### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Australia, West Coast-Geraldton.

Extension to Breakwater.

MARINERS and others are hereby notified that the Breakwater at Geraldton is being extended at the Western side of the Entrance Channel by the addition of a spur 960 feet long commencing near the sea end and bearing in a Northerly direction, the new head to be 580 feet due North of the existing head.

Pty., Ltd., Respondents.

WHEREAS on the 30th day of November, 1928, an Industrial Agreement was entered into between John Darling and Sons and others therein mentioned, of the one part, and the Australian Workers' Union Westralian Branch Pastoral and Agricultural Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, thereinafter called "the Union," the other part; and whereas the said Agreement was duly registered in the Court of Arbitration on the 21st day of December, 1928, and Numbered 27 of 1928; and whereas the said Agreement in its scope made provision for the industrial conditions of workers engaged in the handling, lumping, and loading of wheat, including sewing, rebagging and laying dunnage; and whereas the said Agreement specified that at the date thereof, the rate of pay for wheat lumping or tally elerks should be three shillings and threepence halfpenny (3s, 3½d.) per hour, and the rate, when engaged handling sleepers to be used as dunnage, or sewing of bags, two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per hour, the basic wage at the time being at the rate of Four pounds five shillings (£4) by the parties, have now become two shillings and sevenpence halfpenny (2s. 7½d.) and two shillings and one penny halfpenny (2s. 1½d.) respectively; and whereas no specified rate was fixed in the said Agreement for rebagging of wheat; and whereas a dispute having arisen between the parties to the said Agreement as to the rate to be paid for the said rebagging of wheat at Geraldton, then, in pursuance of Section 145 of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," a Compulsory Conference was summoned by me the undersigned Walter Dwyer as President of the Court of Arbitration, and was held on the 25th and 26th days of May, 1934, at Geraldton aforesaid; and whereas during the holding of the said Conference various suggestions the holding of the said volterence various suggestions were made by me as such President as aforesaid for the purpose of the settlement of the said dispute in pursuance of Section 63 of the said Act; and whereas the parties agreed that the rate for the said work should be fixed by me and the matters in dispute settled, and any decision that might be arrived at by me would be accepted as a settlement of the matters in dispute: Now, therefore I, acting herein in pursuance of the powers vested in me under Section 63 of the said Act and all other powers therein or thereby enabling me, do hereby order and award as follows:

(1) When it is necessary that the contents of an old or used bag of wheat must be placed into a new bag, and for such purpose the former bag is required to be lifted up by hand from its

resting place, the rate to be paid to workers when engaged in such work shall be two shillings and fivepence halfpenny (2s. 5½d.) per hour; otherwise the rate for such work shall be at the lower rate, namely, two shillings and one penny halfpenny (2s.  $1\frac{1}{2}$ d.) per hour.

- (2) The said rates are subject to adjustment from time to time as prescribed.
- (3) This Award shall apply to Geraldton and not elsewhere.

  - (i) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpreta-tions of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
  - (ii) Classifying and fixing wages and conditions, for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the above-mentioned Award or in any other Award bind. ing on the Minister;

- (iii) Deciding any other matter that the Minister may refer to such Board from time to time.
- (6) The Union hereby agrees that there shall be no interruption in the work of the Minister over any matter within the jurisdiction of the Court or the Board.
- (7) The decisions of the Board shall be recorded in writing, and such decisions shall be conclusive. A signed copy of the decisions shall be forwarded to each of the parties hereto.
- (8) The Board shall sit at such times and places as the Chairman shall direct.
