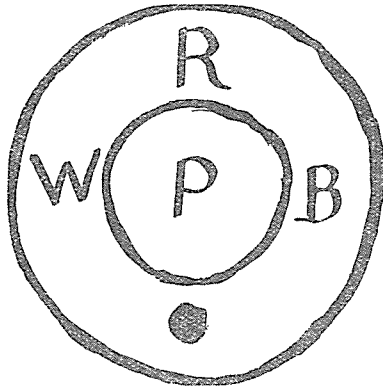
Meat Inspection and Branding Regulations.

WHEREAS by the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-33," His Excellency the Governor may make Regulations, and may repeal, alter or amend Regulations so made: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby amend the Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 11th day of December, 1925, as follows:—

(1) By adding to Regulation 4, at the end thereof, the words "Butchers' slaughterhouses, Wiluna."

(2) By adding to Schedule A a further brand, as illustrated:—



(3) By adding to Schedule B the words "Wiluna Health District."

(4) By adding the following to Schedule C:—

THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1933.

Mount Margaret Road Board.

By-laws for the Management and Use of Hall and other Buildings under the Control of the Board.

P.W. 1358/25.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1933," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purpose of the said Act mentioned; and whereas the Mount Margaret Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

(1.) In the construction of these By-laws, subject to the context—

- (a) The word "Board" shall mean the Mount Margaret Road Board;
- (b) the word "Building" shall mean and include any hall, room, corridor or stairway, or any annex of any such hall or room under the control of the Board.

(2.) Applications for the hire of any building or furniture shall be made in writing to the secretary of the Board not less than twenty-four hours before the time that such building or furniture is required, and shall state the purpose for which the building or furniture is required.

(3.) The name and place of abode of the actual responsible person or persons hiring any building or furniture shall be given in the application for the use of such building or furniture.

(4.) The rent of the building or furniture, inclusive of the use of the crockery-ware, shall be paid with each application, and shall be as set out in the Schedule hereunder.

(5.) The Board may in its discretion grant to any person or company a lease for the exclusive right to screen sound or other pictures in any building for any period deemed requisite.

(6.) The hours for which any building or furniture may be hired shall be:—(a) Day, 9 o'clock a.m. to 7 o'clock p.m.; (b) evening, 7 o'clock p.m. to 12 o'clock midnight.

Extension of time may be granted upon payment of prescribed fees.

(7.) A deposit of five shillings shall be made with the application for the hire of any building or crockery, in good faith, returnable if Clause (8) is complied with, and the Board may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an additional amount estimated to cover any loss or damage that might occur during the term of engagement.

(8.) Any person or persons having hired the building, furniture, or crockery shall give up possession promptly at the time agreed upon, and shall leave the building, furniture or crockery clean and fit for other occupation, and the furniture in good condition and in its normal position.

(9.) The Board reserves the right to refuse to hire any building, furniture, or crockery to any applicant for the hire of same without assigning any reason for such refusal.

(10.) The Board may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring or leasing of any building, furniture, or crockery.

(11.) In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any building or furniture or crockery for the same date and hour, the Board may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire of the building, furniture, or crockery shall be granted.

(12.) The hirer of the building shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, Entertainments Tax Act, and any other Act in force for the time being applicable to the hiring and use of any building.

If, in the opinion of the Board, all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the aforementioned Acts, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of an engagement forbid and prevent the use of any building.

(13.) In the event of the use of the building being forbidden or prevented under the last preceding By-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the

hire of the building, as if the hire had been duly fulfilled, and the Board shall not be responsible for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.

(14.) No fermented or spirituous liquors shall be brought into, or consumed in any building, except when permitted by the Board in writing.

(15.) No person shall, in any part of any building—

- (a) Use profane or improper language;
- (b) enter or be allowed to enter whilst intoxicated;
- (c) be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever;
- (d) damage, mark, or deface any wall or any part of any building. (Any person who does, permits, or suffers such damage shall be liable to pay the cost of all such damage, in addition to any penalty imposed by these By-laws.)
- (e) Stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever. (Any person so doing shall immediately disperse on being requested to do so by the hirer, the secretary or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable, whether in uniform or otherwise.)

(16.) No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons, or anything calculated to produce a disturbance, riot, or other breach of the peace, shall be permitted in any building.

(17.) No encouragement shall be given to improper characters to assemble in any building.

(18.) The hirer of the building shall maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour in such building, and shall be solely and entirely responsible for the carrying out of these By-laws, and for any damage done to the building, fixtures, fittings, furniture, or crockery-ware, and shall pay such damage as shall be assessed by the Board.

Any article of crockery-ware not accounted for or in a cracked or broken condition shall be paid for at current rates or prices.

(19.) The secretary or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable, when dressed in uniform or otherwise, shall be permitted to have free ingress to any building at all times during the term of engagement, and every facility shall be given them for enforcing these By-laws.

(20.) Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds for every such conviction.

FREMANTLE ROAD BOARD.

By-laws relating to Beaches, Reserves, Bathing, and Camping.

P.W. 32/27.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919-33," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Fremantle Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Interpretation.

1. "Public bathing reserve" means any public park, sea beach, public reserve, river or lake shore, and the waters adjacent thereto, wherein public bathing is permitted by the Board, By-law, or by custom, and includes any dressing enclosure or building thereon.

Costume.

2. All persons over seven years of age bathing in any waters exposed to public view shall be clad in a suitable bathing costume covering the body so as to secure the observance of decency; and any inspector or police officer may require any person contravening this provision to resume at once his ordinary dress.

In any case where an inspector is of opinion that any person's bathing costume is indecent or inadequate, or that the material thereof is too thin, or is not in a proper state of repair, or is unsuitable, may direct such person to resume at once his ordinary dress.

If any person fail to resume immediately his ordinary dress when directed so to do by an inspector, he shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and may, with any necessary force, be removed to the dressing enclosure or shed by the inspector.

Dressing in Public View.

3. A person shall not dress or undress or remove or disarrange any part of his bathing costume in any place open to the public view: Provided that this shall not prevent any person already clad in proper bathing costume from doffing or donning at any public bathing reserve any dressing-gown or outer robe.

Separation of Sexes.

4. A male above the age of 12 years shall not trespass upon any part of a public bathing reserve which is set apart for women.

A woman shall not trespass upon any part of a public bathing reserve which is set apart for men.

Use of Dressing Enclosures of Sheds.

5. A dressing enclosure or dressing shed shall be used for dressing and undressing only. A person shall not play games, or, without reasonable excuse, loiter in or in the vicinity of any such enclosure or shed.

A person shall not bring or deposit any filth or rubbish in any such enclosure or shed.

A person shall not damage, disfigure, or write in or upon any such enclosure or shed.

Erection of Temporary Screens, Awnings, etc.

6. Where a dressing enclosure or shed has been provided on or near any public bathing reserve the Board may, by notice exhibited in some conspicuous position on any such public bathing reserve, prohibit the erection by the public on any such public bathing reserve of temporary screens, awnings, enclosures, or structures of a like kind for the purpose of dressing and undressing or for any other purpose.

Dogs and Horses.

7. Any inspector may, when in his opinion inconvenience may be caused to the public by the bathing of dogs or horses, order any person in charge of any dogs or horse not to send or drive such dog or horse into the water, or permit such dog or horse to enter the water at any place where the public are bathing.

Any inspector may order any person in charge of any dog or horse to remove such animal from a public bathing reserve, if such animal's presence on the public bathing reserve causes inconvenience or danger to the public.

Regulation and Protection of Public—Preservation of Order.

8. A person shall not in a public bathing reserve or public bath do any act which would be likely to injure, endanger, obstruct, inconvenience or annoy any person.

A person shall not in a public bathing reserve or public bath do any act which would be likely to injure, displace, pollute, foul, litter, deface or disorder such reserve or bath, or anything appertaining thereto, or to cause waste, loss, or inconvenience to the Board or its servants.

If any person break any bottle or any article of glass or earthenware in any public bathing reserve or public bath, he shall collect and remove all portions of such bottle or article, either to a receptacle (if any) provided by the Board therefor, or to some place beyond the public bathing reserve or bath.

Regulation—Notices.

9. The Board may, by notices exhibited in a public bathing reserve or public bath, regulate the lighting of fires, require animals and vehicles to be kept off places indicated, mark places where bathing shall be prohibited, regulate vehicular and pedestrian traffic, regulate the conduct of persons, and generally regulate the use of the reserve or bath by the public.

Inspectors.

10. The Board may appoint any person or servant of the Board an inspector under these By-laws.

Provided that a member so appointed shall not prosecute any person for a breach of any provision of these By-laws, but shall report such breach to the Board for action by it.

Every constable or officer of police shall have the powers of an inspector under these By-laws.

Every inspector may demand the name and address of any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these By-laws, and such person shall comply with such demand.

A person shall not obstruct or hinder any inspector in the performance of his duties or in the exercise of his powers.

The Board shall supply each inspector with a written appointment, under the seal of the Board.

Shelter Sheds.

11. No person shall use any shelter shed to the exclusion of any other person or persons. Camping in shelter sheds will not be permitted, and any person shall vacate any shed, upon being so ordered by an inspector or police officer. Shelter sheds shall not be used as dressing sheds or for the stabling or parking of vehicles.

12. (a) No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly or not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain in any reserve or reserves, and no person shall commit therein any act or indecency.

(b) No person shall interfere with, damage, or destroy the seats, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers or any property in any reserve, or throw stones or other missiles, or light fires therein, or leave in any reserve any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, litter, or refuse of any kind.

(c) No assemblage of persons for any fete, picnic, or concert, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or any meeting of a like character, shall take place in any reserve without the permission in writing of the Board first had and obtained.

(d) No person, unless authorised in writing by the Board, shall offer for sale in any reserve any article of fruits, soft drinks, refreshments, or merchandise.

(e) Any person found removing or taking any plants, flowers, seeds, or other property from any reserve, or injuring any property therein, shall be liable to be removed from such reserve and prosecuted.

(f) No horse shall be broken-in or trained in any reserve.

(g) No motor-bicycle shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through any reserve, except on the portions thereof specially provided for same.

(h) No horse, cattle, sheep or pigs shall be allowed or suffered to enter or pass over or through any portion of any reserve.

(i) No person shall be allowed to erect or conduct a shed, platform, merry-go-round, circus or any other form of entertainment, without first obtaining the Board's written permission therefor and a license fee paid as per Schedule. The Board's approval may be withdrawn or withheld if, in its opinion such shed, etc., is not properly, decently, or cleanly conducted. No shed, etc., will be licensed unless solidly built of stone, brick, iron, or wood and iron or approved material, properly roofed in. Tessian structures not allowable.

Camping.

13. No person shall camp on any beach, reserve, or foreshore without a license from the Board, which shall be produced on demand by an officer of the Board or police constable. Camping is strictly prohibited in all parts of the District, excepting on those portions of any reserve, beach, or foreshore which are set apart for that purpose by the Board. License for camping must first be obtained from the secretary's office, or such other place as may be appointed by the Board, and must be renewed there. The license fee shall be paid in accordance with the Schedule hereto and shall be paid for in advance. The license shall set forth the portion of the District in which such license may be exercised.

The Board reserves the right to refuse, without assigning reason, to issue a license to any person or persons.

Schedule of Fees.

For each private camping site (20ft. x 30ft.), 2s. 6d. per week or portion of a week.

For each charitable institution, £1 1s. per visit.

For each side-show, etc., 10s. per week.

For every mechanical contrivance, £1 1s. per week.

14. Any person guilty of an offence may be forthwith removed from the bathing reserve or bath by a servant of the Board, or by an inspector, or by a police constable, without affecting his liability to be subsequently prosecuted for such offence.

Penalties.

15. Any person not complying with or offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws or the terms of any notice, order, or direction exhibited, issued, or given thereunder, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £10.

The foregoing By-laws were adopted by resolution of the members at a meeting of the Fremantle Road Board held on the 20th day of November, 1934.
