WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and amending Acts, it is made lawful for the Governor in Executive Council from time to time by Proclamation to appoint such place or places in each District, as shall be expedient, to be reserved for the burial of the dead: Now, therefore I, Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid,

with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, do by this Proclamation appoint Reserve 19311, in the Wellington District (near Mudiarrup), a Public Cemetery, but subject to such regulations as may be published from time to time for the proper management thereof.

SUPREME COURT RULES, 1920.

Amendment of Rule 8a, Order LXV.

THE Honourable John Alfred Northmore, Chief Justice of Western Australia; the Honourable Thomas Percy Draper, and the Honourable John Patrick Dwyer, Puisne Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers contained in "The Supreme Court Act, 1880," and every other power enabling them in this behalf, amend Rule 8a of Order LXV. of the Supreme Court Rules, 1920, by adding the following proviso at the end thereof:—

Provided further, that the total of bills of costs of fees as increased by this Rule shall be reduced by fifteen per centum as from the 1st day of January, 1935, until the 1st day of January, 1936, on which date the aforesaid increase of twenty-five per centum shall again become operative.

THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1906.

Albany Municipality—Building By-laws.

P.W. 2704/23.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Municipality of Albany doth hereby make and pass the following By-laws:—

1.—Existing By-laws.

Where the text of the following By-laws is in conflict with any other By-law previously passed, the interpretation of these following By-laws shall be deemed to be the correct one.

2.—Motor Garages.

Motor garages not exceeding 300 square feet in floor area may be built in brick, stone, concrete, iron, or other approved fire-resistant material, provided that the Council may require:—

- (a) That any motor garage be not less than 50 feet from the frontage of any road or street;
- (b) That any motor garage be not less than 10 feet distant from any building used other than as an outbuilding.

3.—Outbuildings.

Outbuildings for the housing of birds or animals of not more than two hundred square feet in floor area, and not more than 6 feet 6 inches in height, may be erected at the rear of any dwelling; provided that the nearest portion of any such outbuilding is at least 30 feet from any building used or intended to be used as a dwelling, and at least four feet from the boundary of land not in the same occupation.

Outbuildings of larger area and up to seven feet in height may be erected, if at a distance of at least 50 feet from any street, 40 feet from any dwelling-house, and six feet from the boundary of land not in the same occupation.

All outbuildings must be erected of iron, brick, stone or concrete or other fire-resistant material, to be approved by the Surveyor.

In the case of an application to erect any outbuilding from the use of which unpleasant noises, unpleasant odours, or unusual risk of fire may reasonably be expected to arise, the Council may determine in what position upon the allotment such outbuilding shall be erected, or may refuse such application absolutely.

4.—Position of Building on Site.

No building which is intended to be used, or which shall be used as a dwelling-house, and no addition to any such building shall be built, constructed, or erected within a distance of 20 feet, measured horizontally, from the building-line of the street or road the building is intended to or shall front.

Except as hereinafter provided, no building with an external wall of other than brick, stone, or concrete, which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling-house, and no addition with an external wall of other than brick, stone, or concrete to any building, which is intended to be used or which shall be used as a dwelling-house, shall be built, constructed, or erected—

- (a) within a distance of four feet, measured horizontally, of any street, road, lane or right-of-way at the side of any such building; or
- (b) within a distance of four feet, measured horizontally, of any land not in the same possession or occupation:

Provided always, that any such building or addition may abut on the building-line of any street, road, lane, or right-of-way at the side of such building, or be less than the prescribed distance therefrom, or from land not in the same possession or occupation, or from a building or erection with an external wall of other than brick, stone, or concrete: provided that the wall or walls which abut on or face within the prescribed distance such street, road, lane or right-of-way or land or building or erection, as the case may be, shall be of concrete at least 8½ inches in thickness projecting in all cases at least one inch beyond the woodwork front and back, and at least one foot six inches through the roof covering of gutter adjoining the same.

5.—Materials.

The Council may define any portion of the Municipal District, and by resolution prohibit the erection within that portion of buildings with external walls of materials other than brick, stone, concrete, or the like material.

6.—Timber Construction.

All timbers used in any buildings shall be of good sound material, free from rot, free from large and loose knots, and free from shakes, and free from any imperfections whereby the strength of the timber may be impaired.

The following minimum conditions shall apply as to spacings and scantlings of timber:—

1. Stumps shall be not less than 4in. x 4in. jarrah or other approved timber, spaced 5 feet centre to centre. Stumps shall be tarred and sunk at least half their length in the ground, provided that no stumps shall be less than 2 feet in the ground. Tarring is to extend for 6 inches above the ground surface.

2. Studs and ceiling joists shall not be less than 4in. x 2in., spaced not more than 2 feet apart, centre to centre, properly secured and braced. Studs and ceiling joists of 3in. x 2in. may be used, provided they are spaced 18in. apart, centre to centre, properly braced and secured.

3. Rafters shall be not less than 3in. x 2in., spaced not more than 3 feet centre to centre in the case of iron roofs, and 18 inches centre to centre in the case of slate, tile, or other similar roofs; 4in. x 2in. rafters may be used, but must be spaced at 2ft. centres for slates or tiles and not more than 3ft. apart for any type of roof. All rafters must be securely braced with purlins and collar-ties.

4. Floor joists shall not be less than 4in. x 2in., spaced 18in. apart, centre to centre.

5. Floor bearers shall be not less than 4in. x 3in., spaced not more than 5 feet apart.

No framing timber in any building shall be notched or checked out to receive bracing or otherwise, so as to reduce its cross sectional area more than one-sixth.

7.—Proportion of Site to be Covered.

A dwelling-house, together with its appurtenances, to be erected on an allotment, shall not occupy more than two-thirds of such allotment, and the minimum of unoccupied area shall not be less than 1,000 superficial feet.

For a set of flats or a group of tenements in one building, the minimum of unoccupied area of the site shall be 1,000 square feet for the first tenement, plus 500 square feet for every additional separate tenement in the building.

Provided that, where situated on a site considered by the Council to be an established shopping locality, the Council may permit a building, which is to be a shop and dwelling combined, to occupy not more than four-fifths of the allotment, subject to the un-built-upon area being not less than 500 square feet.

No building shall be erected in such a position that it shall lie between another building, or any part there-

of, and any street, unless such other building has a direct and unobstructed access to some other street at least 16 feet wide.

If there be any side wall of a dwelling-house in which it is proposed to provide a window or door opening, that wall shall be set back (throughout its whole length) from the sideline of the allotment to a distance of three feet, in the case of a dwelling of one or two storeys or to a distance of five feet, in the case of a dwelling of more than two storeys.

8.—Kitchen, Laundry, and Bathroom.

Every dwelling-house or self-contained flat shall be provided with a completely enclosed bathroom, or combined bathroom and laundry, and with washtubs and copper, or other means of washing clothes, and the water laid thereto. The floor surfaces of bathrooms on any floor, and of laundries, when above the ground floor, shall be of impervious material, properly graded and drained. The washtubs, copper, and bath shall not be placed in the kitchen.

One bathroom in each dwelling-house shall have at least 30 square feet of floor area; and a combined bathroom and laundry shall have at least 56 square feet of floor area.

9.—Drainage and Levels.

Every person who shall erect a building shall construct the lower storey of such building at such a level that, in the opinion of the Council, it may be practicable to construct a drain sufficient for the effectual drainage of such building.

No person shall build or erect, or cause or permit to be built or erected, any building, erection, tent, or addition to any building, erection, or tent on any land unless and until such building, erection, tent, or addition, and the site and curtilage thereof, can be properly drained, and the Council may refuse permission to build and erect any building, erection, or tent, or addition, unless and until it is satisfied that the proposed building, erection, tent, or addition, and the site and curtilage thereof, can be properly drained. No water is to be discharged on to the surface of any footpath.

10.—Design and Appearance.

Notwithstanding anything in these By-laws or in any other By-laws passed by the Council, the Council may refuse to permit the erection of any building which, in the opinion of the Council or the Surveyor, is of such design or appearance as would be prejudicial to the value, interests, or purposes of property in the vicinity of the site on which it is proposed to erect such building.

11.—Time Limit.

Any building, addition, or alteration for which a permit is issued must be completed within a period of twelve months from the date of issue of such permit.
