The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 453/34.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Excellency the Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act:—

Description of Proposed Sewerage Works Approved and Exempted.—Melville Road District:—6-inch Reticulation Sewers with all Manholes, Inspection Shafts, and all other Apparatus connected therewith:—Commencing at a point in the centre of Westbury Crescent opposite the North boundary of Lot 307, Westbury Crescent, and proceeding in a North-Easterly direction across Westbury Crescent, along the North boundaries of Lots 307, Westbury Crescent, and Lot 283, Birdwood Circus, and their prolongation to the centre of Birdwood Circus; thence in a South-Easterly direction along the centre of Birdwood Circus to a point opposite the East boundary of Lot 281, Birdwood Circus; thence in a South-Easterly direction across Birdwood Circus and along the East boundaries of Lot 281, Birdwood Circus and Lot 312, Westbury Crescent, and their prolongation to the centre of Westbury Crescent; thence in a North-Westerly direction along the centre of Westbury Crescent to the point of commencement, as shown in pink on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 5358.

IN THE COURT OF DISPUTED RETURNS.

In the matter of "The Electoral Act, 1907-1921," and in the matter of the Election of a Member of the Legislative Council for the Metropolitan Province, holden on the 12th day of May, 1934.

To the Court of Disputed Returns:

THE Petition of James Thomas Franklin, of 155 Adelaide Terrace, Perth, in the State of Western Australia, Lord Mayor of the said City of Perth, whose name is subscribed.

- 1. Your petitioner was a candidate at the election of a member of the Legislative Council for the Metropolitan Province, which was holden on the 12th day of May,
- 2. At the said election James George, Joseph Levey, and your petitioner were candidates.
- 3. On the counting of the First Preference Votes for the said election the totals recorded in favour of each of the said candidates were James George 1,991, Joseph Levey 1,093, and your petitioner 1,991 vetes.
- 4. On the votes given for the said Joseph Levey being counted and the second preference votes in respect thereof being allotted to the said James George and to your petitioner, the totals were James George 2,695 votes and your petitioner 2,380 votes, and the Returning Officer, on the 14th day of May, 1934, declared the said James George as being duly majority of 315 votes. elected by a
- Your petitioner says that there was corruption and that illegal practices were committed in connection with the said election.
- 6. Included in the votes above-mentioned were various postal votes, which purported to be the votes of electors of the said Metropolitan Province but which were in fact knowingly and fraudulently forged.
- 7. Certain of the said postal votes were obtained by one George Henry Green, a Postal Vote Officer under the said Electoral Act, by visiting electors for the purpose of taking postal votes in places other than his ordinary places of living or business contrary to the provisions of the said Act.
- 8. Certain of the said postal votes were recorded without the electors knowing for whom he or she was
- 9. For the purpose of simplicity certain electors intending to vote for Joseph Levey were advised to mark their preference votes James George 2 and your petitioner 3, which your petitioner says was not a genuine exercise of such preference.
- 10. The said James George exceeded the amount of electoral expenses authorised by Section 172 of the said Act.

Whereupon your petitioner prays that it may be determined and declared:—

- (a) that the said James George was not duly elected; and
- (b) that your petitioner was duly elected; or
- (c) alternatively that the said election was and is absolutely void.

CHILD WELFARE DEPARTMENT, PERTH.

Departmental Instructions Governing Outdoor Relief.

- 1. The Secretary of the Child Welfare Department to control the issue of outdoor relief throughout the State.
- 2. All documents referred to in these instructions shall be in the forms similar to the forms in the Appendix, but may be used with such variation as the circumstances require.
- 3. Before relief is granted the destitution of applicants shall be satisfactorily established by—
 - (a) Statement and declaration (Forms 31 and 32);
 - (b) Personal inquiry;
 - (c) Report from officer of police; or
 - (d) From some other reliable source.
- 4. It must be shown that there are not any relatives in the State who are legally liable and are able to support the applicant.
- 5. It must also be shown, in cases when any relatives who are legally liable to support the applicant are not in a position to do so, entirely to what extent they can assist.
- 6. Applicants for relief in Perth or suburbs should apply personally to the office of the Secretary Child Welfare Department, Perth.
- 7. Applicants for assistance in Fremantle and suburbs should apply personally to the Officer in Charge of the branch of the Child Welfare Department at Fremantle.
- 8. Applicants for assistance in towns and districts outside Perth and Fremantle and their respective suburbs should apply to the office of the Resident Magistrate, or, where there is not a Resident Magistrate, to the Clerk of Courts or the nearest Police Officer.
- 9. The Resident Magistrate in each district, Clerk of Courts, or local Police Officer, as the case may be, shall act as agent for the Child Welfare Department.
- 10. When the conditions as set out in Clauses 3, 4, and 5 above have been satisfactorily complied with, relief by means of ration orders or monetary assistance may be granted to—
 - (a) The aged;
 - (b) The infirm;
 - (c) The sick;
 - (d) Women upon whom children under the age of 14 years are dependent.
- 11. Relief in Perth, Fremantle, and respective suburbs may be granted for a period not exceeding four weeks, and may be continued on satisfactory proof that such is still necessary.
- 12. The amount of assistance given shall be subject to the approval of the Minister.
- 13. Monetary assistance of a temporary nature which does not exceed $\pounds 5$ in all may be granted by the Secretary of the Child Welfare Department.
- 14. Relief to children will be discontinued upon their attaining the age of fourteen years, unless for special circumstances approved by the Secretary of the Child Welfare Department.
- 15. On satisfactory reasons being established, the Secretary of the Child Welfare Department may approve of the cost of transport of a destitute person travelling within the State. See Subclause F of Clause 16 hereof.
- 16. In all towns and districts outside Perth, Fremantle, and their respective suburbs— $\,$
 - (a) Relief in urgent necessitous cases may be authorised by the Resident Magistrate, or, where there is not a Resident Magistrate, by the Clerk of Courts or local Police Officer. Urgent relief applicable only to those persons coming within Clause 10 may be given by means of ration orders for a period not exceeding two weeks, except for towns and districts which comprise the North-West of Western Australia, i.e., from Carnarvon Northwards, when assistance may be extended for a period of four weeks. The value of such orders shall not exceed 7/— per head per week. The period for which such relief is granted shall not be extended without the approval of the Secretary of the Child Welfare Department.

- (b) In every case where urgent relief is given the Secretary of the Child Welfare Department shall be immediately notified, and Forms 31 and 32, whichever applies, completed and for varded, together with a police report showing the full circumstances of the person or persons to whom relief has been granted. Details of all such issues shall be included on the monthly return (Form 36) and marked "temporary".
- (c) Where relief is being given which, in the opinion of the Resident Magistrate, Clerk of Courts, or local Police Officer, as the case may be, should be reduced or discontinued on account of the altered circumstances of the recipient, or for any other reason, action should be taken accordingly, and the Secretary of the Child Welfare Department advised immediately.
- (d) At the end of each month a return of all relief issued during the month to be forwarded on Form 36 to the Secretary of the Child Welfare Department, Perth.
- (e) All claims for payment of relief issued should be made on Treasury Form 10, the orders attached, together with a full list of items supplied, the Form 10 to be certified by the officer issuing the relief order "services verified", and forwarded monthly to the Secretary of the Child Welfare Department, Perth.

(f) Rail Passes:

Applications for assistance, in the form of rail passes for sick indigent cases travelling for medical treatment, which cannot be obtained locally, to be made on Form 32 and forwarded, together with a medical certificate and police report, to the Secretary of the Child Welfare Department, Perth. If the urgency of the case warrants, the necessary approval may be sought by telegraph and the prescribed documents forwarded by following mail.

(g) Burials:

Where a contract is in existence, the burial of deceased destitute persons can be arranged without reference by the local Police Officer. In places where a contract does not operate, the lowest competitive prices to be obtained and particulars telegraphed to the Secretary of the Child Welfare Department, Perth, for confirmation. In every case of the burial of a deceased destitute person, a report is to be forwarded on Form 150 to the Secretary of the Child Welfare Department, Perth. Claims for this service to be rendered promptly on Treasury Form 10, together with supporting vouchers and report, the officer authorising the burial to certify the account prior to despatch to the Secretary, Child Welfare Department.

17. The Minister may grant assistance in any special case not covered by the foregoing instructions.

An engine-driver who is in charge of plant, and being the only person of his class employed on the plant and doing the general repair work of the plant, in addition to the work of engine-driving, but not when he merely assists the fitter or engineer to do such work, shall be paid 1s. per shift additional.

Firemen:

Fireman attending to steam boilers or suction gas generators 6/-

Where two or more firemen are employed on one shift, one fireman shall be leading fireman and shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day extra.

3.-No Reduction.

Nothing in this Agreement shall in itself operate to reduce the wage of any worker below the rate actually received by him at the date hereof.

4.-Hours of Duty.

- (a) Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked in six shifts of eight hours each.
- (b) In all cases, in reckoning the time of duty, any time necessarily occupied in raising steam, in starting up or closing down engines, or in banking fires, shall be included.

5.—Overtime.

- (a) All time worked in excess of eight hours in any one day shall be deemed overtime, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half. All time worked on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.
- (b) Work done on Christmas Day and Good Friday shall be paid for at double time rates. Foundation Day, New Year's Day, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Boxing Day, and Labour Day shall be paid for at time and a half.

6.-Holidays.

Each worker, other than a casual worker, shall be entitled to fourteen days' annual leave each year, on full pay; or, should the period of continuous employment be less than one year, the worker shall be paid holiday pay in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment. Annual leave shall be taken at a time suitable to the convenience of the employers.

7,-Casual Workers.

- (a) A casual worker shall mean and include an employee competent to do the work he is engaged to do who is, without any fault of his own, dismissed or refused work (as it is hereby agreed he may be), before the expiration of six days from and including the date he starts work.
- (b) Casual workers shall be paid ten per cent. in addition to the rates set out above.

S.—Weekly Engagement.

Except as provided by Clause 7, all employment shall be by the week.

9.-Rotation of Shifts.

Where an employee works afternoon or night-shift only, or afternoon and night shifts in rotation, but does not work day shift one week out of three, he shall receive one shilling per shift in addition to the rates set out above.

If Christmas Day or New Year's Day falls on a Sunday the following Monday shall be kept.

10.—Definition.

"Engine-driver" means any person who starts, stops, takes charge of, or drives any engine or engines or machinery of which the motive power is steam, gas, suction gas, oil, air, electricity, or any other motive power other than manual or animal power.

11.—Area.

This Agreement shall have effect over the area comprised in the South-West Land Division, in the State of Western Australia, excluding the Metropolitan Area and such Areas as are comprised within the Municipality of Bunbury and the Collie Power Company, Limited, Collie.

12.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all engine-drivers and firemen engaged in the production of electric current within the area prescribed in Clause (11) hereof.

DOCK, RIVER, AND HARBOUR WORKERS.

(Mooring Staff, Fremantle Harbour Trust.)

(Registered 25/6/34.)

No. 5 of 1934.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," of Western Australia, this Fourteenth day of June, 1934, between the Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, Fremantle, hereinafter called the employers, of the one part, and the Coastal Dock, Rivers and Harbour Works Union of Workers, hereinafter called the employees, of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to the mooring, unmooring, and shifting of vessels, rigging and removing gangways, etc., where such services are undertaken by the employers, within the Port of Fremantle.

2.—Hours of Duty.

Employees shall be available for duty at any hour of the day or night on each and every day in each week, as required by the exigencies of the service or as demanded by the employers or their representative: Provided that the hours stated hereunder shall be observed as the regular meal hours, but should the requirements of the service interfere with these hours, work shall be performed or continued until completed, when a clear hour for each meal shall be allowed:—

Breakfast—7 a.m. to 8 a.m. Dinner—noon to 1 p.m. Tea—5 p.m. to 6 p.m.

3.—Engagement and Dismissal.

All regular employees shall be deemed to be engaged upon a weekly basis, and one week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the services of any employee; provided that an employee may be instantly dismissed or suspended for insobriety, misconduct, or neglect of duty.

4.—Rates of Pay.

Basic wage—£3 9s. 3d. per week.

- (a) Leading hand-£5 14s. 3d. per week.
- (b) Ordinary hand-£5 4s. 3d. per week.

5.—Casual Employees.

A "Casual" is an employee engaged to assist in the performance of any of the specific services defined hereunder. The rates of pay to casual employees shall be as follows:—

Basic wage-£3 9s. 3d. per week.

- (a) Between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.:-
 - Mooring or unmooring vessels, for each separate service—2s. 6d.
 - (2) Shifting vessels or hulks along wharves where such service does not occupy more than one hour, for the complete service of unmooring and remooring—2s. 6d.
 - (3) Shifting vessels or hulks along wharves where such service occupies more than one hour, for the complete service of unmooring and remooring—4s. 2d.
 - (4) Shifting vessels from one berth or wharf to another, where complete unmooring and remooring is necessary, for each service of unmooring or remooring—2s. 6d.
 - (5) Mooring and unmooring vessels at Robb's Jetty, for complete service—6s.
 - (6) Shifting lighters or floats along wharves, or assisting to shift cranes, for complete service—1s. 8d.
 - (7) Rigging and/or unrigging or shifting gangways, for complete service—1s. 8d.
 - (8) Fixing and unfixing ratguards, as required, for complete service—1s. 8d.
 - Placing or removing fenders, for each service —1s. 8d.
- (b) The above rates shall be varied in accordance with the variations in the said basic wage, by one penny for each complete two shillings by which such basic wage is varied from the present rate.
- (c) Where portion of any of the services defined in Subclause (a) hereof is entered upon prior to 6 a.m. or completed after 6 p.m., the rate specified shall be increased by ninepence (9d.).

6.-Waiting Time.

- (a) Waiting time for casual employees shall be paid after one hour has elapsed from the time when such employees are in attendance, according to orders, to unmoor a vessel; provided such period of one hour has been exceeded owing to the vessel not being ready to sail at the appointed hour. The rate of pay shall be 1s. 8d. per hour or portion thereof between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. and 2s. 5d. per hour or portion thereof between 6 p.m. and 6 p.m. and 6 a.m.
- (b) Should a casual employee report for duty to unmoor a vessel, and, not being required, be released and ordered down for a later hour, he shall be paid at the rate of 1s. 8d. for each such attendance.

7.—Annual Leave.

Employees who serve continuously for twelve months shall be granted annual leave on full pay for a continuous period of twenty-nine days. Where the period of service is less than twelve months, but is not less than one month, the period of leave shall be reduced pro rata to the period of service. Annual leave shall be taken at the convenience of the employers and shall be in accordance with a roster to be arranged in January of each year.

8.-Sickness and Accident.

- (a) 1. Where a regular employee is incapacitated through illness or injury other than that arising in the course of his employment, he may be granted sick leave with pay in respect of such incapacity for a period not exceeding two weeks upon production within 48 hours of the commencement of any such period of absence of a medical certificate as to his incapacity. A similar period of two weeks' sick leave with pay may be granted in respect of any subsequent illness or injury contracted or sustained during the ensuing twelve months; provided that the aggregate period of sick leave with pay does not exceed four weeks in any year.
- 2. Where such incapacity arises through the wilful act or misconduct of the employee, or where a medical certificate is not produced as required, or where the employee has already had sick leave with pay for periods

aggregating four weeks during the preceding twelve months, the employee shall not be entitled to any pay for the period he is absent from duty.

- 3. Upon the period of absence exceeding two weeks in the case of paragraph (1) hereof, and immediately an employee absents himself in the case of paragraph (2), the employers shall be relieved of any further obligation to the employee; provided that any such period of absence without pay may, at the discretion of the employers, be deemed to be leave without pay.
- (b) A regular employee who in the course of his employment, and while on duty or acting under the instructions of the employers, receives an injury or contracts any sickness which incapacitates him from duty, shall be entitled to receive, in addition to the benefits prescribed under "The Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1924," the difference between the compensation provided for under the said Act and the wages prescribed in this Agreement for a period not exceeding 30 days.
- (e) All amounts payable under this clause shall be paid in the usual manner each week.

9.--Uniform.

Regular employees shall be provided with uniforms, consisting of a tunic coat, vest, and trousers each eight months, and, in addition, there shall be provided each year, if required, one oilskin coat and sou'wester hat and one cap.

Badges and buttons will be renewed when necessary.

10.—Rest Room.

A rest room shall be provided by the employers for the use of the regular employees. Employees must provide their own rugs, etc., and must keep the room clean and tidy.

11.—Telephones.

Each regular employee shall be provided with a telephone to his place of residence, the rental and a reasonable amount for calls to be paid by the employers.

12.—No Discrimination.

The employers shall not discriminate against members of the Coastal Dock, Rivers, and Harbour Works Union when members of this Union are available and capable of carrying out the work required.

13.—Board of Reference.

Should any dispute arise between the employers and the employees under this Agreement, the matter shall be referred to a Board of Reference, consisting of a representative of the employers, a representative of the employees, and the Registrar of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia, who shall act as Chairman. The decision of the Board shall be final and binding.

14.—Term.

This Agreement shall come into force from the date of signature thereto, and shall continue for a period of twelve months therefrom.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," of Western Australia, this fourteenth day of June, 1934, between the Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, Fremantle, hereinafter called the employers, of the one part, and the Coastal Dock, Rivers, and Harbour Works Union of Workers, hereinafter called the employees, of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to the patrolmen in the service of the employers, and shall operate over the area comprised within the boundaries of the Port of Fremantle vested in the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners.

2.—Hours of Duty.

- (a) The hours of duty shall consist of seven shifts of eight hours each per week.
- (b) The rotation and hours of shifts, at both Victoria Quay and North Wharf, shall be as follows:—

Day shift—one man, 8 a.m.-4 p.m. Night shift—two men, midnight-8 a.m. Afternoon shift—two men, 4 p.m.-midnight.

- (c) Employees may be permitted to relieve one another for the convenience of catching trams or trains within a reasonable period (as per transport timetables) of the starting or finishing time of a shift, provided that the full shift, as herein defined, is at all times maintained.
- (d) In special circumstances an employee may, where convenient, be permitted to change shift or part of a shift by mutual arrangement with another employee, provided due notice of such desire is given, and provided that the relieving employee will not thereby be caused to be on duty for an excessive period in any one shift.

3.—Engagement and Dismissal.

All regular employees shall be deemed to be engaged upon a weekly basis, and one week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the services of any employee; provided that an employee may be instantly dismissed or suspended for insobriety, misconduct, or neglect of duty.

4.—Rate of Pay.

Basic wage-£3 9s. 3d. per week.

The rate of pay shall be £4 19s. 9d. per week, which amount shall be computed as follows:—Basic wage, plus one-sixth and margin over basic wage 19s. per week.

5.—Overtime.

Overtime shall mean all time worked in excess of eight hours in any one shift, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and at double time thereafter; provided that overtime shall not be payable where such period of eight hours is exceeded owing to the mutual relief arrangements permitted under Clause 2, Subclauses (c) and (d).

6.—Meals.

Employees shall be granted thirty (30) minutes during each shift, as near as possible to the middle of such shift, for the purpose of having a meal.

7.—Leave.

- (a) Employees shall be allowed special leave with pay for one complete day of 24 hours during each fortnight, excepting during such period as the employee shall be on annual or long service leave.
- (b) Employees who serve continuously for twelve months shall be granted annual leave on full pay for a continuous period of twenty-one (21) days. Where the period of service is less than twelve months, but is not less than one month, the period of leave shall be reduced pro rata to the period of service. Annual leave shall be taken at the convenience of the employers, and shall be in accordance with a roster to be arranged in January of each year.

8.—Sickness and Accident.

- (a) 1. Where an employee is incapacitated through illness or injury other than that arising in the course of his employment, he may be granted sick leave with pay in respect of such incapacity for a period not exceeding two weeks, upon production, within 48 hours of the commencement of any such period of absence of a medical certificate as to his incapacity. A similar period of two weeks' sick leave with pay may be granted in respect of any subsequent illness or injury contracted or sustained during the ensuing twelve months; provided that the aggregate period of sick leave with pay does not exceed four weeks in any year.
- 2. Where such incapacity arises through the wilful act or misconduct of the employee, or where a medical certificate is not produced as required, or where the employee has already had sick leave with pay for periods aggregating four weeks during the preceding twelve months, the employee shall not be entitled to any pay for the period he is absent from duty.
- 3. Upon the period of absence exceeding two weeks in the case of paragraph (1) hereof, and immediately an employee absents himself in the case of paragraph (2), the employers shall be relieved of any further obligation to the employee; provided that any such period of absence without pay may, at the discretion of the employers, be deemed to be leave without pay.
- (b) An employee who in the course of his employment, and while on duty or acting under the instructions of the employers, receives an injury or contracts any sickness which incapacitates him from duty, shall be entitled to receive, in addition to the benefits prescribed ander "The Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1924," the difference between the compensation provided for under the said Act and the wages prescribed in this Agreement, for a period not exceeding 30 days.
- (c) All amounts payable under this clause shall be paid in the usual manner each week.

9.—Uniforms.

Employees shall be provided with uniforms, consisting of a tunic coat, vest, and trousers each eight months, and, in addition, there shall be provided, if required:— Each year—one oilskin coat, one cap; each 2 years—one helmet; each 4 years—one greatcoat. Badges and buttons will be renewed when necessary.

10.-Change Room.

A change room shall be provided at Victoria Quay and at North Wharf, with lockers suitable and high enough to take employees' topcoats, but nothing herein shall prevent the employers from requiring the employees to report at the Victoria Quay office only, when coming on or going off duty, provided that the hours of duty are not thereby exceeded.

11.—First Aid.

Where an employee desires to qualify in first aid, and regularly attends classes of instruction for this purpose during his leisure time, arrangements shall be made, where convenient, for such employee to attend any class that may be held during such time as he should otherwise be on duty.

12.—Casual Employees.

- (a) A "Casual" employee means an employee engaged in a temporary or a relieving capacity only, and his engagement shall be by the day, excepting that, where the period of employment exceeds one month, one week's notice shall be given to terminate such engagement.
- (b) The rate of pay to casual employees shall be as for regular employees: provided that, where the period of employment does not exceed fourteen consecutive days, such rate shall be increased by ten per cent.
- (c) A casual employee shall be entitled to pro rata annual leave: provided that his period of employment exceeds one month, but shall not be entitled to uniform nor to the sickness and accident benefits provided in Clause 8.

13.—Board of Reference.

Should any dispute arise between the employers and the employees under this Agreement, the matter shall be referred to a Board of Reference consisting of a representative of the employers, a representative of the employees, and the Registrar of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia, who shall act as Chairman. The decision of the Board shall be final and binding.

14.—Term.

This Agreement shall come into force from the date of signature thereto, and shall continue for a period of twelve months therefrom.
