PROCLAMATION

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1884," I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint special days to be observed as Bank Holidays as follows:

Date and Town.

Wednesday, 19th September, 1934-Northam, Cunderdin, and Northampton. Saturday, 22nd September, 1934-Nungarin. Wednesday, 26th September, 1934—Northampton.

GOD SAVE THE KING!!!

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 7th day of August, 1934, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:

The Vermin Act, 1918. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Vermin Act, 1918," the Governor is empowered to make, repeal, and alter Regulations for carrying this Act into effect: And whereas the Governor, acting under the said Act, did on the 19th day of March, 1919, make certain Regulations, which were published in the Government Gazette on the 21st day of March, 1919: And whereas, by an Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 30th day of January, 1931,

the said Regulations were amended by the repeal of certain of them and the insertion in lieu thereof of certain new Regulations numbered 90, 90A, 91, 92, 93, 93A, 93B, 93C, and 93D respectively, which Regulations are still in force, save and except that the said Regulation 91 has been amended by Orders in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 6th day of November, 1931, and the 9th day of February, 1933, and the 4th day of May, 1934, respectively: And whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient further to amend the said Regulations, as amended from time to time as aforesaid, in the manner hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, His Ex-celleucy the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby amend the said Regulations in the manner mentioned and provided in the Schedule hereto, to operate as from the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the Government Gazette.

The Schedule.

- 1. Regulation 92 is repealed and a new regulation is inserted in lieu thereof, as follows:-
 - 92. Any person who destroys any animal or bird in respect of which the payment of a bonus is provided for in Regulation 91, or the legal personal representative of such person may claim payment of the bonus payable in respect of the animal or bird destroyed as aforesaid, but the said claimant must, according to the requirements of Regulation 93, but subject as hereinafter provided, deliver the scalp and tail, or the skin, or the beak and claws (as the case may be), to the Chief Inspector, or to the secretary of the Vermin Board of the Vermin District in which such animal or bird was destroyed.

Provided that, any claimant as aforesaid who wishes to obtain the market value by sale or other disposition of the skin of the animal destroyed by him, and also to claim the bonus in relation thereto, may make application for that purpose to the secretary of the Vermin Board aforesaid, and, if such secretary is satisfied that the animal from which the skin was obtained was destroyed within his Board's Vermin District, the claimant may retain the skin intact and fill in the form of claim for bonus, which claim shall then be signed by the said secretary and by him be forwarded to the Chief Inspector. In any such case, the acceptance of the claim for bonus, and the payment of the bonus claimed, shall be subject to the following conditions, namely:—

- (i) The claimant shall, as soon as reasonably may be, consign the skin intact to a merchant earrying on business either in Perth or Fremantle, and approved by the Chief Inspector, and notice of such consignment shall be given by the claimant to the Chief Inspector, either on the form of claim or by other writing signed by the claimant.
- (ii) The skin shall be retained by the merchant to whom it is consigned and shall be made available by such merchant, on demand for inspection by the Chief Inspector or his authorised officer.
- (iii) The officer who inspects the skin shall examine and classify the same, and, if he is satisfied that the skin is one in respect of which the said claimant has made a claim for bonus, and that it has been obtained from an animal in respect of which the claimant is entitled to make his said claim, the officer may mark the skin in such manner as will not affect the market value thereof but will identify the skin with the said claim for bonus by the said claimant.
- (iv) When the skin has been inspected and marked as aforesaid, the skin may be sold or disposed of or otherwise dealt with by the merchant without prejudice to the claim of the said claimant for bonus.
- (v) The claim for bonus in relation to the said skin shall not be deemed to be accepted, and bonus shall not be payable or paid to the claimant, or anybody on his behalf, unless and until such skin has been inspected and marked as required by paragraph (iii) hereof.
- (vi) The Chief Inspector, or his authorised officer, shall not be bound, and may decline, to inspect and mark any skin unless and until the form of claim submitted by the claimant has been signed by the secretary of the Vermin Board of the District in which the animal was destroyed, or if the skin has been wholly or partly tanned or wholly or partly manufactured.
- (vii) The Chief Inspector, or his authorised officer, shall not be bound to attend at the place of business of any merchant for the purpose of inspecting and marking skins more often than once in every two weeks.
- 2. Regulation 93 is amended by inserting after paragraph (c) a new paragraph, to stand as paragraph (d), as follows:—
 - (d) Any animal or bird aforesaid, unless the Chief Inspector, the secretary of the Vermin Board, or any other person authorised to receive the prescribed evidence of destruction, to whom such evidence of destruction of such animal or bird has been produced, is satisfied that the evidence of destruction produced was taken from an animal or bird for the destruction of which a bonus is payable and that the animal or bird was destroyed in the State.
- 3. Regulation 93B is amended by inserting at the beginning thereof the words "subject to the proviso to Regulation 92."
- 4. New regulation—A new regulation, to stand as Regulation 93E, is inserted after Regulation 93D, as follows:—

93E. Wherever any person claiming payment of bonus under these Regulations produces any scalp and tail, or skin, or beak and claws (as the case may be) purporting or represented to be taken from the animal or bird for the destruction whereof the claim for bonus is made, and the Chief Inspector, secretary to the Vermin Board, or other authorised person to whom the same are produced is not satisfied that the claimant is the person who destroyed the animal or bird, or is the legal personal representative of such last-mentioned person, or that the evidence of des-

truction produced to him was taken from an animal or bird for the destruction of which a bonus is payable, or that the animal or bird was destroyed within the State, the Chief Inspector, the secretary to the Vermin Board, or other authorised person aforesaid, shall retain in his possession the evidence of destruction produced to him as aforesaid sufficiently identified with the claimant, but shall not accept any claim for payment of bonus until such claimant shall have furnished to him further evidence sufficient to satisfy him concerning the matters about which he was previously not satisfied as aforesaid.

Provided that, if the claimant fails within three months after producing the evidence of destruction as aforesaid to furnish to the person to whom such evidence of destruction was produced, further evidence in support of his claim as required, the person holding the said evidence of destruction may forthwith totally destroy the same by fire, and thereafter any and every claim by the said claimant for payment of bonus which was supported or intended to be supported by the production of the said evidence of destruction shall be refused, and the said claimant shall not be entitled to payment of any bonus under or by virtue of such claim.

- 2. No person shall misconduct himself, or indulge in any riotous or indecent conduct, or use any indecent or improper language, or offend against decency as regards to dress on the reserve.
- 3. No person shall enter upon or remain on the reserve when visibly under the influence of liquor.
- 4. No person shall post, stick, or stamp, stencil, paint, or otherwise affix, distribute, or give out any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, or any document whatsoever upon any tree, fence, post, gate, building, road path, or any place whatever on the reserve, and no person shall cause to be done any of the acts bearing archibited. herein prohibited.
- 5. No person shall spit or expectorate in or upon any building, structure, or erection in the reserve.
- 6. No person shall engage in public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or a meeting of like character, on the reserve, without the consent of the Board.
- 7. No person shall bet or offer to bet publicly on any part of the reserve without consent of Board.
- 8. No person shall injure, cut, break, deface, pull up, pick, remove, or destroy any tree, shrub, or grass growing on the reserve.
- 9. No person or persons shall carry or discharge any firearms, or throw or discharge any stone or other missile, or set off any fire balloon, or throw or set fire to any fire-works, or kindle or make a fire on any portion of the reserve without the consent of the Board.
- 10. No person shall deposit or leave any rubbish, refuse, paper, broken glass, china, or litter of any kind whatsoever within the reserve except in the receptacles provided for the purpose.
- 11. No person shall break or place, or permit or suffer to be placed, any broken glass, metal, or earthenware, bottles, or utensils in the reserve, without having first obtained the consent of the Board to do so.
- 12. No person shall trot or gallop a horse or drive any motor car or motor cycle or other vehicle on the arena without consent of the Board.
- 13. No person shall cut up, damage, disfigure, or interfere with the roads on the reserve, or with any part of the fences, buildings, electrical equipment, water pipes, or fittings.
- 14. No person shall, without the consent of the Board, sell or expose for sale goods, wares, refreshments, fruit, nuts, confectionery, fish, or other merchandise or things, or solicit or offer to purchase bottles on any portion of the reserve.
- 15. No person shall upon the said reserve, without the consent of the Board, exercise horses, dogs, or other animals for racing.
- 16. No person shall cause, allow or suffer any horse, cattle, sheep, dog, goat, camel, donkey, mule, pig, or other animal, or fowl or other bird to enter, stray, or feed upon the said reserve without the permission of the Board.
- 17. No person shall damage, deface, disfigure, or write in or upon, or paste or affix any advertisement on or to any dressing shed or public convenience, or to or on any notice board or other erection, except with the written consent of the Board first had and obtained.
- 18. No person shall camp, lodge, or tarry overnight, or frequent the reserve for the purpose of camping, lodging, or tarrying overnight.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1933," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act; and whereas the Narembeen District Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every authority ampling it is that belong the said act and of every authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

- 1. In the construction of these By-laws, subject to the
- context:— "Board" shall mean the Narembeen District Road Board.
- 2. No hawking shall be permitted in Churchill Street, Narembeen.
- 3. No person shall hawk any fruit, fish, vegetables, or any article of merchandise within any part of the Board's District, without having first obtained a license from the Board.
- 4. Any person who trades or travels on foot, or with any vehicle or animal, or carries to sell, or expose or offer for sale within the Board's District, any of the articles or things above-mentioned, shall be deemed to hawk same.

Provided, that nothing contained in this section shall apply to any person or persons paying rates, or liable to pay rates, for any shop or store carrying on the usual business, trade, and delivery trade, or delivery of goods

- therefrom. 5. A Hawker's License shall be in the Form No. 3
- in Schedule A attached hereto.
 6. The fees to be paid for licenses issued to hawkers shall be as set forth in Schedule B attached hereto.
 7. Every application for a Hawker's License shall be made during the currency of the financial year in which the license is to have effect; and every such license shall have effect for and during that year, or the unexpired portion thereof, and no longer.

- 8. Every hawker, whilst employed in hawking, must produce his license, upon being required to do so by any police officer or officer of the Board.
- 9. Every hawker shall rigidly affix to some conspicuous part of his cart, barrow, or other vehicle or basket, and at all times maintain thereon, a board or plate bearing his name and the words "Licensed Hawker" legibly written thereon, in letters not less than one inch in height and of corresponding breadth.
- 10. No person to whom a Hawker's License shall have been granted shall lend, transfer, or assign his license, and no person shall borrow or make use of such license granted to a person other than himself.
- 11. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such conviction.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1933," the Board of any Road District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act; and whereas the Harvey Road Board doth, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every power enabling it in this behalf, hereby make the following By-laws:

- 1. In construction of these By-laws, subject to the
- context- "Board" shall mean the Harvey Road Board district.
- "Secretary" means the secretary for the time being of the Harvey District Road Board.
- "Hall" means and includes any hall, room, lounge, corridor, stairway, stage, entrance, yard, or land situated within the boundaries of the Townsite lot upon which any public hall shall be erected.
- "Caretaker" means the caretaker of the hall duly appointed by the Board.

- 2. Application for the hire of the hall or any room or furniture shall be made in writing to the secretary or duly authorised agent not less than twenty-four hours before the time that such hall, room, or furniture is required, and shall state the time and purpose for which the hall is required.
- 3. The name and place of abode of the actual and responsible person or persons hiring the hall or any room or furniture shall be given in the application for the hire of the hall, room, or furniture.
- 4. The application for the hire of any furniture or crockery-ware shall state the precise locality to which the said furniture is to be removed; and the Board, when granting the use of any furniture and crockery-ware, may fix a date and hour when such furniture or crockery-ware shall be returned to the hall.
- 5. The rent of the hall, or any room or furniture or crockery-ware, shall be paid with each application, and shall be set out in Schedue A hereto annexed.
- 6. The Board at any time may demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of engagement.
- 7. Any person or persons having hired the hall or any room or furniture shall give up possession promptly at the time agreed upon, and shall leave the hall or any room clean and fit for other occupation, and the furniture in good condition and in its normal position.
- The Board reserves the right to refuse to hire the hall or any room or furniture to any applicant for the hire of same, without assigning a reason for such refusal.
- 9. The Board may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of the hall or any room or furniture.
- 10. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of the hall or room or furniture for the same date and hour, the Board may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire of the hall or any room or furniture shall be granted.
- 11. The hirer of the hall or any room shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, Entertainments Teax Act, and any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such hiring and use of hall or any room.
- If in the opinion of the Board all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the aforementioned Acts the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of engagement, forbid and prevent the use of the hall or any room.
- 12. (b) enter or be allowed to enter whilst intoxicated;

- (c) be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever;
 (d) damage, mark, or deface any wall, or any part
 of the ball, or any room. (Any person who
 does, permits, or suffers such damage shall be
 liable to pay the cost of all such damage in
 addition to any roughty imposed by these Br addition to any penalty imposed by these By-
- (c) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatso-ever. (Any person so doing shall immediately disperse, on being requested to do so by the hirer, the secretary, the caretaker, or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable, whether in uniform or otherwise.)

- 16. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons, or anything calculated to produce a disturbance, riot, or breach of the peace, shall be permitted in the hall or any room.
- 17. No encouragement shall be given to improper characters to assemble in the hall or any room.
- 18. Skating shall not be permitted under any consideration.
- 19. Children under ten years of age must be under responsible supervision when in the hall or any room.
- 20. The hirer of the hall or any room shall maintain and keep in good order and decent behaviour such hall or room, and shall be solely and entirely responsible for the carrying out of these By-laws, and for any damage done to the building, fixtures, furniture, or crockery-ware, and shall pay such damages as shall be assessed by the Board. Any article of crockery-ware not accounted for, or in a cracked or broken condition, shall be paid for at current rates or prices.
- 21. The secretary, caretaker, or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable, when dressed in uniform or otherwise, shall be permitted to have free ingress to the hall or any room at all times during the term of engagement, and every facility shall be given them for enforcing these By-laws.
- 22. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing, contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such conviction.
