WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation declare, inter alia, that any Western Australian waters shall be closed against the taking of any prescribed species of fish by any means whatever, or against fishing generally by any method of capture, during any specified time in any year: And whereas it is desirable that the waters of the Capel River should be declared closed against the taking of English Perch: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:—

That the waters of the Capel River shall be closed against the taking of English Perch by any method of capture whatever from the 1st day of June, 1934, until the 30th day of September, 1934.

The Financial Emergency Tax Assessment Act, No. 20 of 1932.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council has been pleased to make Regulations as follows, under the provisions of the Financial Emergency Tax Assessment Act, No. 20 of 1932, and the Financial Emergency Tax Assessment Act Amendment Act, No. 15 of 1933; to take effect from date hereunder.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE FINANCIAL EMERGENCY TAX ASSESS-MENT ACT, 1932 (No. 20 of 1932), AND THE FINANCIAL EMERGENCY TAX ASSESSMENT ACT AMENDMENT ACT (No. 15 of 1933).

Commencement.

1. These Regulations will come into force on publication thereof in the Government Gazette.

Short Title.

2. These Regulations may be cited as "The Financial Emergency Tax Assessment Act Regulations."

Interpretation.

3. These Regulations shall be construed with reference to the terms and interpretations of the Financial Emergency Tax Assessment Act, No. 20 of 1932, which Act is referred to hereunder as "the Act."

Definition.

- 4. In these Regulations—
 - "Casual employee" means an employee who performs work for any less period than one week or who works broken periods of less than one week for one or more employer at different times in the one week.
 - "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Taxation.
 - "Contract" means an agreement or mutual promise, written or verbal, upon lawful consideration or cause which binds the parties to a performance.
 - "Employer" means a person who employs clerks, workmen, or other persons, working for salaries or wages, fees or other remuneration.
 - "Members of a family" meaning wife or husband, father, mother, grandfather, grandmother, step-father, step-mother, son, daughter, legitimate son, legitimate daughter, grandson, granddaughter, step-son, step-daughter, brother, sister, half-brother, half-sister, and, with respect to an illegitimate person, includes his mother, and his brothers and sisters, whether legitimate or illegitimate by the same father and mother
 - "Old age and invalid pension" means an old age or invalid pension under "The Invalid and Old Age Pension Act, 1908."
 - "Payment" includes the value of a thing given other than money in discharge of a debt.
 - "Salary" and/or "wages" include all emoluments such as directors' fees, commission, overtime, higher duties allowance, child endowment and district and other allowances, but not including travelling and motor car allowances.
 - "Taxpayer" means a person liable for taxation under the Act.

Exemptions, Section 4.

- 5. Every person-
 - (a) in receipt of old age and invalid pension; or
 - (b) in receipt of salary or wages under thirty shillings a week and having no other source of income; or
 - (c) whose income, including salary or wages (if any) is under seventy-eight pounds a year; or

- (d) in receipt of a salary or wage under one pound a week, plus board and lodging;
- (e) in receipt of salary or wages of thirty shillings a week but under three pounds ten shillings a week, and having no other source of income, or in receipt of income, including salary or wages of seventy-eight pounds a year but under one hundred and eighty-two pounds a year, who proves to the satisfaction of the Commissioner that they are regularly maintaining or contributing to the maintenance of one or more members of their family who is or are resident and domiciled in Western Australia; or
- (f) being a racing club, which is not established or carried on for the pecuniary benefit of the individual members thereof,

shall be exempt from liability to pay tax;

Provided also, that in assessing the amounts liable to tax-

- (i) pension granted for war service and paid by the Commonwealth Government shall not be taken into account; and
- (ii) board and lodging supplied by an employer to his employee who is receiving wages in cash not less than one pound a week shall be deemed to be equivalent to additional wages at the rate of one pound a week;
- (iii) the board and lodgings also supplied to the employee's wife and dependent children shall be assessed to the employee at the values assessed under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1932";
- (iv) board and lodging supplied by an employer and valued by him at less than one pound per week shall be taken into consideration at the value assessed by the employer;
- (v) when board only is supplied by an employer it shall, for the purposes of the Act, be valued at thirteen shillings per week, and, when lodging only is supplied by the employer, it shall be valued at seven shillings per week.

Provided also, that a person in receipt of payments from a superannuation fund to which he has contributed, shall be exempt from liability to taxation under the Act in respect of a proportionate part of each payment received by him as aforesaid in ratio to the amount of his contribution to such superannuation fund.

It is further provided that persons claiming exemption from payment of tax under Subclause (e) of this Regulation are required to fill in Form F.E. No. 4 of Schedule 1.

Regulations "Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1932," Section 5.

Tax in respect of Income.

6. Subject to any express provisions of the Act and these Regulations the provisions of the Regulations under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1932," and any amendment thereof, as in force immediately preceding the date of these Regulations relating to assessment and collection of income tax shall, with all necessary modifications, apply to and in respect of the assessment and collection of tax under the Act.

Notice to make Returns, Section 7.

7. Public notice shall be given in the Government Gazette annually of the time and place at which all persons liable to taxation under the Act personally or in any representative capacity shall furnish returns for the purpose of assessment, and returns shall be in the Form F.E. 5 of Schedule 1.

Provided that any person who has furnished an Income Tax return under the Land and Income Tax Assessment Act or a return under "The Hospital Fund Act, 1930," for the year ended 30th June, 1932, or any subsequent year, shall not be required to furnish a return of income under the Act.

Tax in respect of Income exempt from Taxation, Section 7.

8. If any person, other than a salary or wage earner, is not required to furnish an income tax return to the Commissioner of Taxation for the purpose of assessment under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1932," of his income for the year ended the 30th day of June, 1932, or a return under "The Hospital Fund Act, 1930-1," or any subsequent year, on the ground that his income is of such amount, or is derived from such a source as to be exempt from income tax or Hospital Fund contribution, or for any other reason, such person shall furnish a return of his income for 30th June, 1932, on Form F.E. No. 5 of Schedule 1, to the Commissioner of Taxation not later than the 31st of March, 1933, or for any subsequent year on or before the 31st day of August.

Return of Income, Section 7,

9. A return of income by any taxpayer, except where the return has been lodged for the purpose of assessment under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1932," or "The Hospital Fund Act, 1930-1," shall be on the Form F.E. No. 5, in Schedule 1, and shall be furnished at the time and place prescribed in the notice given in accordance with Regulations 7 and 8.

Special Returns.

10. The Commissioner may at any time accept a return or notice in a form substantially similar to the prescribed form.

Taxpayers to take necessary steps for Lodgment of Returns.

11. Whenever a taxpayer is required by the Act, the Regulations, or the Commissioner to furnish a return to the Commissioner, it shall be the duty of that taxpayer to make the required return, and to take all steps necessary to insure that the return is received by the Commissioner at the place where under these Regulations the return is to be furnished.

Addresses of Taxpayers.

- 12. (a) Every taxpayer shall, upon every return, give an address in Western Australia for service of Notice of Assessment, and shall from time to time give notice to the Commissioner of any change in his address within one calendar month after such change, and, in default, shall not be permitted to avail himself of the fact of such change of address in defence in any proceedings which may be instituted against him for any breach of the Act or Regulations.
- (b) For the purpose of any notice under the Act or these Regulations, where not otherwise provided, the address given by any taxpayer in accordance with the Regulation shall be deemed to be his last known place of business or abode, as the case may be.

Returns to be signed by Taxpayer.

13. Every return shall be signed by the taxpayer or by some person authorised by the taxpayer in that behalf, or, in the case of a company, by the public officer nominated under Section 45 of "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1932." If the taxpayer is unable to write his name his signature shall be made by a mark attested by a witness.

Instructions may be Indorsed.

14. Such instructions and observations as the Commissioner may think fit may be indersed or noted on any form of return, and reference to such instructions or observations may be inserted in the form or appended thereto.

Notice of Assessment under Section 5.

15. The notice of assessment of Financial Emergency Tax shall be in the Form F.E. No. 1, Schedule 1.

Tax in respect of Income, Section 5.

- 16. In cases in which an employed person returns income from investments or a business, or any other source except salary or wages, an assessment must be issued on such income separately. The net income liable for taxation shall be the income chargeable as assessed under the Land and Income Tax Assessment Act after adding thereto deductions allowed for—(a) general exemption; (b) repairs to dwelling-house; (c) premium of life insurance or fidelity bond; (d) medical expenses; (e) travelling expenses (including members of Parliament allowances); (f) children; (g) dependants; (h) capital expenditure on a mining tenement; or (i) gifts; (k) rates and taxes, except rates and taxes paid on property used in the production of income.
 - (a) Tax under the Act shall be payable in each year of assessment under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1932," and shall be calculated on and payable in respect of the income of the taxpayer for the year next preceding the year of assessment.

Provided also that where a person is subject to taxation on a salary or wage under Section 9 of the Act, and has paid tax under that section, he shall receive credit for the amount of tax so paid from the amount of the assessment on his total income, including salary or wages under Section 5.

(b) Any person who has furnished to the Commissioner of Taxation an Income Tax return under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1932," for the year ended 30th June, 1932, or any subsequent year, and has not included in that return income that is exempt from income tax, but which is subject to tax under the Act, shall immediately notify the Commissioner in writing, or furnish a return to him under the Act, of the total amount of such income.

Any person failing to comply with this Regulation is liable to a penalty of not exceeding twenty pounds.

Default Assessments, Section 6.

17. If an assessment is made by the Commissioner of Taxation under Section 43 of "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1932" (assessment in case of default) tax in respect of the income of any person so assessed shall be due to the Department and payable to the Commissioner of Taxation on behalf of the Department, and Section 5 of the Act shall apply.

Minimum Assessments-Method of issue-Due date of Payment.

18. No assessment of less than one shilling and fourpence shall issue, and no assessment under two shillings shall issue where the person is not assessed for State income tax. All assessments under the Act shall issue at the same time as assessments for income tax under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1932," or dividend duty under "The Dividend Duties Act, 1902." All assessments under the Act shall be due and payable on the date shown on the notice of assessment.

Postage to be prepaid.

19. Postage on every return, statement, communication, remittance, or other matter sent by post addressed to the Commissioner shall be fully prepaid by the sender.

Copies of Returns.

20. A copy of or extract from a return of any taxpayer may, subject to the approval of the Commissioner, and upon payment of the prescribed fee (one shilling), be supplied only to the taxpayer himself, or to some person authorised by the taxpayer in writing in that behalf.

Payment of Tax.

- 21. An employer may pay the tax where deducted, other than by means of adhesive stamps, in any of the following ways:—
 - (a) By delivery of cash, bank notes, or cheques to the Commissioner, at the Taxation Department, G.P.O. Buildings, Forrest Place, Perth.
 - (b) By remitting the tax to the Commissioner by bank draft or cheque, or postal money order or postal note, payable in the city to which the remittance is sent.
 - (c) By depositing the net amount of the tax to the credit of the State Commissioner of Taxation at any branch of the Commonwealth Bank in Western Australia, or by paying the tax to any State Department.

All tax in respect of salaries and wages paid must be remitted to the Commissioner of Taxation within seven days of such payment, or within seven days of the end of each month, in those cases where the Commissioner has approved of monthly remittances.

Post Office to be Agent of Remitter.

22. When a remittance is posted by a taxpayer addressed to the State Commissioner, the Post Office shall be deemed to be the agent of the remitter, and payment shall not be deemed to have been made until the remittance has been received by the addressee. All remittances must be accompanied by a memorandum signed by the employer or his authorised agent, giving the period of payment of wages, number of taxpayers (employees), and total amount of wages paid, and upon which the tax is levied.

Payment by Cheque.

23. When a cheque has been delivered or remitted to the Commissioner in payment of tax, the tax shall (notwithstanding any receipt given therefore) not be deemed to have been paid until the amount of the cheque has been collected.

Receipts to be Issued.

24. Receipts for tax shall be issued by such person as the Commissioner may authorise, and shall be in the Form F.E. No. 2, Schedule 1.

Part Payment not to be Accepted.

25. Except with the express consent of the Commissioner, no money shall be accepted on account or in part payment of the tax.

Insufficient Postage.

26. When any sum is received as payment of tax, the Commissioner shall first deduct therefrom the amount of postage and surcharge (if any) paid upon any unstamped or insufficiently stamped matter received through the post from the taxpayer, and shall credit in payment of the tax only the net amount then remaining.

Tax in respect of Salary and Wages.

27. For the purpose of paragraph (c), (i) and (ii) of Section 9 of the Act, any person paying salary or wages may select the method of collection, either by means of adhesive stamps of the requisite value attached to the pay-sheet, or by deducting from the salary or wages payable by him contributions to the Fund and paying as prescribed to the Commissioner, and once the method of collection has been selected or adopted, no departure from the said method can be allowed without the express permission of the Commissioner.

Drawings by Principals and Partners not Liable.

28. Drawings by the principal or partners in any business, either as salary or wages, or in anticipation of profits, shall not be liable for tax under Section 9 of the Act, but will be assessed by the Commissioner under Section 5, in conjunction with the other income of the business.

Adhesive Stamps.

29. The adhesive stamps to be used in connection with deductions of tax under the Act shall be of the form and size as prescribed in Schedule 3; such stamps shall be printed by the Government Printer only.

State Treasurer to Issue Stamps.

30. The State Under Treasurer for the time being shall be the only person authorised to control and issue on the part of the Commissioner stamps for sale to persons authorised to sell stamps by the State Under Treasurer or the State Commissioner of Taxation.

All advances for stamps shall be properly recorded, and shall be balanced monthly. A remittance of the value of stamps sold shall accompany every application for fresh supply or recoup of the stamps sold.

Collection of Tax from Casual Employees.

- 31. Every casual employee (see definition of "Casual employee") shall keep a casual employee's wages book, and every employer of a "casual employee" shall see that payment of tax is made by means of adhesive stamps of the requisite value, to be affixed to the casual employee's wages book where—
 - (a) any payment amounts to 30s. or over, either at a daily or weekly rate or a lump sum in a nature of a contract; or
 - (b) £1 per week or over, plus any remuneration by way of sustenance (board and lodging).

Such wages book, in the Form F.E. No. 6 of Schedule 1, will be supplied by the Department on application, or may be obtained from any clerk of court.

Where any payment without board and lodging amounts to less than thirty shillings per week, no tax is due, but where the payments in any week amount to one pound, and, in addition thereto, board and lodging is received, adhesive stamps of the requisite value of the aggregate of any casual labour during any week must be attached at the termination thereof. For example—Where an employee, such as a gardener or charwoman, is employed by several employers, and where the weekly or periodical payment for wages totals thirty shillings per week or more, such employee shall keep the prescribed book in which all payments for wages shall be entered, and the employee shall affix Financial Emergency stamps to the value applicable to the total payments received during the week, and shall cancel such stamps by initialing and dating the face thereof.

Note.—Any ordinary memorandum book may be used for the purpose of this regulation. The wages book must be kept written up and stamped up to date, and must be produced to any inspector appointed under this Act when demanded.

Cancellation of adhesive Stamps.

32. All adhesive stamps attached to wages sheets, wages books, receipts, or other documents, and used in payment of tax, shall be cancelled by the employer, employee or paying officer by writing his name or initials and correct date of writing across the face of the stamps. Any person authorised by the Minister or the Commissioner may cancel stamps used in respect to the payment of tax.

Failure to cancel involves a penalty of twenty pounds.

Overlapping of Stamps.

When attaching adhesive stamps to wages sheets, wages books, receipts or other documents, they shall be so attached that one stamp does not overlap another for more than half the length of the stamp.

Fractional Tax.

Stamping of Salary and Wages Sheets, Wages Books, etc.

34. Where two or more employees are engaged by an employer it shall not be necessary for the employer to attach to the salary or wages sheet, receipt, or salary or wages book signed by each employee a stamp for the amount of each employee's tax, but stamps to the aggregate value of the total tax of all the employees may be attached to the salary or wages sheets, receipt, or salary or wages book (for example see Schedule 2).

Payments in respect of Contracts, Section 9, Subsection (3).

35. All payments in respect to any contract for work done or labour performed, including clearing, shearing, droving, and carting made by any person shall be deemed to be wages within the meaning of the Act. Every person making such payments shall deduct the amount of the tax due thereon, and shall pay the amount of such tax to the Commissioner of Taxation in the manner prescribed, or he may purchase Financial Emergency Tax stamps to the value of such tax and attach the stamps to the receipts, wages sheets, wages book, or other document in use, and shall cancel the stamps in the manner prescribed.

In respect to contracts for shearing, the following deductions shall be allowed from each payment made by the employer or other person making such payments to:—Shearers, 3s. 6d. in the £; shed hands, 2.0d. in the £ (adults); shed hands, 3.0d. in the £ (18 to 21 years); shed hands, 2.6d. in the £ (under 18 years); pressers, 2.0d. in the £; cooks, 2.0d. in the £.

Where a lump sum is paid by a pastoralist, farmer, or any other person to a contractor who employs a number of shearers and other men in the shearing of sheep, and that contractor is unable to produce evidence from the Commissioner that he has furnished an income tax return, a return under this Act or "The Hospital Fund Act, 1930-1," deductions of tax must be made by the pastoralists, etc., but no deduction for expenses is to be allowed to the contractor beyond the deductions mentioned in the previous paragraph.

In respect to contracts for earting of super, wheat oats, and other farm produce by a carting contractor, where the contractor produces evidence that he has furnished an income tax return or an income return under the Act or the Hospital Fund Act, and produces a certificate of exemption from taxation under Section 9 of the Act, no deduction of tax shall be made from the payments made to the contractor. The number of the certificate of exemption from payment of tax under Section 9 of the Act must be quoted against every payment made to the contractor. In all other cases a deduction of 4d. in the £ must be made from the gross amount paid under the contract.

Financial Emergency Tax must, however, be deducted by the contractor when paying wages, etc., to any of his employees.

Any contractor claiming deduction for expenses beyond those covered by these Regulations, and allowable as a deduction from payments made, must make application for same to the Commissioner of Taxation at the time of furnishing his income tax return or a return of income under the Act.

(a) Where any employer (person, firm, or company) paying commission regularly to a number of agents or other persons, desires exemption from collecting the tax at the time of payment of the commission, such employer may furnish to the Commissioner a list of the names, occupations, and addresses of the persons to whom commission is payable, and the Commissioner, on being satisfied that the persons receiving commission have furnished an income return under the Act or "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1932," or "The Hospital Fund Act, 1930-31," may, in his discretion, grant to such employer exemption from liability to deduct tax under Section 9 of the Act. (Form F.E. No. 3, Schedule 1.)

Each certificate of exemption granted under this Regulation shall be numbered, and such number shall be quoted against every payment made for commission to the persons mentioned in such certificate.

Use of Adhesive Stamps for payment of Emergency Tax and Hospital Contributions.

(b) Care must be exercised in seeing that only Financial Emergency Tax Stamps are used for payment of tax where tax is payable under Section 9 of the Act. Hospital Fund Stamps must not on any account be used for this purpose, nor must Financial Emergency Tax Stamps be used in connection with payment of Hospital Fund contributions.

Payment of Tax by Cash or Cheque.

(c) Where an employer elects to pay Financial Emergency Tax and Hospital Fund Contribution by each or cheque to the Commissioner of Taxation, or to any officer authorised by him to collect tax, he shall forward with each remittance a correct statement of the total amount of salary and wages paid and on which Financial Emergency Tax and Hospital Fund contribution have been calculated, and the amount of tax and Hospital contribution deducted.

Tax payable by Companies, Section 8.

36. Every company subject to "The Dividend Duties Act, 1902," and amendments thereto shall, as and when every payment of duty under "The Dividend Duties Act, 1902," and amendments thereto, is payable to the Commissioner of Taxation, in addition to the duty payable under that Act, make a payment of tax at the rate in the pound fixed by Parliament in respect to every pound of its profits as assessed under the Act.

In the case of a life assurance company, it shall be assessed at the rate in the pound fixed by Parliament on the amount of interest received from its investments.

Other insurance companies shall be assessed at the rate fixed by Parliament in respect of every three pounds two shillings and sixpence of the premiums received by the company after any allowance for reinsurances paid away.

Provided that income (in the nature of dividends) received by any person in respect of shares in any company that has duly paid tax shall be exempt from tax, but this exemption shall not apply to persons resident in Western Australia and receiving dividends from companies incorporated and carrying on business in the other States of the Commonwealth or from ex-Australian companies. All such dividends are liable to tax under the Act.

Exemptions under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1932."

- 37. The following incomes, revenues, and funds exempt under the Land and Income Tax Assessment Act shall be exempt from tax under the Act—
 - (1) The revenue of municipal corporations, road boards, or other statutory public bodies;
 - (2) The incomes of life assurance companies and of companies or societies not carrying on business for purposes of profit or gain; but this exemption shall not apply to incomes derived from interest on investments;
 - (3) The dividends and profits of the Government Savings Bank and the Agricultural Bank;
 - (4) The funds and incomes of any registered friendly society or trade or industrial union;
 - (5) The incomes and revenues of all ecclesiastical, charitable, and educational institutions of a public character, whether supported wholly or partly, or not at all, by grants from the Consolidated Revenue Fund;
 - (6) The income derived or received by or on behalf of the Governor in respect of the salary and emoluments of his office;
 - (7) Any pension received by a person for injuries while on active service in the naval or military forces during the present war or any pension paid to the widow, relatives, or dependants of a deceased soldier or sailor killed during the war, or who had died from injuries received, or sickness contracted, during the war, or any pensioner under "The Invalid and Old Age Pensions Act, 1908";
 - (8) The income of any society or association not carried on for the purposes of profit or gain to the individual members thereof established for the purpose of promoting the development of the agricultural, pastoral, horticultural, viticultural, stock-raising, manufacturing, or industrial resources of Western Australia.

- (9) The income of any society or association of a public character established for the promotion of scientific research;
- (10) The cash allowances paid and the bonus shares allotted to shareholders of any co-operative company or society as a rebate or discount on their trading with such companies or societies.

Service of Notices.

- 38. Any notice or other document, the service of which is not elsewhere provided for, shall be deemed to be served on the taxpayer by or on behalf of the Commissioner when service is effected—
 - (a) by delivering it to him personally;
 - (b) by leaving it at his address in accordance with Regulation 12 (a) and(b);
 - (c) by posting it in a letter addressed to him in accordance with the said Regulation 12 (a) and (b).

Any notice to be given by the Commissioner may be given by any officer of the Commissioner duly authorised in that behalf, and any notice purporting to be signed by the authority of the Commissioner shall be valid and effectual for all purposes as if signed by the Commissioner in person.

Onus of Proof.

39. In any proceedings against the taxpayer for failing or neglecting to duly furnish a return, a certificate in writing signed by the Commissioner, or the prescribed deputy of the Commissioner, certifying that no return has been received from the taxpayer by any officer authorised by the Commissioner to receive returns at the place where under the Regulations the return should have been furnished, shall be *prima facie* evidence that the defendant failed or neglected to duly furnish a return.

Spoiled Stamps.

40. If any stamp after having been issued in the manner prescribed in the Regulations shall have become damaged, spoiled, or unfit for use other than in the ordinary course of affixing to wages and salary sheets, the State Under Treasurer shall, upon application being made to him and upon delivery to him of the stamps damaged, spoiled or rendered unfit for use, cause a similar stamp or stamps of equal value to be delivered to the owner of such stamps so damaged or spoiled or rendered unfit for use, or to his representative.

Payment of Wages or Salaries in Lump Sums at various periods, Section 9.

- 41. Where an employer (such as a pastoralist or farmer) makes payments of salaries or wages to his employees in lump sums at different periods the following provisions shall apply:—
 - (a) Where a lump sum is paid to an employee after the 1st December, 1932, but covering a period prior to such date, no tax is due on such payment;
 - (b) Where a salary or wage is paid in a lump sum, or in instalments, and covers a period subsequent to the 1st December, 1932, a deduction shall be made by the employer of the amount of tax due on such payment; and
 - (c) Where an employee is also entitled to receive his board and lodging, a sum shall be added to such payment calculated at the rate of one pound per week, dating from the first day of December, 1932, up to the date of such payment.

Payment of Allowances.

42. Retiring allowances, furlough, or any allowance for past services, when paid in a lump sum after the 1st December, 1932, shall be assessed for tax to the extent of 5 per cent. of the amount of the total allowance paid, but where such allowances, furlough, etc., are paid fortnightly or monthly after the 1st December, 1932, such periodical payments shall be subject to tax and must be deducted by the employer at the time of payment.

£

Note.—Travelling allowances or any allowance granted to cover any special expenditure, except for living and maintenance, shall not be subject to tax under the Act.

Treatment of Salary and Wages as Income, Section 10.

- 43. Where any salary or wages consists of fees paid to directors of a company, members of boards, or trusts or commissions, or commissions paid to agents, and the taxpayer satisfies the Commissioner that-
 - (1) he has incurred expenses in earning such salary or wages, and
 - (2) he has furnished a return under the Act, "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1932," or "The Hospital Fund Act, No. 39 of 1930,"

the Commissioner may issue a certificate of exemption from tax under Section 9, and such salary and/or wage shall be assessed as income under Section 5 of this Act.

Refund of Tax under Section 9, Subsection (6).

44. If, during the period between the 1st December, 1932, and the 30th June, 1933, or during any subsequent year ended 50th June, any person shall pay tax in respect of his salary and wage, and at the expiration of such period he proves to the satisfaction of the Commissioner that the amount of his salary or wage, together with any other income received by him during such period, was exempt from tax under the Act, he may apply for, and the Commissioner shall make, a refund of the amount of tax over-paid.

THE HOSPITALS ACT, 1927.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the attached Rules and Regulations made by the Westonia Hospital Board under the provisions of "The Hospitals Act, 1927."

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGE-MENT OF THE WESTONIA DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

1.-Name.

The name of the Institution shall be "The Westonia District Hospital.'

2.—Objects.

The objects of the Institution shall be to provide hospital accommodation, treatment, and advice to the best of the professional skill of the officer in charge (doctor or matron) for the time being.

3.—Subscribers.

Subscribers shall not be entitled to benefit until 14 days after registration by the secretary, and subject to the recommendation of a medical practitioner or the matron in charge.

Subscriptions shall be paid quarterly in advance at the rate of £3 5s. per annum. Subsequent to the first quarter, subscriptions may be paid in mouthly instal-

Every subscriber, his wife and dependants under the age of 16 years, shall be entitled to the benefits set out in Clause 4 of these rules.

4.—Subscribers' Benefits.

Subscribers shall be entitled to not more than three months' treatment in the local hospital free of charge for themselves and dependants.

In the event of the matron in charge advising the removal of any patient, who is entitled to subscriber's benefits, within that time to the nearest hospital for treatment by a medical practitioner, the Board will pay up to an amount not exceeding ten pounds (£10) towards the cost of transporting the patient to the nearest railway station or hospital, the balance to be paid to the hospital and medical practitioner pro rata.

5.—Outpatients (Subscribers or Non-Subscribers).

Outpatients requiring attention shall, except in cases of emergency, visit the hospital between 10 and 11 a.m. and 3 and 5 p.m.

6.—Charges.

- (a) General cases—8s. 6d. per day.
- (b) Maternity cases, for a period up to 12 days after confinement—Subscribers, £4 4s.; non-subscribers, £5 5s.; after 12 days after confinement, subscribers and non-scribers—8s. 6d. per day; waiting cases—7s. 6d. per day.
- (c) Maternity cases-Maternity patients on entering the hospital shall be requested to sign a prescribed form authorising direct payment of the maternity bonus to the matron in charge, unless other arrangements for payment of fees are entered into.
- (d) Maternity cases requiring more than 12 days' treatment shall be brought under the notice of the Hospital Board. Subscribers who desire to receive maternity benefits at the rate of £4 4s. must be financial three months in advance.
 - 7.—Outpatients (including Non-subscribers).
- (a) Per visit to hospital-2s. 6d., plus cost of medicines, drugs and dressings supplied.
- (b) When cases are visited by the matron in charge at residence, subscribers within one mile radius of hospital—free; non-subscribers—9s. for first vist and 5s. for each subsequent visit.
- (c) Outside one-mile radius, arrangements must be made with the Board, and the cost of conveyance necessary to and from the patient's residence shall be paid by the patient.

8.—Non-subscribers' Guarantee.

Any non-subscriber entering the hospital for treatment, or the person responsible for his or her main-tenance, shall, if required by the Board, provide a guarantee for the payment of hospital fees as set out in Rule 6, or any portion of the fees, that the Board may deem the person reasonably able to pay.

9.—Cases Non-admissible (Except in cases of Emergency).

- (1) Any insane person or idiot, in respect of such insanity or idiocy.
- (2) Any person suffering from primary syphilis or chronic paralysis.
- (3) Any person suffering from any chronic disease of a serious or critical nature.
- (4) Any person who, in the opinion of the medical officer, is unsuitable to be admitted.

10.—Cases becoming Chronic.

When any person shall have been admitted to the hospital suffering from an ailment which is not sufficiently advanced for the medical officer to declare it to be of a chronic nature, and which ailment subsequently develops into one of a chronic nature, such person shall be allowed treatment from time to time; provided that, if the medical officer so advise, he or she shall be transferred to another hospital or institution suited for the treatment of such patient.

11.

No member shall receive medical or surgical attendance free under these Rules, if an accident or illness arises from acts of bravado, the use of intoxicants, or immoral conduct of any kind.

PART II.

Administrative.

12.-Board.

There shall be a Board of Management, consisting of seven members, selected as hereinafter provided. Board shall have entire control of the Institution.

13.-Nomination for Board.

Nomination papers for candidates for selection to the Board must be sent in to the secretary at least twenty-one days prior to the day fixed for the annual selection, and such nomination papers must bear the signatures of two financial subscribers, and the written consent of the subscriber nominated to act, if selected. Such nominees must be financial subscribers.

The Board of Management shall consist of seven members, appointed by the Governor. They shall be selected in the month of July in each year, at the annual general meeting of subscribers. eligible for re-selection. Retiring members shall be

15.—Selection.

If there are no more candidates than the number of vacancies, such candidates shall be declared selected. If there are more candidates than the number of vacancies, the secretary shall, at least fourteen days prior to the day of the selection, cause to be supplied to each financial subscriber a ballot paper containing the names of all candidates. Such ballot paper shall be returned to the secretary and be received by him not later than seven o'clock in the afternoon on the day of the selection, in envelopes sealed and indorsed "Ballot Paper." The names of any candidates for whom a subscriber votes shall be left intact, and the remaining names scored through with a pen or pencil. No subscriber shall have more than one vote for each of the vacancies. Subscribers must vote for as many candidates as are to be selected, otherwise the vote shall be declared informal. All ballot papers shall be opened by the Chairman at the annual meeting, in the presence of two scrutineers appointed by the Board to check the votes, and the candidates receiving the largest number of votes shall by the Chairman be declared selected. In the event of the number of votes for any two or more candidates being found to be equal, the Chairman shall, by his casting vote, decide which of the candidates shall be selected. The omission by the secretary to supply to, or the non-re-

ccipt of any ballot paper by any financial subscriber within the time aforesaid, or at all, shall not in any manner invalidate or affect the selection.

16 .- Vacancies.

The Board shall recommend to the Governor in Council that the office of a member or a Chairman of the Board shall be vacated-

- (1) if after ten days' notice he remains non-financial;
- (2) if he has been absent from three or more consecutive monthly meetings of the Board, without leave obtained from the Board in that behalf, and a resolution has been passed by the Board recommending that the office be declared

17 .- Vacancies (Extraordinary).

When a vacancy arises from any cause except annual when a vacancy arises from any cause except annual retirement, the subscribers shall select, upon a day to be fixed by the Board, a person to fill the vacancy, and of which notice shall be given as the Board shall direct, and nominations for the filling of any such vacancy shall be made, and such selection shall be conducted in the same manner as provided by Rules 13 and 15, respectively, in the case of an annual selection, except that for such purpose the word "annual" shall be omitted in the reading of Rules 13 and 14.

18.—Meeting of Board.

The Board shall meet at least once a month, at a time and place to be fixed by resolution of the Board, which time and place may be altered at any time by notice.

19.—Quorum.

A quorum of the Board shall be a majority of members.

20.—Order of Business at Board Meeting.

The secretary shall arrange the order of business. Every question coming before the Board shall be decided by open voting, and by the majority of the members present. Each member, including the Chairman, shall have one vote, and, in the case of an equality of votes, the question shall be declared "carried in the negative."

21.—Notice of Special Meeting of Board.

A special meeting of the Board may be called at any time and place by the Chairman or two members of the Board, in writing, through the secretary.

22.—Chairman.

At the first meeting of the Board after each annual appointment, the Board shall select one of the members to be Chairman and vice-Chairman. The Chairman shall hold office until the conclusion of the next annual appointment of members to the Board. The Chairman shall, when present, preside at all meetings of the Board.

- (1) If the Chairman or vice-Chairman, after being present retires, the members present may elect one of their number to be Chairman for the remainder of the
- meeting.
 (2) In the absence of the Chairman or vice-Chairman from any meeting, the members present may elect one of their number to be Chairman for that meeting.
- (3) In the absence of the Chairman from the district, or in the case of illness of the Chairman, the members present at any meeting next following such absence or illness may elect one of their number to be acting Chairman during such absence or illness.
- (4) The Chairman may resign his office by writing under his hand, addressed to the Board, and in such ease or, if his office becomes recated, the Board shall elect another member to be Charman in his place.

23.—Secretary: Duties of.

The secretary shall attend all meetings, whether ordinary or special, take minutes of all proceedings, conduct correspondence, keep a register of subscribers, and keep a debtor and creditor account of all monetary transac-He shall render to the Board at each ordinary monthly meeting a report, which shall include a financial statement of the position of the Institution. He shall file and preserve all documents, produce receipts for all payments made by him, and be answerable at all times to instructions from the Board. He shall visit the hospital and inspect the reports of the matron, and collect all subscriptions. He shall, if required, give the

Board a satisfactory guarantee by furnishing bondsmen to their approval, or insure in an approved insurance company for an amount to be fixed by the Board, who shall pay the premium.

24.—Treasurer.

(a) Where a treasurer is appointed to assist the secretary, he (the treasurer) shall pay all moneys into the banking account of the hospital on the first banking day following receipt of same, all receipts to be handed to the secretary; and

(b) At the first meeting of the new Board a Finance Committee of three, consisting of Chairman (ex officio)

and two members shall be elected.

(c) It shall be the duty of the Finance Committee, before each Board meeting, to examine the monthly financial statement and list of accounts to be passed for payment.

25.—Board: Removal from Office.

Removal of the Board from office may be recommended to the Governor at a special meeting of the financial subscribers, called for the purpose by a resolution passed by at least two-thirds majority of the financial subscribers present and voting at such special meet-

26.—Audit of Books and Accounts.

The books and accounts of the hospital shall be audited by auditors at least once a year, who shall be appointed by the Board.

27.—Payments.

All payments shall be made by cheque, which shall be signed by the Chairman and the secretary and one member. In the absence of the Chairman from the District, cheques shall be signed by two members of the Board and the secretary.

28.—Annual Meeting.

There shall be an annual meeting of subscribers early in July in every year, at which an annual election of the members of the Board shall be held.

29.—Annual Meeting: Notice thereof.

The secretary shall give notice of the annual meeting at least ten clear days before the day of meeting, and such notice shall be advertised in such manner and at such place or places as the Board for the time being shall direct.

30.-Annual Meeting: Order of Business.

The order of business at the annual meeting shall .—The Board's report for the previous year; Treasbe.—The Board's report for the previous year; urer's report; business of which seven days' notice has been given, and selection of members of the Board.

31.—Special Meetings.

A special meeting of subscribers shall be called by the secretary at the request of the Board, or by the secretary on a requisition addressed to him and signed by at least twenty financial subscribers, the same notice being given as in the case of the annual meeting; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting other than that for which it is called All resolutions passed at such special meeting shall be absolutely final and binding

32.—Appointment of Staff.

The Board may appoint from time to time medical officer, secretary, matron, nurses, orderlies, cook, and other servants as may be deemed necessary, and may assign reasonable remuneration for their services, and may remove them and appoint others in their stead. Written agreements must be made between the Board and all officers and servants.

33.—Matron.

The matron shall have charge of all nurses and servants of the Institution, and shall report to the Chairman or secretary of the Board any misbehaviour, neglect of duty, or disobedience of orders on their part.

She shall be responsible for the good order and cleanliness of the Institution, the clothing of the patients, the preparation and service of meals, and the proper and efficient nursing of the patients.

She shall have charge of all money and valuables belonging to patients.

She shall keep a record of all furniture and other articles in the hospital.

She shall keep a register of all patients received into the hospital, showing their full names, so far as she can ascertain, date of admission and discharge, and such other particulars as the Board may at any time determine; also a register showing the date and quantities of all provisions received by the Institution. She shall not leave the Institution without the consent of the Chairman or secretary of the Board,

34.—Orderlies' Duties.

The orderlies shall carry out any instructions which they may from time to time receive from the medical officer, matron, secretary, or nurse in charge.

35.—Supplies, Drugs, etc.

Any requisition for drugs, surgical, and medical appliances shall be made by the matron and be countersigned by the secretary, and by him forwarded to its destination. Duplicate copies of all orders must be supplied to the secretary for filing.

36.—Visiting Committee.

The Board shall appoint two of their number at each ordinary meeting of the Board to be a Visiting Committee. The Visiting Committee shall meet at the hospital once at least every week, to inspect the Institution in every department; make inquiries as to the quality of the provisions supplied, and recommend any improvements to the Board meeting next ensuing.

They shall enter a written and signed record of each visit in a book to be kept for the purpose in the hospital.

37.—Complaints.

- (1) All complaints made by subscribers and nonsubscribers with respect to the administration or the staff of the Institution shall be in writing, signed by stan of the Institution shall be in writing, signed by the complainant and addressed to the secretary; and such complaint shall be brought before the Board at the next meeting, and may be adjourned from time to time, as may be necessary for the proper investigation of the matter complained of. The Board may require any member of the staff to attend a meeting of the Board in respect to any complaint made under this
- (2) Any complaint by any member of the staff shall be made to the Visiting Committee as soon as possible after the matter the subject of such complaint shall have arisen, and such complaint shall be entered by one of the Visiting Committee in a book to be kept for the purpose, and shall be signed by the person making the complaint, and such book shall be laid before the ensuing Board meeting.

38.—Fees.

All fees due and payable under these Rules, whether by subscribers or non-subscribers, shall be recoverable by the Board in any Court of competent jurisdiction; and the Board may authorise any legal proceedings for the recovery of such fees to be taken in the name of the Chairman or the secretary for the time being.

All fees shall be payable at such time or times as the Board by any By-law shall subscribe.

39.—By-laws.

The Board shall have power to make, alter, and amend from time to time By-laws not inconsistent with these Rules for the management of the Institution.

40.—Alteration and Amendment of Rules.

Any Rule may be altered or rescinded, or a new Rule may be added at a special meeting of financial subscribers called for the purpose by a resolution passed by at least two-thirds majority of the financial subscribers present and voting at such special meeting.

41.—Residential Rule.

No persons other than patients or those employed by the Hospital Board shall reside on the premises, except by special arrangement with the Hospital Board.

42.—Obligatory.

All persons being or becoming subscribers to the Institution, and all non-subscribers being or becoming patients at the hospital, shall be deemed or taken to have subscribed to these Rules and By-laws.

43.-Repeal.

All Rules and By-laws in force prior to the date of the passage of these Rules and By-laws are hereby repealed as from such date; but such repeal shall not affect any appointment made or act or thing done under such repealed Rules or By-laws.

By-laws.

- 1. The yearly and quarterly subscribers shall be allowed one month's grace, and the monthly subscribers shall be allowed fourteen days' grace after the expiration of the term and date for which their subscriptions have been paid.
- 2. Yearly and quarterly subscribers whose subscriptions are more than one month in arrears, and monthly subscribers whose subscriptions are more than fourteen days in arrears, shall be declared unfinancial.
- 3. All bottles supplied by the hospital shall be returned, failing which a charge of sixpence (6d.) per bottle shall be made.
- 4. All employees of the hospital shall be paid monthly.

1. Wherever the District or part of the District under the control of a Local Authority has been or here-

after shall be zoned or districted or classified under the provisions of the Town Planning and Development Act, no building shall be used or erected for any purpose contrary to the provisions of any Town Planning Scheme.

- 2. The authority or authorities responsible for carrying the Town Planning By-law into effect and enforcing its observance shall be the Executive Officer of any Local Authority and/or the Town Planning Commissioner.
- 3. If any person shall, either by act or omission, contravene this By-law, he shall be guilty of an offence under this By-law, and on conviction for such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.
