GENERAL ORDER.

The Legal Practitioners Act, 1893. (Consolidation, 1927.)

We, the Honourable John Alfred Northmere, Chief Justice of Western Australia; the Honourable Thomas Percy Draper, and the Honourable John Patrick Dwyer, Puisne Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, and we the undersigned, being a majority of members of the Barristers' Board constituted and appointed under and in pursuance of "The Legal Practitioners Act, 1893" (Consolidated 1927), hereby amend the General Order made the 21st day of September, 1920, and gazetted on the 24th day of September, 1920 (whereby the totals of certain bills of costs for the remuneration of practitioners of the Supreme Court of Western Australia in relation to the several matters therein mentioned were increased by twenty-five percentum) by adding the following proviso at the end thereof:—

Provided that the total of such bills of costs as increased by this General Order shall be reduced by fifteen per centum. This provise shall have effect from the first day of January, 1935, and shall continue in force until the first day of January, 1936, on which date the aforesaid increase of twenty-five per centum shall again become operative.
