WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is pro-vided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—(a) the Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliacause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parlia-ment a proposal for such revocation; (b) after such proposal has been laid before Parliament, the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication: And whereas His Excellency the Lieu-tenant-Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposals dated the Thir-teenth day of December, 1932, and the First day of November, 1933, for the revocation in part of the dedi-cation of Crown lands as State Forest: And whereas, after such proposals had been laid before Parliament. after such proposals had been laid before Parliament, after such proposals had been laid before Parliament, resolutions were passed by both Houses that such pro-posals should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forests Nos. 4, 15, and 33, by excising those portions of such State Forests as are described in the Schedule hereto.



### Buckland Hill Road Board.

#### River Foreshore By-laws.

P.W. 830/26.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919-33," the Board of any Road District is empowered to make Bylaws for all or any purpose in the said Act mentioned, the Buckland Hill Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:-

#### Interpretation.

1. "Foreshore" shall mean that portion of the Swan River Foreshore, in Buckland Hill, on, and/or adjacent to Reserve A1634 and Johnson Parade, between Johnstone Street on the North and Mosman Bay Jetty on the South.

"Board" shall mean the Buckland Hill Road Board. "Jetty" shall mean the Jetty at Buckland Hill on and extending into the Swan River, Mosman Bay, from Reserve A1634.

"Proper Bathing Costume" shall mean a costume covering the body from the shoulders to the thighs, with an overpiece or skirt extending from the hips to a point half way between the hips and the knees, and which shall be composed of wool or wool and cotton mixture.

"Reserve" shall mean any portion of the Reserves above-mentioned.

2. No person shall pry into or over, or enter any lavatory, bathing shed, or building or portion of a building, crected upon the Reserve or the Foreshore expressly reserved for the use of the opposite sex.

3. No person shall break, injure, pull up, or destroy any tree, shrub, or grass growing on the Reserve or the Foreshore.

4. No person shall place or break, or permit to be placed or broken, any glass, metal, bottle or utensils on the Reserve or the Foreshore, and no person shall deposit or leave any rubbish, refuse, paper, broken glass, china, or litter of any kind thereon, except in receptacles provided for that purpose.

5. No person shall, without the written consent of the Board, remove any sand, soil, or stone from the Reserve or the Foreshore.

6. No person shall, either upon the Reserve or the Foreshore or the Jetty, without the written consent of the Board–

- (a) in any way damage, alter, or interfere with the electric light fittings, or electrical equipment; (b) sell or offer or expose for sale any goods or mer-
- chandise;
- (e) alter, deface, or remove from its position any notice board or other sign erected by the Board;
  (d) carry or discharge auy firearm, or throw or discharge aux firearm.
- charge any stone or other missile.

7. No person shall cause or permit any dog of which he is the owner as defined by Section 4 of "The Dog Act, 1903-28," or of which for the time being he has control, to be on that portion of the Foreshore between Johnstone Street on the North and Mosman Bay Jetty on the South, between the hours of 11 a.m. and 10 p.m. Any dog found on the Foreshore or Reserve in contra-vention of this By-law may be destroyed or sold in accordance with the provisions of "The Dag Act, 1903-28."

8. Every person on the Foreshore shall, when not at-tired in ordinary apparel, wear a proper bathing costume, and every person on any portion of the Reserve (other than the Foreshore) when not attired in ordinary apparel, shall wear, in addition to a proper bathing cosnature, which shall completely cover the body.

9. (a) The Board may appoint any servant of the Board an Inspector under this By-law.

(b) Every constable or officer of police shall have the powers of an Inspector under this By-law.

(c) Every inspector may demand the name and ad-dress of any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law, and such person shall comply with such demand.

(d) No person shall obstruct or hinder any inspector in the performance of his duties or in the exercise of his power.

(e) The Board shall supply each inspector with a written appointment, under the seal of the Board. Every inspector, when on duty, shall produce his written ap-pointment, if demanded of him when exercising authority under this By-law. The production of such written authority shall be prima facie evidence of the appointment of the person producing same.

10. Any person attempting to do any of the things expressly or impliedly forbidden in the By-law shall be liable to a punishment as if he had committed the offence.

11. Every person offending against any provision of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.





WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919-33," the Board of any Road District is empowered to make be Board of any Road District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purpose in the said Act men-tioned, the Buekland Hill Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By low: the following By-laws:

#### Interpretation.

(a) The word "Fish" shall include fish, whether 1. fresh, salt, smoked or dried, oysters, crayfish, crabs, (b) The word "Stall" shall mean a movable or tem-

porarily fixed stall, hand-cart and barrow for the sale of any meat, fish, poultry, game, fruit, vegotables, drink, eatables, or other articles of merchandise. (e) The word "Stall-keeper" shall mean any person who keeps and conducts a stall, and shall include any

person who assists in the keeping and conducting of a stall, or in the sale of articles of merchandise from a stall.

"The Board" shall mean the Buckland Hill (d) Road Board.

(c) "The Secretary" shall mean the secretary or acting secretary of the Buckland Hill Road Board.
(f) "Inspector" shall mean and include any person

appointed by the Board as an inspector, and any acting (g) "District" shall mean and include the whole

of the Buckland Hill Road District.

2. No person shall hawk any meat, fish, poultry came, fruit and vegetables, or any article of merchandise, or keep or conduct any movable or temporarily fixed stall, or assist in the keeping and conducting of any stall, or in the sale of any article of merchandise from any stall, in or near any street or way, for the sion any stan, in or near any street or way, for the sale of any meat, fish, poultry, game, fruit, vegetables, drink, eatables, or any article of merchandise within any section of the District, unless and until he shall have applied for and obtained a license from the Board.

3. Every person who wishes to obtain a hawker's or stall-keeper's license shall apply to the secretary therefor, stating the term and kind of merchandise for which he desires to be licensed. The granting or refusing of a license shall be in the absolute discretion of the Board and, when granted, shall be not transferable. The Board may refuse to grant à license for any reason it may see fit. Licenses shall be in such one of the forms set out in Schedule A hereto as shall be applicable, and shall be issued on payment of such fees as are set forth in Schedule B hereto.

4. Every stall-keeper taking up a position on a stand shall take up such a position thereon as shall be allotted to him by the inspector.

5. No stall-keeper shall take up a position, or allow his vehicle to be or remain upon any stand, except be-tween the hours of 7 a.m. and 11.30 p.m.

6. No stall-keeper, whilst upon any stand, shall deposit or store any box or basket under his vehicle, or on the roadway or footpath.

7. No stall-keeper, whilst upon any stand, shall shout his wares, or make any violent outery, noise or disturb-ance to the annoyance of the inhabitants or of persons 8. Every stall-keeper taking up a position on a stand

shall place and keep his vehicle or stall parallel to the kerb, and in such a position that the distance between the kerb and his vehicle or stall shall not exceed one foot.

9. No stall-keeper, whilst upon any stand, shall place or allow to remain on his vehicle or stall any flag or streamer.

10. No person licensed to hawk shall take up a position in any street or public place for the purpose of soliciting custom, or shall remain stationary at any one spot in any street or public place for a longer period than shall be necessary for the purpose of serving a

than shall be necessary for the purpose of serving a customer then offering to buy. 11. Every hawker, whilst plying his trade, and every stall-keeper, whilst on his appointed stand, shall have his name, the number of his license, and the words 'Licensed Hawker'' or 'Licensed Stall-keeper,'' as the case may be, legibly painted on some conspicuous part of his eart haven before which have made of his cart, barrow, basket, vehicle, bundle, bag, package, tray or stall. 12. Every hawker, whilst plying his trade, and every

stall-keeper, whilst upon his appointed stand, shall earry with him his license, and shall at all times pro-duce the same, on demand, to the inspector or secretary of the Board or police officer.

13. Should the inspector at any time be of opinion that it is necessary to move any stall-keeper from any appointed stand or place, it shall be lawful for him to direct the said stall-keeper to move to any place he shall decen fit, and any stall-keeper who shall refuse to obey such directions shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

14. Every stall-keeper standing on any appointed stand shall at all times act under the direction of the inspector, and any stall-keeper who refuses to obey such instructions shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

15. Where anything by these By-laws is directed to be done or forbidden to be done, or where authority is given to the inspector or secretary to direct anything to be done or to forbid anything to be done, and such act so directed to be done remains undone, or such act forbidden to be done is done, in every such case the person making such default as to such direction and prohibition respectively shall be deemed guilty of a breach of these By-laws; and every person guilty of a breach of these By-laws shall be liable for every such offence, besides any cost which may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person guilty of such offence, as well as costs or expenses which may be incurred in the execution of the work directed to be so executed and not so executed to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

16. The secretary or inspector appointed by the Board may demand from and require any individual, committing or suspected of committing any offence against or breach of these By-laws, his name and address, and every person who shall neglect or refuse to give his name and address, when required so to do, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
