or Medical Practitioner on whose list the subscriber's name is, shall also, in case of necessity, gratnitously attend subscribers at their own homes, provided they reside within a three-mile radius of the Hospital, always excepting cases of venereal disease, alcoholic poisoning, midwifery, and such other causes as are mentioned in Rules 9 and 10.

#### Indoor Patients.

- 42. Accidents or urgent cases shall be received at all hours of the day and night.
- 43. Persons shall be admitted to the Hospital as inpatients on production of a certificate from a Medical Practitioner that they require treatment. Non-sub-scribers shall be examined by the secretary or matron as to their means to pay the Hospital for such treatment.
- Applicants for admission to the Hospital shall, when required by the secretary, make a Statutory Declaration that they are unable to pay for treatment and are not entitled to benefits from any Friendly Society.
- 45. Patients having money or valuables in their possession on admission shall deliver up same to the nurse or attendant, who shall immediately hand them, with written particulars, to the secretary for safe custody, a receipt for which will be given by him and counter-signed by the matron. The Hospital will not be responsible for money or other effects, the property of the patient, nuless this rule be observed.
- 46. On the admission of any patient to the Hospital, his address and that of his immediate relatives, his professed religion, age and other particulars shall be given to the Medical Officer, secretary or matron.
- 47. The patients shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner and strictly observe all the directions of the Medical Officer, matron, or nurse, and such regulations as may be made by the Medical Officer or the Board of Management.
- 48. Patients are not allowed to leave the Hospital precincts without the special permission of the Medical Öfficer.
- 49. No reward or gratuity whatever is to be by the patients or their friends to the Medical Officer, nurse, wardsman, or other servants on account of services performed or to be performed by them in the Hospital, without the consent of the Board.
- Patients quitting the Hospital of their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving, or such declaration shall be signed by the friend removing such patient.
- 51. No patient shall be discharged from the Hospital without the consent of the Medical Officer in charge of the case, except when ordered by the Board in case of misconduct.

#### The Medical Officer.

- 52. The Medical Officer shall be a legally qualified practitioner under the Medical Practitioners Act of Western Australia, and he shall be appointed by the Board of Management, and his salary shall be fixed by them. He shall enter into an agreement approved by the Board.
- 53. On taking office he will check and have charge of all surgical instruments, implements, and apparatus, and shall sign an inventory in correctness thereof, and, on the termination of his engagement, he shall hand them over to his successor or to the Board, and receive an acknowledgment thereof. All new instruments, implements, and apparatus purchased or procured shall be added to the inventory, which shall be a correct record of all such articles.
- 54. No instrument, implement, or apparatus shall be loaned, destroyed, or disposed of without the consent of the Board. The Medical Officer shall report to the Board from time to time that any instrument, implement, or apparatus is worn ont, obsolete, or otherwise useless, and such instrument, implement, or apparatus may then be written off the inventory, on the Board's approval being
- 55. No new instruments shall be ordered, and no addition to any instruments or apparatus made, without the approval of the Board.
- 56. He shall have charge of and be accountable for the medical stores, and, whenever necessary, prepare and submit to the Board a list of all medicines that may be required, and shall from time to time report to the Board such medicine stores as he may deem to be in excess of requirements, or useless, and, with the approval of the Board, have same destroyed or otherwise disposed of.
- 57. He shall be in attendance at the Hospital daily during the hours defined by the Board, and in addition shall attend, in case of emergency, whenever summoned by the matron.
- 58. The hours of attendance defined shall be posted in a conspicuous position at the Hospital, and in any other place the Board may direct.

- 59. He may, if he wish, appoint hours at which he will see the subscribers at his private surgery.
- 60. Subscribers shall have first call on the Medical Officer's services.
- 61. He shall have the immediate superintendence of the professional staff in connection with the professional work of the Hospital, and shall preserve order and sobriety, and, in case of any insubordination or gross default of duty on the part of any of those employees, he shall suspend the same and report fully on each case to the Board immediately, through the secretary.
- 62. He shall be responsible for a daily report of all cases under his charge and see that a diet card is placed for each patient, such daily report to be recorded in a book for that purpose.
- 63. He shall keep an accurate record of the surgical operations performed and all names of patients treated, with results. He shall report monthly to the Board particulars of numbers of patients treated in Hospital during past month, number admitted, number discharged, nature of complaints, and number of outpatients, and give the secretary weekly a list of all outdoor paying patients treated at the Hospital between the hours, as arranged, together with an estimate of the cost of all medicine and dressings supplied to them.
- 64. He shall afford the Board every information and furnish them with reports on all matters within his control, as may seem to him necessary or they may require.
- 65. He shall be responsible for, and, with the assistance of the secretary shall, prepare the annual report, in so far as the medical portion is concerned.
- 66. He shall not absent himself from the town without the consent of the Chairman of Board, and, in the event of the appointment of a locum-tenens being necessary, the Medical Officer shall make all necessary arrangements, and submit the name of the proposed locum-tenens for the approval of the Board, before his appointment. The Board shall have the right to withhold their approval, if in their opinion the proposed locum-tenens is not a suitable person.
- 67. In the event of the Medical Officer neglecting his duties, or being absent for more than 24 hours without the consent of the Chairman and the appointment of a duly qualified locum-tenens approved by the Board, he shall, after receipt of notice under the hand of the secretary, immediately cease to hold office, and shall have no claim on the Board for salary after receipt of such notice, and he shall be liable to the Hospital for any expense which the Board may incur caused by his absence or neglect.
- 68. The agreement between the Board and the Medical Officer may be mutually terminated, upon either party giving to the other three months' notice in writing of such termination.

# Medical Practitioners.

- 69. The Board may approve of any legally qualified Medical Practitioner, who is in public practice in Wiluna attending to Hospital subscribers. Subscribers wishing to be treated by any such Medical Practitioner must notify the secretary in writing of their choice immediately on becoming a subscriber, or not later than the 27th day of December, March, June, or September, for their names to be included on the Medical Practitioner's list as from the 1st day of January, April, July, or October respectively. Subscribers not making any choice will have their names placed on the Hospital Medical Officer's list.
- 70. Medical Practitioners may treat their private patients in the Hospital. Beds will be aliotted to each Medical Practitioner in proportion to the number of subscribers on his list.

### Secretary.

- 71. The secretary shall be appointed by the Board and shall hold office during the pleasure of the Board.
- 72. He may hold office in an honorary or paid capacity.
- 73. If holding office in an honorary capacity, he may be paid an annual Bonus, should the Board consider it advisable.
- 74. If a paid officer, his salary shall be fixed by the Board from time to time.
- 75. He shall conduct the correspondence and have charge of all documents relating to the Hospital, and shall file and record them in a methodical manner, to the satisfaction of the Chairman.

- 76. He shall summon and attend all meetings, and shall keep minute books, in which all the proceedings of the meetings shall be recorded; and shall see as far as practicable that all resolutions or orders passed at such meetings are forthwith carried into effect.
- 77. He shall, under the direction of the Board, keep the books, forms, and accounts of the Hospital, and shall submit his account books to the Board and Finance Committee whenever required.
- 78. He shall see that the Medical Officer takes over and signs for all surgical instruments, etc., as provided in Rule 53.
- 79. He shall receive from the Medical Officer on behalf of the Board the report required by Rule 63 and be responsible for the rendering of accounts of all amounts due and unpaid.
- 80. He shall see that the matron on her appointment complies with Rule 92, and shall submit such inventory, certified to as correct by the matron, to the Board at the end of the financial year.
- \$1. He shall receive all tradesmen's bills for provisions and other articles from the matron and make out accounts for presentation to the Finance Committee at the next monthly meeting.
- 82. He shall receive all moneys paid to the Hospital and enter same in the cash book and pay same into the bank. No moneys shall be held for a period longer than seven days.
- 83. He shall present a copy of the rules to every employee who may be appointed immediately after his or her appointment, and obtain his or her signature to a duplicate copy, which he shall keep in his office for that purpose. He shall keep an interleaved book containing the rules, and shall insert any new rule or order as soon as it shall have been passed by the Board, and shall at once communicate it to any person or persons to whom it may relate.
- 84. He shall, on the day following each Board or sub-Committee meeting, transcribe in the Minute Book fair copies of the minutes taken during each meeting.
- 85. He shall balance the Cash Book at the end of each month, noting whether such balance agrees with that shown by the Bank Book, and, if not agreeing, explain the cause of the difference.
- 86. He shall keep the Contributors' Book, and enter therein and in the Cash Book all subscriptions and donations, and shall report the same at the next monthly meeting of the Board.
- 87. He shall keep a duplicate or true copy of all letters written on the business of the Hospital, and shall execute all orders he may receive from the Board or the Chairman.
- 88. He shall be in attendance at his office at such times as the Board may from time to time appoint, and such hours shall be posted outside his office and at the Hospital.
- 89. He shall be guaranteed for £100 by some recognised guarantee society, or by some responsible person; the premium for such guarantee to be paid out of the funds of the Hospital.

#### Matron.

- 90. The matron, who shall be a certificated nurse and registered maternity nurse, shall be appointed by the Board of Management, and shall hold office upon such terms as they may direct. She shall reside in the quarters provided for her, and devote her time and attention to the superintendence and general management of the Nursing Staff of the Hospital. She shall also take entire charge of the domestic affairs of the Nurses' Quarters and of the Hospital generally, and have, under the Medical Officer, control over all the nurses and employees attached to the Hospital, and, in case of disobedience of the orders, misconduct, or neglect of duty on the part of any nurse or employee, she shall fully report thereon forthwith to the Medical Officer and House Committee through the secretary. The matron shall also do the ordinary nursing duties of the Hospital, as the Medical Officer may direct.
- Officer may direct.

  91. She shall see that, while on duty, the staff appear in uniforms as follows:—Matron—white; nurses—blue; probationers—grey; housemaids—black, with white apron.
- 92. She shall, on taking charge, check and sign a stock book containing a list of all furniture, bedding, linen, clothing, glass, crockery, cutlery, cookery, and kitchen utensils, etc., and be responsible for same, and

on relinquishing her duties shall hand same to the secretary or her successor, as directed by the Board, fair wear and tear being allowed.

- 93. She shall not be absent from the Hospital without the consent of the Medical Officer or Chairman.
- She shall requisition the Board for clothing, bedding, linen, glass, cutlery, crockery, utensils, and appliances of every kind required for the use of the Hospital. She shall enter them in the Stock Book and be responsible for them.
- 95. She shall be careful to see that all articles of cothing, bedding, etc., are kept in thorough repair and marked, and that all articles of bedding (including mattresses) in use in the wards are frequently changed and aired in the airing grounds provided for such purposes; and that no bedding that has been in use, be stowed away without previous airing; and that no article of the Hospital under her control be lent without the consent of the House Committee.
- 96. She shall inculcate strict economy in the use of fuel, etc., and see that all unnecessary lights are dispensed with during the night, and that order, cleanliness and punctuality prevail throughout the establish-
- 97. She shall be responsible for the internal economy and general management of the Institution, the quality, quantity, and preparation of food; the state of the dormitories, and the comfort generally of the patients.
- 98. In the event of any patient requiring the presence of any minister of religion, she shall take measures to have the request complied with.
- 99. She shall not permit any of the patients to re-ceive unauthorised foods or liquors, and see that all Rules respecting visitors be observed, and not permit provisions or other property to be conveyed away from the Hospital.
- 100. She shall take charge of the private clothes of each patient, and store them up for examination, and if necessary, cause them to be cleaned and disinfected.

  101. She shall always have in readiness a proper
- assortment of bandages, lint, strappings, and other dressings.
- 102. She shall preserve order and decorum in the wards; prohibit conduct and conversation improper, and see that the patients adhere to the Rules.
- 103. She shall not permit strangers or visitors to remain after the usual visiting hours, nor to crowd around any bed, but shall quietly request such visitors to retire; and, if such request is not at once complied with, shall report the same to the Medical Officer.

#### Domestic Staff.

- 104. The wardsman or yardman shall be appointed by the Board of Management. He shall perform such duties as the Medical Officer or officer in charge shall direct, and shall at all times make himself generally useful. His hours of duty shall be arranged by the Medical Officer and he shall be relieved of duty at such times as are convenient to the efficient working of the Institution.
- 105. Domestic employees shall be appointed by the Board of Management. They will perform their duties entirely under the direction of the matron, and will endeavour, by strict obedience, to promote the economic and harmonious working of the demostic parties of the and harmonious working of the domestic portion of the Hospital. The hours of leave shall be at regular intervals, to be determined by the matron: provided always that the efficient working of the Institution is not thereby interfered with. The matron shall have power to dismiss any domestic employee, and may obtain temporary domestic assistance, when such is required, and enter same in her report to the Board of Management.
- All employees shall be entitled to three weeks 106. annual leave on full pay for each completed year of service. Such annual leave must be taken out each year, and at a time approved by the Board of Management.

## Minister of Religion.

- 107. The Hospital must be considered to be strictly unsectarian.
- 108. Ministers of religion shall have free access at all times to patients of their respective denominations, but, prior to entering the ward, must obtain the matron's consent. It is expected that ministers will not remain in any ward when requested to retire during the visit of the Medical Officer or matron. Any minister may attend any patient when requested by such patient.

109. It is also to be insisted upon that ministers of religion, and such other persons as aforesaid, visiting the Hospital for the purpose of administering religious instruction to the patients, shall so conduct their services as not to interfere with the repose and quiet of other patients in the near vicinity.

#### Visitors.

- 110. Not more than two visitors shall be allowed to visit any patient on the same day, without special permission from the Medical Officer of matron. Visitors shall be admitted to see patients daily between the hours of 3 p.m. and 5 p.m., or at other times, by special permission of the Medical Officer or matron.
- 111. All visitors must leave the Hospital as soon as they have seen their friends. No more than one (1) child out of arms shall accompany visitors to see a patient. Patients must retire when requested to do so. The Medical Officer has power to close any ward he may think fit, or to refuse visitors access to any patient.
- 112. Visitors must respectfully and quietly obey the sister or nurse in charge of the ward; be quiet in their movements and conversation, and be careful not to disturb the ward in any way.
- 113. Loitering about the premises and smoking are strictly prohibited.
- 114. Male visitors shall not be admitted to the ward for females without the consent of the nurse in charge.
- 115. Visitors must remain at the bedside of the patient they are visiting. Children in arms shall not be admitted to the Hospital Wards.
- 116. No person shall read aloud, nor conduct public or religious services in the wards of the Hospital.
- 117. No visitor shall be permitted to remain more than half an hour with a patient, without special leave of the Medical Officer.
- Persons wishing to visit the Hospital regularly, or at other times than those assigned to ordinary visi tors, may obtain a special general permission, or make application to the Medical Officer.
- 119. Such special visitors must avoid all religious teachings, except with member of their own denomination, and be generally subject to the Rules under the head of "Minister of Religion."
- 120. The Medical Officer, on complaint being made to him, may prohibit any special visitor from entering the wards, pending an investigation by the House Committee, who shall have power to cancel any permission.

Road Districts (Petrol Pumps) By-laws 1934.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1933," the Governor may make uniform general By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which By-laws may be made under the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make uniform general By-laws relating to the erection and use of Petrol Pumps for the supply of Petrol to the public in or near any street or way, and hereby prescribes that such By-laws shall have the force of law in all Road Districts throughout the State, as follows:—

By-laws for the Erection and Use of Petrol Pumps for the Supply of Petrol to the Public in or near any Street or Way.

In these By-laws the term "owner" means any person who for the time being holds a license from a Board under these By-laws.

- Applications for Licenses to Erect and Use Petrol Pumps, for the Supply of Petrol to the Public in or near any Street or Way.
- 1. No petrol pump used or intended to be used for the delivery of petrol in or near any street or way shall be erected or used by any person before a license is obtained from the Board under these By-laws.

Subject to compliance with these By-laws, such license may be granted on payment of the fee prescribed by these By-laws.

2. Any person desirous of obtaining a license for the erection and use of any petrol pump in or near any street or way shall make application in Form No. 1 in the Schedule to these By-laws, and shall submit with such application a plan and specification showing the construction and location of the pump.

Such person shall, if required by the Board, give a practical demonstration of the working of the pump under installation conditions.

Where a type of pump has already been approved by the Board in connection with some other application, it shall not be necessary to submit plans and specification with every application to instal a similar type of pump.

A license shall be in the Form No. 2 in the Schedule.

3. The Board may in its absolute discretion, and on the written application of the licensee, transfer a license to the person named in such application, on payment of a fee of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.)

Construction and Maintenance, etc., of such Pumps.

- 4. All fittings and pipes connecting such petrol pump with the supply tank, and all other pipes or fittings through which the petrol flows, shall be constructed and maintained in such a manner that there shall be no escape of petrol in the form of liquid or vapour therefrom.
- 5. All tanks used to supply petrol to pumps shall be fitted with a ventilating pipe, which shall be carried to an approved position in the open air not less than 12 feet above the ground, and shall there terminate in one or more bends, the opening in the end of the ventpipe to be covered with brass wire gauze of not less than 28 meshes to the lineal inch, secured in such manner that the gauze may be removed for examination and cleaning.
- 6. Petrol pumps shall be erected only in such positions in or near any street or way as may be approved by the Board.

## By-laws for Safe Working.

- 7. All petrol delivered to a tank serving a petrol pump, the intake of which is in, on or over a public place, shall be delivered through an approved pipe designed and sufficient to prevent the escape of petrol or vapour.
- 8. No petrol shall be allowed to remain in the visible (or measuring) container of any petrol pump, except at such times as the discharge device is in actual operation of being filled or discharged.
- 9. No person shall deliver petrol, or permit petrol to be delivered from any pump to the fuel tank of any motor vehicle when the engine of such motor vehicle is running.
- 10. No person shall use any petrol pump whilst there is any light capable of igniting petrol vapour within ten feet of any container while the same is being filled with petrol from any pump.
- 11. No person shall negligently permit any petrol to escape from the discharge or delivery pipes attached to a petrol pump into any street or other public place.
- 12. The owner of every petrol pump shall erect in a conspicuous position on or near such pump a notice containing the undermentioned words, of such form and size as may be approved by the Board:—

#### "NO SMOKING."

## "STOP YOUR ENGINE."

# "KEEP ACETYLENE AND OTHER FLAME LIGHTS AWAY."

- 13. The owner or operator of any petrol pump shall at all times take all reasonable precautions to protect all persons and property from injury or damage.
- 14. All petrol pumps creeted before gazettal of these By-laws shall conform to the Board's requirements under these By-laws, within six months of notice of

- such requirements being served upon the owner or user of such pumps. Where such owner or user fails to comply with such requirements of the Board, the pump may be removed by the Board at the expense of such owner or user.
- 15. An Inspector appointed by the Board, with the approval of the Government Inspector of Explosives, shall have the right at all reasonable times during ordinary working hours of business to make an inspection of premises used for the delivery of petrol, including all petrol pumps and fittings, in order to ascertain whether these By-laws are being observed.
- 16. The fee payable under these By-laws shall be One pound (£1) per annum at each service station irrespective of the number of pumps licensed.
- 17. Any person who by act or omission commits a breach of these By-laws shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
- 18. These By-laws may be cited as the Road Districts (Petrol Pumps) By-laws, 1934.

# THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1906. City of Fremantle.

#### Hawkers.

P.W. 490/24.

A By-law of the City of Fremantle, Numbered 9, made under and pursuant to Sections 179 and 181 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," prescribing the conditions upon which fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, vegetables, and articles of merchandise may be hawked, and prohibiting the hawking of same in certain prescribed streets, ways, and public places within the City of Fremantle.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and of all other powers them enabling, the Mayor and Councillors of the City of Fremantle order as follows:—

(1) All By-laws heretofore made relating to the bawking of fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, vegetables, and articles of merchandise are hereby repealed.

- (2) No person shall hawk fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, vegetables, or articles of merchandise in or within any of the following streets or places within the City of Fremantle:—(a) High Street from Cliff Street to Parry Street; (b) Market Street; (c) Adelaide Street; (d) South Terrace, from Market Street to the Southern boundary of Norfolk Street; (e) Reserve No. 12477, known as South Beach Reserve; (f) Mandurah Road, from Douro Road to the Southern boundary of Island Street; (g) Douro Road, Scott Street and Island Street, from Mandurah Road to the sea; (h) Marine Terrace, from Scott Street to the Southern boundary of Douro Road; (i) Fremantle Suburban Lots 85 and 1709.
- (3) No person shall hawk fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, vegetables or articles of merchandise in any streets, or in or within any place or places in the City of Fremantle, in or within which the hawking whereaf is not prohibited by this By-law, unless licensed in accordance with this By-law so to do.
- (4) Every person desirous of obtaining a license for the hawking of fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, vegetables, or articles of merchandise shall make application in writing in approved form to and shall submit for the approval of the Town Clerk the eart, dray, wagon, barrow, truck, motor, or other vehicle, pack, or basket proposed to be used for that purpose, and obtain the approval in writing of the Town Clerk for the use thereof, and no licensed person shall, without the like approval, use any other eart, dray, wagon, barrow, truck, motor, or other vehicle, pack, or basket, or any approved eart, dray, wagon, barrow, truck, motor, or other vehicle, pack, or basket after any alteration thereto, without first having obtained the sanction of the Town Clerk to such use or alteration.
- (5) Every licensed person shall have and keep exposed to public view, while hawking on his licensed cart, dray, wagon, barrow, truck, motor or other vehicle, pack or basket his name and license number, and the words "Licensed Hawker" painted in legible and conspicuous Roman letters not less than one inch in length and of corresponding width.
- (6) No licensed hawker shall stand in any street, way, thoroughfare, or public place for the purpose of plying his trade or calling without first obtaining leave of the Town Clerk.
- (7) The Town Clerk may in his discretion refuse to grant a hawker's license or a renewal thereof, and in so doing shall not be compelled to give to such person any reason for such refusal.
- (8) No unlicensed person shall, within the City of Fremantle, hawk any fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, vegetables, or articles of merchandise, or expose any name on any cart, dray, wagon, barrow, truck, motor, or other vehicle, pack, or basket purporting to be the name of a licensed person.
- (9) Every licensed person shall on application show to any Inspector or other officer of the Municipality or Police Constable, on demand, his license for hawking.
- (10) Every licensed person hawking fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, vegetables, or articles of merchandise shall carry with him in a convenient place a suitable weighing instrument or measure, with the necessary weights for weighing the same, and shall, when requested by a purchaser, weigh or measure any article sold by weight or measure purchased by him in his presence.
- (11) Every Hawker's License shall be in the form or to the effect following:—

# HAWKER'S LICENSE.

This License shall remain in force until the.......... day of......and no longer.

This License is issued subject to By-law No. 9 of the City of Fremantle, and such By-laws as are now or may hereafter be in force.

This License does not entitle the owner thereof to hawk within the undermentioned streets or places, namely:—High Street from Cliff Street to Parry Street; Market Street; Adelaide Street; South Terrace, from Market Street to the Southern boundary of

#### Schedule of Fees.

For hawking fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, vegetables, or articles of merchandise—If with dray, wagon, truck, cart, motor or other vehicle (other than a motor cycle and side car), whether drawn by horse, motive or other power—7s. 6d. per month.

If with motor cycle and side car, cart, or barrow or truck drawn by hand—5s. per month. If in basket or pack carried by hand—2s. 6d. per month.

(14) Every person offending against any provision of this By-law shall forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
